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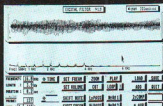

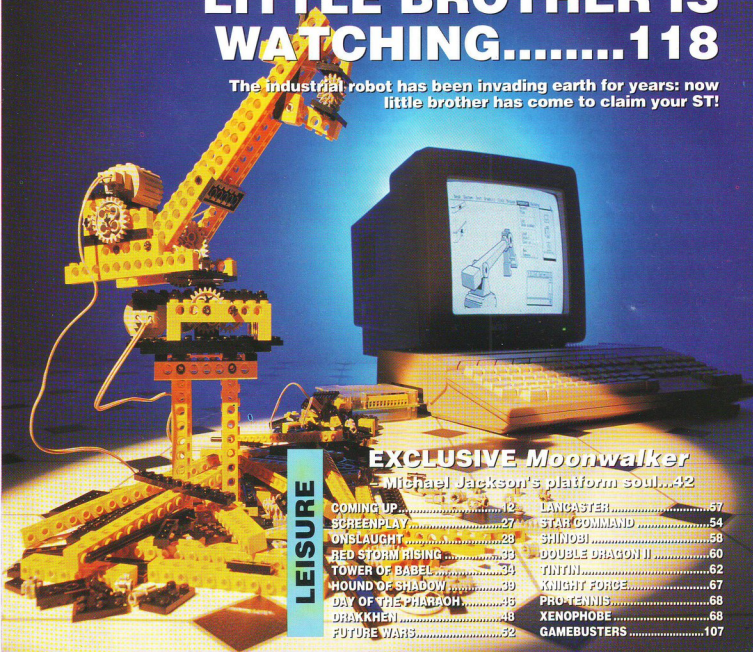

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GST SCUPPER PIRATES

GST Software Products, the company responsible for the best-selling DTP package Timeworks as well as a range of other popular ST programs, have taken action against a large-scale software pirating operation in France.

GST's former French distributor had been manufacturing and selling allegedly counterfeit copies of Timeworks Publisher and Timeworks Publisher Life.

During a massive police raid – the biggest of its kind in France – on the premises of Wings Micro Electronics, a substantial amount of what is said to be pirated material was seized.

"40% of our products are sold outside the UK," said GST's Managing Director David Rose. "France is one of our most important markets. Software piracy is a threat to all our customers, and the action we have taken will help to protect all parties."

GST has recently appointed Guillemot of La Gacilly, Brittany, as their new importer/distributor.

"FURIOUS" ATARI THREATEN TO TAKE THEIR BALL HOME

Recent criticisms of Atari's latest machine the STE have produced an extraordinary response from the company. Following the comments of several top programmers in last month's *ST Format* that the machine was "too little, too late," Atari have threatened to withdraw development machines from the programmers involved.

In order to begin software development, a handful of programmers were given the STE with a clause committing them to a non-disclosure agreement designed to prevent adverse criticism.

This type of agreement is standard practice among computer manufacturers who involve "outsiders" in their projects – hence Atari's anger at the disclosures.

"They can have opinions, but they should keep them to themselves," stormed an Atari spokesman. "We're furious, and you can print that!"

In a recent census by *ST Format*'s sister magazine *New Computer Express*, however, not all of the programmers polled expressed adverse criticism. "A lot of people won't bother taking advantage of it, which is a shame," observed Trip-a-Tron programmer Jeff Minter. "If I get one I'll try and get the best out of it. I wouldn't mind using the hardware scrolling just because it's there."

Glen Corpes of *Populous* fame agreed with Minter: "I'm still finding my way around the machine but it looks good."

Atari are confident the STE will be available in time for Christmas, and will be priced the same as the 1040ST at £499. Sceptical observers will believe it when they see it.

ATARI BY ANY OTHER NAME

In a bid to increase their profile in the games market, Atari Software are launch an all-out attack on the 16-bit software scene – and doing so under a new name!

The new label is to be called ARC, and a whole host of new software will emerge through it for the ST, the PC and something called the Amiga. 15 games are lined up for release before Christmas, with many more planned next year.

Whether Atari will be able to topple software giants like US Gold, and Ocean remains to be seen. But Mirrorsoft, perhaps their leading competitor in the 16-bit market, don't sound too bothered. "With Tim Chaney behind it, they've got the right credentials," was the Mirrorsoft verdict, "but we can't offer an opinion without seeing their software."

OLD GOLD

The signing of Chaney, industry veteran and former director of US Gold, to plot their strategy is a bold move that signals Atari's seriousness of purpose. Heavyweight marketing and development plans are afoot.

The name change is an implicit admission that Atari have a past to live down: previous

releases such as *Tempest*, *Enterprise* and *Starbreaker* raised little excitement and are unlikely to have generated vast amounts of cash. In fact it is being suggested that the change is taking place largely so that PC and Amiga owners won't be put off buying Atari products.

On the other hand ARC will, of course, still be able to enjoy Atari's clout in attracting top programmers and trade attention.

CONDOR UNVEIL NEW PLUG-IN PC EMULATOR

After *PC Speed* and *PC Ditto*, PC emulators are really taking off. Condor, new to the ST scene, are set to release yet another before Christmas.

Supercharger differs from *PC Speed* and the soon-to-be-released *PC Ditto 2* in that it doesn't plug inside the machine. Instead, the *Supercharger* connects to the DMA port and provides PC emulation that way. A thorough port is provided for daisy-chaining hard drive units or an Atari laser.

The *Supercharger* operates as an MS-DOS operating system and contains its own expansion bus. This lets you plug standard PC boards into an optional expansion chassis, currently under development.

Howard Newmark, Condor's head, explained to *ST Format*, "We've studied the various methods of PC Emulation on the Atari, and have found the *Supercharger* to be more than just an emulator. No other emulator allows you to have 703K available for DOS programs

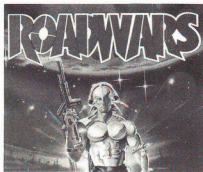
on a 520 ST. We think this will revolutionise PC emulation as we know it today."

Another feature *Supercharger* boasts that *PC Speed* lacks is the addition of a hot key. This allows you to toggle between MS Dos and TOS without needing to re-boot the machine. Condor are claiming a highly impressive Norton speed rating of factor 4. Immediately the emulator is brought into use, the standard Atari mouse is treated as if it were Microsoft compatible. 512K of RAM is provided as standard, although 1MByte can be purchased.

Although currently only a CGA emulator, VGA emulation will be available soon. The emulator uses a V30 processor, running at 8MHz. It's available now at £299: contact Condor on 01 828 9755.

MASTERTRONIC DO GAMESTERS A FIVER

Mastertronic have announced a new 16-bit label which is to release games for just £4.99. The intention is to re-release older games such as *Road Wars* and *Enterprise*. The price is the lowest ever charged for 16-bit games and represents a major reduction. Budget product manager, Andrew Wright, said, "It's become increasingly obvious that £9.99 was not a realistic price-point for budget 16-bit software."

ANTI-SEXIST CAMPAIGN GAINS GROUND

OASIS, the Organisation Against Sexism in Software, celebrates its first birthday this month. Sandra Vogel, founder of the organisation, decided to campaign against sexism after seeing so many games featuring offensive female (and indeed male) stereotypes.

Vogel is an ST owner and a keen games player, but argues that unnecessary elements spoil her enjoyment of leisure software. "I can see no reason why stereotypes of women and men should have to be used in computer games," she said. "One of the advantages this technology has over other games media is that you can do literally anything with a computer."

OASIS has campaigned hard against offenders in both the advertising and games industry throughout the year. "It's been a time when hardly a month goes by without a letter appearing in a magazine or without particular software houses being ticked off. The first year was a testbed. It has proved that there is a need for OASIS in the computer industry."

PIPELINE IN THE, ER... PIPELINE

Dragon's Lair and *Space Ace* distributors Entertainment International have announced a tie-up with Lucasfilm in the States. EI have been developing a project which was originally called *Pipeline* but has now been renamed *Pipe Dream*. Lucasfilm spotted the game and felt that it was something they wanted to market.

No-one's saying how much was involved in the deal but it is the first time that Lucasfilm have shown an interest in an outsider's products. They've wielded their power already by getting the name of the game changed and demanding - and getting - the alteration of numerous aspects of the original concept.

The ST game was previewed over a year ago. Recently we sneaked a look at the new version. The aim, apparently, is to piece sections of pipe together and allow oil to flow

through. Sounds inspired? Well no, it sounds duller than ditchwater actually, but according to well informed sources (ie Entertainment International) Lucasfilm are hoping to cash in on the "sheer addictiveness" of the game. And Lucasfilm didn't get where they are today without being able to spot a winner.

Lucasfilm will market it in the States in January. Unfortunately we won't see the product until February.

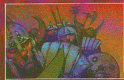

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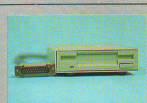
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THE FUTURE'S SO BRIGHT

As the games houses go into frenzy mode, we take a cool, calm and considered view of the titles you could be playing next month

Here's a taste of a few of the games that have been pouring through the ST Format letterbox in the past few days. Reviews of many of them next month...

PARK'N'RIDE

You've inherited a theme park from your grandpa. But the park has no customers and no staff, and you have to discover why everyone's abandoned it. No, it's not market research for Maplins; it's Mirrorsoft's *Theme Park Mystery*. Never a company given to making false claims (it says here), they're boasting that *Theme Park Mystery* is going to take the games industry by storm with its action and special effects. We'll be the judge of that, if you don't mind.

RAYS ARE SHARP

Four prisoners from the Sidereal Prison institute have escaped with lunar assault vehicles. Their aim is to take revenge on the planet Earth. You don't need to be told how you fit into this scheme. *Dark Century* features two-player action using a split-screen mode similar to

Bloodwych. Titus are making much of the game's 3D ray-traced graphics. We shall see.

THE LAST WAVE

Logotron's *Bad Company* features simultaneous two-player option and exciting sprite-based 3D combat routines in true *Operation Thunderbolt* style. You could be in for a treat as you and your sidekick wipe out wave after wave of enemies in a ferocious blasting session.

TRIAL RUN

The tribal elders of the planet Tasmin have gathered in the Great Hall to watch the ritual testing of their young warriors. As they wait, an image of their founding elder appears on the screen and calls for the first warrior. The young Tasminian climbs into the test craft and the trials have begun. *Starblaze* is a pure solid vector 3D shoot-em-up with five colourful backdrops and over 100 different attack patterns.

BAND ON THE RUN

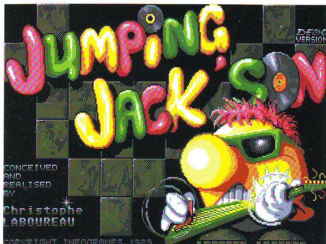
More than just a wild vigilante shoot-em-up, *Resolution 101* has you driving a training vehi-

cle and trying to assassinate a band of criminals roaming the planet.

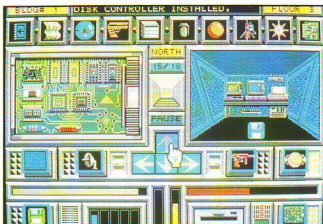
3D graphic routines form the basis of the game and make your journey around the cities a thrilling challenge. This could well be the most promising game Logotron have released since *Archipelagos* - which is hardly surprising since the 3D routines are said to be derivatives of those used in that game.

GORE BLIMEY

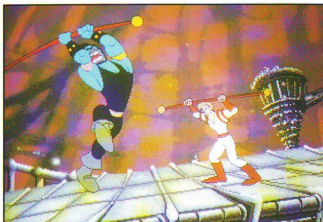
There are 30 different types of enemy to conquer in Gremlin's *Axel's Magic Hammer*, including the traditional heavy breathing green dragon. You battle through this dangerous adventure in a bid to find the beautiful maiden who bowled you over (stop me if you've heard it before). So far, so what: but this isn't just another soppy scenario. There's a subtle balance of blood and gore in the shape of the magic hammer, with which you smash your enemies into small pieces. Told you it was subtle. The game has eight levels spanning 200 screens and including a Roman village, a castle dungeon and even an Egyptian tomb.



■ Two views of Christophe Laboureux's *Jumping Jackson*, another game in the same "cute'n'cuddly" vein as Loriciel's *Skweek*. Infogrames' effort has you in the lead role as the son of Jumping Jack (a kind of musical in-joke), hopping from square to square and putting records into the jukebox. Something like that, anyway. Review next month



■ (above) **SAVE, SAVE, SAVE!** Accolade's *Day of the Viper* puts you in control of Viper V. Mission: to penetrate enemy defence lines and re-activate a defence computer. Performing this nifty little task will (surprise,surprise) protect the Earth from attack. Catch the review in next month's monster issue



■ (above) **CLOSE ENCOUNTER:** Empire's going to send you into orbit, if the demos of *Space Ace* are anything to go by! The game features astonishing cartoon visuals and lots of sampled speech, combining to make it what may prove to be one of the all-time great releases. We'll have to wait until next month to see how well it plays, but the signs are good. Readysoft admitted there were problems with the playability of *Dragon's Lair*, their last release, but these have supposedly been fully resolved in *Space Ace*. Eagerly awaited

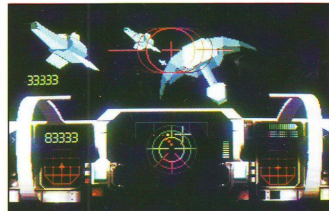

Looking better than it sounds (not hard), it incorporates smooth bi-directional horizontal scrolling at 50Hz, and, using palette shifting techniques, manages to deliver more than the standard 16 colours on screen at once. Set in *Shogglewaggle (oh dear)*, DD centres on an apprentice-hero about to undergo his last big test before becoming a full-blown *Dynamic Debugger*

■ (below) **TRACK RECORD:** a 3D tank simulator, Loriciel/US Gold's *Track Attack* is touted as an accurate simulation of the control method used in an M1 tank. ■ (below) **ALGORITHM METHOD:** Microdeal are keeping all items crossed that this flight-sim becomes one of the classics. They're already daring to compare it to Spectrum *Holobyte's* mighty *Falcon*. (What was it pride came before?) *Goldrunner* has a realistic flight deck and spectacular view of the landscape, but it's the 3D graphics, Microdeal claim, that surpass any other flight sim. The algorithms have taken over a year to perfect: 360 polygons plus can be drawn each second. If it lives up to the claims being made for it, *Goldrunner* could be a smash



■ (above) **FOWL PLAY:** King Arthur is back in *Ghouls 'n' Ghosts*, US Gold's conversion of the '86 Capcom classic. It's taken its time getting here, but judging by the playable demos *G'n'G* has all the charm and addictiveness of its arcade ancestor. King Arthur adapts to a bi-directional horizontally scrolling environment and still manages to defeat one ghost after another. He even gets to use spells to help him, but if these go wrong he finds himself transformed into a chicken. ST ON THE STE

STORY "Eureka"

Sam Tramiel, president of Atari Corporation, is in talkative mood these days. Last month we reviewed an in-depth interview with Sam in an American ST publication. This time he's gone online, with a real-time conference on Genie, an American information service.

The conference was short, and interest was centred on the specifications of the new hardware. Over 100 Genie subscribers attended, and many asked questions about Atari's future products and plans.

US audiences are still awaiting product information on the STE and TT, which were announced in Europe some time ago.

According to Tramiel, Atari plan to ship the TT during the fourth quarter of 1989, and he claimed the STEs would be shipped to Europe in September, and reach the U.S. in October.

PORTFOLIO UPDATE

First shipments of the Atari Portfolio have reached the U.S. marketplace, beginning with a thousand units in mid-September. Full page ads in national magazines and newspapers are scheduled to introduce the product to businessmen nationwide. Dealers will be given an opportunity to sell a limited quantity, as promised, but direct sales from Atari will be heavily promoted.

The Portfolio, Atari's handheld IBM-compatible computer, looks set to be a bestseller. If it catches on in the U.S. it should give Atari enough market credibility to make an impact with other Atari computer products.

MOUSE WITH NO TAIL

Practical Solutions, an ST developer in Tucson, Arizona, has released a cordless mouse for the Atari ST. The mouse uses an infra-red signal to communicate with the base receiver connected to standard mouse port.

The cordless mouse can be operated up to five feet away, and according to the company, will eliminate "those old cable tangles," and provide faster and smoother mouse movement.

It's lightweight and contoured to be equally easy to use for both right and left-handed operators.

The new mouse is twice as fast as the Atari mouse (which was never going to be particularly difficult), with a resolution of over 200 cpi and a tracking speed of up to 600 mm/sec. This means movement takes less than half the rolling time normally required.

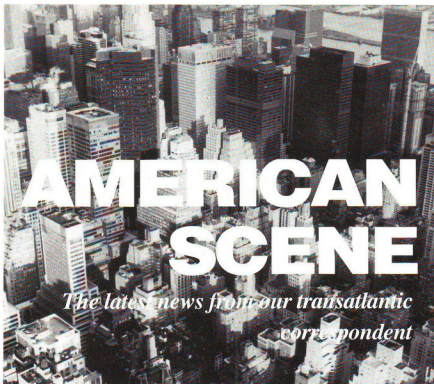
The cordless mouse also has an automatic shutoff to extend battery life (two "AAA" batteries required). It will retail at \$130.

ATARI LOSES CALCULATED GAMBLE

According to informed sources, Atari is planning to shut down its Consumer Products Division, less than a year after its formation.

Based in Scottsdale, Arizona, it produced a complete line of calculators and adding machines for every home and business need. The reason for the closure was the failure to produce high volume sales.

The division was only formed early this year when Atari cancelled a licencing agreement with Harteck Ltd of Hong Kong and hired Harteck's president, David Harris.



CODEHEAD KEEP ON GROWING

CodeHead Software, a small company in southern California that develops exclusively for the Atari ST, is run by former musicians Charles Johnson and John Eidsvoog. Every program they've released to the ST market has been a smash hit with hackers and power users alike.

Programs such as G+Plus and Hot Wire even find widespread usage inside Atari Corp itself.

G+Plus (\$35) is a font management system that replaces Atari GDOS. G+Plus is both faster and easier to use.

MultiDesk (\$30 - and reviewed in this issue) allows the ST user to load and use up to 32 desk accessories at any time by providing a shell for accessories to load into. Hot Wire (\$40) allows the user to access up to 54 programs by hitting a single "hot" key.

The CodeHead Utilities (\$30) include the Multifile handler, the CodeHead Ramdisk and print spooler, a graphics viewer/slideshow program, and a disk copying programs.

FatBack (\$40) is a fast hard drive backup program that backs up sectors, not files. Unlike other image backup programs, however, FatBack doesn't waste time backing up unused sectors.

POPSTERS PROMOTE ATARI

Many popular American musicians use Atari computers in the recording studio and in performance. The Atari has long been recognised for its built-in MIDI capability, which allows the computer to control electronic instruments and manipulate sound.

Teenage warbler Debbie Gibson has publicly endorsed Atari computers. Other big name Atari fans include the Pointer Sisters' band, ex-Mormon Donny Osmond, Van Halen, Peter Gabriel (he gave STs to his kids for Christmas), as well as boring ancient rockers Fleetwood Mac and Tangerine Dream.

Jazz greats like Lee Ritenour, Dave Grusin, and Oscar Peterson use Atari computers in the studio. They praise the machine for its ease-of-use and versatility.

Frosty Julia Fordham is currently touring the UK with Atari's help: they're backing her as the kind of musician ST users look up to, which may be a mistake.

Several major American motion picture soundtracks have been produced using Atari computers. For example, Ataris helped create the soundtrack for the films *Colors* and *The Milagro Beanfield War*.

ATARI SHARES CONTINUE TO RISE

Atari Corp. continues to find itself listed on the American Stock Exchange's most active list, trading close to 4 million shares in one week in September. Stock prices have risen dramatically, as much as 2 points in one day.

ATC stock is currently valued at about \$12 per share, and is expected to rise even further as Portfolio sales increase and new products are released on the market.

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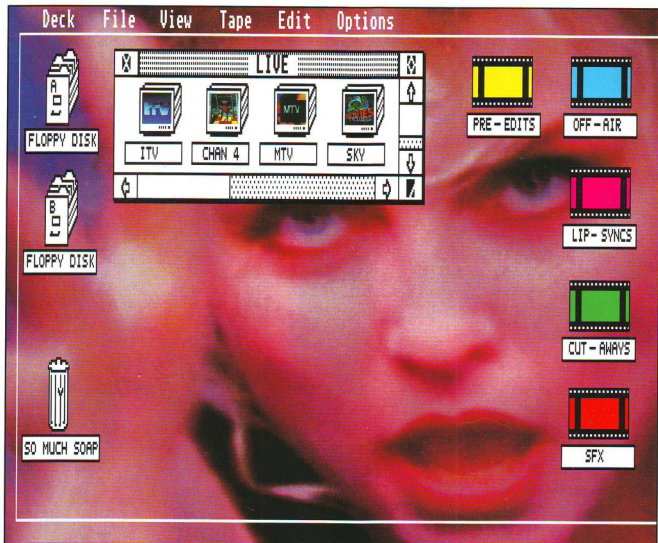
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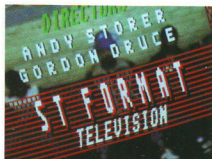
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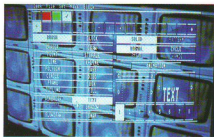

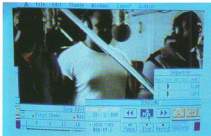

Compositions can be sequenced as normal background video signals, cut so that video edit points coincide with beats in the music. Accurate edits can be guided by the sequencer's own time code readout and recorded to videotape. Finally, all you have to do is record audio to the videotape and you have a promo produced from ST's desk top

With the massive growth in ownership of domestic video-recorders and, of late, the burgeoning camcorder market, it's little short of astonishing that we've had to wait virtually until 1990 to see video processing arrive on the ST desktop.

The hold-up's been due to the lack of a genlock – a device which allow you to superimpose computer and video displays on a single screen. The potential for low-cost video effects, editing, titling and animation is enormous, so just why has a genlock been so long in arriving? After all, whatever the intricacies of the code defining the image you see on your ST's monitor, it's a video chip that's producing it. All that's needed is a means of synchronising the ST's video output with that of a live or recorded video source and you're away, surely? Sounds simple enough, and indeed it is – once, that is, you've cracked the problem of the different rates at which videos and computers refresh their displays.

GENLOCK ON HOLD

The ST, unfortunately, isn't one of the easiest computers to doctor. Sending a sync pulse to the ST's clock to alter its screen refresh rate is extremely difficult, if not impossible, without making hardware modifications.

One brave company that tried, Digma

If you own a video camera or recorder, all you need is a genlock to break into the brave new world of Desktop Video. Behold the pioneer: GST's Gold Genlock

International, spent a whole year developing a completely external sync pulse generator which the ST's clock would accept; and then ended up approaching the problem from another angle altogether.

Digma were determined not to make direct modifications to the ST's CPU. Their solution was to grab the ST's and the video source's screen outputs separately, shove them both into 640K of external RAM and use custom chips, a separate 68000 and a host of I/O controllers, all contained in a stand alone box, to synchronise the signals for re-display.

MultiGen, as the product is known, is now shelved until early next year. Digma considered that a price of at least £600 for an off-the-shelf model wouldn't be practical, so it's looking at ways of reducing component costs. However, their external memory method of mixing images would mean you could sync and mix signals from a variety of sources – be they

different video formats, STs, STes, TTs, PC Compatibles, BBCs, even, God forbid, Amigas. Let's hope it eventually does see the light of day.

Given the difficulties outlined briefly here, the £500 price tag for GST's Gold genlock begins to look reasonable, if not exactly dirt cheap. In resorting to the hardware modification solution, GST has managed to crack the problem. And judging by the impressive results of its rock solid video mixing, they've done it in style.

The GST Gold genlock works by injecting an external sync pulse which alters the phase-lock of the ST's system clock, while continuing to provide horizontal and vertical scan synchronisation. The doctored monitor output then feeds back into the genlock unit, where it's processed by another video chip and fed back out to your display. On the way you can control the brightness, contrast, colour and horizontal position of the signal on your screen through the genlock's front panel.

All the necessary RGB leads are supplied, but you'll need a monitor with a RGB input socket rather than the socketless Atari badged models. You'll also need a Mega ST. This isn't due to any need for extra RAM but simply because not all versions of the 520 and 1040 are able to accept a genlock without even further modification. GST merely recommend contacting your dealer if you don't have a Mega - although, if you're brave, fitting the component is still an option.

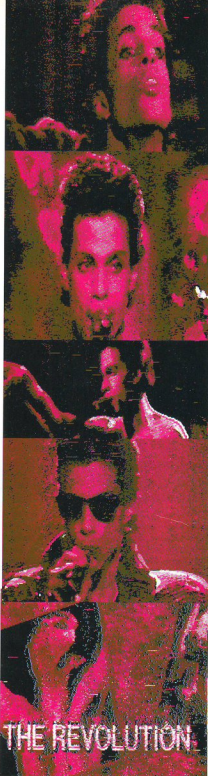
Once you've overcome the rather wacky translations from French that comprise the manual, and reassured yourself with the old adage that you don't need to be a mechanic to drive a car, you set about some minor surgery. Fortunately there's no soldering involved: all (all) you have to do is take the IC 2591 chip out of its socket, put it in the supplied custom housing and replace it. You then connect its lead to the Gold unit and feed a video signal from a deck or camera into the system. After slapping home a short synchronising boot program in the disk drive, you flick a switch for ST rather than video display on the monitor, and the GEM desktop appears.

At this point you won't see a superimposed image of your desktop over the video feed. This is because a genlock mixes an RGB computer image with a video source by replacing everything that is black on the computer's display with the video signal. So you need to call up the standard Control Panel D/A and change green to black. At this point you'll be astounded by a flawlessly steady superimposition of your GEM desktop over the video image. Now, after the hard work, you're ready for the fun to begin!

