Whatever your ST interests, there's plenty here to keep you busy. Enjoy!



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
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Killer TOS on the loose

An illegally circulated, pirated and potentially dangerous version of the Atari TT operating system has been discovered on British bulletin boards. The software is an early alpha test version of TOS 2.2 which contains few of the features of the full package and could well wreck your hard drive or corrupt your disks.

Participating in an on-line conference, Derek Mui of Atari USA has revealed that the software is definitely "not an official release version." He added that to the best of his knowledge it was "done by an irresponsible person who stole an alpha test version of the Desktop, put in a version 2.0 title in the info box and distributed it." He had a word of warning for anyone contem-

plating using the software: "If you insist on using it, that's fine with us. But don't complain to us that it trashes your files or wipes out your whole partition!"


Alistair Burton of Atari UK's technical team told *FORMAT* that there are two pirated versions of the TOS circulating illegally. "One version is very buggy," he said, "but I wouldn't imagine that it's going to be causing too many problems, because there's not much to it." He told us that there was a version 3.00 which had originated from Germany and "which is very nearly a final version, 3.01 being the full version. It uses TT

specific instructions, however, so it's not a lot of use to people."

Peter Staddon of Atari UK was unaware of the illegal TOS before *FORMAT* informed him. "This operating system is an illegal product," he states. "It is a prototype, it's not finished. We would strongly recommend that no-one uses it." He also stressed that Atari take a very dim view of this type of piracy: "it's a very serious piece of software, therefore it's important that it goes out in its correct form. Moreover, if we find that someone is distributing it, we will consider taking legal action." He asks that if you know of people distributing the TOS, you notify him at Atari (☎ 0753 33344).

David Cagle, of the Atari US technical team, has a timely warning for bulletin board owners and users: "If you've had it uploaded onto your board or you downloaded it from a board, delete it." If you've come into contact with this software and it trashes your hard drive, don't expect any sympathy from Atari.

Condor go a bundle

Condor Computers are hoping for great things from their latest bundle. They've acquired a large stock of Power Computing's excellent 40MByte Series 900 hard drive and are bundling it with *Supercharger 1.4* for the knockdown price of £549.

Supercharger is a PC emulator which sits in its own case and comes complete with 1MByte of RAM. Version 1.4 includes multi-tasking, hot key operation, a program launcher and a technical tool box (whatever that is).

Keen to diversify, the same company are also distributing a pro-


fessional Computer Aided Design program which goes by the name of *CADja*.

The folks down at RGB Studios have been busy creating animation kits for your ST, to be used in conjunction with *DeluxePaint*. The theme of Volume 2 is birds, 11 examples of which are included on the disk.

Doves, kingfishers, owls, eagles and seagulls are all included, along with scenery sequences. The animation of these creatures is top notch, since they've been created by some top professional artists and animators.

Applications for this type of program extend from the home to the classroom, because they go a long way to explain the mechanics of flying. RGB Studios are promising that the next volume will feature humans. *RT Animkit* volume 2 costs £29.95, from RGB Studios, Gables, Buxted, East Sussex, TN22 4PP.

Softsellers bomb out

One of the largest distributors of ST-related software and hardware has gone into receivership. Softsellers of Ipswich in Suffolk (proprietor: Martin James) ran into financial problems earlier this year and were unable to pay outstanding debts, leaving many ST owners awaiting goods they'll never receive.

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Incentive release amazing new 3D creator for ST

Incentive Software, best known for the 3D game creation system *Freescape*, have revealed details of a revolutionary new package that enables users with no programming knowledge whatsoever to create games and routines every bit as complex and impressive as their own *Total Eclipse* and the *FORMAT* Gold winning *Castle Master* (STF 10: 90%).


3D Construction Kit, set for an April launch, gives newcomers and non-programmers the power to create solid 3D objects (hence, no doubt, the title) that can be stretched, rotated, suspended, stacked and even given animation effects. Yet the whole system is so user-friendly that it makes most simple art packages look cumbersome.

One obvious use to which the package can be put – but by no means the only one – is the creation of games. If you have played any of the four *Freescape* games – *Driller*, *Dark Side*, *Total Eclipse* and *Castle Master* – the appearance of objects and the general environment will already be familiar to you. Using *3D Construction Kit* you can create complete, stand-alone games that are every bit as complex and entertaining as these, the only limitation being your own imagination.

The best thing about the whole project is that objects, animations and games created with it work independently of the *Construction Kit*, and no licence is required. There's no reason why games should not be good enough for commercial release. The only downside is that it's obvious within about five seconds that your object or game was created with this system.

"This package is so easy to use," Incentive's Andy Tait told *ST FORMAT*, "that you can do amazingly rewarding stuff within minutes. But once you've mastered the easy bits you can progress onto the more complex features to produce environments or complete games."

