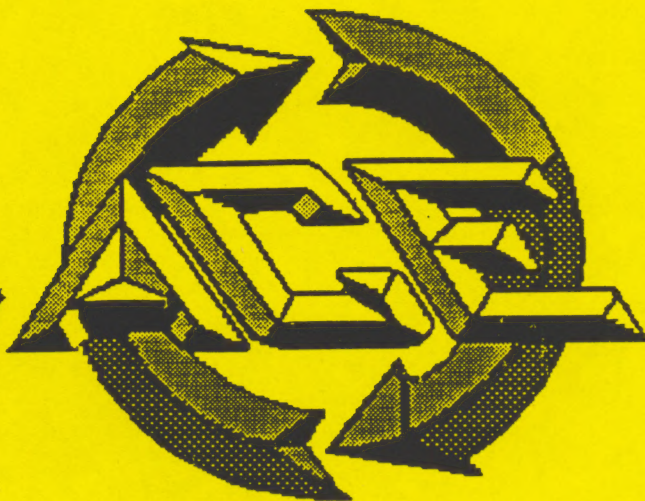

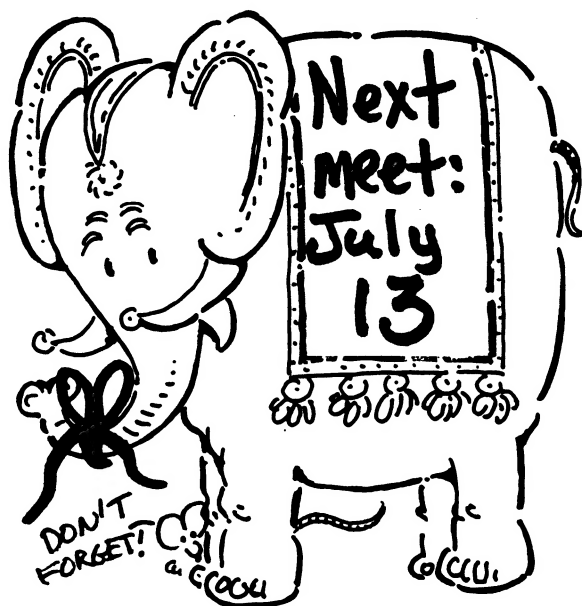

July, if we receive enough interest (over 6 calls), Dave will be there with Atari Guts everywhere.

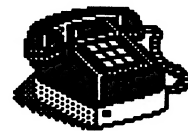
As interest increases, we may want to consider some Magical Surgery—a real computer repair AS WE ALL WATCH! Boy, talk about pressure!!

Modem Problems by Jeff Golden



If you are having problems logging on to the DALACE BBS while using 850 Express, then the problem may be with your modem cable. However, before tearing into your cables, first be sure that Mode = Ascii, not Atascii.

There are some Atari modem cables out there that only have three pins connected on the DB9 connector. These cables work fine with AMODEM. (DALACE disk #70), but do not work very well with 850 Express. The symptoms are: the modem dials correctly; the BBS answers with some beeps and buzzes; but the CONNECT message never appears and the Express program eventually times out and redials.

There are also some cables that are missing pin 6 or pin 8 on the DB25 connector. These cables will fail in the same way unless pin 2, carrier detect, on the DB9 connector is faked out by connecting it to data set ready, DB9 pin 6.

A better option for those cables with eight crimped-on DB25 pins. (not solder tail), is to punch out the pins in the DB25 connector and reinstall them in the correct locations. A light rap with a punch and a pair of pliers on the end of the pin should do it without damaging the connector/pins too much. Check that the pins are secure after reinstalling them. The worst that could happen is that you might have to buy a new connector.

It is also possible that some of the older, cheaper modems may not provide carrier detect on DB25 pin 8. Check your modem manual.

The connections that work for me are as follows:

Male DB9-----Male DB25

pin 1 data terminal rdy pin 20
 pin 2 carrier detect pin 8
 pin 3 send data pin 2
 pin 4 receive data pin 3
 pin 5 signal ground pin 7
 pin 6 data set ready pin 6
 pin 7 request to send pin 4
 pin 8 clear to send pin 5

The pin numbers are marked in very fine print on both sides of the connectors adjacent to the pins.

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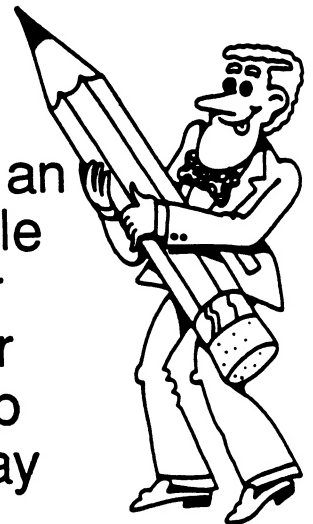
DALLAS ATARI COMPUTER ENTHUSIASTS

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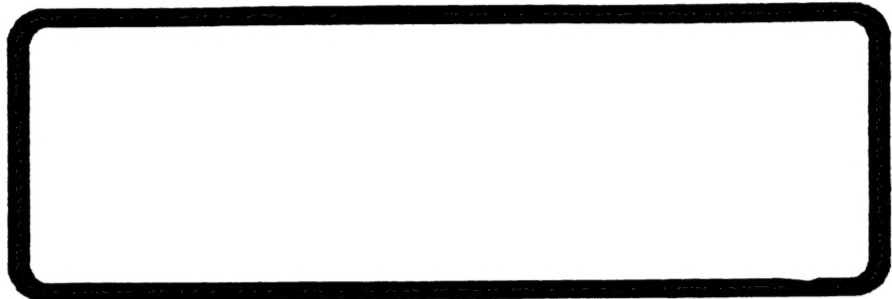
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