FIRST FRAMES

Let's just clarify a couple of points. Just because you have a video mix on screen doesn't mean you can save moving video images to disk. A genlock merely superimposes one image over the other, either as a foreground or background "mask," the signals themselves remaining entirely independent. It is possible, however, to direct the mixed output to videotape, since the signal reaching your monitor in mix mode is to all intents and purposes a single signal.

As such, you can record all ST operations to videotape - whether it be a sequence of ST animation screens superimposed over a live



video sequence, or your latest software demo, recorded over black video, captured on tape as an indication of work in progress. Or it could be just the mere meanderings of your mouse. You needn't in fact do anything more than say, watch TV on your monitor as a background task while you're waiting for that complex raytracing operation to take effect, or waiting for your

comms package to connect that call. Indeed, any on-line material you've accessed could be sent to video for later viewing a great deal faster than buffering it in RAM or sending it to disk or printer.

It's in the area of animation, though, that the Gold genlock will make most difference, since it allows you to output animations as long as a four hour videotape. You're no longer constrained by RAM or hard disk capacity. Lastly, if you use an ST for heavy duty database management then videotape could act as a useful backup medium.

VIDEO EDITING

But it's in the area of overlays that a genlock really comes into its own. Simple operations, such as adding titles to a videotape, are effortlessly achieved by setting the desktop background to black, booting up an Art or DTP package and placing the text anywhere you want. Hook up another video recorder to the PAL output on the GST Gold and you can try out pre-edit rolls of the video material to determine the exact timing of your titles. When you have it down to a tee, just hit Record on your second VTR and you have an edit.

Better still, use a package like *Cyber Studio*, *GFA Raytrace* or *Mastersound* to produce animated text and you soon have rolling credits to lay down to tape. If you're lucky enough to have access to three videocorders and a videomixer you can really go into overdrive. Using two as source decks switchable through the mixer, you can push them through the ST where they may be treated to realtime digitising, with the results being recorded onto the third.

VIDEO SEQUENCING

A little more adventurous, though by no means more difficult, is digitising video material from either a live camera or recorded video source, maybe looping the results with a package like the *A-Magic Turbo* or SAM digitisers, and laying down sequences onto videotape already containing a music track.

Combine animated, off-air and live material with trendy full screen captions and you have your own promo. Better still, if you work with sequencers, load up *Steinberg* or *Master Tracks* and follow the time code readouts to get perfect accuracy for your video sequence durations. Just think of the video material your sequencer is superimposed over as an extra audio channel that can be cut and pasted in the same way.

PRO-VIDEO AND ST DTV

Since the GST Gold is the first piece of enabling ST video kit on the market besides digitizers, it's likely to be some time before we see accompanying peripherals that allow the ST to be used in professional applications. But it's essential in the first instance to have a good

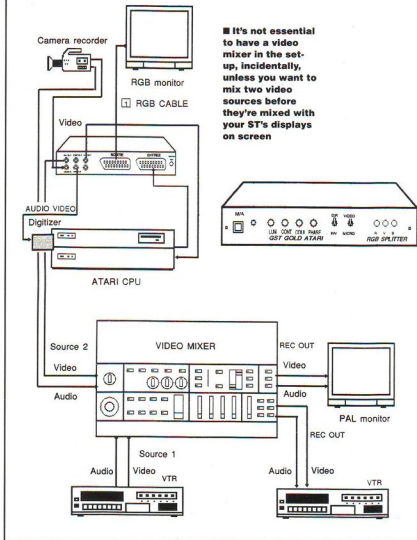

DREAM ST DTV

But perhaps full spec ST DTV is already here. At September's PC Show Signa showed off a ST-based desktop video system that drew the crowds like moths to a lamp. Running on a Mega ST4 the system, codenamed Chilli, features built-in genlock, realtime colour frame grabber and a 512x512 resolution custom video board. Its software can access 256 colours from a palette of 16 million.

Chilli is designed to be a pre-edit tool for conceiving pictorial ideas before sending productions to Quantel based systems like Paintbox and Harry that can easily cost some £200 per hour. No news on the price yet (but expect five figures), availability, or, indeed, its real name.

Meanwhile, what software could the ST Desk Top Video Editor expect next year? If developers get their acts into gear we might see integrated digital special effects software and hardware. Such a suite would include infrared drivers for videodecks whereby all deck controls including freeze frame, single frame step, and visible high speed search can be controlled from your desktop.

Video editing features would include adjustable pre-roll for frame accurate insert and assembly edits, an edit preview mode and an automatic edit decision list generator. Digital effects would comprise graphic and title overlay, picture-in picture facilities, wipes, fades, dissolves, solarizing and pixelizing.

None of these is so very far fetched: they're all available for the Amiga. The only difference is that Commodore thoughtfully included external sync pulse in its CPU right from the start and as such developers have had more time to produce the goods.

If £500 for the GST Gold genlock seems a bit steep, hold out for an STE. It has a system clock that can be phase-locked for genlock and the mono detect on the monitor socket is capable of taking an external sync pulse. So the future for video on the ST looks good.

Only problem is - can you wait that long? ■

quality video deck: sadly the typical VHS machine just isn't up to the professional spec. Not only is picture quality deficient, but there's no accurate means of controlling the tape-servo heads so that you can be assured of recording a frame exactly where you want it to go.

A pro-video editing environment not only uses rock steady and reliable 3/4 inch U-Matic videotape machines but relies on Time Code Generators to ensure accuracy. An external sync pulse is pre-recorded onto the tape to be edited, such that any point on the picture or audio track is denoted by a 8 or 10 figure time code that can be quickly accessed and used as guide for edit start and end points.

Thus the duration of particular edits can be calculated, so that, for instance, you know just how much ambient sound needs to accompany the exterior shots you're cutting together. Edit controllers also rely on time code to perform mixes, wipes, fades, dissolves and other effects.

It's not too difficult to see how an ST could be used as a TCG - all we're talking about is a stable clock output with accompanying digits that can be recorded to an audio track as sync pulse and a videotrack as an extended digital clock.

Time Base Correctors are also essential in any pro or semi-pro environment, since these allow realtime sampling of video signals so that digital drop-out can be compensated for. Picture quality is maintained through continuous processing thus negating "glitches" in video images. Here, though, we're talking custom hardware, as sampling rates are typically four frames a second.

It won't come as news that gear of this specification doesn't come out of a lucky bag. And that's before you've considered edit controllers and video effects units. U-Matic decks, for example, start at around £2,500 (13-amp plug extra); time code generators might easily knock you back £1,000; while a TBC is none in the region of £3,000. Edit controllers start out at around £750 and go all the way into editor salary figures (that cheap, huh? - ed).

The answer, if you're serious, is to hire from facilities houses. Samuelson's on 01 208 0011 are the leading hire company. U-Matic recorders are £30 a day, for instance, an edit controller with built in mix effects £80 a day, a time base corrector £95. But meanwhile there's still an awful lot that can be done with two VHS decks, an ST and a genlock.

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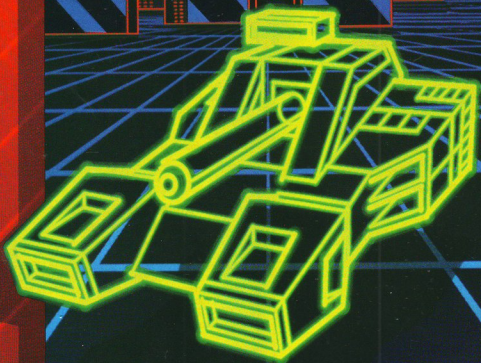

HOW RATINGS WORK

Graphics

The ST is capable of superb graphics and animation, so the last thing you want is crummy old 8-bit style graphics with tiny sprites and jerky movement. Graphics rating takes both still and moving graphics into account

Sound

Your ST holds the power to output some great audio effects – not just sampled music but some nifty tunes. One thing that doesn't go down well with our team of experts is the monotonous beep

Intelligence

Some games you can just pick up and play: if you've seen half a dozen vertically scrolling shoot-em-ups you know what to expect. Other games, however, take some thought and intelligence to play well. Look out for a high score here if you like your games brainy

Instant appeal

If there are 1,001 instructions to read before you can boot up the game, then it's hardly playable. You need to be able to shove the disk in and get on with it right away before it can truly be said to have instant appeal

Long term interest

The adventures/action distinction has finally been eroded with *Onslaught*, an action-adventure. In charge of graphics was Nigel Brownjohn, of *Verminator* fame. So it looks great. But how does it play?

Armour seems to be trendy again, so if you're a hip dude, or into heavy metal, pop down to Burtons and pick up a suit – you'll need it if you want to win this game. *Onslaught* is set in Gargore, a country riddled with kingdoms competing to crush each other. As a magical warrior, you need to guide your troops across enemy territory and defeat any opposing kingdom you meet.

Game play is divided into four areas: field battle, sieges, defending actions and mind combat. You'll spend most of your time engaged in field combat. Fight your way forward through a horizontally-scrolling maze of levels, defeating all the little bad guys who come your way.

Onslaught is more than just another bout of alien bashing, however, because it's essential that you don't let too many enemies get

by. If they do sneak past they'll reach your banner and take control of your army. You can redress the balance by moving left and killing any enemies you missed – but by doing this, you're wasting valuable time. While you're clearing up mistakes, more enemies are emerging from the right of the screen making things even tougher.

When you reach the enemy's banner, opponents stop emerging. Now go back and kill all the char-

acters still left on the battle field. Achieve this and you're ready for the siege.

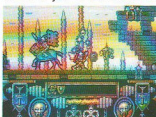
Sieges are similar to field battles but if you win one of these you enter a mind duel. Lose a mind duel and you return back to the siege. Lose a siege and you must go through the field battle all over again (ain't life a bitch?).

Tactical moves are essential when you're engaged in defending actions. This time you're competing on a map of your stronghold. If you lose your banner then you must enter a mind duel to reclaim it.

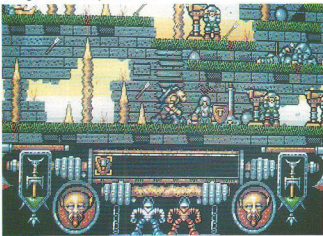
As you've probably gathered, winning a field battle is fine, but if you're going to get through this game it's the mind battles that really matter. These take place on a single screen and you fire mind

blasts at the enemy's banner to defeat him. Win this section and you pass to the next tough campaign.

Throughout the game there are obstacles to overcome. The worst is rebellion among your troops. If you own large amounts of land this is quite likely to occur; as a result, control of your land is transferred



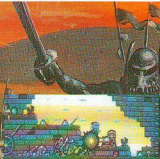

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to the enemy. The same thing happens if your troops fall victim to plague.

To help you in the challenge, four types of items may be picked up. Weapons are the most useful and can be anything from a mace to a magic demon. The mace is standard equipment and allows you to give the enemy a good whack

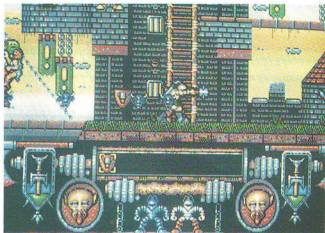

around the head - but because it's a body-contact weapon, you need to come dangerously close to your victim for it to have the desired effect

Most of the other weaponry can be tossed at the enemy from a distance, which makes it much easier to survive. Unfortunately, these don't last long. The more effective the weapon, in fact, the shorter the amount of time you can carry it. Talismans crop up in areas of terrain impossible to cross. Different types of talisman allow you to pass through different types of terrain - from forest to swamps to mountains. Special talismans can even be used to clear plagues and put down rebellions.

Since the game is all about amassing a gigantically high score, bags of gold found around the map

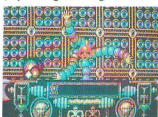
can earn you an extra 500 points.

EFFECTS

Nigel Brownjohn has been responsible for the graphics and it shows. The first thing that strikes you when you start to play *Onslaught* is its amazing similarity to *Verminator*. This isn't surprising since Brownjohn has used his traditionally detailed designs in both of these games. *Onslaught* is a visual treat and because more than 16 colours appear on screen at once it looks even better than its predecessor.

The amount of animation used on is so intense that you need 12 eyes just to keep track of the enemies on your tail - let alone fire back at them.

Standard sound-chip music plays throughout the game accom-

panied by spot effects every time you attack. Since you can't walk more than three paces without needing to retaliate to some form of attack, these effects tend to override the music.

VERDICT

Read the scenario and you could easily be forgiven for thinking that *Onslaught* was some type of adventure game, and this is certainly to its credit. After all, how many slay-em-ups have a plot that's actually relevant to the gameplay?

If you're after constant, mindless alien bashing then you won't find it here. In *Onslaught* you need to employ some grey matter if you're going to win the day. At the same time it's a test of your skills with the joystick - and what a test! There's so much going on that it's impossible to do anything without running into an enemy and needing to do some quick thinking pretty damn fast.

The strategy element, the graphics, the variety of levels and the separate mind duels all make *Onslaught* original, exciting, and fun to play, even if it is horrendously difficult to grab much land.

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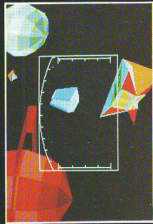
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Can you save the beleaguered Western forces by wreaking havoc among Russian raiders? Have you the skill to send carrier fleets to the bottom of the ocean? Most importantly, could you survive a silent duel with a "wolf pack" bent on your destruction? It's time to leave Holy Loch and prove your nautical mettle in heated battle beneath the ice flows of the North Atlantic. This is *Red Storm Rising*, a sub simulator with a difference – it's exciting!

You are in sole control of the bridge, deciding what the sub does, who it shoots at and whether it survives. Using the classic Microprose keyboard overlay, the whole boat is in your hands; weapon selection, guidance, speed and depth, all variable at the touch of a button. The on-screen displays show your position, the water characteristics, detection probability and even sonar comparisons as you prepare to engage in battle. This is realism city and *RSR* has taken up residence!

Using the political and tactical assumptions of Tom Clancy's novel *Red Storm Rising*, the manual goes beyond giving instructions and becomes a reference document on current and future developments in submarine warfare, its tactics, themes and traumas.

There are four dates on which the war can be fought, 1984, '88, '92 and '96. These determine the type of vessel and armaments you and your Russian opponents possess, which in turn affect the strategies you'll use. Compounding this are four levels of difficulty from complete beginner to participation in the *RSR* campaign. When even the choice of ship is taken into consideration, you can see this is no simple game of submerge,

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point and shoot!

The red storm really breaks when you eventually take to the high seas. However, all (yes all!) the information gathered from the 100 page booklet is needed for successful raiding. The beginner can have life easy, but never simple. The theory of submarine warfare is complex and subtle. It's a game of cat and mouse, relying on long range sensors to identify and then destroy foes. Only experience can tell you how and when to hide, the benefits and risks of good "active" sonar contacts, or how to

surprise an enemy with long range wire guided torpedoes.

Nothing is overlooked: the effect of water temperature on sonar emissions, the presence of thermal layers and even underwater weather must be taken into account. It's important to know where you can hide a 7,000 ton submarine in the open sea, and to know your blind spots and evasive techniques.

Once in battle, you acquire skills quickly. You fire torpedoes, judging the best time to activate their own logical hunting systems,

and try to get to surface to loose off a harpoon missile at an aircraft carrier. This being done while you throw quick turns at high speed, creating water "knuckles," to confuse any torpedo breathing down your rudder.

EFFECTS

Although it's far from silent, as you'll discover the first time an active sonar picks you out, it's not surprising that a game with a "run silent" feature has limited audio appeal. Visually the nature of the beast dictates that more maps and charts are used than traditional displays of controls. These are clear and flexible, allowing you to extract information as fast as possible – all maps have a zoom function for close examination of what's going down.

Most disappointing are the lame sinking sequences, which go on just too long. A detailed picture of the sub/ship in question just gets blammed, burns a little and gracefully sinks to the bottom... This is not what you learned to pilot a sub for!

VERDICT

A few hundred words cannot do justice to such a detailed and complex game. Only its atmosphere, its tense and intense gaming experience, can be described. Players of other Microprose techno-epics such as *Gunship* will understand the joy you feel when the submarine becomes your tool, and you finally understand how to employ it to total effect.

There's a strange satisfaction in outwitting the computer sub commander and dealing him a state of the art death. The complexity of the game is daunting to the first-time player, yet it's also the source of its appeal as a realistic shoot-em-up that requires learning, skill and intuition. You want extensive gameplay fused with intensive action? Go hunt the bear, a big red Russian bear.

Who said the Old Testament was gospel? Microprose are trying to prove that it was all a load of hogwash with this major strategy game. According to them, the tower of Babel wasn't built for God, but for a bunch of mechanical aliens from the planet Zantor who took control of its construction.

The Shinarians were an Earth tribe wanting to contact God. And since the telephone hadn't been invented, the tower was the next best thing. When the Zantorians came along and saw the tower they tried to assist in the building so they could climb to the top and use their own telecommunications system to phone home.

The Shinarians were upset at having their tower invaded and built

Suddenly from nowhere comes a game with such an arresting plot that our jaded games man is absolutely gobsmacked. Two years in the making, Microprose's latest strategy is aiming to repeat the success of epics like *Elite* and *Sentinel*

Zantorian-like robots who opposed the tower's construction. They made life hell for everyone.

Your role is to control three of the Zantorian robots, collect building blocks (Klondikes) and avoid the enemy. If the plot sounds convoluted – that's because it is. But in a strategy game complexity is to be expected.

The towers are solved by collecting all the Klondikes. Each

tower is arranged as a set of coloured panels, sometimes on two levels. You have three spiders under your control to help you collect the Klondikes – a Zapper, a Pusher and a Grabber. They're called spiders because they're four-legged, crawling robots.

The Zapper zaps certain objects out of the way. His main role is to rid the tower of enemy robots – but be careful, he can

blast your own spiders as well!

The Pusher shoves things out of the way. He removes blocks and other objects littering the tower.

The Grabber picks up Klondikes. He also links to objects in some towers that enable him to carry out special tasks such as freezing enemy robots or swapping positions with them.

You use a set of directional arrows at the bottom of the screen to move the spiders around the platform. Select the spider you want to move and click on the directional arrow to move him forward one coloured panel. The spider moves slowly – but you can set other spiders in motion at the same time. An option to program the spiders lets you enter a series of directions which are executed in

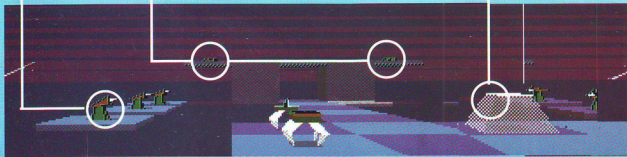

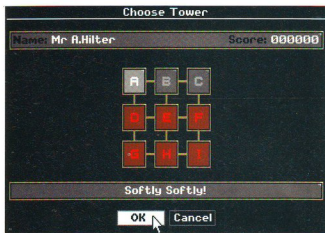

turn, sending spiders all over the place.

Once you learn to control the spiders (the easy bit), the next step is to confront the problem of collecting Klondikes. The idea is to use the Grabber to pick them up – but watch out for enemy Zappers installed around the tower, or your spider will be zapped to death!

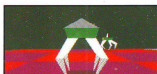
Opposing Pushers are scattered round the towers ready to frustrate you by pushing blocks into your path. In level one there are three Klondikes in a row, but by destroying the first one you open up a square that a Pusher blocks. With the obstacle in front of the other Klondikes it's impossible to solve the tower because all the Klondikes must be collected before the tower is complete.

There's a set of towers in each group. Completing one tower presents two linking towers to be completed. A group isn't complete until all the towers have been solved. Your score depends on the number of Klondikes you manage to collect.

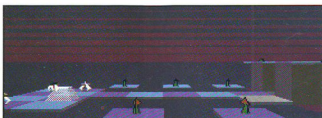
One problem with the game is that you can't tell if a tower is solvable. It's possible to move things around so you can't complete a tower, but you're only told it can't be done when all your spiders are zapped.

At any time in the game you can switch from playing through the eyes of a spider to viewing the scene from the cameras. These are located North, South, East and West and face toward the tower. You can move up and down to gain a different perspective and zoom in and out. This allows you to spot the locations of enemy Pushers or Zappers and plan your strategy.

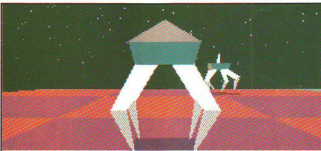
The game is totally logic controlled. There's no luck involved at all, so you're pitting your skills against the designer of the level. In fact you can be the designer yourself, because there's a level designer which lets you create a



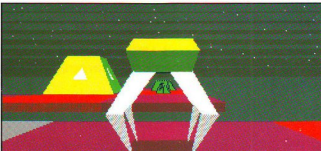

group of towers as complex or as easy as you wish.

EFFECTS

The 3D routines are brilliant. You're playing through a large window, but the action still moves quickly.

The Spiders chug along slowly – which can be annoying – until you gain the confidence to move around more than one at a time. The ability to move several spiders and still zoom in and out on the levels without losing speed makes it very playable.

Sound is limited to firing noises and spot effects accompanying the movement of spiders.

VERDICT

Good strategy games are notorious for being insanely difficult to get to grips with – and this is certainly not one of those games that can be picked up and played within five minutes of tearing off the shrinkwrap. Even when you understand the principles, there are so many problems specific to each tower that it never becomes easy.

If any criticism is levelled then it has to be that there's a lot to understand before you can play. The manual boasts a step-by-step guide so initiation is made as painless as possible.

It's the mixture of excellent graphics and strategy which makes *Tower of Babel* a success, and if you combine this with no luck-factor involved, only sheer determined logic, then you have yourself a challenging and addictive game.

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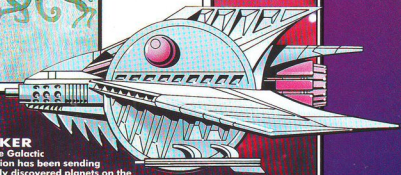

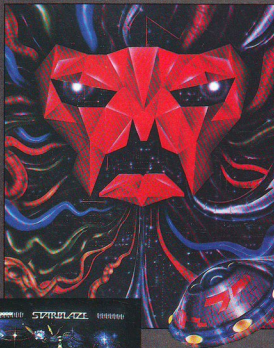

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The Hound of Shadow has arrived – and he brings death and destruction to all who bear his mark. Will you fall prey to his fangs and claws, or defeat that hideous hound of hell?

Before play begins you must create your character. Space is short (see last month's preview for more details): suffice to say that you choose sex, nationality and occupation, and decide which skills you will specialise in. Once your character is completed you go off to a little seance with a friend, who's the same sex as your character and will be around to help you through most of the game.

At the seance you meet several people, some of whom have a greater part to play in the adventure later. The Adept Karmi conducts the seance, and if you have a smidgen of occult knowledge you soon realise this Karmi character is a fraud.

Later in the seance, however, there's a weird occurrence that's enough to give anyone the shakes. The Karmi speaks with a woman's voice and glares at everyone at the table.

Finally his gaze falls upon a young gentleman next to you and the Karmi informs him that the Hound of Shadow is upon him and he bears his mark, sorry and all that, nothing personal but there it is.

After the excitement of the seance everyone goes their separate ways and the plot slowly begins to unravel. The early stages of the adventure are very restricted, and you are more or less guided through.

Gradually you start to discover bits of information you can act upon. As time passes events continue to unfold and if you waste too

much time you could miss out on the plot altogether.

There is one area in which *Hound of Shadow* falls down very badly: parsing. It seems to have a very limited vocabulary and only a vague grasp of the English language (about as little as your aver-

age staff writer).

The most irritating thing to encounter in any adventure is the message "You can't do that," and *Hound of Shadow* manages to utter that phrase with great regularity, thus spoiling the game and bringing you out of the fantasy

world and into the world of man versus machine.

More time should have been spent on the passing of commands to make it friendlier to the adventurer.



EFFECTS

You can forget about sound in *Hound of Shadow* – there ain't none. Important locations are depicted graphically and are of a generally high quality. Text is, strictly speaking, nothing to do with the graphics of a game, but adventures rely on text to create the world around you. Descriptions here are both lengthy and atmospheric, creating the link between you and the computerised world.

VERDICT

Hound of Shadow is described by Electronic Arts as a role playing game, but I would tend to compare it more to an adventure. There are role-playing elements, but most of the game plays like a conventional graphical adventure. What does make it different, however, is the way your character develops as a result of outside influences, such as phobias. Other than its poor parser it's an excellent game that should give you plenty of sleepless nights: when you're not up playing it, will be on your mind...

That's the trouble with being a robot. Nobody ever listens to you. After all, when you're trapped inside a space station suffering from the ravages of green aliens, and nobody else wants to lend a hand, what do you do? Split into three parts and try doing it yourself – that's one way to solve staff shortages!

You're inside a four-deck space station and an alien spacecraft has

decided to attach itself to deck A. These green beasts are running loose inside the space station and you have to repair the damage they're causing whilst avoiding getting zapped – an activity which sends your energy levels tumbling dangerously.

Equipment lockers are set into the walls of each control deck and hold various equipment. To use something you must first pick it up,

but while the arm droid can hold four objects, the head only holds two and the legs hold none at all. Equipment is important because it's only by assembling the pieces of hardware that you can repair the station.

From a control panel, you select the droid to control. A power indicator keeps you informed of the strength of each droid. This is important because by colliding with walls or firing at the green aliens, the droid gradually runs low on power. This is restored by stopping off for a refill at a power-outlet.

A panel menu is provided and here you have access to essential utilities. The most complex of these, but also the most useful, is the droid programming routine. Here, you select where the droid should go and what it should do – and actions can even include refuelling. This is achieved by writing a small program, either executed immediately or stored for later use.