He is also keen to stress that there will be a complete game and

an environment will be included with the kit when you buy it. "I'm looking forward to seeing what people can do with it," he said.

3D Construction Kit, which will cost £39.99, is in effect the *Freescape* object editor made user-

friendly. While the programmers and graphic artists who worked on Incentive's own games had to make do with complicated hex tables and calculations, soon ST owners will be creating the same effects via a remarkably flexible and friendly pull-down menu and point-and-click system.

Apart from game creation, uses for the new kit may include educational design, modelling and urban studies.

3D Construction Kit, due for release in April, is to be published by Domark ☎ 081 780 2222.

Colour digitising software for ST

Most digitisers work in black, grey and white. This is fine if you fire digitising pandas but not much use if it's the Coldstream guards. DAC Software have produced a nifty program which enables you to produce colour pictures from grey scaled images. *DiviChrome* works with the Vidi ST digitiser from Rombo ☎ 0506 414631, which costs £99.95. The program examines the image and apportions to it shades of colour from a palette of 512. The coloured images can then be saved in Spectrum 512 format. *DiviChrome* costs £19.95 from DAC Software, 8/6 Hay Road, Edinburgh, EH16 4QA.

TCB team get active

■ Not one to rest on his laurels, Anders Nilsson, author of *TCB Tracker*, is putting the finishing touches to version 1.2 of this fabulous music maker. The new version fixes a number of bugs which caused problems for users. Password entry, disk drive access times, pitch bending, replay routines and the MIDI routines have all been fine tuned and Anders promises they all work fine.

■ Coming soon from MPH is a *Tracker* cartridge which enables an ordinary STFM to produce quality stereo sound. The cartridge attaches to the ST via the Centronics printer port, with the handy side-effect that processor time is cut down by about 10%. Sound runs at a very clear 16KHz, compared to the 8KHz of the existing *Tracker*. Phillip Harman, manager of MPH, says he is hoping for a retail price of about £10, adding that "software houses could incorporate routines into their code."

■ MPH are also moving into the world of games production. Drawing on his contacts with demo groups, Harman has contracted a group of French programmers to write a car racing game, to be based on *The Run* demo, featured in *STF 18*. He says the game will be "a cross between *Hard Drivin'*, *Chase HQ2* and *Stunt Car Racer*."

■ With new *Tracker* programs appearing by the day you might have thought Anders was worried about having his crown knocked off. However, the Swedish ex-demo writer reckons they've all jumped on the bandwagon too late. For instance, he believes that *Audio Sculpture*, one of the better *Tracker* programs, "is good but it takes too much processor time." He adds that "there were a lot of bugs in it, and most of the features are rip-offs of existing software."




Always intent on doing things in a big way, America recently witnessed the largest computer show of its calendar. The Comdex show, all 2.2 million square feet of it, was held in Las Vegas and attracted thousands of companies and computer enthusiasts. Atari have long been a strong presence at this show, using it on more than one occasion to launch new products. This year was no exception: see box below right.

Interesting new products for the ST were an obvious force on the exhibition floor. Zephyr, the American hardware specialists, were showing their STeFax machine. This tasty piece of hardware combines a scanner, printer, fax and copier. The unit works at a resolution of 200 DPI

with thermal paper for the printer and the copier. It retails in the States for \$1000 (about £500). Bill Yerger, managing director of Zephyr, is currently looking for a British distributor for the product, although he sees Germany as the main market. He also revealed exclusively to *ST FORMAT* that he'll probably be joining Atari really soon as a marketing man, to fill Elie Kenan's shoes. The same company are currently testing their "Sherlock" hardware, an optical character recognition system. Two versions of this are expected to be available: Sherlock Junior at \$189 (£90) and Sherlock Professional at \$789 (£400). Zephyr Inc ☎ 0101 415 845 2000.

Softlogik's *Pagestream 2.0* was in a beta test state. Version two offers improved colour desk top publishing on the TT, and the ST version is expected to sell for \$299. A wide variety of fonts has been added and colour graphics can be incorporated. Deron Kazmeir was tight lipped about a release date for the program but told *FORMAT* that Softlogik Publishing Ltd (☎ 0101 314 894 8608) will be distributing it in this country.

GDOS, the graphic operating system for the Atari, has undergone a complete revamp. Atari have renamed it FSM (Font Scaling Module) GDOS. The old font routines have been replaced with a plush *Ultrascript* scaling routine, meaning that fonts of any size look smooth. What's more, these can now be

smoothly rotated. This means that cheap DTP programs with more than adequate font reproduction can be implemented. Atari may release this as freeware. Atari US ☎ 0101 408 745 2000.

