FOX ENTERS VIDEO GAME SOFTWARE BUSINESS

Chicago, IL -- Twentieth Century-Fox Film Corporation has entered the video game industry with the formation of Fox Video Games, Inc., it was announced today by C. Joseph LaBonte, Fox president, who will be responsible for the operation of the new venture. Based in Saratoga, Calif., the new company will market its products under the name of "Twentieth Century-Fox Games of the Century."

Fox Video Games initially will develop, produce and market video games which will be compatible with the ATARI VCS home game system.

LaBonte said, "The formation of Fox Video Games is a natural extension of our Company's objective to be a prime software supplier to the home video market. We intend to take advantage of the burgeoning business opportunities in all facets of home video entertainment."

Frank O'Connell has been named president of the new company. He formerly was senior vice president, sales and marketing of Mattel's Electronics Division.

O'Connell said that his primary objective will be to build a unique, leading international company which will provide consumers a wide variety of software for home electronic systems. "Our initial introduction of products will be at the June, 1982 Consumer Electronics Show in Chicago where we are introducing four new innovative games for release in the fourth quarter of 1982," O'Connell said. "The intro-

duction of our games will be backed by a substantial advertising and promotional campaign."

Fox Video Games will be located at the Twentieth Century-Fox Video booth (no. 410) at CES.

In addition, Paul G. Carter has been named senior vice president of Fox Video Games. Carter has an extensive financial background and formerly was director of corporate finance for Nutech.

Fox Video Games is a wholly owned subsidiary of Twentieth Century-Fox Film Corporation.