To find out what needs repair, you direct the droid to the required wall unit and press fire. If repairs are needed, you'll be informed and given the chance to carry out what's required, providing you're

holding the right equipment. Only the arm section can make repairs, however.

EFFECTS

There are no massive sprites in *First Contact* but those that do make an appearance are carefully animated so that the movement of each is very smooth. In fact one of the game's great strengths is the way that the droids move – some parts swing, others shuffle. The backdrops and, in particular, the wall panels are very detailed but this is necessary if you want to know the operations of the panel without selecting to read information about it.

Your droid moves in four directions, but instead of the display scrolling with you, it flicks instead between one screen and another. For example, as you get to the top of the screen, a new backdrop suddenly appears and you're down the bottom. This can be frustrating, since your eye is forced to shift around the screen, but it's surprising how quickly you grow to enjoy it.

The sound is unspectacular, merely using the ST's sound chip for average spot effects.

VERDICT

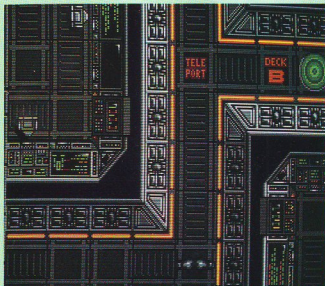
As you hold down on the stick to move in any direction, the droid lurches forward, going faster and faster. It takes a while learning to stop it at the correct wall panel because pulling down switches its direction but not, for a while, its speed.

With green aliens and an unusual method of movement you expect *First Contact* to be all action – until messages start appearing to let you know what needs fixing. This makes for a strange concoction. Attempting to bridge two different genres, it ultimately appeals to neither strategists nor to action lovers.

There are some clever effects, but they still don't amount to a particularly good game. The movement is fun and the lack of traditional scrolling is a welcome change, but the idea of looking for parts quickly becomes tedious.

A promising action game has been wasted on mediocre strategy.

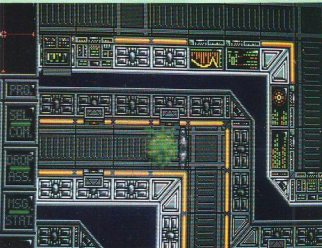

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Leather is back with a vengeance, as that permanent germ-free of the wall adolescent Michael Jackson roams four levels squashing bad guys and generally making a better and cleaner world for the children everywhere. The film was a baad (as in terrible) excuse for stringing together one video track after another, so coming up with some kind of valid plot for a computer game was always going to be difficult.

The first level provides an overhead view of the pale one as he careers around the studios, avoiding being mobbed to death by his crazed fans. The second is in similar vein, except that by collecting lucky orbs you can become various vehicles (whacko, huh?) which enable you to access special areas of the map.

The third and fourth levels switch to a horizontally-scrolling scenario where His Royal Oddness can really let rip with sub-machine guns and lasers. Here, the purpose is to blast away the Stormtroopers with all the firepower you can muster.

Michael is controlled with the joystick: in the first two levels he walks until you hold down on the fire button, then he breaks into a run. Running comes in handy, especially when you need to dodge all those pesky fans, but being an ethereal kind of a chap you can't keep up the running for long. There are places scattered around the map where the fans never go and you can stop for a rest but these aren't highlighted - it's a matter of guesswork.

If you do get caught by your fans (ow!) you part with one of your Platinum Disks. MJ would probably feel more like walloping the crazed youngsters, but one of the restrictions imposed on the game by The Man Himself was that he shouldn't be too macho.

In level one the idea is to find the various pieces of the rabbit suit (what is this guy on?). With each piece you collect, the graphic of MJ down one side of the playing area is gradually dressed in the suit.

To find the six sections you need to move across the entire map, but once you've worked out where they all are, they'll always be in the same place each time so it's not going to be a problem getting past this section again.

Level two sees MJ collecting green orbs which first change him into a car and then into a boat. Collecting the orbs is a strategic task, because the moment you change into the car you have only a short

counter the worldwide threat of narcotics by running over the packets of drugs he leaves behind with your motorbike.

It's on this level that you encounter your first Stormtrooper: squash him with your bike, too, because if you don't get him he'll get you for sure. Since you're on a bike there's no need to worry about two speeds - the bike travels fast all the time, making it

much easier to mow down Stormtroopers and escape those wretched fans.

The third level, where the action switches to a horizontally-scrolling Club 30s, is the most visually impressive scene - excluding the detailed introduction sequences. Here you can go in for some serious blasting, because the objective is to wipe out all the Stormtroopers hiding upstairs.

Your first duty is to pick up the gun and go searching for a magazine cartridge so that you have the ammo to fight back. These cartridges don't last for long, however, so it's important to find others quickly. When you've got the gun, moving around causes the gun sights to shift across the screen. Whenever the Stormtroopers appear on the balcony you must blast them before they can blast you.

Without giving away the plot behind the final level, I can say that it's another horizontally scrolling section, in which MJ, attacked by a giant laser gun, has to change into an automaton.

EFFECTS

Animated intro sequences between each level are superb. They've all been digitised directly from video, so they're accurate in every detail. Sound on the ST version is unfortunately limited to the sound chip, so there's no sampled effects taken from the video.

Four-way scrolling in the first

two levels is very fast, although the overhead view of MJ and his fans becomes annoying after a while. For one thing, it makes it difficult to distinguish enemies from fans.

It's not until you get to the third level that the graphics really take off. Suddenly you're greeted by a large sprite of MJ and some brilliantly detailed graphics that are a huge improvement on the previous levels.

Speedy animation is maintained throughout all the levels so that each one is addictive, challenging and, most important of all, very playable.

VERDICT

With carparks full of driving games due out for Christmas, finding anything with a spark of originality is going to be difficult. Moonwalker has the distinction of being different from everything else on the market.

The overhead display is confusing at first, but once you get over this hurdle you have a great game. The first two levels would

improve enormously if you could simply whip out a gun and blast all those fans to bits, especially since that's often exactly what you feel like doing. Instead, you have to try and dodge them, which is very annoying and occasionally impossible.

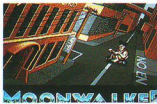
The first two levels of Moonwalker are decent enough, though the sprites – seen from overhead – are so small you sometimes wonder if this is a 16 bit game. In no way do they prepare you for the superb graphics in the third and fourth levels, which on their own would be worth the price of the game.

In any action game what matters most is how playable and addictive it is: will you be unable to tear yourself away from the screen even when it's way past midnight? In this respect Moonwalker certainly delivers the goods. Combine this with the massive variations between levels and you're always inspired to delve further and further into the game.

Day of the Pharaoh has superb graphics all the way through: here you get to choose a wife. Personally I'd go for Sit, if only because she's the only one whose name I'd be able to pronounce! (I wonder if Eymis would be shortened to 'Ey!'?)

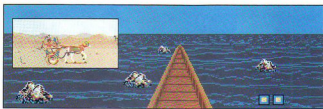

Upon the death of the Pharaoh, the evil god Seth commanded that all heirs of the Pharaoh be executed. Amn-Re, the sun god, saw the murders and saved one young heir – the part you play – from drowning in the Nile. Workers living on the banks of the Nile raised the rescued boy as one of their own. Now it is time to regain what is rightfully yours: to help you have a little money and a ship.

To build your finances you put on your trading hat and set sail for distant ports – controlling the rudder of your vessel as you move. But be careful! The waters of the Nile are treacherous and you must navigate through the rocks with care. If you crash three times you'll lose your ship and cargo. Don't worry, though, because more ships can be built, provided you have suf-

ficient materials.

If you want war you can have it. The game then switches to horizontally scrollin' landscape. Standing in a chariot, you shoot arrows at the enemy and do what you can to avoid their spears. Kill all your foes and victory is yours. Lose your three chariots and it's time to drink the embalming fluid and lie down in a big metal box.

There are also options to allow you to pray to the gods, build your

self a harem and construct buildings. If you're feeling lucky (punk) you can always wager your ship's cargo in a camel race. It's risky, but can be very profitable.

EFFECTS

The graphics are superb and look like they're written on parchment. Animation of the ship and chariot is rudimentary, but sufficient. Sound effects are feeble and the tune on the menu screen sounds more like

a mediaeval fanfare than anything from Ancient Egypt.

VERDICT

Day of the Pharaoh's roots are buried deep in the history of the computer games industry but it's more sophisticated than its Kingdom and Empire ancestors and it has some entertaining arcade style sequences. Becoming a Pharaoh is a long term task and although you'll find it interesting trying, it's repetitive as well.

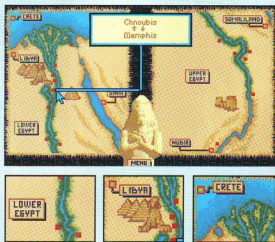

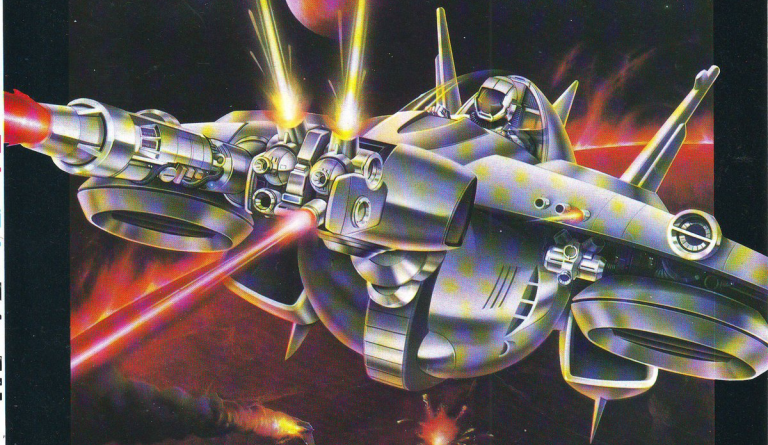

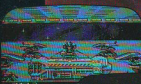

If you have a fondness for green dragons you'd best steer well clear of this one, because the whole idea is to search out everything that breathes fire and kill 'em. You play the game in a strange world where dragons rule the roost.

Your goal is to find eight special stones which belong to the dragons. You must take these to the centre of the island where the plot is being played, and call up the Primordial Dragon in a scene somewhat reminiscent of a day out at Stonehenge for the druids.

Quest for the Time Bird was the last adventure from Infogrames, but with this latest release, it's back to fantasy land. *Empire's Sleeping Gods Lie* hasn't exactly taken the world by storm, so why should *Drakkhen*, making the same 3D boasts, be any different?

To collect the special stones you need to wipe out the dragon holding them and claim the stone located in its forehead. If you thought dragons were sexless beasts, forget it: according to the French programmers, there are good and bad dragons, male and

female. The Dragon Princess is the most powerful of them all, but you only meet her towards the end of the adventure.

The island is divided into four different zones. There are two dragons allocated to each of these – one male, one female, some good, some bad. Within each zone are two palaces and two princes, again with some good and others bad.

Confused yet? This might all sound very daunting, but it's important because each palace possesses its own mysteries and plots as well as an endless variety of monsters, tricks and traps all designed to keep the eight stones out of your grasp for as long as possible.

As if all this weren't enough, there's a time limit involved as well. The earth is being racked by earthquakes and volcanic activity which gets worse as the days go by. In a few months the earth is due to snuff it – and you go along for the ride.

As with any decent RPG, the game begins by giving you the opportunity to select the characters you want to use.

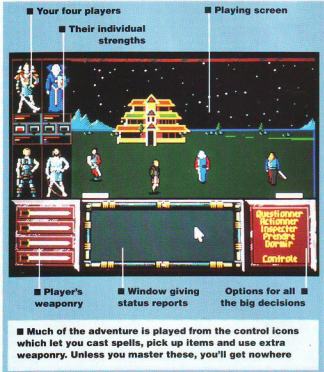
After choosing whether to play a male or female character, you describe each team member as thief, warrior, priest, magician or

necromancer. This option allows you to dictate the areas where your team members will be strongest, and by creating a good cross-section of strengths and skills you can increase the likelihood of surviving at least as far as the first dragon.

To allocate the attributes you're given a list of five random strength numbers (values between 1 and 20) and you must drag them over the five attributes that you need to specify. Force, dexterity, intelligence, resistance and instruction all need to be entered for every team member. After this, you must enter the weaponry that each of them will possess during the adventure, and the results are then saved to disk for playing future games.

With this done, you're through to the main playing screen which is where things really start happening. To move your team of four characters across the landscape you use a standard point-and-click method, choosing first the character to move and then the portion of the screen where they should go. There is a vast number of places which require your attention – from hotels and inns to darkened dungeons.

Travelling is frequently interrupted by giant dragons which leap

up out of the ground or come at you from a distance. These are best destroyed by casting spells; but first you have to find a spell. Depending on the way you choose to attack the dragon and the weaponry you use, you can click on icons which respond by animating your attack.

For most purposes there seems little point in having four team members to direct, but you realise how important they are when you come across large buildings. Generally, it's best to move the team around together, but when you want to search the rooms of a house, you can split them up so that they wander off alone. Four team members also have their benefits when it comes to defeating the monsters. Either you can link up together and fire more ammunition or you can sacrifice a team member with an up close intense attack. Only when all members of your team are dead does the game close.

At any time, you can call up an inventory of the objects being held by team members. This is helpful since it gives an indication of the strengths of different characters.

Along the way other obstacles present themselves and the only way to get around these is either to use spells or to make the most of items that you collected on your journey. Because it's not always obvious which items to use when, a limited amount of help is provided in the game book. Here, certain poems and sentences will help

you to master the Drakkhen island. There are also additional clues located in places such as camps and inns.

EFFECTS

As you wander around the landscapes, large fiery dragons leap out of the ground to attack you. Although these images look very impressive, compared to the background, they're often very out of place. Most of this has to do with the look of the game - grass is represented by solid slabs of green and there are no lines of gradation in the sky; consequently the detail of the monsters leaps out.

This doesn't follow for many of the interior scenes, particularly when you start to wander around the dungeons. These often have animated sequences which might not make much of a contribution to the gameplay but certainly liven up the action.

For an adventure game, a surprising amount of attention has been paid to animation. Whenever you move the characters, they are seen to walk rather than shuffle. They also have a different sprite depending on the weapon being held at the time, which is always a good sign.

In the version we reviewed there was no sound: Infogrames say spot effects using the ST sound chip will be added before final release.

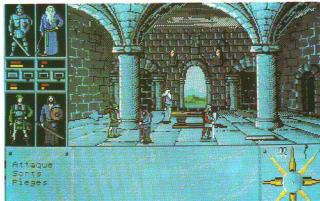

Sleeping Gods Lie because it didn't fall into any readily identifiable category - it was neither a true adventure nor an action game. Infogrames are likely to suffer the same problems.

This doesn't mean *Drakkhen* is another *Sleeping Gods*, though. For a start the graphics are more impressive, and it doesn't have the same kind of 3D playing area.

In *Drakkhen* you don't feel free to wander at will. 3D in this game means you can walk in front and behind objects - not nearly as exciting as *Sleeping Gods*. Nevertheless, control over four characters at once certainly makes it more unusual to play. This is important in a game where the 3D environment has to be backed up by extra features and quality graphics.

The adventure itself sounds very contrived and the fantasy scenario has surely been clubbed to death by now. But once you start playing, it's surprising how addictive your search through rooms and camps becomes. But will the point-and-click environment appeal to enough people? *Drakkhen* is neither a great RPG nor a good action game. It derives its strengths and weaknesses from a mixture of both.

Future Wars explores the paradox of Time. Aliens and humans are brought together in a search for bombs, which if successful, will save the world. The mixture of Time and aliens isn't exactly original – but in *Future Wars* it is relevant to the storyline.

Aliens want to colonise the Earth, but we've managed to develop our SDI project to such a degree that they can't get anywhere near us without being zapped to hell. (Aliens I can believe – but a working SDI? Come off it!)

In response they've come up with an alternative plan. They've travelled through time and planted fiendish bombs. The bombs are placed in Medieval, Prehistoric and Future ages and you must explore each of these territories if you're going to make the world a habitable place.

At the beginning you disguise yourself as a window-cleaner to gain access to a tower block – and hopefully discover the aliens' secret plans.

The environment uses the mouse: click left to move; click right and you bring up a set of commands that offer special effects – EXAMINE, TAKE, INVENTORY, USE, OPERATE and SPEAK.

EXAMINE provides a detailed explanation of the area of the map you select. To examine something, you need to move the hero as close to the object as possible. It's annoying when you're forced to move directly in front of it and can no longer even see what you're supposed to be examining! It's best to examine just about everything in each scene, because it's easy to miss something and missing a single useful object can impede further progress.

If an object is important, EXAMINE calls up an additional graphic that gives extra control. When you want to move the scaffolding supporting the window-cleaner, for example, you have to examine it first, which brings up a display of the operating buttons. You are offered two options – one arrow which moves the scaffolding up and the other which brings it down. This is not a lot of use because the only way into the building is up!

TAKE enables you to pick up objects, but again you need to be very close. Unlike other games, you can hold as many items as you wish – but as you use them to solve problems, they disappear forever.

The INVENTORY command displays a list of the items you're carrying, while USE calls up a list of

the items held in your inventory. Select one and you're told whether that item is of use to you at that particular moment.

OPERATE lets you use items you're not holding. You could use OPERATE to switch on a tap, say, open the windows and even move the scaffolding which your window-cleaner is using.

Finally, there's SPEAK, essential if you're going to progress far. Click on it and you can converse with someone. This isn't very productive in itself, but by talking to others you may gain useful information to help you when problems become too tricky.

The game demands imagination from the player even to get from one room to another. The moment you get inside the first office, for example, you're confronted with the problem of how to get through to the next one. If you try opening the door, your boss comes out of another door and kicks you out of the building. The only way to survive is to find a plastic bucket, fill it with water and put it over the second door. Now when you try and get through to the next office, your boss comes out of the other door and is drenched – giv-

ing you the chance to get through without being stopped and wet yourself laughing.

EFFECTS

Visuals aren't usually important in an adventure game, but they're essential here. You need to inspect everything in each scene, and if you can't distinguish what it is then you're going to have problems. Fortunately the graphics are brilliant and there's no problem in this department.

Play takes place against a static screen with a limited amount of animation overlaid. This includes the hero walking when you click the left mouse button, and a few humorous special effects.

Sound is impressive – Delphine are shortly releasing a CD of all the tracks used in the game. (Richard Clayderman is in their books, but fortunately they didn't book him to do the soundtrack!)

VERDICT

Delphine have tried hard to make the adventure environment of *Future Wars* as detailed as possible. They've achieved this largely by copying the style of the Sierra On-Line games currently available

through Activision. But this isn't a rip-off, since there's much more to *Future Wars* than pretty graphics.

You're given freedom to explore every nook and cranny in a room, every bush and every tree – you can even peer down the toilet if you're into that sort of thing. This gives the game great "depth," as it were, and makes it immensely addictive once you're familiar with this kind of environment.

It can also make it immensely complicated. The problems are hard – and I mean very hard. Unless you scour every scene thoroughly they're downright impossible – and searching doesn't end with just a peek through all the cupboards: there can even be tiny items under the carpet. Even when you find all the objects you need, things don't suddenly become easy: knowing what to do with the objects you've accumulated is a massive problem in itself.

Future Wars has enormous appeal for avid adventure fans who are after a game that takes longer than ten seconds to solve. Combine this with its brilliant graphics, and the point/click environment and you have one hell of a game for the adventure pro.

Star Command is set in the familiar territory of a space nation under threat. The aliens are bug-eyed and green, the ships jump through hyperspace and lasers rule the roost. You build a team from everyday people in the street, examining their abilities and choosing a profession for them – pilot, soldier, marine or esper. Then it's off to college for eight years to learn the subtle art of meeting interesting alien life forms and killing them. After the training, your skilled, though still green, warriors are sent on their first mission. But before the off, there are a few basic necessities that may come in handy. Such as a ship.

Now Star Command is safe in its rulers' hands because you have to buy all your own kit in order to kill someone else's enemies! The cutbacks mean the lump sum you're given to buy your toys is pitiful. There's all these state of the art mega-death devices down the arms-dealing supermarket, but all you can afford first time round is a set of second-hand space age peashooters.

The missions follow instructions to explore an area of the galaxy and look for/bring back/do something. So off you zip from Starport Luna and head into the wild black yonder. Occasionally inter-ship combat develops when the unidentified ships you meet

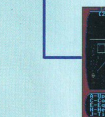

aren't entirely convinced by your deity impersonations and demands for fuel. This is a slow business, as you creep around popping shots at each other.

Once you've arrived planet side, you fly the drop ship down to terra firma for the real action. This is where the game promises to deliver; "realistically" representing future wars. But gung ho it ain't, as the fighting totally lacks any pace

whatsoever, again laboriously controlled by vague text displays.

EFFECTS

The word for Star Command: ponderous. A standard role-playing game, all its options are text driven, with choices displayed on various menus and sub-lists. Switching between menus must be fast and smooth to stop the game being weighed down by continual

disk access and pointless questions, but this is not the case with Star Command. The menus are plentiful, but the choices few. This would be forgivable if your actions were dramatically enacted. Yet the graphics are woefully inadequate: stick men, of all things, represent your team when planet side! There are some beautiful representations of space stations, but these are purely cosmetic and add nothing to the game itself.

VERDICT

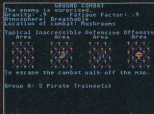
A vast role-playing adventure with varied tasks and challenges this may be. But it's too slow and too cumbersome to be worth the effort to find out. The crime of which some ST games are accused is exceptional graphics with insufficient gameplay. This is not the case for Star Command, as there are hardly any graphics and the gameplay is tedious and overly complex. The strategy elements remain unhelpful due to a lack of explanation in the manual, while the role-playing fragments the game, with everything having to be done eight times, not once.

Star Command is not a game the first time role player could enjoy without suffering long hours of frustration as squads are repeatedly wiped out. The experienced role-player on the other hand would find the limitations of the text driven "adventure" unbearable. If this is "living" science fiction I'll take the present anyway.

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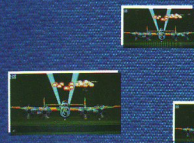
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There are flight sims, the F15s and Falcons of this world, that are immensely complicated, with an initial interest rating somewhere down in single figures and a long term one up in the 90s. Try loading one of these and see how far you get without the manual, chum. Great if you have a transpotter mentality, but not exactly thrill a minute.

There is the frenetic arcade action of *Thunderblade* and *Afterburner*, all excitement and trigger finger ache. The most fun you can have with your clothes on, sure, but hardly Mensa material. You could train a monkey to play these, if it had the patience.

And in the middle there is *Lancaster*: thrills, spills and not a cardboard keyboard template in sight. In this WWII flying ace setting you're the gunner, bearing a heavy responsibility: keep those nasty Bosch off your pilot's back while he reaches his objective. Then it's a quick change of uniform and down into the loading bay to act as a target spotter for the bombing raid ('scuse lack of authentic flying lingo, by the way).

Begin by choosing your options, setting the conditions – and therefore the level of difficulty – as tough as you feel you can take. Complete novice? Opt for instructions, automatic targeting, practice mode, safety belt and regular stops for cocoa and a lie down. Then, as you become mission-hardened you can opt for less

hand-holding and more in the way of stomach-churning, wrist-aching, mindblowing, breathtaking action.

Now choose your pilot from the three available – pilots Pennington, Thompson and Jennings. The missions you fly depend on their age and experience, so you'd be well advised to begin with Thompson and work your way up through the ranks.

Time to take to the air, as a rather neat animated sequence shows you and those other magnificent men climbing into your flying

Yet overall there's more than enough to convince you, in a darkened room and with the sound up, that you really are living dangerously four decades ago over Germany.

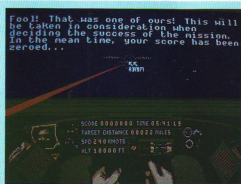

Sega's scrolling beat 'n' shoot 'em up appeared in the arcades 18 months ago, boasting little more than large sprites, parallax scrolling and fairly average Rolling Thunder-style gameplay. Still, this didn't stop it from becoming a real favourite with arcade goers everywhere.

Master of the Ninjutsu, Masashi, is called upon to rescue kidnapped children from the inevitable group of despicable warlords and their violent entourage. The action takes place against a series of urban backdrops. The Ninja starts his mission armed with an unlimited supply of Shuriken stars with which to despatch long-distance assailants. When in close quarters, combat automatically switches to hand-to-hand, where Masashi unleashes punches kicks or lashes out with any hand weapons collected along the way.

The kiddy hostages are liberated simply by walking into them, at which point either a bonus score, extra weapon or Ninja magic is revealed. This magic – a sort of oriental smart-bomb – can be activated with a flick of the

space bar, whereupon dozens of Masashi sprites whizz around the screen, clearing the scene of enemies.

Each level consists of several stages, all of which must be cleared of kiddies within a time limit before Masashi is allowed access to the next. The last stage of each level provides a showdown with one of the five overlord bosses, taking the shape of a huge armoured Samurai, massive helicopter gunship, animated statues, another Samurai (even tougher than the first one) and an assortment of Masked Ninjas. These end-of-level guardians must be conquered before continuing with the mission, and considering the relative ease with which the earlier stages are mastered, can prove

frustratingly tricky to beat.

An intervening bonus round sees the display switch to a first-person perspective, where Masashi's Shuriken-throwing talents are required to defeat an advancing horde of enemy Ninja. Total success is rewarded with an extra life to add to Masashi's initial store of three.

EFFECTS

Gone are the smooth parallax scrolling and fast-moving detailed sprites of the original coin-op. The sceneries are recognisable from Sega's version, but jerk rather than scroll. Masashi's enemies hobble along in a most peculiar fashion and are far less threatening – visually and physically – than their arcade originals: they're large, but

drab and poorly animated.

A reasonable rendition of the coin-op soundtrack burbles along in the background, but sound effects are weak and all the better for their scarcity.