Goldleaf Publishing Inc. (☎ 0101 415 461 5703) were showing the vastly updated version two of their

word processor *WordFlair*. Gribnif Software were demonstrating version 3 of *Neodesk* (reviewed in *STF* 18 and awarded a massive 95%).

Notable Atari personalities at the show included Jack, Sam and Garry Tramiel, along with General Manager Gregg Pratt, and the usual assortment of technical staff.

■ Surprise of the show for Atari personnel came at a concert given by the evergreen Beach Boys. Bruce Johnston of the band paid tribute to the ST in the corner of the stage and proceeded to dedicate "Don't Worry, Baby" to the company, saying "This one's for you, Atari." *stf*

New Atari products a big hit at the Comdex show





The Mega STE, with its scorching specification, was a massive hit at the show. Atari's decision to bundle the base unit with a 40MByte hard drive was seen by many to be one of the best moves the company has made. They have effectively, through aggressive pricing, bridged the gap between the business and the recreational computer markets. What's more, the standard Atari peripherals have all undergone transformations.


The SC1224 monitor has been replaced by a Philips-built unit named the SC1435. This is a colour stereo monitor with a large 15 inch

screen (the SC1224 was a 12 inch monitor). A green tint button has been added, making word processing a joy, and a stereo headphones socket has been included for quiet gaming. The TT's keyboard, a very high quality micro switch affair, has also been well received.

The old Atari laser printer, the SLM804, has been replaced by the SLM605, to retail at \$1,300 (about £680). Print speed has been significantly improved: the unit now operates at about six pages per minute, at a resolution of 300x300 pixels.




■ The new SC1453 monitor

This is getting boring. Even Queen and Bohemian Rhapsody didn't spend as long at number one as Microprose and *F19 Stealth Fighter*.


Not that it doesn't deserve to be there, of course; it takes some kind of wonderful game to merit an *ST FORMAT* 96% rating, and its chart performance has justified our outrageously high mark.

Still, there's an interesting challenge coming up on the inside from Gremlin, though it's doubtful whether it can get to the finishing line before Those Turtles arrive to make their reptilian presence felt.

Microprose stamp their mark all over the charts, with two in the top ten and four in the top 15 (Microstyle's one of theirs too). But there's a pair from Virgin coming in strongly at 10 and 11.

Note, though, how many publishers struggled to get their really big games into the shops in time for the big push...

Millennium have given the standard racing game a complete overhaul to come up with *Hillbilly* – which doesn't even sound like a racing game. Their first change to the common scenario is to ditch the souped-up racing car. Instead, you play with a run-down truck.

Another change (and it's a pretty radical one) is that this isn't a race. The objective instead is to collect moonshine and deliver it to your clients. If you run low on fuel you can always start burning the moonshine, but if you don't deliver enough you don't get paid.

Whenever you get back from a trip you have the option to visit a shop. This enables you to buy new bits and pieces to equip your car – for example, a pair of fluffy dice to make the sheriff laugh or new wheels to replace

those lost in your travels. One of the most important purchases is a map detailing the route you need to take. There are three maps available at increasingly extortionate prices. The most expensive map not only shows you the route but also pinpoints any Police roadblocks along the way.

Hillbilly Racers has an excellent pedigree. It's been programmed by the same team who wrote *Continental Circus* and *Chase HQ*, so the road movement is smooth and realistic. Heaps of roadside sprites, such as fuel stations and hotels, liven up the action. Sound effects are courtesy of Justin Scharvona (*Hero's Quest*) and promise to include sampled banjo noises guaranteed to make you turn the volume down.



You'll have to wait until the end of March to get your hands on the game – but if the early demos are anything to go by, *Hillbilly Moonshine Racers* could be worth the wait.





Forget the manual – Richard Monteiro introduces the basics of using your ST

Are you one of the many thousands who got an ST for Christmas? Perhaps you've had yours for a while but still find the whole thing a mystery and the manual not much help. Well, look no further! Throughout this issue *FORMAT* answers some of the most common questions we get asked – but let's begin with the basics.


SWITCHING ON

You've plugged in and switched on. The ST's power light is on, its drive light flickers... but

there's still nothing on your monitor or TV. Have you been landed with a duff machine?

Don't give up just yet! Leave the ST in this state for long enough and you're greeted with the Desktop, a green background with several tiny pictures on it and a few odd words at the top. On a black and white TV or Atari's high resolution monitor (SM124) you get the same display, except in black and white.

Why the delay? When the ST is switched on or reset, it looks for a disk in the internal floppy drive. If you don't put a disk in the drive immedi-

ately after switching on, the machine takes around 20 seconds to realise it's indeed missing a disk and ought to get on with displaying something useful before it gets chucked in the bin.



Try it. Switch the ST on and don't place anything in the drive.

Of course, you won't want to do this all the time – it takes far too long to get to the Desktop this way. What you need is a Boot disk.

