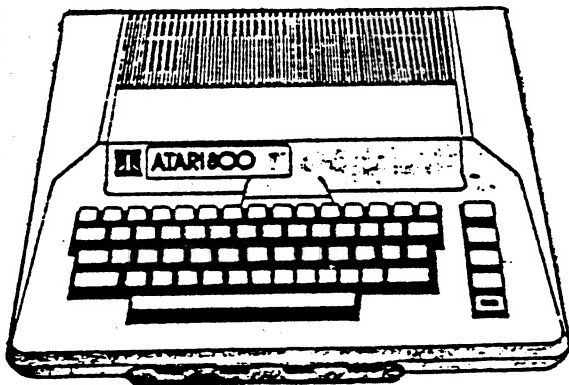

ATARI EMBRACES COOKIE MONSTER

Atari has announced the development of a series of educational programs which feature Sesame Street characters and are designed to appeal to children ages 3 to 7. Altogether there are three programs, and each can be played at 10 to 12 levels of difficulty. They are aimed at helping children develop skills in letter and number recognition as well as other reading and writing skills.

The suggested retail price of these products is \$30.45. The movement to work out programs for the preschool level is a part of Atari's strategy to target all age levels with entertainment and educational software of high quality. These products have been developed in cooperation with Children's Computer Workshop, a division of Children's Television Workshop, which produces Sesame Street.

(EDITOR'S NOTE: It is our opinion that Atari is probably on the right track with these programs because of the relationship with Children's Computer Workshop, which is a highly reputable organization. The educational market at the present time offers very little that is of good quality for young children, and Atari has definitely found an area in which there is a tremendous need.)

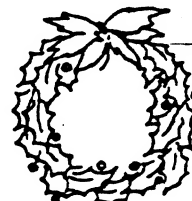
BO DAVIS

CHANGING VARIABLES TO INVERSE AND LOWERCASE

(EDITORS: Travis is one of the youth contributors to the DAL-ACE Newsletter, and we are very pleased to have an opportunity to publish his work. Travis also contributed the article which follows this one, "Machine Language Subroutines." DAL-ACE is extremely proud of the young people who have chosen to become active in the group, and would like to encourage more of our youth to consider making contributions to the Newsletter.)

Have you ever wondered how to print a variable such as one that is entered by the keyboard operator (i.e., a program asks for a person's name) in Inverse, Lowercase, or Inversed Lowercase? I wanted to know for a long time and just found out how. First of all, you need to have the computer figure how long it needs to make the loop by having it find the length of the variable. Let's say we use the variable NMS; therefore, we use the computer command LEN(NMS). To define the loop, we tell the computer:

```
FOR W=1 TO LEN(NMS)
```

Next, we add the numeral that makes it become what we want it to be. Presto! We have our variable just how we want it when the computer prints it. This is the entire routine and should easily fit in one program line:

```
FOR W=1 TO LEN(NMS):NM$(W,W)=CHR$(ASC(NMS$(W,W))+X):NEXT W
```

Here are the values and their purpose:

- X = 30 - Changes to Lowercase Normal
- X = 128 - Changes to Uppercase in Inverse
- X = 168 - Changes to Lowercase in Inverse

I hope this article has been helpful to all who own and program an ATARI.

MACHINE LANGUAGE SUBROUTINES

The following three programs change the colors in three color registers. The first program changes the color in COLPF1 (\$D017) which is the background color register. The second program changes the color in COLPF2 (\$D018), which is the character color register. The third program changes the color in COLBK (\$D01A), the border color register, along with COLPF1 and COLPF2 to affect the entire screen.

The programs are loops that change the color register for each line on the screen. They are called from BASIC by A=USR(1536) and when they are running, the Atari is locked up in a machine language routine. Therefore, your program can't do anything until the routine returns to BASIC. For those interested I will print the source code for these programs in the newsletter next month.

OUTSIDE ATARI

TI INTRODUCES PORTABLE COMPUTER

Texas Instruments has announced that its new portable computer will be available to dealers in December and ready for customer shipment next month. The new model comes equipped with 64K internal memory and is expandable to 768K.

The TI portable is fully compatible with the TI Professional Computer, and runs a wide range of software, especially in the areas of word processing and business applications. Although it is not IBM compatible, the company does not view this as a drawback because all of the major software packages are becoming available for both the TI and the IBM products.

The 16-bit TI Portable uses the Intel 8088 microprocessor and has the same keyboard as that which is used on the desk-top model. There are five expansion slots and a storage compartment for electrical cords and cables.

TI recently announced that it had dropped the 99/4A home computer and will devote more of its resources to the desk-top and portable models. The 99/4A was actually produced by an entirely different division of TI and bears little relationship to the other TI computer products. Incidentally, TI claims that the 99/4A was one of the market leaders when it was dropped, but that it was too much of a financial strain for the company to continue to devote resources to it.

ITT INTRODUCES DESK-TOP SYSTEM

ITT Corp. recently unveiled its new 16-bit desk-top computer, the Xtra, which is expected to be a real competitor to the IBM PC. The Xtra is fully IBM compatible, and sells for about \$1150. The basic configuration includes an Intel 8088 microprocessor, 128K bytes of internal memory, a keyboard, a 360K byte 5.25 inch floppy-disk drive, a controller, a monochrome video-display monitor, a Centronics printer port, and an RS-232C port.

This basic system sells for about \$3,000, and for an additional \$500 a second floppy drive can be added.