VERDICT

Timid action, shallow gameplay, annoying disk access and average audio-visuals do not make *Shinobi* an immediately endearing proposition. The game's visual and technical deficiencies would have been forgivable a year ago, but ST owners now expect a bit more polish for their notes. If you're willing to put up with its drawbacks, *Shinobi* does provide a challenge of sorts, and is (amazingly enough) moderately addictive. If you're not a great fan of the coin-op and don't have money to burn, though, forget it.

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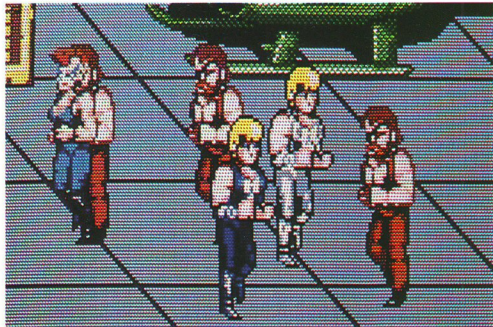

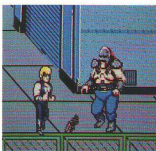
Double Dragon the first had two things in its favour as a good old fashioned kick-em-up: two player action and a variety of weapons. Simultaneous two player games aren't that uncommon, but *Double Dragon* had something that most didn't – you could beat up the other player!

But surely, you might say, you have enough problems fighting your enemies, never mind your friends? Maybe so, but it did make the game more fun and if you got annoyed you could take it out on your computerised ally rather than belting your friend around the head with your ST.

Being able to pick up weapons was an added bonus – it allowed you to give the bad guys a taste of their own medicine.

You'll be glad to know that both of these features have been carried over into the sequel – *Double Dragon II*.

The action begins immediately with you pitted against the first of many foes on your quest to fulfil five missions of progressive diffi-

culty.

Your foes come in many shapes and sizes – with some very hefty adversaries towards the end of the levels. The three most common thugs that you'll meet are Patch, the acrobat and the girl.

Patch is the toughest of the tough and is pretty useful (if not very pretty) with his feet. The acrobat somersaults around the screen and is of medium strength. And of course you have to watch out for the girl.

Your first real opponent is the

big thug in the middle of mission one – he must be about nine feet tall! When he puts his size 12 boot in your ribs you certainly know it. Later on you meet a sumo wrestler in armour who has personality problems and a nasty tendency of picking you up and pummeling you without mercy. One guy that really takes some beating is the man in green on the fourth level – he knows what he's doing and will have you eating dust faster than you can say "Oh, you seem to have beaten me to a pulp."

And that's all – you beat your way through a horde of tough guys with only your wits and reactions to save you from a hideous death.

EFFECTS

Each level is made up of many detailed and colourful backgrounds which scroll as you progress through the game. The sprites are huge and as beautifully drawn as the backgrounds. Animation leaves a little to be desired – but the general appearance and presentation is very good. Sound effects are done well – especially the groans

and yells when someone dies. The thud of flesh against flesh sounds solid too. Music is tolerable, but nothing to dance about.

VERDICT

Double Dragon II is a great game to while away an hour or so, but it suffers from the same deficiency as its predecessor – it's too easy to complete. The problem lies in credits – you have five credits to complete the game with, which is effectively 15 lives.

Credits work fine in the arcades – people have to put in more cash to complete the game and so the arcade makes more money. Computer games are bought though, and they can be played forever without paying another penny. If it costs you nothing to play then you can continue for hours and become an expert. Completing a game on the day that you buy it means you've wasted a lot of money.

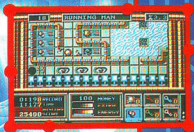
That said, *Double Dragon II* is great fun as a two player game, because it calls for co-operation and sharing of weapons to get anywhere. The problem lies in the one player game, in which you have only hordes of bad guys to smash into the ground and more lives up your sleeve than the proverbial cat.

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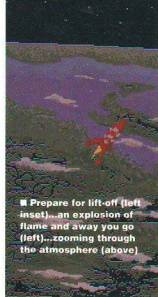
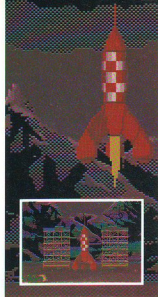

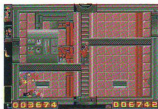

In his first adventure Snowy boldly goes where no dog has gone before – to the moon. Tintin tags along for a laugh and brings Captain Haddock, Professor Calculus and engineer Wolf too.

Before the game begins there's an impressive cartoon-like launch sequence in which you see Tintin and crew approach the rocket in a car. Then there's the final countdown followed by BLAST OFF.

Your journey to the moon is split into stages. First you guide your rocket through a meteorite storm. Avoid the rocks and collect the red and yellow globes. Eight red globes must be collected to take you to the next stage; the yellow ones build up your energy. Run out of energy and you drift around in space for eternity.

In the next stage Colonel Boris has somehow managed to stow-away on the ship and is determined to destroy it. This is a bit silly, when he'll die too, but that's loonies for you, I suppose! To reach the next stage you must satisfy four conditions: capture Colonel Boris, put out all the fires, free your companions and disarm the bombs.

Disarming bombs and freeing your companions is simple to do – you just have to touch the bomb or

person. Fires are put out by giving them a quick squirt with an extinguisher – assuming that you've found the extinguisher of course. If it's out of puff then you'll have to find another one. Capturing Colonel

Boris is a matter of spraying him with the extinguisher or jumping him from behind.

When you reach the moon you control the rocket for a lunar landing. Watch the surface draw closer

as you prepare to touch down. After a brief rest it's time to take off and head back to planet earth again.

EFFECTS

Infogrames has a good reputation for graphics and Tintin is no exception. The opening sequence is excellent and proves that you can indeed get cartoon style graphics out of your ST. The in-game graphics are still very good and Tintin and co are beautifully animated.

Soundwise there's a few good effects, but these are in the opening sequence as well. In-game effects are alright, but nothing spectacular.

VERDICT

Tintin is a combination of dodge-the-asteroids and a platform game – and they combine surprisingly well.

It's frustrating when you run out of energy if there's a red blob in sight, but that's just a fact of death. The platform game is hard work; the closer you get to the moon the meaner it gets. But the two types of game become repetitive, with difficulty being the only variable. Nice opener, shame about the game. Lets hope they do better with any subsequent Tintin games.

BEHIND THE SCENES

The Tintin licence was acquired from Castelman (the publishers of the book) just over a year ago. Castelman insisted on seeing the game at various points and made changes to it so that it would resemble the comic book as much as possible.

One part which came under their scrutiny was the space scene at the start. Infogrames wanted to insert a second rocket so that the game would be more playable but Castelman wouldn't have it. Infogrames hit the same problem when they tried putting a second

character in the rocket with Boris.

This version of Tintin is the second one to have been programmed. Preliminary versions of the first were

shown to select members of the French press who said that if Infogrames released the game, they would trash it.

As a result, Infogrames went back to the drawing board and looked at writing a new

version. This is what you see in front of you.

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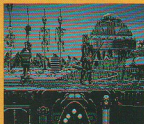
Strange, don't you think, how the mysteries of time travel continue to fascinate game designers? The theme crops up yet again in this release from the French-based Titus - previously renowned for *Crazy Cars II*, which was more concerned with travel against time than in it.

You play a knight wandering through different time phases in search of a beautiful princess (you never see her, so for all you know she could have the grace and beauty of Paul Daniels). Along the way you use your trusty sword to wipe out the bad guys.

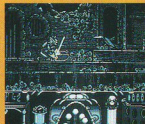
You can visit five different time phases: Pre-History; a distant time in Versailles (well, it is a French game); present-day New York; the future; and a mystical age.

The enemies you encounter are specific to each time period and to overcome them you must employ certain fighting techniques, learnt through trial and error.

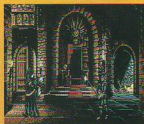
The knight is controlled using joystick combinations. You can



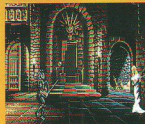

time travelling option appears, giving you the chance to deny all rational laws of chronology.

EFFECTS

It's the graphics which make *Knight Force* special. The size of the animated sprites is amazing, although they're not as bright and colourful as they might be.

There aren't many frames of animation in between each movement to keep the action smooth, which is unfortunate because with a little more care we might have seen a graphically superb game.

Sound consists solely of monotonous spot effects each time you use your sword. These are nothing to scream about, though Titus have indicated that they'll be making slight alterations to the effects before release.

VERDICT

There's a lot which stands *Knight Force* in good stead. The graphics are impressive and well-defined - the sheer size of the main charac-

make him run, jump, crouch or stamp without holding down the fire button. Pressing the fire button makes him attack.

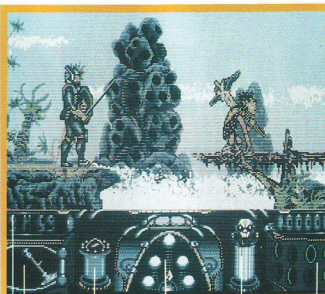
Depending on how you move the joystick, he uses the sword to thrust forward, swipe or protect himself with the shield. These combinations are logical and it takes little time to learn the techniques.

The game would be just another slay-em-up if it weren't for a handful of useful amulets. On each level there are one or more of these - but only one of them will be related to the period you're exploring. It's important to pick them all up because they can be used when you shift time.

An amulet appears whenever you destroy the enemy holding it, and they're important because you can't progress through time without them.

The aim on each level is to defeat the merry sorcerer who lives in the castle. One of the biggest problems is how to find your way inside - essential if you want to hack the sorcerer into lots of little pieces.

Once the game begins the only way to move between levels is to find the magic bird and thrust your sword through its heart. Then the

ter is appealing. Add to this the amulets, the magic bird and an intriguing time element and you have something fun to play - at least for a while.

Since you can select the initial time period, instead of progressing successively through each level, *Knight Force* is very exciting to play for the first time. It becomes tedious once the delight in graphics wears off.

The knight can be frustrating if he doesn't respond to the joystick the instant you touch it, especially if you're trying to make split-second accurate assaults on enemies.

If *Knight Force* had come out two months earlier, the size of the sprites and the gameplay would have made it original; but following so closely on the heels of *Altered Beast* has dampened its impact.

Only for the dedicated slay-em-up fan.

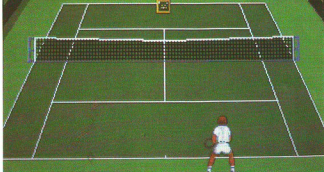

Pro Tennis Tour features excellent 3-D fast colour graphics, smooth animation, sexy sounds and digitised speech – transgress the

white lines and you're regaled with a bellowed "Out!"

Unfortunately for McEnroe fans there's no opportunity, to indulge in tantrums and contest umpire's decisions.

Players move with agility and grace and the ball is easy to track across the court. If you don't make



a return then check your joystick twiddling – jerky animation is not an excuse in this game.

Sound is merely droning elevator musak, but a tweak of the volume control provides blissful release. There's lots of quality spot effects which enhance the game and add to the sense of "being there."

VERDICT

Well programmed, splendidly decorated, *Pro Tennis Tour* is addictive and fun to play. You may experience a certain frustration in the opening games as you fumble easy ball returns, run to the wrong side of the court and generally misjudge everything, but a little application will soon have you rallying with the best of them. And besides, if you don't have to try, it ain't much fun, right?

Instant appeal for those whose sole existence is dedicated to the manipulation of little hairy green balls, but non-tennis fans will also become devoted to the cross court carnage.

A myriad of green and scaly creatures appear from cracks in

the floor and ceiling, from behind doors and out of cupboards and although they're definitely green and certainly scaly, little else can be said of them.

There's a feeling of *deja vu* – and that isn't good for a game

already struggling to escape the bulging mass of similar games.

A nice effect is that you and a friend can appear in the game at the same time via split screens and attack each other as well as the Xenos.

Sound is consistent and fairly well implemented but nothing to write home to Ma about, comprising the usual stirring soundtrack into leading to a multitude of gunfire and death rattle spot effects.

VERDICT

Animation is smooth, joystick control responsive, and although the game isn't going to win any prizes, it may well enjoy a little more than the statutory 15 minutes of fame.

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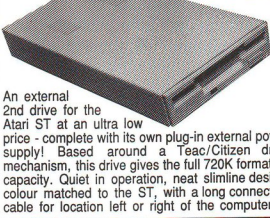
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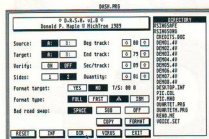

Yet another utility to add to Microdeal's impressive range. While DASH - duplicating and security handler - doesn't offer anything innovative, it combines all the elements necessary for rapid disk copying and formatting in one very small program.

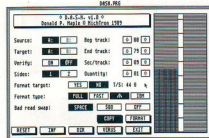
Yes, DASH does copy disks - but not the protected variety. In the light of recent copyright laws, it's just as well. Instead, DASH allows you to copy standard ST, 10 sector ST and IBM disks.

Exactly what is copied, and how it is copied, depends on a variety of settings: number of sides, number of tracks, sectors per track. Up to 83 tracks can be copied - well past the 80-track limit of many Atari disk drives.

The copying process is displayed both graphically and numerically on the main work screen.

It's possible to select format with copy, something current versions of TOS (that is, versions below 1.4) can't do. If the memory available is insufficient to contain all the disk data, several passes will be made.

Each disk is automatically checked for the presence of a possible boot virus. If found, the virus can be deleted before proceeding.

MINIMUM DAMAGE

GEM refuses to copy damaged disks - not DASH, however. Data on damaged disks is lost, of course, when Microdeal's program attempts to copy it, but the data is replaced with spaces,

HIGH SPEED SAFETY

Microdeal's DASH is the fastest utility around - but not the only one, as ST Format discovers

binary zeros or 255. Which value appears in the damaged sectors depends on you.

DASH's ability to fill damaged disks with spaces or zeros is extremely useful. For example, an ASCII file has a damaged sector lying in the middle of the data. Normally you'd lose the data completely as GEM would not be able to access the file. DASH, however, will replace the bad sectors with whatever you want. In this way you can get at the text file. While you'll lose some data, most of the file will still be intact.

The Full formatting option lets you format a disk in much the same way as GEM - although other options allow you to pick the number of sides, the number of tracks and sectors, and whether the disk will be ST or PC compatible.

Besides Full formatting, you can use a special fast reformat which will wipe out the contents of an old disk in just four seconds. This works by reformatting just the boot sector and FAT tables. The drawbacks are obvious - any corrupted sectors are going to cause problems later. Nevertheless, it does make DASH a quick alternative to wiping the contents of a disk by dragging all the files to the Trash using the GEM Desktop.

MAXIMUM SPEED

You can force the software to format the disk in drive A first and then the disk in drive B. This means you could put a disk in each drive and come back later when the formatting has finished.

For straight formatting DASH is better than the GEM version simply because of speed. It can format a single-sided disk in 34 seconds and a double-sided disk in 65 seconds. These compare to GEM timings of 53 seconds and 99 seconds.

DASH can be customised and an INF file saved to disk. Every icon that is highlighted will be detailed in the INF file.

While the virus killer supplied with DASH is useful, it isn't in the same league as Richard Karsmaker's Virus Killer reviewed last issue. Any non-standard boot-sector will be assumed to be

a virus, and link viruses go unharmed.

DASH is unquestionably useful and very fast, but many of its facilities are available in other packages. Chances are you will own software that duplicates many of DASH's features - and spending £20 on something that you already own might not be your idea of good sense - but DASH offers a lot in just 24K. ■

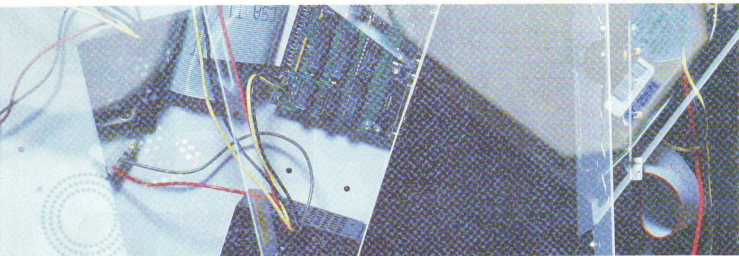

HARD DRIVING: THE FACTS

The hard drive has, as its name implies, an inflexible spinning disk made from a substance known as Mylar coated with a magnetic material allowing it to store electronically encoded signals on its surface.

The disk or "platter" as it's also known is permanently fixed

inside the drive casing and operates in a partial vacuum.

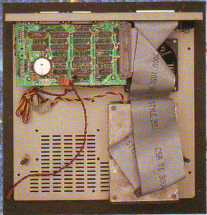
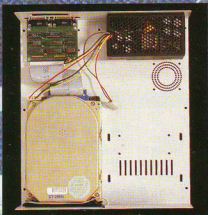
By setting up the drive thus, it is possible to make the platter spin at a truly tremendous rate – 3,600 revolutions per minute compared to the floppy drive's miserable 300rpm – and to have the read/write heads (which pick

up and deposit information to and from the disk) placed extremely close to the platter's surface.

In this way, the drive can store enormous quantities of data and you load that into your computer at a rate far greater than that of the humble floppy.

THE INSIDE STORY

Two 85Mbyte whoppers, separated only by a measly twenty quid in favour of the Gasteiner. But is that all? Take a look inside: you'd be surprised. The drive on the left is Gasteiner's: with no internal fan, you'd expect it to be virtually silent but susceptible to heat problems. Wrong on both counts. In fact it makes an unbelievable racket when it's going. Third Coast's model is considerably quieter and better constructed. But what matters is how they perform...



It may be only a year ago or so that you, like most new ST owners, were impressed with the speed and convenience of the floppy disk. Now, with advances in technology and cheaper manufacturing methods, your friendly neighbourhood ST dealer can offer you a range of capacious and reasonably priced hard disk drives that would shame the humble floppy.

The hard drive might seem an unnecessary luxury for the home computer user, but just try using some of the latest DTP, paint and graphics packages from floppy and you'll soon wish you had one. Databases and spreadsheets improve beyond recognition when allowed to bust through the 720K formatted storage space of the floppy, and even games are more fun with the increase in speed and loading convenience.

So they're wonderful. But until recently the downside to all this marvel of modern engineering has been an eye-watering price that has very successfully deterred all but the most affluent technojunkie. Now, however, with cheaper manufacturing costs and a bigger market for the devices, the price-per-Mbyte ratio is tumbling.

Even so, after deciding to purchase a hard drive, many users plump for the standard 20 or 30Mbyte sizes. Yet a much larger capacity doesn't necessarily mean a much larger price, and the difference in cost between the 30Mbyte and the 60 or 70Mbyte is small enough to make going for the big ones a sensible decision.

Although standard hard drives are available up to 300Mbyte, probably the biggest you'll find for the ST is around 80Mbyte. We pit two leading contenders from Third Coast Technology and newcomer Gasteiner against each other. There's almost nothing between them in price; both come formatted and ready to power up. Yet in terms of quality of finish and above all noise there's a big difference. Read on...

There are usually two or more heads in each fixed drive, with one or two heads on each side of the disk. Platters come in various sizes and generally have from 150 to 640 cylinders. This compares to the usual 80 tracks, 9 or 10 sectors found on a formatted Atari disk. A floppy disk is formatted as one unit,

but hard drives are usually divided into separate partitions. This makes it much easier to track down your software.

Originally, ST hard-drive programs only allowed three partitions but new ICD software remedies that.

There are two common hard

Third Coast are a major supplier of Atari-related hard and software and – quite aside from the genlock reviewed earlier in this issue, caching devices and replacement floppy drives – market their own series of hard drives. The range begins with a 22Mbyte device, and there's 32, 45 and 65Mbyte drives as well as the whacking great 85Mbyte monster reviewed here.

SIZE MATTERS

When hard drives first appeared for the ST they were little bigger than a floppy. Atari's own device and the popular Supra drive were both tiny. But with the release of the Mega STs, drive manufacturers realised the advantages of housing the mechanism in a case that could conveniently be used to support the CPU/system box. The result: larger drives requiring less space on your desktop. 520/1040 ST owners can use the larger drives as a stand for a monitor or television.

Third Coast have decided to adopt the latter styling, and there's enough space inside the case to add a second drive mechanism or tape streamer for back up purposes.

The drive is housed in a well made and sturdy steel case. The front panel features power lights for the drive, room for the optional second drive and tape streamer, and a drive busy light to indicate read/write operations. At the rear, there's a DMA outlet and ports for computer connection and future expansion.

Opening the case reveals the SCSI interface/controller card and the drive itself. The circuitry is thoughtfully laid out and tidy, and the

whole thing oozes quality. Increasing the storage capacity of the unit is a simple matter of opening the case and plugging a second drive mechanism into the space provided: Third Coast supply a full range of compatible drives for this purpose.

SMOOTH OPERATOR

The FA ST comes ready formatted and set up for use with your ST. Getting the drive into action is a simple matter of connecting it to your computer with the lead provided, plugging it into the mains and switching on.

A few seconds later you're presented with the ST desktop, floppy drive buttons A and B, and twelve other drive icons labelled C through

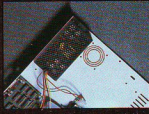

disk formatting techniques: FMF (Modified Frequency Modulation) and RLL (Record Length Limited).

The latter provides 50% more data storage space than the former. Most drives can be formatted to either specification, but a different drive controller is needed in each case.

N representing the hard drive broken into manageable partitions. Each of these partitions acts as a drive in its own right, and makes the process of handling and using 85MByte of storage space much easier.

The first thing one notices about the FA ST in operation is that it's incredibly quiet. A slight background hum is all that can be heard, so you won't be distracted while working on that bestseller. Disk accesses are fast – typically 22 milliseconds – and quiet, with none of the shake, rattle and hum of stepper motors associated with some cheaper hard drives.

The drive is supplied with two excellent manuals and for those new to hard disks, there's an explanation of how they work, what they're made of and so on. This information is easy to assimilate and helps dispel some of the mystique surrounding that little box of electronic tricks sitting under your computer.

The rest of the manual tells you how to format and partition the drive, and gives general tips on caring for the device. It's a fine idea to have photographs illustrating the text, but not when they're this bad: guys, sack the chump with the box Brownie and the shakes.

The manual, blurred photographs notwithstanding, is written in a clear and lucid manner, and assumes little knowledge on your part. At the end of it you'll feel confident of booting up and using this well constructed, solid, dependable and pleasantly quiet drive. Everything about it inspires confidence.

Gasteiner, who formed after a split with PC specialists Cavendish, market a large range of hard and software for the Atari ST including RAM upgrades, laser printers and several hard drives imported from Germany.

The range starts with a 50MByte drive priced £479 rising to this enormous 85MByte drive for a very reasonable £679. But is it in fact a false economy to buy such a cheap drive? After all, 85MBytes is a hell of a lot of data to lose if the drive goes down due to poor construction or inferior parts.

STANDING PROUD

The GAS 85MByte is housed in a large, plain grey case with a single disk busy light on the front panel. This light, however, stands proud of the case, and is likely to be the first casualty in the event of a bump.

At the rear, there's a couple of unmarked ports, an oblong hole the purpose of which is unclear, and an on/off rocker switch. The rear panel looks shoddy and unfinished. The case fits together badly – there's a large gap at the front, and the whole thing does not suggest that this is the Rolls Royce of hard drives.

Opening the case reveals a slight improvement in quality. There's a 5.25 inch hard drive mechanism, neat little power supply, control electronics circuit board, and space for a second drive. One or two parts could be better connected, but the interior is tidy.

GETTING UP

The GAS 85MByte is supplied pre-formatted and partitioned, so connecting it to your ST via the lead supplied and providing power is all that's required.

Switching on, it must be stated, produces a noise not unlike a 747 winding up for take-off. I mean, this drive is incredibly noisy. A continuous whine somewhat akin to a harassed editor demanding copy howls forth, and read/write operations produce a graunching and grinding that wouldn't be out of place in the bonecrushing department of the local abattoir.

The noise is probably amplified by the empty space in the case provided for the second drive, but knowing that doesn't help when you're trying to work with a decibel count in the upper 90s flying around your desk top. Data access time for the GAS is typically 28 milliseconds.

The Gasteiner drive is accompanied by a pair of manuals which although little more than pamphlets, do provide all the information necessary to get the most from your drive and the supplied back up software. Gasteiner have thoughtfully provided several other public domain disk utilities such as Diskmech, a sector editor, and Ultra, a utility which measures the performance of your hard drive.

HARD DECISION?

Both drives are fast and capable. Both offer an increase in productivity unheard of in the ST market until recently. Both are reasonably priced and fully supported by their respective suppliers.

Despite their similarities, however, the difference between the two is all too obvious. The Third Coast drive most definitely has the edge when it comes to quality. It's better put together, and, more important, it's so much quieter.

If you reckon it's worth saving £20 and you really don't mind having to wear a Walkman wherever you use your ST, then go for the Gasteiner. Otherwise, make your cheque out to Third Coast.

Once a file hits the Trash icon on the Desktop the file has gone forever. It is an ex-file, it is no more, it has gone to meet its maker. That's no longer the case, though, with Recover. Accidentally deleted files, and even damaged files, can be partially recovered.

Recover is best for reviving text files rather than program files because it displays the contents of a "cluster" (two sectors) on a disk, and it's up to you to decide whether the sectors belong to your deleted files or not.

GETTING STARTED

Double-click on the RECOVER folder followed by a double click on RECOVER.TOS. Do read the .DOC file first by double-clicking on it and clicking on "SHOW."

When prompted, type a single letter for the drive identifier (A might be a good start). When asked for a cluster number, enter consecutive cluster numbers (starting from 1) and write down a list of the clusters you think contain your file. Enter N if you don't think the cluster belongs to your file - enter Y if you think otherwise.

Insert a blank disk when you've collected together all the clusters you think make up the deleted file and then simply enter a suitable filename. Job done!