“SELECTING” AN ICON ON THE DESKTOP


■ With the pointer over the icon you wish to select, simply press the left mouse button once. The selected item appears

in reverse shading or inverse. To “deselect” or cancel a selection, simply click on an empty area of Desktop



THE GEM DESKTOP: WHAT IT ALL MEANS

The standard elements of the Desktop are present every time you switch on your ST and get to the Desktop – though the icons may not necessarily be in the same place: some programs rearrange them, and you can drag them to a new location (see “Dragging” on page 25)

Desk File View Options

The menu bar gives you access to drop-down menus. Each heading (Desk, File, View, Options) has its own menu. See page 27 for a complete explanation of some of the facilities you can put into operation from here



The filing cabinet-like drawers, labelled FLOPPY DISK, represent disk drives. Okay, so you've only got one drive and the Desktop shows two. Where is the mysterious

drive B? Fear not! Unless you actually have a second floppy drive attached, everything you try to do on the drive B icon simply results in drive A springing to life



The trash can icon is a probably lot more obvious than the filing cabinet. The rubbish, in this case, is any unwanted items from your disks



This arrow shows your position on the Desktop. Simply move the mouse and the pointer moves with it

BOOTING UP

Inserting a disk into the ST when you switch on or reset has a different result depending on the information stored on the disk.

■ A formatted disk (see “File” commands, page 27) containing no files causes the Desktop display to appear very quickly indeed.

■ Inserting a non-formatted disk at the start causes the ST's Desktop to take more than 20 seconds to appear, and also results in the ST complaining that data on the disk is damaged.

■ Insert a disk containing an AUTO folder and the ST automatically runs or starts the program contained within the folder. Depending on what this program is, you may be returned to the Desktop once it's done its business. For more on the AUTO folder, see page 135.

■ If the disk you insert contains something called a DESKTOP.INF file, unusual things might happen – like windows appearing on the Desktop, pictures or icons showing up in odd places, and the whole Desktop appearing to be a different size – see “Save Desktop”, page 28.

■ Most games automatically run when you insert them and reset your ST. Generally, games have a special code located on the boot sector of the disk – the part the ST checks straight away – which informs the ST of the whereabouts of the game on disk. Things get rather involved when dealing with the disk boot sector: let's just say that the majority of programs that make use of this do so to prevent prying eyes from seeing what makes them tick.

TOS AND GEM

Well, you've got to the Desktop. What next? Technically, the screen you're now looking at is called the GEM Desktop. GEM stands for Graphics Environment Manager, which is part of the ST's operating system. The operating system (TOS) is the brain of the ST, controlling all the machine's functions. GEM is the part of the operating system you get to see and interact with. Graphically, the GEM Desktop is designed to resemble an office with filing cabinet drawers, a work surface and rubbish bin – see box at left.


MOUSE TALES

Your mouse is the easiest way of communicating with your ST. It attaches itself via its tail to the ST's mouse/joystick port, labelled 0.

Move the mouse on a hard flat surface and you can position the pointer anywhere on the Desktop. Touch the menu bar with the pointer and a menu drops down. That's why they're called drop-down menus. To get rid of a menu, move the pointer onto an empty piece of Desktop and press the left mouse button once. This action is called **clicking**. Clicking on an icon **selects** it – see the box on page 24.

Ensure there's a formatted disk in the drive and try this: move the pointer over floppy icon A and press the left mouse button twice in quick succession. This is called **double-clicking**. You've got to do this quickly, or the floppy drive A icon remains highlighted and nothing else happens. If you do things properly, a **window** displaying the contents of your disk appears – see the box on this page.


Reset the ST. There is another important mouse operation for you to try. Move the pointer till it's roughly in the centre of the screen. Press the left mouse button and hold it down. Move the mouse so the pointer moves to the right and down. A rubber band-like box appears. This is useful for making multiple selections. Try this: move the pointer so it lies just above the floppy drive A icon, then press and hold the left mouse button. Move the pointer straight down so the rubber band covers both floppy drive icons either wholly or partly. Let the mouse button go and both drives are selected.




■ Position the mouse pointer over any heading in the menu bar and the drop-down menus (you guessed it!) drop down

DRAGGING

No, dragging isn't anything to do with getting your ST into the next room: it's a way of moving an icon or file to another location on the Desktop. This is useful for instance when you want to open a window on-screen but still have access to that particular icon.



■ Select the icon you wish to move by pressing and holding down the left mouse button when the pointer is over it. The icon changes to a reverse image to confirm that it has been selected



■ Still holding down the mouse button, move the mouse in the desired direction. A ghost outline of the selected object accompanies the pointer on its travels around the screen



■ Once at your destination, release the mouse button. The item you've dragged automatically drops at the pointer's last resting place

KEYBOARD SHORTCUTS FOR COMMANDS

Sure the mouse is fun, but sometimes it's faster to use the keyboard – and it saves you moving your pointer all over the screen. GEM, the Graphics Environment Manager which enables you to interact with your ST, has keyboard alternatives for most mouse movements.

