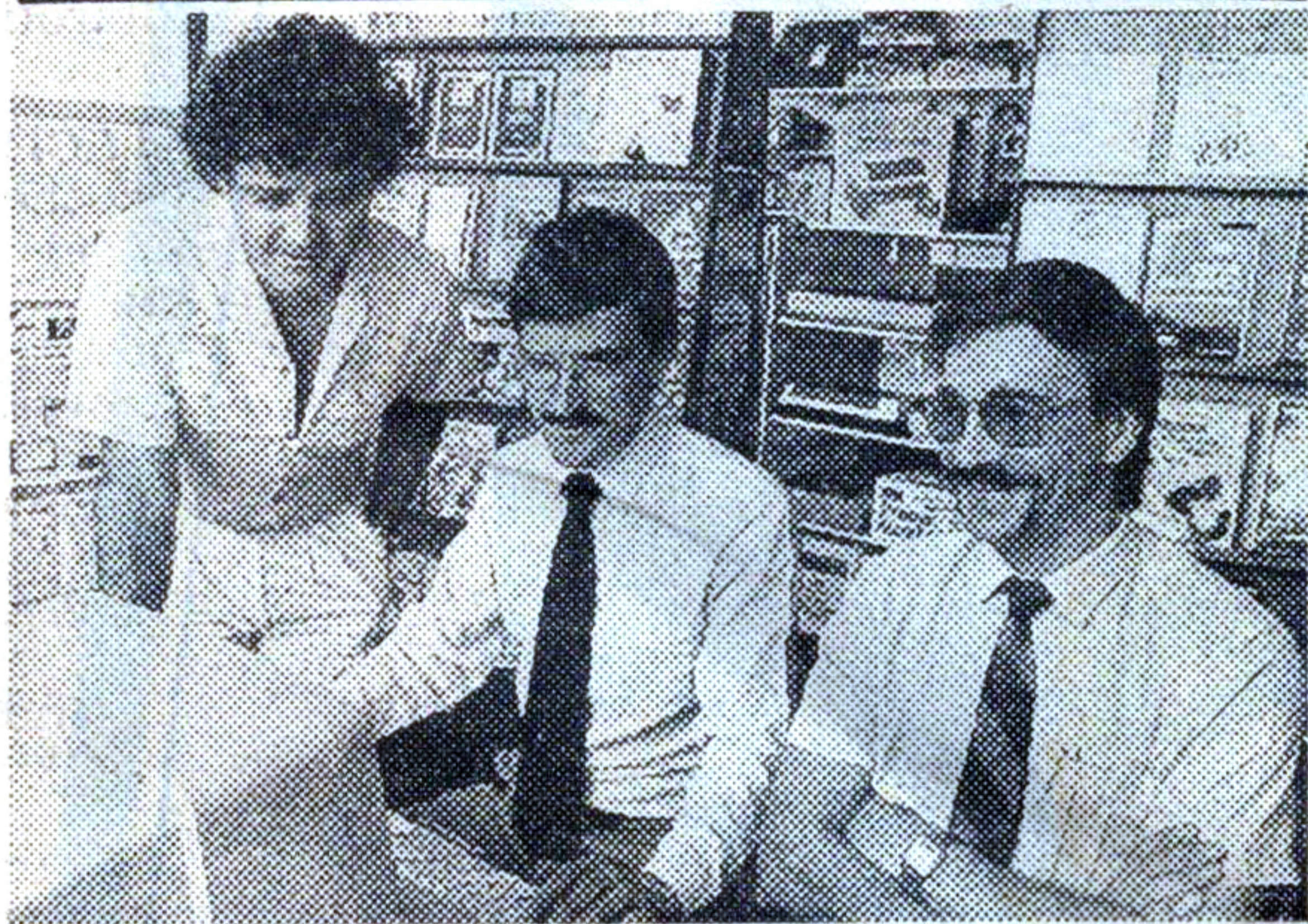


Top Atari dealer to display full range

IN JUST a few months, WA's newest Atari dealer has become Australia's major outlet for Atari's 16-bit computers.

Paragon Computers will be at the show to display the full range of Atari 16-bit models — 1040 ST, 520 ST, Mega ST4 and the Mega ST2.

Bob Stuart, of Paragon, said Atari computers were becoming popular with the business community, especially for desktop publishing.

"Teamed with an Atari laser printer, the package makes a very efficient desktop publishing unit," Mr Stuart said.

"Paragon has been successful, because no other dealer in Australia knows more about the ST range than Phil and Bob Reeves.

"Phil brought one of the first Atari's into Australia and has worked with them ever since."

Visitors to the show will also be able to see Atari's PC2, an IBM compatible XT computer.

There is a PC1, but Atari has decided not to release it in Australia.

Paragon staff will be demonstrating Atari's midi capabilities and the Aladin Emulator, running Macintosh programs.

"The advantage of running Mac programs with an ST, is they run faster and the screen is one third larger," Mr Stuart said.