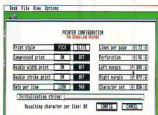

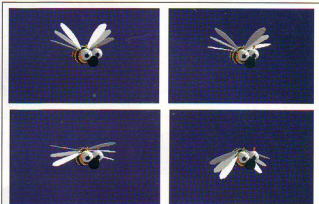

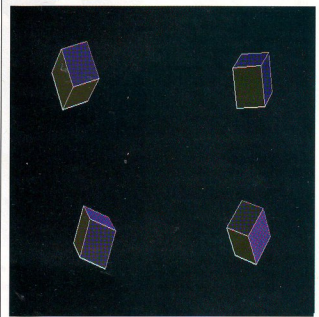

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HOW TO BACK UP YOUR DISK

Because the ever so wonderful and scrumptious *ST Format Cover Disk* is wilfully non-standard and squeezes in a whopping great 400K of data per side, the back up procedure is not simple. Follow these steps, however, and you won't encounter any problems. Do it any other way and you could knacker your Cover Disk.

1. Format a couple of blank disks - single-sided if you've got a single-sided drive, double-sided if you have a double-sided drive (with us so far!).
2. Write protect the Cover Disk and insert it into drive A (if you have two drives, you lucky devil you, insert the Cover Disk into drive B). Double-click on the drive B icon. If you're still saving up to buy a second drive, a message appears requesting you to put disk B in drive A. Simply click on OK.
3. Insert one of the fresh, crisply formatted disks into drive A. Double-click on the drive A icon.
4. Pick up a folder at a time from the Cover Disk window and plonk it into the drive A window.
5. If you have one drive then you'll be asked to insert disk A and disk B at regular intervals. Don't, whatever you do, mix the two up! Disk B is the Cover Disk and disk A is the freshly formatted disk.
6. When you get a "disk full" error message, recopy the last folder - and all subsequent folders - onto the second freshly formatted disk.
7. Double sided owners, double-click on SIDE_2 once you've finished copying all the folders from side A of the Cover Disk. Job done!

To get to the ANIMATE folder double-click on the SIDE_2 folder. Inside the ANIMATE folder you'll find Buzzbee (Public Domain; all colour STs - sorry about last month, by the way! - with the filename Buzzbee.Seq). This small but perfectly formed cute animation is well worth the measly 21K it takes up. You'll also find Cube1 (Mark Pickavance; all colour STs; filename Cube1.Seq), which illustrates our Cyber tourist (see section beginning page 101).

Animate4 was on last month's disk - so we won't go over how to use it again. But if you're stuck, there's a very comprehensive help file on the disk. Boot maker

Inside the SIDE_2 folder you'll find a folder called CZSOUNDS: double-click on it. Double-click on the CZSOUNDS.PRG program to start.

A menu offering six options appears. Simply type the number of the option you wish to select. When downloading or uploading you're asked for a preset number - enter something like P05 (for the fifth preset voice) or I16 (for the sixteenth internal voice). The view-memory facility allows you to display (or print) the memory buffer where the data is stored.

Flying start

Here it comms (ouch) - a full-featured comms package that lets you log on to the likes of Prestel and Telecom Gold. There are menus offering standard RS232 configurations for 7 data bits, even parity, 1 stop bit; 8 data bits, no parity, 1 stop bit; inverse video, and both colour and monochrome screen displays.

Data transfer rates of 300/300, 1200/75 and 1200/1200 are supported. Free, and worth every penny (erm...).

GETTING STARTED

Load the program by double-clicking on the SIDE_2 folder, double-clicking on the FLYSTART folder and double-clicking on the file FLYSTART.PRG. A seven-option menu appears:

1. 300/300 Telecom Gold
2. 1200/1200 Telecom Gold
3. 1200/75 Prestel
4. 1200/1200 Prestel
5. 300/300 BBS
6. 1200/75 BBS
7. Invert video

Return to the above menu at any time by pressing the HELP key. Pressing UNDO returns you to the Desktop.

The first option puts the ST into an ASCII character set, 300 baud transmit/receive rate with 7 data bits, even parity and one stop bit (7E1 for short). It responds to VT52 commands, but if you don't know what that means, don't worry - it just makes the RS232 port communicate with the outside world in the way that a 300 baud Telecom Gold connection would understand.

Option two is identical to option 1, but with a 1200 baud transmit/receive rate. The third causes the ST to transmit at 75 baud and receive at 1200 baud. It uses the 7E1 structure, but with a Prestel character set.

Number four allows 1200 baud receive and transmit (still 7E1) using the Prestel character set. This selection allows intelligent modems to perform the 1200/75 split internally, while they still talk to the ST at a constant 1200 transmit/receive rate.

Pressing five places the ST into 300 baud transmit/receive, 8 data bits, no parity bit and one stop bit (8N1). This is the most commonly used bulletin board standard. Option six puts the ST into a 1200 receive, 75 transmit mode and the ASCII character set in VT52 emulation mode. This is used by some BBS for rapid retrieval of information where only limited commands need to be transmitted by the ST.

The last option toggles the text between black and white. This doesn't function in Prestel mode, and resets itself on exit to the desktop.

Number two in a highly irregular series

DESKTOP ACCESSORIES

Unlike standard .PRG or .TOS files, Desktop accessories (recognisable by their .ACC extensions) can't be executed by double-clicking on their file names. Instead, GEM must be given instructions to load them at start up.

Accessory files must be present in the root or main directory so that GEM can find them. Once installed, an accessory is run by pulling down the Desk menu and clicking on the accessory's name. Up to six accessories can be held in memory at once - but they take up memory all the time the ST is running, so install only those you really need.

Make sure all accessories you want to install are in the root directory of a disk. Hit the reset button once you've got them there: this forces them to load automatically into the ST's memory.

To use the desk accessories (files with a .ACC extension) on this disk, copy the ones you want onto a blank disk. You can have up to six at once. Insert the disk containing the accessories in the root directory into your internal drive and switch on your ST. The accessories load automatically and are available for use until you reset the ST. Simply move the pointer to DESK and click on the name of the accessory you wish to use.

You can run Ramload from the desktop, although for convenience it's best to keep it in the AUTO folder. The program expects to find RAMDISK.INF (in either the AUTO folder or root directory) which details the files to be copied to the RAM disk. RAMLOAD.INF is an ASCII file and can be edited with most word processors. Following is a typical example:

The first line specifies the drive which is to be used as the RAM disk - C in this case. (Each program that you want to copy to the

RAM disk must be on a separate line, and all letters must be in upper case). If you want to copy files from a folder you first need to specify the folder: #MACROS, for instance.

If you're using this program from the AUTO folder make sure it comes after your RAM disk program. AUTO folder files are executed in the order in which they were copied into the folder.

To prevent Ramload from running, hold down left Shift and Alt together.

Your ST can read and write PC format disks, but a PC can't read and write ST disks (you've got to feel sorry for the older, more basic technology inside the PC). The obvious answer to this predicament is either to format a 3.5-inch disk on the PC and use it to transfer data between the two machines, or use PC Format to format your ST disks.

As well as formatting 3.5-inch disks, PC Format can format 5.25-inch disks (you need to have a 5.25-inch disk drive attached, obviously). It's even possible to alter the ST's step rate to bring it in line with 5.25-inch drives.

GETTING STARTED

Double-click on SIDE.2. Once inside the folder, double-click on the PCFORMAT folder. Finally, to run the program, double-click on PCFORMAT.PRG. A box appears with options for formatting a disk in drive A or B, and altering the step rate of either drive. Items are selected WIMP style, so it's easy to get around. ■

READING .DOC FILES

In most folders on the Cover Disk there's a file with the extension .DOC. This is a help file containing instructions on using the program: read all relevant help files before running any program.

To read a help (or .DOC) file, simply double-click on it. Click on CANCEL if you don't wish to read the file; click on PRINT to send the document to a printer; click on SCREEN to send the text to your monitor. After each screenful of text the display halts. Pressing return scrolls up a line while pressing space scrolls up a complete page of text. Pressing Q or Control C returns you to the Desktop.

ST Format can't be held responsible for damage resulting from improper use of the Cover Disk. If you failed to read a help file, it's tough. Sorry to get so heavy, but this is important.

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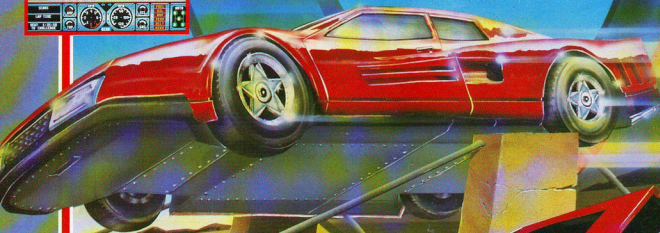

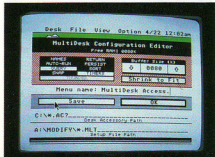
"That's impossible!" you cry: 'you can't load more than six desk accessories into an ST! Look - it says so in the manual, I even tried it once and my machine wouldn't boot. It's not possible!"

Yes it is - if you use the astonishing Multidesk, a new desk accessory which skilfully shatters the old limitation by providing a shell for other desk accessories to load themselves into. Upon selecting Multidesk from the DA slot, you are given a list of all the desk accessories it is currently holding.

The task most often performed from this main menu is the simple act of choosing which desk accessory to use next. Just point with the cursor at the one you want and up it comes.

Next to this list of desk accessories are a series of control boxes. Clicking on the CONFIGURE box takes you into a submenu where the user has full control over the program's performance.

You can choose to have the desk accessories return to the main Multidesk menu after



Multidesk lets you use as many desk accessories simultaneously as your memory - and your wallet! - allows

they are exited. Choosing PERSIST enables the last desk accessory used to come up the next time you select Multidesk from the desktop.

Groups of desk accessories can be set to autoboot automatically and files can be sorted by name or by the order in which they were loaded.

The buffer, which allocates memory to the desk accessories, can also be set and controlled within this menu. To control Multidesk, the buffer needs to be sized to the maximum amount of memory you wish to reserve for desk accessories. Once set, Multidesk loads as many desk accessories as the buffer can hold even while a program is running in the foreground.

This means you can load and unload desk accessories without having to interrupt a session and re-boot the computer. Loading desk accessories into Multidesk is elementary - just click on the LOAD ACCESSORY option and choose the files from the GEM item selector.

You can also save groups of desk accessories by using SAVE SET-UP. You can then load these groups by clicking on LOADSET-UP. One of these groups can also be set to boot automatically when you start up your ST.

So how many desk accessories can you load into Multidesk? It depends only on the amount of memory available. Writing this article on a Mega 4 ST, I was able to have the following magnificent collection of desk accessories loaded into Multidesk: Thunder, K-Thesaurus, K-Rhyme, Keyword, G+Plus, Timeworks Partner, Maxpack, Crystal, C Panel+, Turbo ST, Keymaster, Calendar, Flexcessory, C-Man, Fast, Backpack, Igor, Flair Paint and several useful PD and shareware programs.

Multidesk can even become an ordinary stand-alone program, running desk accessories as if they were programs with PRG or TOS extensions.

Is Multidesk too good to be true? Not only is it true, it's exceptionally reliable: it even runs certain sloppily programmed desk accessories which formerly didn't work! It also allows certain incompatible pairs of desk accessories to be loaded at the same time.

Multidesk is a must for any ST user interested in maximizing the ST's performance. If you're a desk accessory freak you won't want to miss out.

Everyone agrees that the ST's GEM file selector is clumsy. There are PD file selector replacements around, but UIS is far and away superior in every respect. It crams an extraordinary number of features into an ingenious shell and takes the tedium out of choosing files.

The program can be activated from the AUTO folder, or even from the desktop. So whenever you use the file selector within any program UIS comes up instead.

Exploring the item selector from top to bottom, we first come to two useful boxes, one which formats disks and the other which creates new folders. Using FORMAT brings you into another menu where you can choose to format disks in 9 or 10 sectors and 80, 81 or 82 tracks. You can also use the special Twister format if you have the new ST ROMs.

Below the two boxes are six file extenders to choose from. At a click of the mouse you can search files ending with any search mask of your choosing, such as DOC, NEO or DDP. Click one of these extensions and the display lists only files which match the mask.

Next comes the extended file display. At

first glance it looks like the ordinary GEM display, until you use the scroll arrows at the bottom. Using the arrows, you can see the file or folder's name and size, as well as the day and time it was created.

SECRET FILES

On the corners of the display are the STATUS, LOCK and PRINT boxes. You can find the status of any file, folder or disk simply by dragging it to the STATUS box. Some of the important information available includes: how many folders/files are on the disk, bytes used, bytes remaining and the number of files or folders in a folder.

Dragging files to the LOCK box, you can protect files by setting them to READ ONLY. You can also choose to have files HIDDEN, which means that they are still on the disk but do not show up on file directories - a useful feature if, for instance, you want to keep your CV secret!

The PRINT box prints out either a disk directory or an unformatted copy of any file dragged to it.

To the right of the file display is a series of boxes containing DOS functions. You can drag one or more files to either the COPY, MOVE, RENAME or DELETE box.

The MOVE box is a convenient feature unavailable from the GEM desktop that allows you to transfer a file from one disk or folder to another without having to copy and then delete the original - always one of GEM's most laughable limitations. This is especially useful when copying files from folder to folder on the same disk because the file name is only moved on the directory listing.

To the right of the DOS functions are a row of small boxes representing each hard disk partition or floppy drive. It provides a fast, one click, way of instantly changing drives.

Thoughtful small touches have been provided in most of the functions to provide convenient operation. One of these is the search facility, with wild cards, which quickly locates files on a disk. Another is the fact that the Item Selector memorises the last path used. This small addition greatly speeds up many of the disk functions.

All in all, Universal Item Selector is an impressive programming feat which proves the point that the best place for DOS functions is in the item selector.

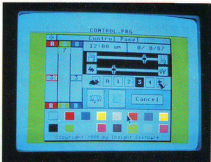

Attention Atari: scrap your GEM system and blaze this brilliant desktop on your ROM chips - and I mean immediately!

The inefficiencies of the GEM - not to mention the Macintosh - desktop become even more obvious after you use this thoughtfully designed program. It does everything you'd expect (and several things you wouldn't) an ingenious user interface/desktop to do.

It uses the same basic technology as GEM: drop-down windows and icons which represent disk drives, folders, files and the dustbin. But it goes further and provides different icons for RAM disks, hard disk partitions and even adds a print queue icon.

The FILE window contains straightforward commands such as creating folders and closing/opening disks and folders - which can also be done the normal way by double-clicking the desktop's icons.

The window also includes a facility to show information on disks and files, quit Neodesk and format disks with nine or ten sectors and 79 to 82 tracks.

WINDOW DISPLAY

The next two drop-down menus are the SHOW and VIEW windows, which control the file display. Files and folders can be displayed as text or icons. But Neodesk goes a few steps beyond GEM, since text can be displayed in either small or large text and in one or more columns. You can also choose which items of information you want displayed in the window: a file's size, date or time.

The icons are more in the tradition of the Macintosh, since they can be customised for individual files and folders. It makes a difference to be able to identify a word processor from a database or game simply by the design of its icon.

The SORT window allows you to arrange files and folders by name, date, size, time or even no-sort (the order they are in on the disk). The final drop-down menu is packed with controls to customise Neodesk creatively.

The advanced INSTALL APPLICATION feature allows you to specify two file extensions, so that you can open a data file into an application without having to open the application first.

It also allows you to open up batch files, >

like on a PC, corresponding to whichever Command Line Interpreter you assign to use with Neodesk. And if you do not possess a Command Line Interpreter, Neodesk includes a reliable public domain version called COMMAND.TOS.

Using a text editor you can execute a series of commands and open files by just clicking on a single BAT file.

The Edit ENVIRONMENT feature allows programmers to enter up to ten environment strings so that, when a program is executed, a special pointer is passed on indicating where the pointers are located in memory. Hence programmers can compile programs from the desktop.

The SET PARAMETERS menu allows you to customise Neodesk's personal preferences. You can choose whether or not to confirm deletes and copies, have system messages, or have Neodesk in memory or installed on disk.

When running Neodesk, you are actually executing a special "master shell" program which in turn loads and executes the main Neodesk program. Choosing to have it installed on disk means that it only takes up a meagre 24K of memory while another program is running. Then, when that program is finished, the disk automatically re-loads the Neodesk work area.

There are also facilities to save the desktop, fix the 40 folder limit, install the desktop icons and neatly snap them to grids.

In the main desktop area file icons are displayed to fit evenly across the window, so you don't have to use bottom scroll bars; you only

need to scroll files up and down.

Displayed where the bottom scroll bar is on GEM is the individual disk's volume label. This volume label is easily changed using SHOW INFORMATION in the FILE drop-down menu.

The corner boxes on the windows are similar to GEM - except in the lower left-hand corner is an arrow which drops the window to the bottom of any other open windows.

HANDY SHORTCUTS

Another impressive difference is that Neodesk allows eight windows open at one time, twice as many as GEM.

When dragging files and disks from one window to another, you can either COPY like the GEM desktop or MOVE, which allows you to move a file from one disk or folder to another without having to first copy and then delete the original.

The disk copying function provides a great deal of freedom. Disks can be copied using files only, which drags files from the source to the destination; with format, which reformats the destination to match the source; or no format, which performs a straight GEM desktop-like copy. And copying uses all available memory, so that there are as few disk swaps as possible.

The main desktop functions are also packed with handy shortcuts, such as CONTROL/HOME, which immediately switches whichever window is open to its root directory and therefore eliminates having to go up folder by folder.

File icons can even be taken from the window and placed directly on the desktop. This

allows you to display your most often used programs on the desktop and run them without having to open a directory.

Neodesk comes with a Control Panel replacement, a printspooler and an Icon Editor to let you create or edit icons to custom fit individual files.

The drawing menu is well designed, to enable you to create amusing and attractive desktop icons. It can also load DEGAS pictures as a background to the desktop, warm or cold booting the ST from the keyboard and a diagnosis of system boots.

Once you use Neodesk it's a certainty that you'll never want to suffer GEM again. ■

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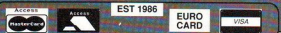

ST Format investigates some of the treats and the terrors of the public domain

In the public domain, the Atari ST stands head and shoulders above the rest. Most micros have a similar resource of "free" programs, but the ST has a truly comprehensive range of excellent applications and utilities.

There is nothing inherently "dodgy" about PD, although it has its fair share of dud programs. The authors of PD software have decided that their work might be useful to others, and out of generosity or laziness are not marketing it commercially. PD is free from copyright and can be copied and given out to whoever you like. The best sources are bulletin

boards, public domain libraries, and of course these pages.

Another related area is "shareware." This is software distributed on trust – if you try a program and intend to use it, you are expected to send a contribution to the program's author. Honesty is the best policy, because registered

owners often get free upgrades and manuals with details of otherwise hidden features.

THE VIRUS THREAT

A common worry among PD buyers is the risk of catching viruses. ST viruses are among the most common, but with a few sensible precautions you should be OK. For a start, buy from the bigger libraries; they check each disk carefully for viruses as their reputation depends on it. Secondly, buy direct; PD passed from friend to friend is much more likely to be infected. Lastly, check the disks yourself with a virus killer – several are available in the public domain itself. If you follow this advice your ST should be at no risk.

MONKEYS & BALLOONS PAGE SIX DISK ST191

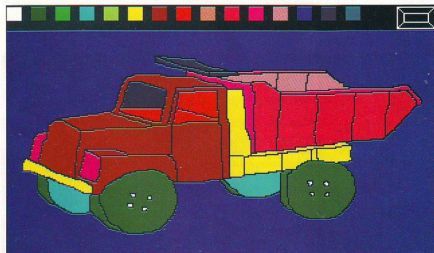
Two simple, but enjoyable, games on this disk. In *Monkeys and Balloons* you guide a trampoline in order to keep a monkey airborne. The aim is to get the monkey to burst balloons floating past. I recall publishing this game as a type-in listing for the BBC B some years ago, and the whole office played it for weeks.

The second game is a variant on *Missile Command* – except you play on the desktop with disk drive icons as bases and every round a "smart bee" attacks!

Such technicalities are lost on me but if you're dying to tweak the ST's innards, this is your program. There's even the original assembler source code thrown in.

The other part of the disk has a slideshow program for *Quantum Paint* files, with a couple of well-drawn examples thrown in. Slideshows are popular programs for reasons which baffle me. Still if you are a *Quantum Painter* and want to impress with the depth of your work, get in touch with *The Other PD Library*.

WORD EXTRACT GOODMAN PD DISK GD427

Are you a cheat? Do you like word games? If the answer to both is yes – get this disk. *WordExtract* takes any word and finds all the other words which can be made from its letters. It also searches its dictionary for words which fit a pattern.

WordExtract managed to make some 459 words out of my name in around three minutes. The dictionary the program uses is apparently based on the Bible (also available in PD, see *ST Format 1*), which doesn't explain why it offered *Aberdeen* as a partial anagram at one point – unless there's a book I missed at Sunday school.

STUFFED #3 FLOPPYSHOP ST

I reviewed issue 2 a couple of months ago, and by the time you read this issue 4 will be out, but this copy of *Stuffed*, a disk magazine, is so much better than the last it deserves mention. The problem with this demo is the visuals - a rather tedious oscillating Batsymbol and a single line of scrolling text is all you get. Still, it's worth it for the music.

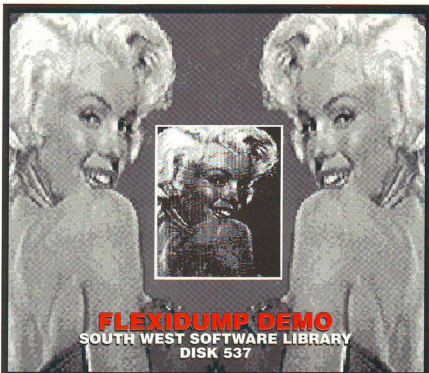

Flexidump proper is a powerful utility for printing out Degas and Neochrome pictures on a dot-matrix printer. This cut down version, although relatively limited compared to the commercial product, is still a very valuable program. It allows you to control the scale and size of the output picture (Flexidump proper allows total control, but the demo's fixed preset sizes are good enough for many applications) and produce accurate dumps of colour pictures. You can control print density and enhance the image, and both nine and 24-pin dot-matrix printers are supported.

The inset shows the quality of the printout from the Degas file above. A handy utility which is bound to whet your appetite for the real thing.

40PDL, one of the dozens of back-bedroom public domain libraries, answered the call for the best of PD by sending a PD tennis game. Games are a weak area of the public domain, although Budgie UK do some sterling work, but this tennis game really is a level above the usual run.

With joystick, mouse or keyboard control and one or two players you simply run around

the court and hit the ball back over the net. Sound easy? It's not, but it is great fun. With nice graphics, sound and movement this is one of the best PD games I've seen for ages.

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TAKE CONTROL WITH CYBER

In last month's tutorial we began, you'll no doubt recall, by using the Cyber Control language to manipulate an object in CAD. We exploded the Channel 4 logo ("as seen on TV") and then returned it to its original state. This type of movement is not difficult to produce, because the objects revolve around a static centre. This month I want to explore more complex motion, again using simple Cyber Control programming.

DYNAMIC MOTION

To achieve more dynamic motion we must introduce a mobile centre of rotation. Using a cube to demonstrate this, you can see exactly what happens. The cube progresses around a circle, and as it moves in this pre-determined arc it spins on its own axis (see figure 1 over the page for code: the bee on this page is from a public domain program that's on this month's Cover Disk).

After loading the cube the first task is to spin it on its axis. Then move it away from the centre of the "Universe" before rotating it about the centre again. The coordinates of the centre are 0,0,0. In the example code I load the cube for every frame of the animation. To achieve movement, variables are used to increment the amounts of rotation in two different motions. Those of you who understand Cyber Control will no doubt be exclaiming, "That's stupid! Why don't you just rotate the same cube a little more each frame?"

This was my first thought, but after experimenting I discovered that it was an inaccurate method and liable to a creeping mis-alignment. The cube "jumped" at the join between the start

and end points of the animation. I assume this technique didn't work because of the integer maths used for speed in parts of the CAD code. True floating point maths is best accomplished with FPCPs (Floating Point Co-Processors) - but the ST does not cater for one. If Tom Hudson ever considers writing a new version he might take account of the one you can put in the new TT machine.

From a critical viewpoint this Cyber Control example may not be the most elegant way of producing this kind of motion, but it does work. The cube I was using was created for me by the "Primitives" part of CAD. I could have manufactured it within my code, but thought you would prefer shorter listings. If you require a more colourful version you can re-colour individual facets using Cyber Sculpt. Alternatively you could tumble a completely different object.

The scene is animated at over 72 frames, the two rotational factors both being 5 degrees. If you want to make a shorter sequence, try decreasing the frame number to 32 and increase the rotation to 10 degrees. You may discover because of the nature of CAD's animation files that the shorter animation is not half the size.

ANIMATION LIMITATION

The limitation on animation size is usually dictated by the available disk space. This is because CAD virtually uses the disk as workspace and saves out its animation frames as it produces them.

Only when you want to see the end result do you need to load the entire animation. Logically the largest DLT file you could produce (without a hard drive) is the size of a double-sided disk. This is about the maximum you could load and play in one MByte of memory.

The animation format DLT is compressed, but better compression is possible using the SEQ format. To convert the DLT file into SEQ you can use either Cyber Paint or Cyber Studio. This all assumes that you have enough memory to load the DLT version into these packages. If you are using CAD then you must have one MByte, and hopefully a double-sided disk drive.

It's possible to generate such large animation you can't load it into ANIMATE.PRG: you'll have to experiment with CAD to find out how big this is. I'm being intentionally vague (we noticed - ed), because the amount of RAM left after initialisation differs depending on which version of TOS your machine has. You may produce an

animation sequence which doesn't run on your friend's ST or vice versa.