Alternate + arrow or cursor key – moves the mouse pointer in the direction of the arrow. Note that both keys must be held down simultaneously.

Alternate Shift + arrow or cursor key – moves the pointer in the direction of the arrow in very fine pixel increments.

Alternate Insert – the same as a left mouse button click.

Alternate Ctr/Home – the same as a right mouse button click.

Alternate Help – sends the image on screen to the printer. If no printer is present the ST hangs for around 20 seconds.

Esc – pressing this key when a window is opened results in the contents of the window being updated. Useful, for instance, when you swap a disk and wish to quickly see the contents of the disk in an already open window.

Q or Control C – when viewing a data file on-screen you can return to the Desktop by pressing either of the two key combinations.

Return or Enter – rather than clicking on the OK message which appears in countless dialogue and alert boxes, press either of these keys. In general the item in an alert box highlighted with a bold border is the one that is actioned when you press Return.

If you have a machine fitted with TOS 1.4 or higher – this includes all STEs, STFM's and new STs – you have the following as well. Control Alternate Delete – resets the ST. Has the same effect as hitting the reset button at the back of the machine.

Control Alternate right Shift Delete – cold resets the ST. The same as switching on the ST for the first time.

OPEN UP A WINDOW AND REACH INTO THE WORLD OF THE ST

Most of the action takes place not on the Desktop itself but within windows. These sit on the Desktop and display the contents of a disk. Double-click on a drive icon and (provided there's a formatted disk in the drive) a window appears on-screen. Up to four windows may be displayed at once, holding the directories of various disks and folders, though only one window can be active at any time. You can tell which

window is active by its shaded move bar (that's the bar along the top of the window) and the fact that it's the one in front, not overlapped by any others. The active window is the only one whose contents you can select, delete or copy. Clicking the mouse button while the pointer rests over a window causes that particular window to come to the front and become the active one.


Status or information line: shows how much disk space is used and how many items are stored on disk

Disk identifier: tells you the drive and directory you're looking at

Move bar: like icons, windows can be moved anywhere on the Desktop. Unlike with icons, though, you can drag a window only by a small area at the top of the window

Close icon: press this and the window is history – till the next time you open it

Scroll arrow: causes the hidden contents of the disk to move into view




Scroll bar: operates much like the scroll arrow except it can be dragged to the required position faster. Scroll bars are only present if a window is active and not its full size

Size icon: click and hold the left mouse button over this icon and drag the mouse in the desired direction – down to lengthen the window, up to shorten it, right to widen it, left to narrow it. A ghost outline of the window follows the mouse pointer. Release the button to set the new size

Full icon: a click on this expands the window to full screen size. Clicking on the icon a second time returns the window to its previous size


FILES

Your ST stores two types of files on disk: program files and data files. On the Desktop these files are represented by the icons below.



The icon that looks like a miniature Desktop is the program file icon; it represents an application that you can run by double-clicking on it. These are usually applications like word processors, graphics packages, and so on.

The icon that looks like a stack of paper with one corner folded over is the data file icon. Data files contain information used by applications – for instance, a letter produced with a word processor, a program created with a programming language, a picture designed with an art package. You normally have to run the appropriate application to get at these files; double-click straight on a data file and if you have installed the application it runs with the document automatically opened. In most instances, though, you simply get the alert message below.





Click on "Show" or press Return to display the document on screen. Any readable text is displayed, and when the screen fills with text you see the prompt MORE. Pressing Return displays another line; hitting the space bar displays the

next screenful of text. Once the whole file has been displayed a message proclaiming END OF FILE appears. At any time during the display press Q or Control C to return to the Desktop.

Select "Print" to send the document to a printer. Printing can be stopped by pressing Q or Control C.

Choose "Cancel" to return to the Desktop.

Not all data files contain readable text. You may see spurious characters and numbers, hear the occasional beep and witness strange screen




■ ASCII text documents (top) appear on screen in an ordered, intelligible manner. The result of viewing other documents is always uncertain, but it's never boring

flashing. Don't worry, you can't damage your ST; simply exit from the "Show" option to return everything to normal.


FOLDERS

Folders, which look like the manila variety tucked inside most filing cabinets, are part of your ST's filing system. They provide you with a way of keeping related files (or even non-related ones, if you're that way inclined) together. They can hold program files, data files and even other


folders – up to a limit of eight levels of folders within folders. Double-click on a folder and you can open a window just for it, so you can view the items contained within.




