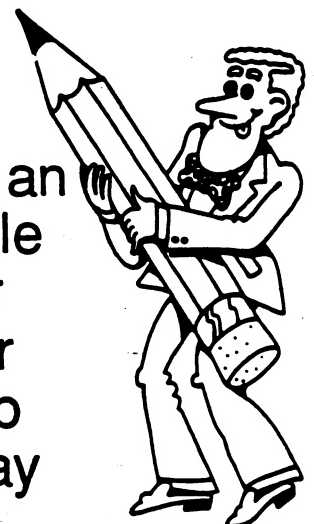
DALACE, INC DALLAS ATARI COMPUTER ENTHUSIASTS

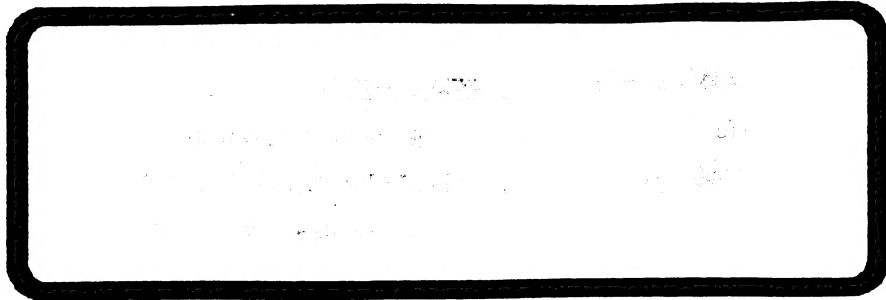
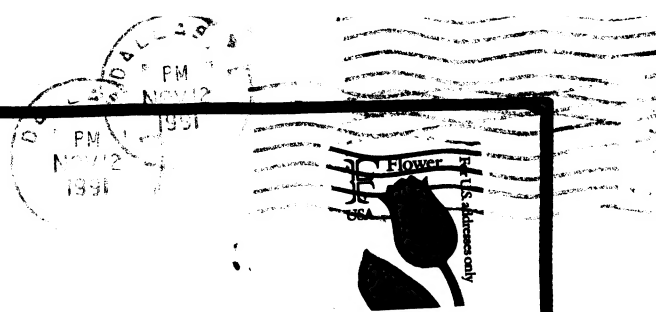