THROWING THE CURVED BALL

Let's return to Cyber Control and tumbling objects. A powerful inclusion in the Cyber Control repertoire is the SPLINE function: a "spline" is a curved line. And that's exactly what CAD generates - a curved path through three dimensional space. It's easy to define one: just give a sequence of key points to the spline routines and a continually curved path will be calculated through these points.

You may have as many as 20 defined points, from which the spline function can generate as many positions along the curve as you need. An additional control is available for three different types of spline.

The "Linear" spline has straight lines between the key points. The "Approximate" spline (use "B" type) is a perfect curve - not necessarily passing through all key points. To do that you must use the third type, a "Smooth" spline. It passes through all the points but might make some sharp turns to achieve it. Once defined the spline can be used as a flight path for an object or camera.

One of the more bizarre uses of splines is in growing curved objects from templates. Making objects using the Control language is a subject we shall cover in another article.

When defining a spline remember that our "Universe" is only 8,000 units wide, high and deep (+4,000 to -4,000). I created a sketch on graph paper of the view from above, showing the required path.

From this I found I could locate the points on the path needed to produce the spline. The spline I created is an approximate figure of "8". For animation purposes I simply used the cube again - this makes render times quick (see figure 2).

The spiral motion of the cube is a smooth point to point transition. The spline function produces an array accessed in the MOVETO line, positioning the tumbling cube along the spline. I decided that 72 frames is a long enough animation loop, so the spline has 73 points on it. The animation loops correctly because start and end points for the spline are the same.

Over the course of 72 frames the cube tumbles over once - bringing it back to its original position (frame 1 or 73, whichever way you want to think of it).

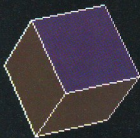
An interesting variation on this theme can be created by driving more than one cube, so that you get a progression. The number of cubes you choose must be based on how much space exists between individual frames. You don't want the cubes to overlap and destroy the visual effect.

If you experiment, I suggest you copy this code and then try some variations - such as having a selection of objects following the spline or giving a different direction to the tumble of each object.

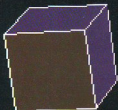
If you're feeling confident, attempt this experiment: two objects, a sphere and torus, follow the spline in opposite directions and at the centre of the figure "8", the ball should pass through the hole in the torus. Phew!

Just moving the objects can become dull, so next month we'll be animating the cameras as well

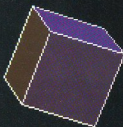

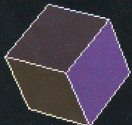

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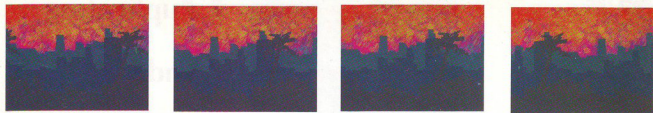
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TAKE THE PARALLAX VIEW

A good selling point for shoot-em-ups is "parallax scrolling." But what exactly is it and how do you get the right perspective?

To understand parallax we must first go way back to the fundamental laws of perspective. As we all know things appear smaller the further away they are, and because of that they also give the impression of moving smaller distances.

Imagine travelling at 125 miles an hour on a train. Any object near the train flies past, but houses on the horizon are hardly moving at all. If we look at the way a conventional animator might create a parallax scene we can understand more about how we can produce computer parallax.

MIGHT AS WELL JUMP

As everyone knows, normal animation is created by filming thousands of individual drawings. To reduce the workload for scenes with complex backgrounds, characters are often painted onto Cel - clear acetate sheets so they can be overlaid to form a composite image.

For good animation, "registration" is very important. In other words, the drawings must be aligned very accurately or the character "jumps" around unintentionally. The method of this "registration" is the peg bar, a simple mechanism consisting of a metal strip with three pegs sticking out of it - two flat and one round. The animation paper or cels are punched with corresponding holes. The animator sticks the peg bar down onto his light box - an illuminated drawing surface enabling him to see through several layers of paper.

By using this apparatus, animators can see several frames simultaneously, allowing them to relate the movement of single drawings to corresponding frames. It also makes tracing of existing shapes easy.

"What," you are asking, "does this have to do with parallax?" The answer is the peg bar, because this has another use other than aligning the drawings when they're created.

After the animation is complete and painted onto Cel it is ready to be shot onto film with a special camera called a Rostrum. The Rostrum camera is mounted vertically, pointing down onto a flat surface on which are a set of pegs. The animation can be aligned for shooting with the same mechanism. Some Rostrum cameras possess more than one set of pegs, and they can move the section of metal that the pegs are embedded in.

HARD CEL

In a typical cartoon scene the hero is pursued down a street. He stays in the centre of the screen as the background slides by and occasionally a lampost whizzes across the foreground.

We've all seen it done. The sky doesn't move and the man doesn't move either. Instead the houses on the street that he's running past move slowly and the lamposts in the foreground move quickly, each on a separate and controllable level. The graphics are placed down in a precise order. The sky is stuck down and never needs moving. The houses move on the top pegs and must be moved a small amount every frame. The character uses the bottom pegs, and while his run is animated he can be scrolled left or right if he accelerates or slows down. The lamps go on the bottom pegs over the character's Cels. The movement has been pre-calculated and animated; you haven't any more pegs to put them on a separate one.

For every frame, the cameraman must change the Cels that change and move the pegs that move. If it is a long scene the houses may be on a continuous loop so that long drawing is not required.

CUE FX

There are several packages that produce the same effect as this but without all the pegs.

■ Perfect parallax using only three planes. Originally each plane is the same size. Using the "Z" position shrink some of them down in perspective. Move them at the same speed, overlay the results - and faster than you can say Walt Disney... Use as many planes and as much detail as your memory can handle

Probably the best of these is *Cyber Paint*. By using the "FX" menu it's possible to pan images at different speeds and thus produce parallax. However, you may find that getting the speed just right is difficult. Fortunately there is an easier way. In my example I have drawn a series of graphic elements which are on separate levels in depth. They were all originally the same size. Using the "Z" position I was able to shrink some down in perspective. If I now move all of them at the same speed and overlay the results I get perfect parallax. The perspective code within *Cyber Paint* has done all the calculations of speed for me.

The only snag is that when you push the screen away into perspective it no longer fits across the screen - so you must repeat the ADO/fx sequence several times (with an offset) to cover the horizon.

To demonstrate this, the example I created only has three levels, but this is not the restriction of the software. You can create as many levels as you wish; the more you introduce the greater the effect. If you examine my parallax screens you will notice that I have used flat colours and no detail. The reason was to save memory. Consisting of 59 frames, it takes up 300k as an SEQ file.

The effects produced are only two dimensional parallax. To achieve "true" or three dimensional parallax you must use real 3D software like CAD 2.0 or GFA Raytrace but for games or demos the 2D version is more than adequate. ■

RAYTRACE MOVES ON UP

GFA are now shipping V. 2 of *GFA Raytrace*, reviewed in October's *ST Format*. "This is a German product," Les Player told me, "and the German ST market is dominated by MONO software. So *Raytrace* did not sell in Germany. It has, however, sold very well in this country and France. We contacted GFA in Germany and asked them to fix a few bugs and improve a few features - they responded with version 2."

From the quick test I gave the new *Raytrace* I can report that not only have they fixed all the bugs, but they have also speeded the main raytracing code up by about 40%. This makes render times very reasonable - it makes *Sculpt 4D* on the Amiga look very slow.

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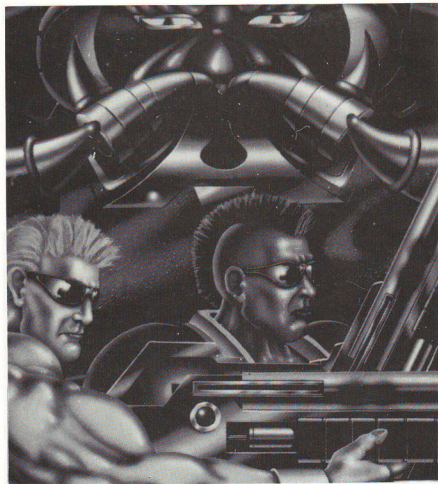

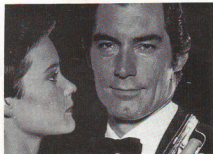
FORGOTTEN WORLDS

Level 1: In the first scene, destroy the escaping jeep as soon as possible. To destroy it, stay in line with it and point the nose down by accelerating. Remember to stay on the road, otherwise Sanchez's men (boo!) will get you.

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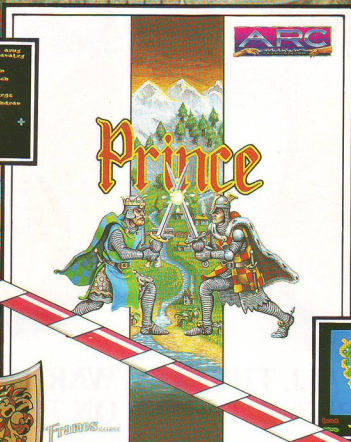
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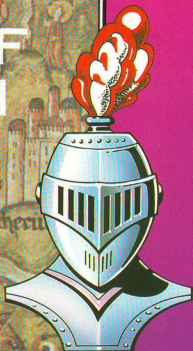
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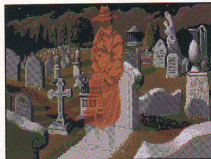

Sad news comes from Level 9: Scapeghost is to be their last adventure – at least in the present format.

"People have been declaring the death of the adventure market for years," Pete Austin observed, "so Scapeghost is an appropriate final release. It comes from beyond the grave – and you play a ghost!"

But is Pete right? There's room in the market, surely, for text/graphic adventures. They may not be runaway bestsellers, but they do have a long shelf life: Zork I and Colossal Cave are still selling.

However, Level 9 have their hearts and minds set on their new system, HUGE (wHolly Universal Games Engine). The system is devoted to 16-bit machines and includes multi-directional scrolling, fast animation with no overhead for 3-D graphics, digitised sound, flexible sprites and high data compression. Mike Austin says that HUGE has taken ten man (person?) years to develop: "It represents a number of major advances for games software."

Level 9 say they've been commissioned by a major US publisher to write games using the system – maybe they could write Gnome Ranger 3 during their coffee breaks?

In Scapeghost (£19.95) you play ex-cop in-spectre (groan) Alan Chance. You've been done away with by a gang of villains because you knew too much and then framed for a number of crimes you did not commit. You return, in ghostly form, to seek revenge upon the self-same baddies.

ULTIMA VI – LATEST DETAILS

Each game in the Ultima series is a vast improvement in every area on its predecessor; Ultima VI continues that trend.

Richard Garriot, Origin Systems' founder, gauges the improvement by the number of tiles used to create the Ultima world. Garriot uses tiles as building blocks. The more tiles – the more detail. Ultima I used 32 tiles, Ultima V had 512. Ultima VI has 24,000 tiles!

The land is contoured so you can see subtle differences in the landscape and even watch a river flow to the ocean. The game is now much more object orientated. Every object (even knives and forks) can be manipulated.

Richard has good news for ST Ultima fans: "It's been difficult for us to do strong ST conversions. They were originally converted from an Apple II, which meant that conversions never really utilised the ST's powers. Ultima VI, however, is developed on a PC, written in C

using VGA graphics and developed as a mouse controlled product. So the ST conversion will be much faster because it can almost be directly ported over from the PC. Ultima VI will utilise the ST's powers much more than Ultima V did."

The characters in Ultima VI are more intelligent. They live in their own ecosystem; they can tell you about themselves, their family and what they know about the world. If they sell you goods the price will depend on what stores they have and so on.

Ultima VI continues the literary content, integrating human emotions and presenting something more than boring hack'n'slash. Interaction from past Ultimas continues. So if you stomp on the peasants and steal their food, then you'll receive no co-operation from them. Fair enough.

And while the world awaits Ultima VI, Ultima VII is already under way!

SNIPPETS...

● Bringing tabletop RPG to computer has never been successfully accomplished – until now, and American software house Masterplay's Star Saga I (SSI). Run by Andrew Greenburg, the chap who created the highly successful Wizardry, Masterplay have developed the very first leisure product to be based on an Expert System.

SSI can be played solo or with up to six players

simultaneously, with the computer performing the job the GM would fill in a table-top game. The game is text-based, using plot booklets and character booklets to further the story. Masterplay reckon this prevents anyone hogging the computer for longer than necessary!

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MACHINE: ALL STs

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Simulations Canada are hardly known in this country, but they have a devoted following in the States and, not surprisingly, in their native country. What's surprising is that this attention is given to a company who produce wargames, a subject which you might think warrants little interest.

Sim Can have often found themselves at the centre of controversy. The root of the controversy lies with Sim Can's wargame design ideas. They live for the policy of the "Fog of War."

In real combat, decisions aren't based on perfectly received information. Commanding officers often find information is very difficult to obtain at all. There are communication breakdowns and even when information is received, some of it is inaccurate or lacking clarity. In addition, the natural elements, such as the weather and the landscape, play a crucial part in many conflicts. They are all elements of the "Fog of War."

GRAPHIC FREE ZONE

Sim Can's major design priority is the decision not to use graphics. All of Sim Can's games are text based (reports, orders and so on) and game movement is tracked, manually, via plastic maps and chinagraph pencils supplied with the box.

Sim Can say this is the only way of maintaining the "Fog of War" element. They believe graphics reduce the realism of the game. Their whole system aims to reflect historical accuracy.

Steve Newburg, President of Sim Can has even go so far as to state that, "Since all these games deal with a historic topic and most call themselves simulations, I assume you actually want history and reality as major aspects of the game."

Needless to say, many are shocked when they see a Sim Can game for the first time. A bare screen, but for a few lines of text, hardly warrants the high cost does it? Well, that depends on your gaming interests.

If you're a "weekend wargamer," the type of person who likes to dabble in wargames and thinks that all wargames should look like Waterloo or UMS and be full of exploding machinery – then you should avoid Sim Can products altogether.

Devoted wargamers, people who want depth and realism, who don't mind working for their enjoyment will find Sim Can games both enjoyable and unique.

ALGORITHM METHOD

Sim Can put a lot into their Combat and AI algorithms, but they should supply more information explaining these, other game variables and historical background information. This is a failing in all of their products.

Many wargamers may find the level of doc-

umentation sufficient. However, considering the audience Sim Can are aiming at, and the depth of involvement required, I think they should make a greater effort.

All three games reviewed make use of the Sim Can features mentioned above. The two naval simulations *Grand Fleet* (WW1 tactical naval combat in the North Sea) and *Kriegsmarine* (WWII tactical naval combat in the Atlantic) may, on reflection, be better suited to the text wargame than *Main Battle Tank* (modern tactical armoured combat in Germany) – the bleak expanse of the ocean lends itself to the bleak expanse of the monitor screen.

One disadvantage with the naval simulations is the slack time between action, (although I found *Kriegsmarine* less prone to this condition). *MBT* did appear to have more options and reports giving it a busier appear-

ance. Graphic reports are supplied (tracing the movements of units) along with some nicely detailed text reports.

Simulation Canada's wargames are more akin to commander simulators than general wargames you might find, say, from SSI. Presentation may be poor but Sim Can have produced a unique design and an original format allowing the dedicated wargamer to lose himself in the fog of war. ■

Anyway, here's a sample of Simon's Space Quest 3 solution that should at least get you started. From the room with the pod head south. Walk almost to the bottom of the room then go east. Walk over the vertical conveyor and stand as close as you can to the buckets.

When you're dumped on the horizontal conveyor STAND as quickly as you can, then JUMP. You should then be standing on the rail. Start to walk west but BE CAREFUL: it's very easy to fall off. Walk all the way to the west until you get to the room with the robot. Walk over to the car hanging under the grabber and type GET IN GRABBER.

Go east into the next room by going left around the rail so that you appear on the far side of the room. Stop just before the right hand side of the screen and type PUSH BUTTON. A claw goes down and picks up the Warp Motivator. Go east to the section where the rail loops back round and stop just after you come onto the nearside rail. Type PUSH BUTTON.

The Warp Motivator should go into a spaceship down below. Go all the way back west to the room with the robot and stop in the centre alongside a platform. LEAVE GRABBER then go south. You'll fall down a chute and land

in a rubbish room. Walk to the west wall and LOOK IN HOLE, then TAKE REACTOR. Walk to the north-east corner of the room and CLIMB the ladder. Walk north, east, west and when you are in a red section of tunnel walk to the first bit of wire and TAKE WIRE.

Walk right, and get mugged by the rat (no seriously). He'll take the reactor off you: to get it back go west, west, south. Go to the bottom left of the screen and find the ladder, CLIMB then TAKE REACTOR again. CLIMB back up the ladder again but this time at the top, TAKE LADDER then go north, east, east, east. You should be in a room with the head of a robot at the front. Walk up to the left hand eye and DROP LADDER in front of the engine.

CLIMB, walk to the hatch, then ENTER HATCH. DROP REACTOR then USE WIRE. Go into the pilot's seat and LOOK AT SCREEN. Click on RADAR then ENGINES, TAKEOFF, WEAPONS SCREEN. Turn on the FRONT SHIELD then FIRE!

You should now have left the freighter!



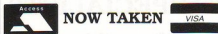
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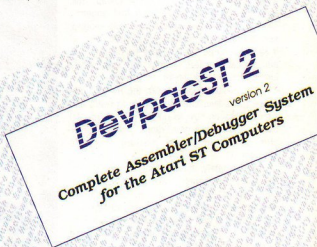
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Robokit is a cartridge that plugs into an ST, providing a user port similar to that on the BBC micro. With it you can connect various devices and detectors. Combine it with the software provided and your ST can take full control of the lot. But what's so important about the cartridge? Well, link it up to a few motors, attach some Lego, add a dash of imagination and lo and behold you have yourself a robot.

TAKE CONTROL

While you can learn all the theory needed to control the robot simply by playing with the software, you're not going to see your mouse clicks turned into actions until you get yourself a Lego Technic kit and build a robot.

If you're a Lego freak with boxes of the stuff spilling all over the floor every time you open a wardrobe you'll be laughing, but otherwise you'll need to buy new equipment. And at £140 for a set, it doesn't come cheap. Still, this isn't as unreasonable as it first appears, since to activate your robot you need motors, sensors and other specialised gadgetry. To top it all, these Lego kits can only be bought from educational suppliers – which suggests Silica's intended market for the kit.

The manual supplied with the Robokit cartridge gives five different models to build, and explanations on how to do this span some 40 pages. The models given range widely – a mini-arm, plotter, card reader, maxi-arm and a lift-operator.

Unfortunately, the instructions on how to construct the models make large leaps from one step to another. This can be confusing when you're constructing gear sets together.

While the five projects which come with Robokit are by no means easy to build, they're by no means boring either.

■ The mini-arm, the easiest to build, has one motor which revolves the arm on its base while the second operates the gripper. Two home-made microswitches are used to detect the position of the mini-arm.

■ The lift operator exploits the microswitches further. Here, one motor is used to control a moving platform. Seven "floors" are used and the lift is designed to stop whenever it reaches one of these. The project is intended to illustrate the principles behind lift operation.

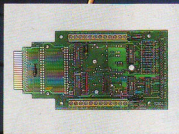
■ A card reader. Depending on the position of the holes, the card reader gives out different values which are detected by the software.

■ Drum plotter: this crude model requires you to tape a sheet of paper around a drum which rotates backwards and forwards while a pen is moved on and off the paper to make the drawing.

■ Finally, the maxi-arm. Three motors provide versatile movement around two axes and also operate a gripper steady enough to move the pieces on a chessboard.

The manual was written at a time when Lego didn't market a kit containing microswitches. As a result, you have to make your own using paperclips and tin foil as illustrated in the manual. These instructions aren't

totally obsolete, because the Lego set containing switches is considerably more expensive.

Besides details on how to construct the models, there is also useful information on wiring the motors and sensors to the Robokit interface. As soon as you've got the robot wired up to the cartridge you're ready to load the Robokit software and start getting the whole setup moving.

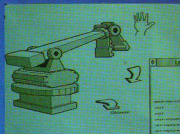
The setting-up procedure which could be better done: the software begins by asking you to select an RSU file from the disk, when there aren't any on it. Still, it all works out in the end, and the next stage is to call up an on-screen backdrop of your chosen robot. On it you position a variety of arrows and hands to represent movement in any direction. None of these icons mean anything until you assign control power and a meaning to them. There are 20 of these icons which cover most situations, but unfortunately you can only use the icons contained on disk and cannot create your own.

MOVING EXPERIENCE

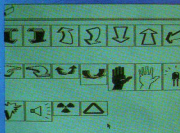
Adding commands to the icons is essential. You can design them so that they initialise a motor, make motors rotate in a certain direction or stop all movement. Altogether you can control eight motors or other switched output devices such as LEDs.

Eight buffered inputs are provided, two possessing special circuitry which allows you to interface Lego onto "Encoders." You can access the board from your own software: several examples of how to do so are provided using both C and Basic code. You could, therefore, use Robokit to do everything from setting up a burglar alarm to creating a Konix multi-system (nice trick if you can do it).

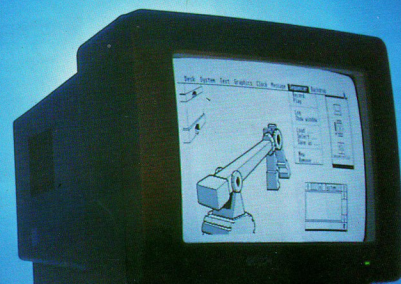
To assign a control function you must allocate a motor number and an output port to the icon. Now, by double-clicking on the appropriate icon, the robot suddenly bursts into life. It's easy to link motors to the wrong ports, however, and you could well find the kit doing

unusual things. Play around with it for a while, though, and it'll soon react correctly. For the more complex robots, like the card reader, the manual gives a list of possible problems which can arise if you've made mistakes and suggestions on how to rectify them.

KEEP AN EYE OUT

One of the best features of the software is the ability to program a sequence of instructions so that the robot can get on with its task. These sequences can be replayed at any time or even assigned to icons.

Input Watching, which enables Robokit to

watch for certain events and act accordingly, is worth mentioning. With the mini-arm, for example, micro-switches are installed so that as the robot rotates it tells you exactly where it's located.

The system can be programmed to watch for this event every five seconds in parallel with anything else currently taking place. Once you've programmed the software to watch the robot it continues to do so until instructed otherwise. You can program a reply to this function so that the robot respond when the situation becomes true.

The educational potential of Robokit is enormous. It could teach children the logic principles behind robots, for example, even though it's unlikely that you could find anything very useful for the robot to do.

Robokit can control robots - but that's not all. Its real significance is that it enables your ST to communicate with the outside world. Who knows where that might lead? ■

In the comfort of your own home:

Teletext comes to an ST screen near you

Receiving Teletext on your ST screen is not such a far-fetched idea after all. Think about it. A box of tricks is plugged into your ST printer which receives and decodes Teletext broadcasts. The Teletext frames are then squirted onto the ST's screen. No problem.

In the first instance, Teletext is sent as a series of binary digits. Your ST loves that sort of information. Second, Teletext doesn't make any big demands as far as resolution and numbers of colours on screen goes. 40 columns of text and 16 colours - low resolution can manage that with no hassle.

Microtext's Adaptor fits into the parallel port of the ST and comes with its own power supply. The Adaptor is a nondescript item, apart from an aerial socket and a port for connecting to a CVBS (or composite) monitor.

You need an aerial if you're going to cap-

ture Teletext frames. A loft or indoor aerial may work in your area, but to be on the safe side you'll need access to an outdoor antenna.

Software bundled with the Adaptor captures the frames and displays them on your ST screen (or TV) and provides plenty of other useful features that you won't find on a Teletext-Receiving television set.

When you run it for the first time, the soft-

ware lets you choose the country from which you're receiving Teletext. With that decision over, the software automatically scans the airwaves and stores the frequencies of any Teletext services it finds.

Assuming you are using the Adaptor in the UK, you'll find only four different Teletext broadcasts. These different broadcasts can be distinguished by the first line of the frame:

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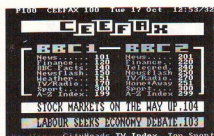
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■ The same picture is displayed in all three of the ST's resolutions. Low resolution (left) shows a picture exactly as it appears on TV

It's possible to distinguish between BBC 1 and BBC 2 frames by the frame number, which is in the 100s and 300s for BBC 1, and 200s, 300s and 700s for BBC 2. It is easy to differentiate between ITV and Channel 4, since 'ITV' or 'C4' is displayed at the top of the frame (a bit of a giveaway, that).

Frames are selected simply by typing in a three-digit number on the keyboard. On many frames there's a line displayed at the bottom of the screen containing the titles of four other pages, each in a different colour and representing the titles of the pages you are likely to select next. While you are reading the current page, the Adaptor is getting the other pages and storing them in memory. Chances are that when you click on the title of the page you want to read next it will already be in memory and therefore appear immediately. This facility, called Fastext, is only just beginning to appear

on some Teletext TVs.

You can save teletext frames for reloading either by the Microtext software, a word processor or paint package. To enable this, three formats for saved frames are supported: compact (which can store over 800 pages on a single floppy), ASCII and Degas Elite.

Pages are printed in one of two formats: Fast and Screendump. The former filters out graphics and double height characters and sends the result as normal ASCII characters to your printer. This has the advantage that it's fast and can be used with a daisy wheel. The Screendump format takes longer, but produces a true representation of the frame.

The Microtext software allows you to program the system to run through a sequence of pages automatically. A sequence program can display the pages, print them or save them to disk as compact files. The system can be programmed to wait until a certain time of day, or delays set in increments of 30 minutes, before grabbing a sequence of frames. Sequences may be run once, continuously in a loop, or automatically on insertion of a disk.

Programming the system opens up a number of interesting possibilities. It would be possible, for instance, to have Teletext data saved to disk and your own program update the results in a pools predictor or plot a graph of share movement. A standard text editor can be used to create sequence files.