■ The folder icon looks like, er, a folder, really. It groups files or other documents under a single heading of your choice

■ Just as you do with a file, you simply double-click on a folder to open it...




■ a new window with the folder's name in the disk identifier appears on the Desktop

WHAT'S IN A NAME? QUITE A LOT, IF YOU KNOW WHERE TO LOOK

Let's start with the obvious. Filenames are the names given to files. New files can be supplied with names and existing files can have their names changed. Folders too have names, and virtually everything that applies to filenames also applies to folder names.

A filename comprises two distinct parts: the name and the extender.



Many applications use specific extenders to represent certain types of data files. Similarly, GEM requires applications to have specific extenders.

APPLICATIONS

.ACC – desk accessory. This can't be run in the normal way. It loads into memory when you switch on or reset the machine and is available from the Desk menu (see *DESKTOP*, page 135).

.APP – GEM application. This rare type of file makes use of windows, icons and the mouse pointer.

.PRG – a favoured version of the above. Nearly all GEM programs have this extension.

.TOS – TOS application. TOS files don't require GEM and all the things which go with it; windows, icons, the mouse...

.TTP – a TOS application that expects some typed parameters before it can run. Double-click on a file of this sort and a dialogue box – a specific sort of window – appears, requesting input.

DATA FILES

.ASM – see .S.

.BAS – data file produced with a BASIC programming language like *1st BASIC* or *ST BASIC*.

.HLP – a help file which could contain information on using an application.

.IMG – a bit image graphics file. Images in this format can be larger than screen size.

.NEO – 16-colour low resolution picture in the very popular Neochrome file format.

.PC?/PI? – another very common picture file format popularised by the Degas graphics package. The question mark is a number between 1 and 3, and informs you of the picture resolution: 1 for low resolution, 2 for medium resolution and 3 for high resolution.

.S – the source file produced when using an Assembler programming language.

.SND – a sound data file.

.TXT – generally indicates a text file from a word processor or other text-producing program.

➤ ON THE MENU: A SMORGASBORD OF FUNCTIONS

Just about every operation you've performed so far from the Desktop can also be done via the menu bar at the top of the screen. But that's just the beginning: the menu bar gives you access to countless useful functions. Some options are self-explanatory, and this brief guide reveals the secrets of the others.

Moving the mouse pointer over a menu heading causes a menu to drop down. In each menu, options in black and white are active; you can access these by clicking once on them. Options in light grey are inactive; these can't be accessed until certain conditions are met. Finally, some menu options have ticks by them. This means they are active and have some influence on what happens on the Desktop.

DESK

The Desk menu contains any desk accessories you have loaded (see *DESKTOP*, page 135). A list of available desk accessories appears after the "Desktop Info" option.

Desktop Info

So you want to know the who, what and when of your GEM Desktop? Clicking on this option displays a few copyright notices and dates. Click on the OK button to return you to the Desktop.

Unfortunately there is no simple way of telling which version of TOS your machine sports, although a good guess can be made by looking at the dates that appear. If you really want to be sure, order a copy of *ST FORMAT* 14 (see page 148): Cover Disk 14 features a little program called *TOS Teller* which does just that.


FILE

Open


Rather than double-clicking on an icon, you can highlight it by single-clicking on it and then hit the "Open" option. This opens the highlighted disk or folder, runs the highlighted application, or shows or prints the contents of the highlighted data file. Stick to double-clicking – the Open option is a waste of time.

Show Info


Highlight an icon – disk, file or folder – then select Show Info to view information about it.

New Folder

To create a new folder, first open a directory window and select this option. A dialogue box appears, asking you for the new name. Type in a name of no more than eight alphanumeric characters plus an optional three character extension. (See "What's in a Name?" on page 26 for all the rules.) Then click on OK or press [Return] and the folder appears in the directory.

Close/Close Window

Like the "Open" option, these two duplicate what you can do by clicking anyway. Both close the currently active window, though "Close Window" goes a step further and removes a window completely even if you're inside a folder.

Format

Disks aren't exactly like blank tapes: different computers do different things with them to store information on them, so they must be formatted for the ST before it can use them. Disks can be formatted as either single- or double-sided. Old STs with single-sided drives can format only single-sided disks while all new STs, equipped with double-sided drives, can format either single or double-sided. (If you're not sure which you've got, see the box on page 52.) A single-sided disk can store around 360K of data, while a double-sided disk can store roughly twice that.

To format a disk, insert a disk into the drive, select or highlight the disk icon corresponding to the drive in which the disk sits and select the "Format" option. This option isn't available unless a drive is highlighted. A dialogue box reminding you that formatting erases all data on the disk pops up. Click on OK to continue.

You get the option of giving your disk a name, but you never really need this so you needn't bother. Highlight either single or double-sided and hit "Format." When formatting is complete, you're informed of the number of bytes available on disk. After this, just click on "Exit."

