Phil is manager of Paragon Computers and he will be at the show with a Hawke OCR (optical character recognition) machine.

This is the latest in

OCR machinery, said Phil.

"Scansoft is the amazing software driving force which couples up with the Hawke to produce results of remarkable quality," he said.

"The Hawke and Scansoft combine with incredible speed, which is faster than a speeding Macintosh.

"There are Hawke machines which will combine with a wide range of computer systems and we hope to have one at the show.

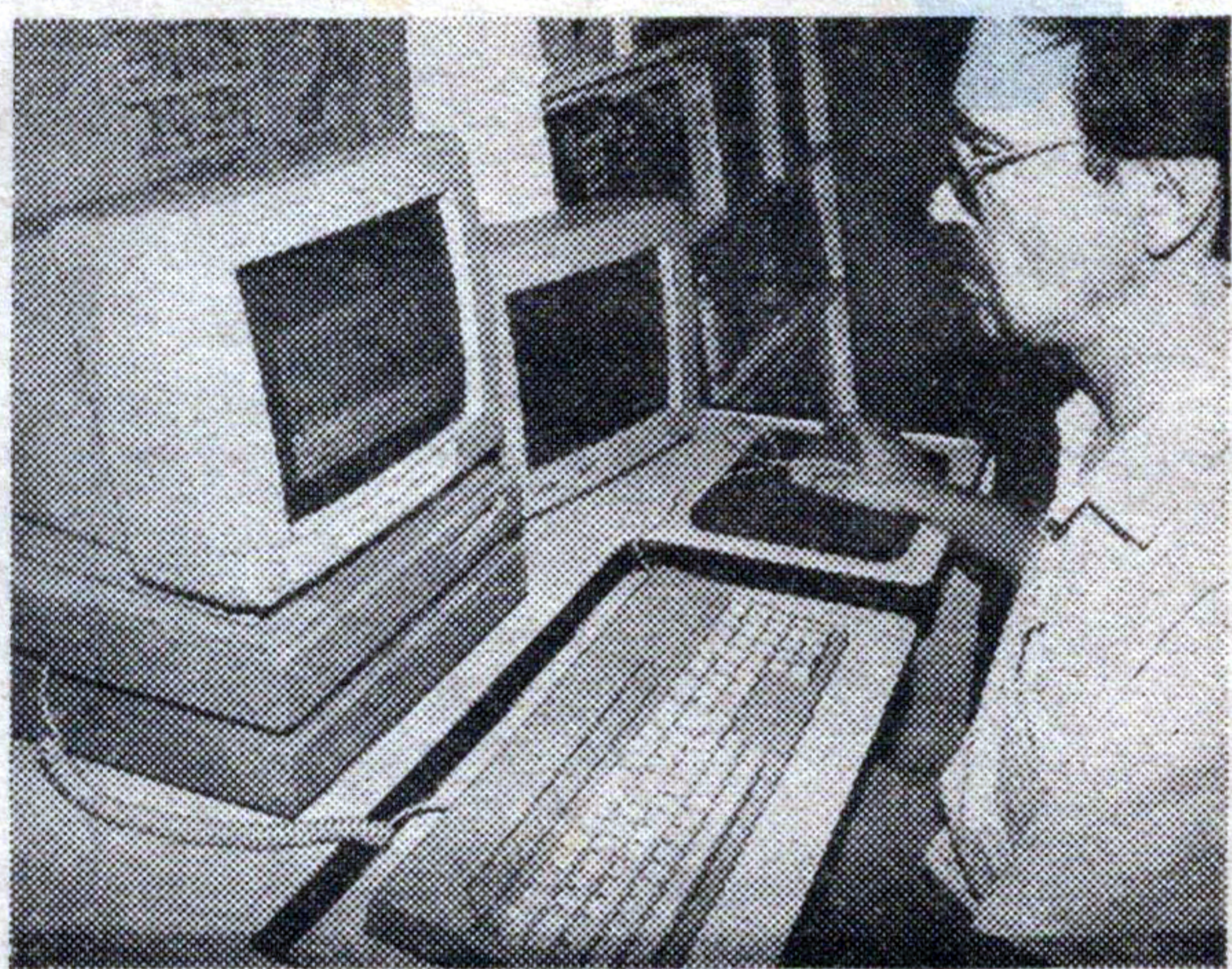
"The OCR software combining with the Hawke is Augur, a brilliant piece of programming out of Germany.

"Augur is one of the most professional, accurate and inexpensive OCR systems available for any micro computer."

Phil said the company would reveal, for the first time in WA, the Atari AT compatible — PC4.

"The PC4 is an 80286-based machine with 640K of main memory (Ram) expandable to 1Mb and a range of graphics and video capabilities," he said.

Paragon will also be demonstrating CD-Rom, an A3 monitor which runs two papers side by side on-screen and a ATW T800 transputer workstation.