Microtext's Adaptor is primarily intended for use in low resolution as this mode displays frames correctly - indeed, exactly the same as TV Teletext.

Only four colours are available in medium resolution - for most pages this is fine, but sometimes you might have red text on red background. The advantage of medium, and indeed high, resolutions is that two frames can be displayed side by side on screen at once.

TV SPREE

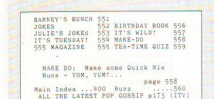
But what's the legal situation concerning all this? Just over two years ago Parliament passed a law permitting computer owners to use a TV (black and white or colour) without a licence.

You could therefore have a TV in your room and not have to pay a licence for it - if you

could prove that you used it solely for computer work.

Dedicated computer monitors - like Atari's SC1224 and SM124 - don't require a licence, of course; you do need one, however, if you wish to use Microtext's Adaptor with a TV or monitor. Teletext is just a part of what the whole TV licence is about, and, in any case, the Adaptor enables some types of monitor to receive TV programmes. And only one TV licence is needed per household, no matter how many sets there are.

If you need to receive Teletext pages regularly, or if you lack such a facility on your TV, Microtext's Adaptor is just what you need. The software is excellent and the quality of Teletext - certainly in low resolution - is actually better than a TV's picture. Additionally, any monitor with a composite video input, such as the Philips CM8833, can be used as a colour TV simply by connecting it to the Adaptor. The quality of picture obtained is excellent, because of the high resolution of the monitor's tube. Highly recommended. ■

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Dr T's two latest software releases are both "second generation" programs, designed to overcome the problems of the first big wave of ST music software.

TIGER improves on the early sequencers such as Dr T's KCS and Steinberg's Pro-24, which had poor graphic editing facilities; X-OR replaces the horde of patch editing packages which were designed to cope with only one particular make of synth.

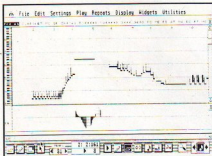

The Interactive Graphic Editor, to give TIGER its full title, is designed to work with Dr T's KCS (Keyboard Controlled Sequencer), or files from other MIDI file standard compatible sequencers. It isn't designed as a sequencer itself; the purpose of the program is to provide a powerful and easy-to-use graphic music editing environment which is, if nothing else, more fun to work with!

TIGER works in mono or – not ideally – in colour, is fully GEM-driven, and has a choice of drop-down or pull-down menus. And since the music is interrupted if you pull down a menu accidentally, the pull-down option is welcome.

The main screen consists of the menu bar, up to three player-piano style scrolling track windows, a controller window which can show performance data such as modulation wheel curves, and a number of control icons. There's also a Controller Track which contains data for the song's tempo changes.

Loading up a demo file and watching the data scrolling as the music plays gives you a

good grasp of the basic idea; each note is represented in a pseudo-3D format, with the vertical position giving the pitch, the horizontal bar length giving the duration, and a vertical stem showing the velocity. All you have to do to edit a note is to select the Draw icon, drop the note into place and drag the bars to set duration and velocity. A full range of cut, copy, paste, loop, insert, delete and move controls make life easier.

Control effects like pitchbend and vibrato are shown as curves in the controller windows. You can insert preset pitchbend effects, or draw and redraw curves to get effects exactly right, and a number of Group functions let you perform functions such as increasing the volume of every note in a required range by a definable amount. There are also note quantisation features derived from KCS.

TIGER is obviously going to appeal most to KCS users who have very limited graphic editing features, though it's so interesting it may win some support from users of other sequencers. Look out too for TigerCub, an entry-level sequencer with many of TIGER's graphic editing facilities, due out early 1990.

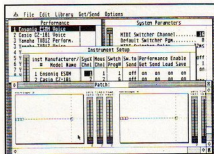
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Software patch editing packages are much more efficient and cost-effective than cartridges, memory cards or internal disk drives for storing all your synth patches. But when you have several synths, it's a pain having to buy a separate patch editor for each. Although there have been a couple of "generic patch librarians" like Hybrid Arts GenPatch, which STORE patches from practically any MIDI synth, X-OR is the first of a new generation of generic patch editors: it also allows you to change the sounds you have in memory.

Fully GEM-based, X-OR is very easy to use, particularly if you're familiar with the Caged Artist patch editors – it's by the same programmer, and it's compatible with Caged Artist patch files. The program works by allowing you to load Profiles compatible with your particular synths: the basic package is supplied with Profiles for Casio, Roland, Yamaha, Ensoniq, Kawai, Korg and many other makes of synths. Regular Profile update disks will keep the package up to date – or if you have the skill you can write your own with the E-OR utility.

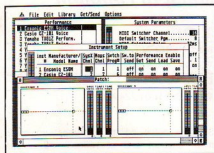
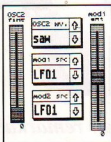
The great thing about X-OR is that its multi-

window environment lets you handle several synths at once. The Performance window lists all the Profiles you have installed; Edit windows full of the appropriate sliders, knobs and switches let you edit and test the sounds, and Library windows let you organise and save them to disk. Once you have tailored X-OR to your system, you can load or save an entire bank of sounds for each of your synths with one click of the mouse - it's that powerful. ■

Dr T main man Al Hospers was over here recently, and talked to ST Format

KCS, the Keyboard Controlled Sequencer, was the first Dr T product to make significant inroads into the ST market. Since then a number of updates and a collection of patch editors and other packages have made the company one of the biggest music software specialists in the world.

Though Dr T is named after programmer Emile Tobenfeld, the company is owned and run by Al Hospers. His visit to the Personal Computer Show was partly to negotiate with hardware manufacturers, partly to get the feel of the UK market, and partly to show the latest software productions to Dr. T's UK distributors, MCMXCIX (01 724 4104).

How is the company run, and what's your role?

We have only two in-house programmers, but we have around 18 outside developers, such as Bob Melvin, the legendary Caged Artist. Most of them are paid on a royalty basis; my role is to act as a publisher for their ideas - so if any ST Format readers have written any good MIDI programs, I'd be happy to look at them!

Sometimes we have to work to transfer a program from one machine to another; Copyist, the musical notation program, came to us on the IBM PC. Some are on the ST but need to be converted to work with MPE, our Multi-Program Environment. We're doing that now with Square Dance Audio's MIDIDrummer. I graduated in computer programming from Columbia, but I don't do much in-depth programming any more. I work on the user interfaces, such as the improved graphics on KCS 1.5 onwards, and on TIGER.

How important is the UK market to you?

Pretty big. Obviously the US is the biggest, followed by Germany, and the UK is third. I think we do well here because we have such a wide selection of products for the whole range of computers.

For instance we have the only Proteus editor for both the ST and the Amiga, and we have the best scoring package on a range of machines. Copyist. Also we usually manage to

get new products out first: OpCode had a six-month head start on us producing a Proteus editor, but we still managed to get ours out first. What's the secret? We just work hard! Have you looked at the STE yet?

We have an STE, and our forthcoming program Tigercub makes use of the enhanced graphics and sound. In the early days we limited the use of graphics because it was faster to handle text on screen. Now we've overcome those problems, and the redraw on the upgraded versions of KCS is faster than Steinberg Cubase or CLab Notator.

But we've reached the limit of the machine because there's nothing you can do about the 8MHz clock rate, blitter or no blitter. We have an Atari TT workstation, and we've got an Apple NeXT system on order. It would be nice to be able to write on a true Unix multi-tasking system; the multi-tasking on Cubase and Virtuoso is really a kludge on a machine that isn't designed for multi-tasking, and we won't do that.

The question is, which machine do we go for? Do we make everyone upgrade to a new system and throw away all their patch editors? Do we just convert X-OR, our universal patch editor, and let them use that? We'll just have to wait and see.

What about the argument that using computers takes the feeling out of music?

Well, if you're talking heavily quantised, repetitive music, maybe, but computers never replace real musicians, they just replace imbeciles! The people who've lost out were no good in the first place! MIDI and computers have given a lot of people a way to express themselves they didn't have before.

So what's Dr T's next program for the ST?

Tigercub, an entry-level 12-track sequencer with some of the graphic editing features of TIGER. It's due for release soon, at £99. We're committed to the consumer marketplace, and I think Tigercub is going to do well both in education and home studios. ■

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SHOW TIME

The PC Show featured more new software than the British Music Fair. Now the dust has settled we assess the implications

Music is undoubtedly becoming a more and more important part of the computer industry: the Personal Computer Show at Earls Court had a special stage area devoted to music demos, and an entire Music Village set aside for software houses.

The software artists in the Music Village had to compete with the racket from the coins and videos, but with a range of synths and samplers every bit as impressive as those at the BMF, the message comes across loud and clear: ST music software is growing faster than ever before.

Although it has already been pointed out that few entirely new products appeared, there was a whole host of upgrades and enhancements, many of them of considerable importance.

PRODIGY EXPECTED

Digital Muse (01 586 3445) showed V1.1 of *Virtuoso*, the only current UK-written ST sequencer, which now includes optional graphic sliders for control of many parameters; an Unlock feature which lets you scroll the Grid Edit display independently as the music plays; recording in Arrange mode; and Chase Back, a feature which searches for events such as program changes and sustained notes taking place before the point where you drop into Play in the middle of a sequence.

Virtuoso will soon be able to compete with *Creator* and *Cubase* for the professional market, when an SMPTE synchronisation box appears at £199. This small hardware unit lets musicians lock their *Virtuoso* sequences to

SMPTE signals from film or videotape.

All SMPTE standards are supported, and the unit also has an audio trigger which allows you to synchronise to click-tracks from tape, drum beats, finger-snaps, anything you fancy – just like C-Lab's *Human Touch* add-on. Also announced, though not yet priced, is a hardware MIDI port expander with four INs and OUTs.

If you want to sample *Virtuoso*'s machine-code speed without spending £299, there's an upwardly-compatible cut-down 32-track version, *Prodigy*, on the way. It has most of the same graphic editing features, but simpler controls. Cost is to be £130 and you'll get a full refund if you decide to upgrade to *Virtuoso*.

Steinberg's *Cubase* actually appeared on the Atari stand, but to everyone's disappointment it wasn't the major upgrade 2.0 on show, merely a "filler" version 1.5. This update, free to registered users, adds such features as automatic saving, faster mouse movements, and definable on-screen real-time "mixer" controls. We'll have to wait until January for V2.0 with its improved music notation facilities.

BIGGEST EVER UPGRADE

Hollis Research announced updates to the *Trackman* sequencer, including real-time fader control of instrument volume. In the next major update, *Trackman II*, there will be loads of improvements including higher note capacity, a MIDI output from the metronome, a "scribble strip" for notes, editing, undo and disk operations without stopping Play, more options for numbering patch changes and so on.

Plenty in the pipeline too from Hybrid Arts, including *Protozoa*, a patch editor for the new *E-Mu Proteus* sampled keyboard – pretty fast work, since no-one seems to have seen the *Proteus* itself yet! More usefully, the good news is that the top-grade sequencer *SMPTETrack* is to receive its biggest-ever upgrade. The bad news is that for the first time users will have to pay for it – £75. Still, you get 100 extra pages for your manual, and a host of new features including improved movement between editing pages, scrolling of any value on screen, keyboard macros for chaining commands, setting of *SMPTE* pointers during play, unmixing of sequences into separate notes (for returning drum parts for instance), a Help page, a damaged data recovery routine, and a utility to program "sets" of songs with definable pauses between pieces – great for live performances.

In issues to come *ST Format* will be taking a closer look at some of these programs as they appear – especially budget packages like Dr T's *TigerCub* and Digital Muse's *Prodigy*.

TYING UP CHORDS

Part four of our musical tutorial series tackles the tricky subjects of chords and arranging songs

This month we're dealing with the knotty question of chords. It's easy enough to create a chord – just play two or more notes at once. The tricky bit is knowing which notes go together to make pleasingly harmonious chords, and which produce a painful cacophony.

Chords are constructed according to the key in which you are playing. When an instrument is required to play more than one note at a time, the notes will appear one above the other on the staff, usually sharing the same stem (fig. 1).

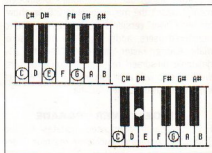
PRIMARY TRIADS

A chord takes its name from its "root note," and there are two main types: major and minor, derived from the major and minor keys. In a major key, the note sequence from the root note is "tone, tone, semitone, tone, tone, tone, semitone." In a minor key, it's "tone, semitone, tone, tone, semitone, tone, tone."

The simplest chord is a "primary triad,"

which consists of the root note, the third note up the scale, and the fifth note up: for instance, in C major, C, E and G. Flatten the E and you get C, D sharp and G; a C Minor chord (fig. 2).

HAPPY TALK

In any key there are usually three major chords which, as we technical types like to say, "sound good." In the key of C Major they are C, F and G Major, for the simple reason that all the notes in these chords fall in the scale of C major. No-one knows why, and there's a whole science of psycho-acoustics devoted to trying to find out, but it's usually said that major chords sound happy while minor ones sound sad – though since most pop music is written using minor chords, this is a little hard to defend!

Things get complicated when we begin to add notes to the basic chord, or transpose notes an octave to achieve a different effect. You may see phrases such as "Augmented 7th" or "Diminished 5th" used to describe these more complex chords.

ARPEGGIOS

A chord in which the notes are staggered in time is called an arpeggio; some synthesizers such as the Roland D5 and Yamaha DX11 feature arpeggiators, which play in sequence through any notes you hold down. This useful performance effect can be used to create backing "sequences" simply by playing the correct series of chords.

It's often said that there are no new ways of combining these chords into songs, but the art of songwriting consists of coming up with appealing chord sequences and matching melodies. Experiment with tricks like changing from major keys in the verses to minors in the chorus, as the Pet Shop Boys often do. ■

GOING FOR A SONG

Last month we covered different ways of creating sequencer patterns; now we'll look at combining these patterns into complete pieces – usually known as songs.

Some sequencers, for instance Steinberg Pro-24, operate on the "endless tape" principle. The computer's memory is treated as a long piece of recording tape, and after recording your tracks, you set start and end locator points and loops to create a Song.

A much more logical method is the pattern/song technique used by our example sequencer, C-Lab's Creator, where your patterns are chained into a song in "arrange" mode. On the left of the Creator screen is the arrange window.

Part of the reason we've chosen Creator as our example sequencer is that this arrange window is visible as you are working on each pattern, so you see the structure of an entire song at a glance.

Arranging songs in pattern mode, the sequencer will play continuously whatever pat-

tern is shown in the window. Having defined your patterns, say intro, verse, chorus, bridge and outro, click on the arrange button, and the sequencer will play through the patterns in the order you enter them in the arrange window. You can just have one immensely long pattern (in Creator, the limit is 1330 4/4 bars), but you'll probably want to use more than one.

At the top of the arrange window is the first bar of the song; all you have to do is click-and-drag to copy it further down. Each new entry in the arrange window can be given its own starting bar, pattern number and pattern name. The real power of sequencers like Creator becomes obvious when you start to edit arrangements.

Each pattern can be transposed, so that all the tracks in it change in pitch; you can mute out any tracks in a given pattern; push forward or pull back the start of the bar; and record tempo changes, either by inserting them on the edit page, or recording them in real-time as you alter the tempo reading.

You can even record in arrange mode in

this way, the structure of your song is as open as the structure of your track or pattern, and final decisions on the shape of your piece of music don't have to be taken until the last minute. If you want an extra verse, just insert it; if the chorus is too long, just click-and-drag to trash part of it.

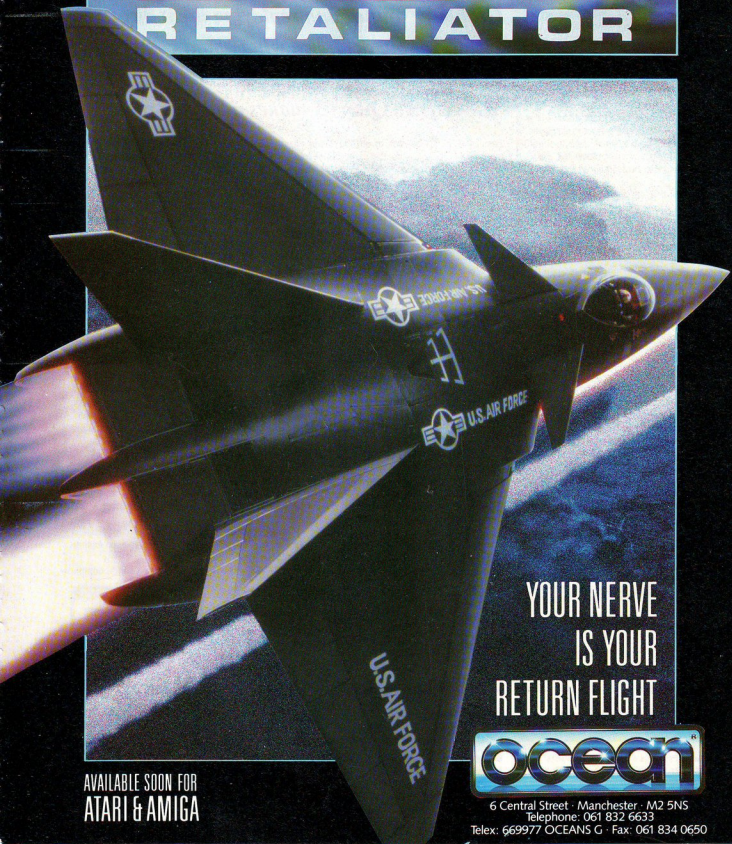
TIMING

As your song plays back, the current pattern appears in the pattern window, and Creator displays the current bar number and time in minutes, seconds and milliseconds (if you need them, there are even facilities for making a song fit in a given time – which is a boon for anyone composing music for TV or films!). You can store and recall different arrange cursor positions, and scroll through the song using the "tape transport" buttons.

Next month we'll look at some of the complex editing techniques which can transform your sequencer performances from the routine to the remarkable. ■

What do you do with a digitised sound once you've got it in memory? Play it back several times, reverse it, squash it, move sections around. Then what? You add a run-time module to it so the thing plays from the GEM Desktop. Well, excuse me for not getting excited. A single sample playing non-stop – gosh, big deal.

Now Rob Povey and Kevin Cowtan have created a composing tool which uses sampled sounds as the instruments. What's really astonishing, though, is that it's now possible to have four channels of sequenced sampled sound playing simultaneously! It's this that makes Quartet so exciting.

Quartet's main screen consists of an empty stave, several menu bar options and a handful of icons. Each voice has its own stave; but only the currently-active voice's stave is displayed. A series of notes, from a semiquaver to a dotted semibreve, are shown just below the stave. A selected note can be planted anywhere on the stave.

You don't need to know anything about music theory to use Quartet. As long as you're aware that a semiquaver is the shortest note and a semibreve is the longest (at least, in Quartet) – and notes planted lower down on the stave sound deeper than notes placed high up – you can easily fudge your way through music composition.

Drop a few different length notes here and there – listen to your efforts. Make a few changes, try again, make a few changes... Trial and error will eventually teach you to recognise which note patterns sound good and which don't.

SOUNDS LIKE ELVIS

Plonking notes down willy-nilly is just one aspect of making music – you've also got to decide which instrument (sample) to assign each note. Up to 20 instruments can sit in memory, and each note can have any of the memory-resident samples assigned to it. Complete sets of instruments can be loaded, and there are over 100 individual ones provided on the disk. Unless you're intending to create an operatic score for the didgeridoo or the fork and spoon, there are bound to be a collection of sounds which satisfy your needs.

Very flexible looping has been implemented in Quartet; it's possible to loop (or repeat) sec-

tions of your composition at any point and on any channel. Loops – so that you can set up short drum patterns and have them play over and over again – can be nested to an astonishing depth of 100. That is, you can have loops inside loops up to 100 times. In reality you'll never need anything close to that.

Doubtless you've heard the God-awful guitar sliding effects that so typify Hawaii and all those rotten movies Elvis Presley made (after he died, I think) – well, you too can produce similar sounds using Quartet, though why anyone should want to torture themselves is beyond me. (In musical terminology, incidentally, these slides and links are called slurs and ties respectively.)

RECORD BREAKERS

If the notes are of different pitches, Quartet slides between them. The first note sounds and, when it finishes, the slide to the next note begins. A link, or two notes of the same pitch, cause the duration of both notes to sound in one long tone.

A selection of pre-set time signatures can be chosen from a menu. Alternatively you can define your own. The time signature consists of two numbers; the top indicates the number of beats per bar while the lower one shows the value of the beat (2 for half-notes, 4 for quarter-notes and so on).

It's possible to transpose, or move up or down a semitone, a whole voice. Any notes that would fall off the stave are not moved.

There's a work area (buffer) in which you can put whole sections of a voice for editing – it looks just like an ordinary voice, but cannot be played along with the rest of a composition. You can, for instance, cut a specified area from a block; paste an area from the buffer into a voice; or transpose an area of a voice by first moving it into the buffer, transposing the section, and then pasting it back.

MEMO TO GAMES WRITERS

Quartet provides two MIDI modes: Poly Play and Record. In either mode it's possible to alter the current sample by pressing the instrument-select keys on your synthesizer.

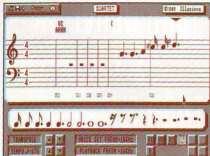
Poly Play takes the sample selected in Quartet and allows you to play your instrument using up to four channels.

The Record mode is arguably more useful, since it enables you to play your MIDI instrument and have the notes automatically appear in Quartet's active stave. Record mode clears the current voice and allows you to listen to the other three voices while inputting the fourth.

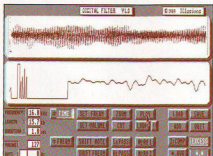
Generally the samples played back by Quartet are resolved to 8-bit at a frequency of 16kHz. Only 8-bit samples can be played, but any frequency between 4 and 16kHz is acceptable. Obviously the higher the frequency the better the resulting sound.

Provision is made for adding compositions to your own programs, with examples in Assembler, BASIC and C on the disk.

Because of the way Quartet works, compo >

■ Voices lets you combine a selection of samples for use in Quartet – cut and paste to your hearts content

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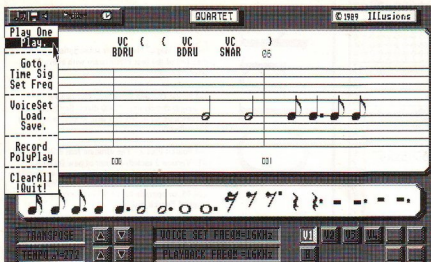
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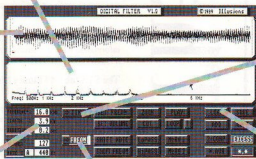

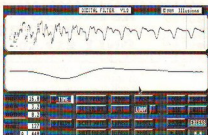

■ If you want to use new sounds in a Quartet song you need to combine all the new sounds into a voice set. The voice set must contain all the sounds used in a particular song. To allow you to create a new voice set or modify existing sets, Voices is provided.

This program loads an existing voice set, or creates a new set, to which samples may be added or removed. As many as 20 samples can be included in a voice set – as long, that is, as the combined sample length does not exceed 256K

SING YOUR OWN SONG

When you're creating songs you may want to use sounds other than the ones supplied. You can do this easily enough, but you must create a new voice set. A voice set is simply a list of sounds that can be used in a song.

First you sample the sounds you want on disk. (You can find disks full of samples in the public domain or you can create your own using a sound sampler like *Replay 4*.)

Next, load them into a program called *Digital* (supplied with *Quartet*), which lets you modify the samples so they can be used by *Quartet*. Various options exist to reduce noise, change sample length and alter the frequency. The edited sample is saved as an AVR (Audio Visual Research) file which must go through another program before being suitable for *Quartet*. But first, *Digital*.

Digital allows you to manipulate samples up to 40K on a 520ST and 64K on larger machines. These size limitations are imposed by the digital filtering algorithms. Besides, you will never want a sample larger than 64K as an individual note on an instrument lasts little more than a second.

sitions lasting several minutes take up very little memory. A typical song might take up 3K. The sampled data might add another 32K and the replaying routines a further 16K. Still, that's little more than 50K for a fantastic composition – well worth it. Memo to software houses: use this tool to add four-channel sampled music to your games – you can't afford not to!

Quartet is absolutely fantastic. You just won't believe the sound you hear coming out of your ST. You don't need a sound sampler to use the program as there are so many instruments provided (and the programmers reckon others will be distributed via the public domain), but if you have *Microdeal's* *Replay 4* you'll be able to add your own voice and other noises to compositions.

If you're the slightest bit interested in making music, or have dreams of going down in musical history, *Quartet* is the package to beat all others. Go for it!

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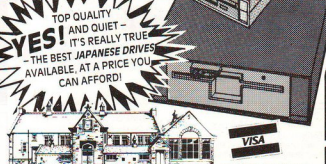
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FRONTIERS WITHOUT GAMES

A games machine, just one of the many items in your toy box? There's a company that takes very badly to such a low estimation of the ST's considerable – and so far virtually unexplored – business potential...

Cast your mind back a few short months to the beginning of 1989. ST owners, watchers and writers everywhere are buzzing with excitement at the release of a product that is destined to stretch the capabilities of Atari's baby beyond recognition. The product is *Calamus DTP*, but for Signa Publishing Systems – the company responsible – it is just one item, albeit an important one, in a series of innovative, high quality hard and software packages they're bringing to the ST market.

Signa Publishing Systems began life when company head Mike Dale discovered the first multi-lingual word processor for the ST. Realising the potential of the product, he bought the rights to the program, acquired some partners and founded a company to market the program.

The new company, however, did not head in the direction Mike had planned. "I wanted to do certain things," he explains: "they [the two partners] leaned more towards the Amiga, and I just can't relate to that machine." So Dale found himself once again in the position of setting up a new company. This time however, it was to be solely devoted to the ST.