Warning: You can format not only blank, brand new, never-before-used disks, but also used disks, and formatting erases any data previously saved on that disk. Make very sure you don't mind losing that data!

VIEW

Sort by Name/Date/Size/Type

Of these four options, only one can be active at a time. "Sort by Name" displays items alphabetically, with folders before files. "Sort by Date" lists files chronologically, with the most recently created or revised item appearing first. "Sort by Size" shows items from the largest down. "Sort by Type" lists files alphabetically by their file-name extenders.

OPTIONS

Install Disk Drive

GEM normally displays two disk icons on the Desktop. Each icon has a disk identifier (A or B) and the label FLOPPY DISK. You can change the labels and add or remove disk icons from here.

RENAMING A FILE

First highlight the file you want to rename. Then go to the "File" menu and click on "Show Info." Check that the read/write button is highlighted and press [Backspace] or [Esc] to delete the existing filename. Type in a new name (observing the rules stated in the "What's in a Name?" box on page 26), then click on OK or press Return. The new filename appears in the disk directory.

RENAMING A FOLDER: COMPLETE GUIDE

With all new STs/STEs (TOS 1.4 and above) renaming a folder is easy: simply highlight the folder and select the "Show Info" option in the File menu. From there you can change the name just like a filename. If you have an ST with an older version of TOS, you basically have to copy all the old folder's contents to a new one. Let's say you want to change the name OLDFOld to NEWFOld:

- 1 Check the size of the OLDFOld folder by highlighting it and doing a "Show Info."
- 2 Check how much room remains on the disk by highlighting the appropriate disk icon and doing another Show Info.
- 3 If there's enough room on the disk to fit the entire contents of the folder, continue with this procedure.
- 4 Ensure you're not inside the OLDFOld folder

which you want to rename and click on "New Folder" in the File menu. Enter the new name NEWFOld.

5 Open up NEWFOld so you get a window of its contents (there should be nothing inside).

6 Double-click on the floppy drive icon a second time to open up another window so you can see what's inside OLDFOld.

7 Ensure that the two windows don't overlap and that you can see the entire contents of OLDFOld.


8 Select all the items in OLDFOld and drag them across to the NEWFOld window. You get an alert box asking you to confirm that you wish to copy files. Click on OK.

9 Once copying has finished, get a directory window which shows both OLDFOld and NEWFOld. Select and drag OLDFOld into the trash can. Job done!

Install Application

Double-click on a data file and you usually get a screenful of gibberish. "Install Application" enables you to set the application to load automatically whenever you open the data file, so you can double-click on a document produced with your word processor, for instance, and have the ST automatically run the WP program then load the document ready for you to edit.

First highlight the application you wish to install. This must be a file with the extension .APP, .PRG, .TOS, or .TTP. Then click on "Install Application."




The name of the application you selected appears in the "Application Name" line. In the line below, type the kind of file that application normally produces – DOC or TXT, for instance, for your WP program. Then highlight an application type: "GEM" if the application ends in .APP or .PRG, "TOS" if it ends in .TOS and "TOS-Takes-Parameters" if it ends in .TTP.

Set Preferences

From here you can choose whether or not to display certain alert boxes and determine the screen resolution.

Your ST has three resolutions, or detail levels of screen display, measured in pixels (little squares on screen): low (320x200), medium



■ When you set preferences, it is best to leave "Confirm Deletes" and "Confirm Copies" with the "Yes" button highlighted. This way you're warned when you're about to copy or delete a file or folder – a useful double-check just in case you accidentally select the wrong command

(640x200), high (640x400). Low and medium resolution can be viewed on a TV or Atari's colour monitor. High resolution can be viewed only on Atari's SM124 monochrome monitor, and if you haven't got the appropriate monitor attached the mode buttons appear in light text, signifying that they can't be selected.

Save Desktop

Any modifications you make to the Desktop can be saved to disk so that every time you switch on or reset the machine you return to the Desktop as you left it. All the following are saved: window size and position, icon positions, the way files are displayed and sorted, installed applications, screen resolution. Select this option and the information is saved to disk in a file called DESKTOP.INF.

Print Screen

Has exactly the same effect as pressing the key combination [Alternate] [Help]: the contents of

the screen are dumped to printer, exactly as you see them. No printer, no dump.


Blitter

Only STs with a special graphics processing chip (the "blitter") for speeding up text and graphics have this option (see *DESKTOP*, page 135). Keep the blitter on unless you encounter problems with certain applications.


FILE AND DISK COPYING

Because the ST is so versatile, there are many ways of copying files and disks. Here are just some of the best – once you get to know your ST inside out, you may decide you prefer using a different method to the ones mentioned here.