ROCKET LAUNCH

Dale believed that although there was a multitude of good games software on the market, a dearth of serious applications was holding back the ST from achieving its true potential, and stopping it from becoming acceptable to the business buyer.

After all, Atari touted the ST as "power without the price," but a computer can only be as good as its software, and with one or two exceptions, argues Dale, software houses were content to carry on writing games and decidedly mediocre business and productivity applications.

He acquired the rights to the document processing program *Signum*, called his new company Signa Publishing – and the rest, as they say, is history.

Signa believes wholeheartedly in the ability of the ST to become more than a games console with a keyboard. "I'd been used to selling a word processor that cost £10,000," Dale recalls, "and the ST was less than a \$1,000 – including a decent monochrome screen. A nice little machine. The ST is now three or four years old and there's some damn good software for it."

Many products marketed by Signa originate in Germany, a traditional stronghold for the ST and one in which owners and software houses are continually producing exciting, new and innovative programs. "Signum took off like a rocket and other products started to come our way. We got known by the Germans as a professional operation."

Three packages of which Signa can rightly be proud are the now well established *Calamus*, and two new ones, *O-Line* and *Imagic*. In addition they're working on an inexpensive ST network that could give the machine an enormous boost in the education market

DEEP INTO DTP

Calamus is the flagship of the Signa range. At a tad under £400 the program is the first, and indeed the only, professional quality desk top publishing package available for the ST. Featuring everything that a professional designer could require – and many extra wrinkles that

hadn't been available previously at any price on any machine, such as upside down text, text at a variety of angles, unlimited command macros and so on – *Calamus* is worth every penny of its price. And then some.

Signa Publishing have just spent £30,000 to have a Linotron 300 installed at their offices. The Linotron is a professional ultra-high resolution, reproduction/typesetting device which is used in the final stages of magazine page production. (The pages of *ST Format* are produced on a Linotron before being sent to the printers.)

Owners of *Calamus* can send disks of their work to Signa who, for a nominal sum, will out-put them to the Lino and send back the finished work by return of post. The implications of this are amazing. For the first time, the person in the street with DTP talent but without the necessary capital can have work reproduced to a standard on par with professional printing and publishing companies.

LINED UP

O-line is a new text manipulation program about to be launched by Signa Publishing that enables DTP users to do fantastic things with strings of text. Previously, desk top publishers needed to use paint programs such as *Neochrome* or *Degas* in order to create new designs for text or to present text in unusual and interesting ways.

After typing a word or phrase into the program, you're presented with a graphics window with a series of icons for selecting shapes, fills, points or whatever at the side of the screen. Creating the desired text effect is then a simple matter of plotting points in the graphics window, commanding *O-line* to position curves, circles, and other geometric shapes around these points, then placing the chosen word or phrase inside the shape. Fills, shading and shadowing can be added, the image can be reversed, copied or mirrored, then dumped to a printer or imported into a DTP application such as *Calamus*.

The results of *O-line* have to be seen to be ➤

believed, and for once the computing cliché that you're "limited only by your imagination" has a grain of truth. The program places the power of graphic manipulation programs such as the Mac's *Freehand* and *Illustrator* into the hands of Atari ST owners for a fraction of the price of those programs.

Release is imminent, and the program is expected to be priced around £150.

NOW THAT'S MAGIC!

Ever seen those screens in the windows of shops that tempt you to buy expensive goodies by using a variety of animated pictures and text which flash into view, blend into one another, fade out and generally attract your eye? If you have it's not a sight you forget. Now *Imagic*, a control program to allow you to create your own storyboards, adverts and fun displays, is available for the ST.

Produced in Germany, *Imagic* provides you with all the tools necessary for editing, merging and presenting pictures. Effects such as wipe (one picture gradually sliding over another), mirroring, reversing, merging, flashing and scrolling in every direction can be selected via icons from a panel on screen and applied to the pictures you've drawn with *Imagic* or imported from paint programs and scanners.

You can create animated slide shows consisting of up to 2,500 - count 'em - frames, all loaded and run from memory, so there's no time-consuming disk accesses to slow the program down. *Imagic* will work not only with high resolution monochrome screens, but with colour monitors and televisions. And when you've finished your masterpiece you sell it or give it away to friends. Those of us yearning to be the next Steven Spielberg can have the

neighbourhood stores running a variety of your advertising films on their ST monitors.

NETWORK IF YOU CAN GET IT

One of the most discussed subjects concerning small computer systems at the moment is the network. Connecting together a number of personal computers in order to allow them to share resources such as printers, hard drives, tape streamers and modems, and to provide access to programs and data boosts efficiency and significantly improves productivity.

The PC and compatibles world has a large quantity of reliable local area networks (as the small networks are called), but until now the ST has had to remain a single user machine. Colleges, schools and small business wanting to use several STs had to attach separate peripherals to each machine.

The large investment of cash this would require has hitherto deterred many would-be users from choosing the ST. But Signa are currently working on and testing a new local area network specifically designed to exploit the power of the machine - yet at a price which makes setting up an ST network an attractive proposition.

Based on the ethernet principle (using a simple, cheap co-axial to form the network) the network can support up to 255 stations, each with the ability to access peripherals at any other point on the network.

Extensive file locking, password and other safety devices have been built into the net software to filter out possible weak areas, and there are gateways to allow the net to be connected to others running different operating systems such as the industry best-seller Novel.

The net will run on all STs, and has an intuitive "front-end" so that novices can quickly become conversant with its operation. STs interface to the net via a box containing the ethernet electronics, RAM memory and network traffic routines.

BACK TO THE FUTURE

The future looks rosy indeed for Signa. As well as the best selling *Signum* word processor, the innovative *Aladin* Mac emulator and a DTP package against which all others are measured, the company is pouring much time and effort into the development of a genlock/scanner/desktop video system which is already attracting attention from two major television companies in the UK. "I set this company up with one aim in mind," says Dale: "to really get on the professional route with avant garde products, with a view to servicing people's needs. It's an exciting time. The ST is finally coming to maturity."

Like most missionaries, Dale overstates his case. To listen to him you'd almost believe that playing games really screws up your ST. He's absolutely right, of course, to argue that there's a lot more to come from the machine - you only have to have contacts in Germany and the States to see what we're going to be doing in 18 months or two years.

Yet if one considers those two heavyweight machines the Macintosh and the PC, it's evident that the old 8-bit "serious/games" dichotomy is becoming increasingly threadbare. After all, the Mac and PC pioneered the "boss key" - hit the button in a game and a spreadsheet comes up - and it's mostly through the swapping of games, not serious software, that viruses are spread, suggesting that plenty of games are played on these "business" machines. There's nothing wrong with playing games, even if a machine is primarily a workhorse (tell that to the boss).

And yet you can't blame Dale. It takes dedication and singlemindedness to produce programs like *Calamus*, just as it takes those qualities to produce first class games - and there are plenty of those for the ST, too. So carry on playing, but whatever you do don't make the mistake of calling the ST a games machine. Not, at least, while Mike Dale is within earshot... ■

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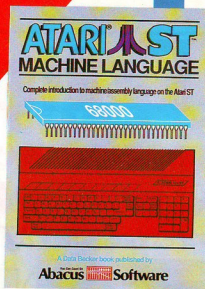
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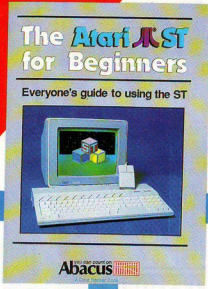
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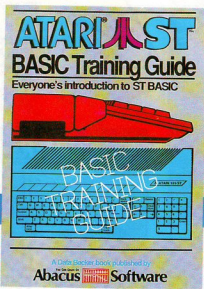
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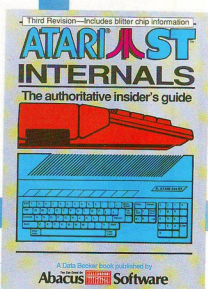
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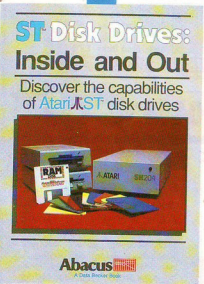
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Programs for 50p, when we all know they cost at least £25 each? If you don't believe me, take a look at a copy of any good public domain catalogue. The disk I'm reviewing this month comes from Goodman PD, priced at £2.50 (£1.25 if you provide your own disk). Number GD71 in their latest catalogue contains five educational games. While none of them will exactly turn a child into an Einstein overnight, they are all of value, and their simplicity will appeal to pre-school and infant children.

Four of the programs come under the "Kid" category, a series written by an American programmer, D A Brumleve, who has a special

interest in educational software. These are Kidgraph, Kidmusic, Kidpiano and Kidgrid2. If you see other PD programs with the "Kid" prefix, they're more than likely from the same source and worth looking at.

Kidpiano is the simplest, and slightly disappointing. (Having said that, no doubt 200 readers will write in and say "Well, my children loved it!") It gives a three-octave keyboard on the screen, and a choice between organ and piano sounds. Click on a key and the note plays. I suppose you'd have cause for complaint if it didn't; but that's all it does.

There are better keyboard programs in the public domain, such as Deluxe Piano. It's a complex program designed for adults, but your child can have more fun pressing the ST's keys to get different sounds than moving the mouse around.

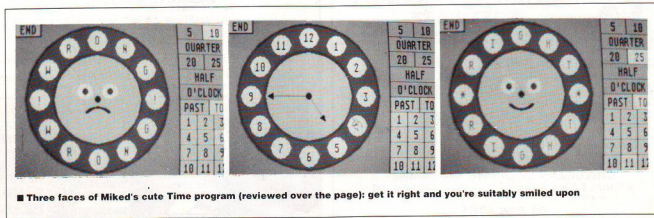
Kidmusic puts eight pictures on the screen. Click on one of these to hear a simple nursery rhyme tune. For example, the teapot gives

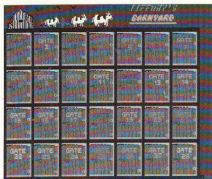
you... well, it sounds like Baa-Baa Black Sheep to me. Very young children will love hearing Rock-a-Bye-Baby, Old MacDonald and London Bridge is Falling Down.

CREATIVE PLAYTIME

Two similar programs are Kidgraph and Kidgrid II (a follow-up to the box-office smash, Kidgrid I), both scaled-down art programs. Kidgraph prints a 28x19 grid on-screen and a palette of 14 colours down the side. Click on a colour to choose it, and click on a square in the grid to fill it in. The left mouse button gives you one dollop of colour, while the right gives a continuous fill. There's an Erase option - but take care! There's no second chance, an accidental click wipes out your masterpiece and it's tears before bedtime.

There are three sample paintings to show that you can indeed produce decent results, and you can save your own offerings to disk. It's hardly Degas Elite, but apart from its minor faults it's worth having for the infant/young junior child to play with. They can get used to creating designs and seeing how pictures can be built up from smaller shapes - in the way that Logo does, when they encounter that at school.

Kidgrid2 is similar but the graph becomes a grid made up of larger squares, each divided into triangles by two diagonal lines. It is capable of subtler designs and drawings with save/load/erase options again available.

The final program on the disk is Barnyard, a computerised version for two children of the old Matching Pairs card game. There are 28 gates on the screen - click on one and the name of an animal appears. You have to try to find a matching name. Good for both memory and spelling. The game has survived a long time, so children must enjoy the comical animation, the rhythmic music and the shuffling of the cards each time round.

Though none of these programs will drive anyone wild with excitement, they provide younger children with entertainment and test their skills in the use of shapes and colours.

Regard them as "Creative Playtime." Give your child a disk, on which favourite games can be kept. And if he or she wants to erase any of them because they're boring, don't forget: they only cost 50p.

Miked's programs

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The young child who has mum, dad, the ST and a copy of the Time program from Miked has no excuse for not getting to grips with the clock-face. Mum and dad need to do some groundwork first, to introduce the idea of the fingers on the clock, since Time (the program, that is) makes no attempt to teach you about big and little Hands.

The "Teach" option displays a face with the hands set to a random time. The numbers being pointed to flash, and as the child clicks on one with the pointer, the time is shown in boxes at the side of the screen. There's a mix of words and numbers, with boxes for half, quarter, past, to and so on, as well as 20, 25 and so on. If the child can use the mouse and can read a little, the relation between clock hands and the time will slowly sink in.

There are a couple of Test sections, one with help and one without. In both the clock is drawn and the child must click on the appropriate boxes to say what time it is. If the answer's

right you get a smiling face; and if it's wrong, a frowning one and the correct answer. The best educational programs are those which choose a simple subject and cover it thoroughly in a sensible manner: this does just that.


All Miked's programs are well-presented, colourful and lively, and they're (comparatively) cheap because, as the company says, "We don't include any fancy packaging." In fact there's no packaging at all, just a disk and a covering letter, with the instructions in a DOC file on the disk for you to print out for yourself if you wish.

SNOOKERED

Trust the reviewer to go straight in and find the one fault in the program, by pure fluke. Miked's Word Search program creates a grid of jumbled-up letters on the screen, and you're asked to find a number of words hidden in there. It's a popular game, as its constant appearance in magazine and newspaper competitions testifies - in fact it could be a lucrative skill to have!

Word Search offers 40 categories of words and as if to confirm my mis-spent youth, I chose the Snooker option. The program gives you the grid, with the hidden words displayed alongside (an option to turn this off would help), and when you spot a word you must click on its first and last letters. This draws a red line through the intervening letters. All words are in straight lines, backwards or forwards, up, down or diagonal.

I spotted E-U-C, and clicked at once. "Wrong!" it told me. What? There it is in black and white, I yelled, CUE, it can't be wrong! Sure enough I found another C-U-E combination else-

where, which was correct, and I began to doubt the value of the entire program. An hour later and I realised I'd hit on the one mistake in the whole 40 categories.

This is a fun program, and absolutely compulsive. Its educational value? It's good for spelling, but also perhaps for logical thought as you try to work out the remaining words. ■

SOUND, MAESTRO

Alex Theedom from Peterborough wants to know whether it's possible to use *Mastersound* samples within the STOS *Maestro* package.

There's no reason why *Mastersound* samples can't be used in this way since they're compatible with *Prosound* - the ST standard for samples. But *Mastersound* will only sample at rates of 5KHz, 7.5KHz, 10KHz and 15KHz, so it's not possible to use the variable playback rates found within STOS.

VIRUSES - PROTECT OR DIE

We've had a desperate plea about viruses this month from **James Lea** of Sussex. He's found himself well and truly infected and is worried that his machine has been permanently virused. The problem, however, is not that the machine has been infected but that the disk he is booting up with contains a virus. A virus copies itself into the memory of the machine and then subsequently copies itself back out to all disks placed in the drive unit.

The way around this is to get hold of a PD virus killer or, better still, CRL's excellent *Virus Killer* software. Now, switch on the ST without

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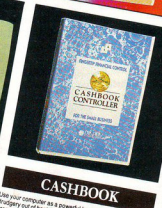
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placing any disk in the drive. It will take a while but the machine will eventually come up with a Desktop. Insert the virus killer in the drive and double-click on the main program. Now use this to wipe the viruses. CRL can be contacted on 01-533 2918 and Virus Killer costs £9.95.

Whilst we're on the subject of viruses, here are some facts courtesy of **Matthew Verinder** of Pontypridd which may help:

1. Viruses can't copy themselves onto a disk if it's write-protected, so write-protect as many as you can.
2. Viruses aren't all that common. Most games are virus free as is PD software, although the occasional one has been known to be infected – and no, we've never put one on the Cover Disk.
3. If you suspect you've got a virus then switch off your machine and wait for a few seconds. Don't re-boot with the same disk. Viruses can survive a reset so don't depend on this.
4. Try using up-to-date virus killers since these can detect the difference between an auto-booting program and a virus.

If you want to find out more about viruses and their history then track down a book called *Computer Viruses – A High Tech Disease* by R. Burger, published by Abacus.

YOUR CONDUCTOR SPEAKS

The trouble with sampling music is the amount of memory it takes up – particularly if you want good quality samples and need to take them at a high rate. No matter how large your disk space might be, you're still restricted by the amount of memory that you have in your machine – and that means 4MBytes at the most.

So what do you do if you need to take samples that are longer than just a few minutes. As **D.C. Derrick** from Somerset found out, you need a sampler that works in real-time. But why aren't there any around?

Until recently they've been impossible to program because to sample sounds and send output to an exterior device would take up too much processor time. That situation has altered

DOUBLE THE SIZE



With the vast number of PC emulators appearing recently, we're getting a lot of enquiries about how to link a 5.25-inch disk drive to your ST. Most 5.25-inch drives will connect to the ST but it's a good idea to go for one of the better models since these are very reliable. Cumana make some of the best and these can be purchased from most places – just scour our ads for one.

They attach to the second floppy port and are treated exactly like any other second floppy. Consequently, you don't have to have a PC emulator to use them.

because hard drives have much faster reading and writing operations now, but we still need someone to produce the software. This is where 2-Bit systems come in.

By the time you read this, 2-Bit will be marketing the only 16-bit CD quality sound sampler currently available for the ST. With the enormous amount of data required to achieve this quality, they have had to sample directly to hard drive. The software will only run with the faster hard drives but there are plenty of these out there.

CD quality sound doesn't come cheap. At £600, the as yet unnamed sampler, is also the most expensive on the market. If you've got the dosh to spend contact 2-bit on 0582 457348 for more details.

COLOURFUL WORDS

Colin Strickland from Cheshire is having problems printing text in GFA Basic. He wants to know how to change the colour of text without using the TEXT command to print. This requires you to enter the pixel address of the start and not the character location.

Ordinarily, DEFTXT has no effect if you use it with any PRINT commands but it does make changes to the display if you use TEXT. The way around this is to open a window first. Now the PRINT command will respond to the DEFTXT parameters. This unfortunately reduces the size of the screen and text is printed at a slower speed.

Opening windows will change the look of the screen but there is a way to clear the window boxes due to a slight error in GFA Basic. Grab the whole screen just before opening the window with the SGET AS command. Now open the window and follow it with the command, SPUT AS. All of the window area lines are removed and you can use the PRINT command in conjunction with DEFTXT.

GET COMPATIBLE

As it stands it's not possible for you to save a STOS picture and load it up in another package. However, the way that STOS stores the data on disk means that you can save STOS's raw data so that it will be compatible with other formats. This is how it's done, courtesy of **Colin Strickland** from Cheshire (again).

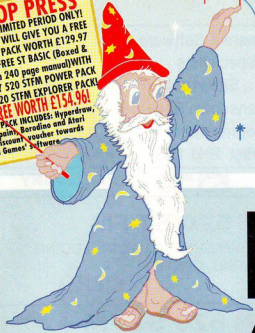

ADVENTURES OF A DISK DETECTIVE

I recently bought a copy of Protext for my ST word-processing, and I thought that anyone who, like me, has an early single-sided drive ST might be interested in a problem I encountered. Protext is supplied on doubled-sided disks, but that's not the problem - Arnor changed them for single-sided within two days! When I'd installed the program to run with my Star LC24-10 printer, everything seemed to be OK except that the printer wouldn't underline, and wouldn't print in any typeface but the one in current use on the printer. In other words, the software and printer were battling for control: and the printer was winning!

I was puzzled by this, since the correct printer driver had been installed, as was confirmed by the Protext Status Line. Arnor were puzzled too, as if the driver showed up there it must have been installed properly and there'd been no other complaints from Star LC24-10 users. After a lengthy chat with Arnor at the PC Show, it began to look like there must be something wrong with the printer.

It was then I noticed something odd. The printer driver on my start-up disk was smaller than the printer driver on the master disk. Funny, I thought. I tried to re-install the driver, and this time noticed a message flashed up very briefly on-screen, to the effect that the disk was full and the installation was unsuccessful. When I'd installed the program the first time I must have been looking away when that message was flashed up, as it's only on-screen for a few seconds. Although I'd notice that the start-up disk was full, software companies often use the "0 bytes available" as a protection device - certainly Arnor's spelling dictionary disks are a little like that - so I didn't think anything of it. What had happened was that the printer driver file had been opened and partly transferred, which was why it appeared on the status line, but not all of the driver commands had gone across. In order to get the full driver on a single-sided start-up disk, you have to remove the CONFIG.PRQ file and put it on a sepa-

rate disk - something the manual doesn't tell you.

That done, and the printer and software talking happily to each other, I must say that Protext is wonderful - having seen it in action on the Amstrad PCW I knew it was good, but the ST version is superb.

BLACK OUT

How is it that every game has white people in it as the main characters - and usually as their minor characters as well? Why do software companies never use black people in their games or in advertisements?

Here's a rough count of adverts with black people in, compared to white people, from issues one to four of ST Format. Adverts were counted only once and only if a human appeared in it.

Number of white people = 38
Number of black people (foreground) = 4
Number of black people (background) = 3

Why do companies always use white people? Magazines tend to be just as bad - including yours. I know you will argue that you used a picture of a black person on issue two's front cover, but that's about the only time.

I would be interested to hear other people's views on the subject.

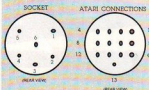

You can indeed use your CPC monitor, Chris, and it's fine for games - though I have to say it's not much fun trying to word process with its garish and kind of "buzzy" colours. These things I know because for ages I had the two plugged together.

Show the accompanying picture and instructions to your local electrical or computer shop. They'll insist - as mine did - that the thing is impossible, couldn't be done and so on. Then they'll look again and tell you it'll be ready a week Thursday, that'll be £17 and would you like to pay now?

**Wire the socket thus:**

1 ground; **2** composite/sync;
3 blue; **4** green; **5** red

The red, green and blue outputs need resistors to get the brightness right; this is better (and safer) than opening the monitor. **12/0:** should be about right, but you may need to experiment. The composite sync can be taken from the composite video output.

6 red; **11** blue; **13** ground
The diagram is taken from the plug and is therefore the reverse of that shown in the Atari manual.

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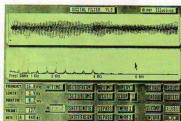
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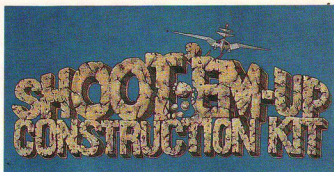
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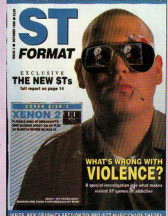
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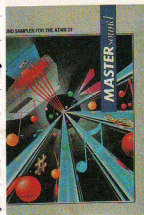
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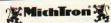
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Several leading laser printer manufacturers have begun concerted campaigns to convince us that laser printing is within our reach. The main thrust of this argument is aimed at corporate buyers – the sales pitch goes, “now you can afford to have a laser per desk, rather than one per office.” This, of course, may sell large numbers of printers to big companies, but it also means end users (like us) may soon be able to afford our own. So what's on offer?

Laser Jet IIP

The P stands for Personal, and the size of the machine does mean it could sit on the corner of a large desk. It's a completely new machine, with a new Canon laser engine. It only prints four pages per minute, but for many purposes this is adequate.



■ **Laser Jet IIP from Hewlett Packard, a neatly designed printer with a new Canon laser engine, compact enough to sit on your desk. Remember the P stands for Personal – not pencil!**

The base machine comes with .5MByte of RAM, upgradable to 4.5MByte. A PostScript add-on cartridge is promised for around £800 in six months time – 2MBytes is needed to run it, though.

The price quoted above is the RRP for the printer, including VAT, but you may well be able to pick one up for around £1,150 when the market determines a street price.

The printer itself is a neat design with handy illuminated press switches for most selections. Paper feeds onto the top and can be hand fed from the front of the machine, placed in a low capacity 50-sheet tray slotting into its underside or put in a larger tray which slots into the front (adding to the printer's length). Print quality is good with the HP standard pair of Courier and Line Printer fonts now adding italic as standard.

This Canon printer, as you might expect, looks very similar to its HP variant. The main difference between the two is the LBP-4's fonts. These are directly scalable from within the printer. They are printed from outlines, like

Following ST Format's definitive survey of low cost laser printers, a spate of new product launches has increased the available range. We give the newcomers the once-over

PostScript, but on the base machine are restricted to Swiss and Dutch outlines (as per GEM).

An add-on i.c. card, costing £171.35, will give Swiss Narrow, Bookman, Century Schoolbook, Avant Garde, Zap Calligraphy, Zapf Chancery and Dingbats. This set is suspiciously similar to the PostScript set on Apple's Laser-Writer, but Canon will also be able to supply a PostScript font card around March next year.

The LBP-4 can apply special effects to any of its scalable fonts. These include outlines, drop shadows and pattern filling. Characters can be rotated through 360 degrees in one degree steps.

All this sounds pretty good, but currently there's little application software support for these features. Although Canon are working with most of the top companies to write drivers, how many of these will filter through to ST products is still uncertain.

As well as having a smaller footprint than the standard office laser, it is equipped with Courier, Times, Helvetica, Letter Gothic, Pretoria and Line Printer fonts as standard. They're available in roman, bold, italic and bold italic styles.

It also includes the Prescribe language which lets you produce high quality vector graphics and fancy text by programming the printer directly. This is a versatile language, unique to Kyocera, and should be suitable for direct control of the printer from an ST.

Two other recent releases are the GLX 600 from Gestetner and a low-cost entry from IBM (with great flair and originality) the Laserprinter.

The GLX 600 is a fairly standard LaserJet II compatible 6 ppm machine with two cartridge slots, .5MByte of RAM and the same Courier and Line Printer fonts as the HP range.

The Laserprinter, designed and built by IBM, sports half the moving parts of most lasers, which should be good for reliability. It's LJ II and ProPrinter compatible and claims to have ten resident fonts as standard (in printer manufacturer's terms these often refer to different sizes and styles of the same typeface, though).

Dealer price for this one should level out at around £1,700. ■