Copying a file from one folder to another



1. Get two windows of the disk contents on the screen. Both should show exactly the same thing. Try not to get any overlap (this only results in confusion later).
2. Double-click on the folder containing the file you wish to copy. Do this in one window only.




3. Highlight the file you wish to copy and drag it to the folder you wish to copy it to.



4. Click on OK when the alert box appears asking confirmation that you wish to copy the file. After copying you can enter the folder to check that the operation has indeed taken place.

Disk copying


1. You should always back up important disks. First write-protect the disk (move the little tab so you can see through the hole), then check its format – single or double-sided – by highlighting the disk and clicking on "Disk Info" in the File menu. Add "Bytes Used" to "Bytes Available;" double-sided disks total 720,000 Bytes, single-sided half that.



2. Then insert the destination disk (the one you wish to copy to), highlight the drive A icon and select "Format" again from the File menu. Ensure the disk you are copying to doesn't contain anything important. Select single- or double-sided format, the same as the source disk (the

one you are copying from).

3. Remove the formatted disk from the drive, insert the disk you wish to copy from and drag the drive A icon on to the drive B icon.




4. You are asked to insert disk B into drive A and disk A into drive A several times. Swap the disks when requested, but take care not to confuse the source disk (disk A) with the destination disk (disk B). Play safe and keep the source disk write-protected.


Copying multiple files to another disk

1. Insert the disk you wish to copy files from and open a window so you can see its contents.


2. Highlight the files you wish to copy. You can select more than one at a time: hold the shift key down and single-click on the first file icon; release the mouse button but keep the shift key down; with the shift key still down, click on another file and both files are selected. Keep holding down the shift key while making further selections.



3. After making your final selection, keep holding down the left mouse button. Drag all the files to the floppy drive B icon. Let go the left mouse button when that icon is highlighted.



4. You are now asked to insert disk B into drive A. This means replace the disk currently in the drive with the one you wish to copy files to. Of course, if you've got two drives, simply insert the disk you wish to copy files to in drive B. Press OK to continue.



5. The more files you wish to copy, the more times you have to swap disks. Keep going, but take care not to confuse disk A (the disk containing the files you wish to copy) with disk B (the disk you wish to copy the files to).

Playing games is all very well, my lad, but when you're ready for something more – well, stick with your ST! Simon Williams looks at some of the best “serious” software on the ST

So you've got a sparkling new ST! Good choice. But if it's your first computer, or even if you've upgraded from a lesser computer, you may not be aware of the non-games software which is available for your

machine. As well as being an ace games player, the ST is very capable at many other leisure activities and a fast and effective vehicle for business software.

If you're thinking of splashing out on soft-

ware to stretch your ST's serious side, you ought to know what to look for. Here are the basics of the most common non-game applications, and some names to play with – software good enough for a *FORMAT* recommendation...



In its simplest form, a word processor is a means of entering text into your ST so you can save it to disk and print it out. Most programs offer a lot more than text editing, though. You should expect even a basic word processor to be able to do at least three things: reformat text when you insert or delete words; mark out, cut, move, copy or delete any section of a document; and search through your text for a given word or phrase.

Reformatting your text varies between WPs, from a simple keystroke to automatically rejigging all text as you type in characters. There are two main methods of controlling a word processor: key sequences and pull-down menus. While working with menus is easier to learn, keystrokes are quicker to use once memorised. With GEM-based programs, you can also use the mouse for menu selection and highlighting blocks of text.

If you intend to use your ST WP for a business or hobby, you'll probably find “mail merge” useful. Mail merge enables you to produce personalised letters for everyone on your address list, simply by “merging” a standard letter and the list of names and addresses.

Recommended viewing: One of the most common word processors on the ST is



■ **Protex is fast, clear and well functioned – though it doesn't use GEM to the full**

GST's *1st Word Plus* (£79.95 from GST Systems ☎ 0480 496666). This is a GEM-based word processor with all the basics plus the ability to import pictures, spell checker and mail merge. Since it runs under GEM, though, it tends to be rather sluggish.

If you're after a full-function word processor, though only partly GEM compatible, you should try *Protex*. The latest incarnation, version 5, offers spell checker, mail merge, comprehensive printer control and the fastest text handling on the ST. It is ideally meant for manipulating large documents and is capable of handling up to 32 files at once. An enhanced form of the earlier version, now called version 4.3, is

also available for about £50 less, incorporating some of the new features of version 5. You can also access and use your GEM accessories from version 5 – all you don't get is GEM's slider bars and pull-down menus.

PD choice: The original version of *1st Word* is available in the Public Domain, but your best bet is *ST Writer Elite*, which is better featured and quicker. It's easy to use and is only partly GEM-based. It lacks some of the refinements of commercial WPs, such as pull-down menus and windows to handle several documents at once, but some versions come complete with a RAM disk and rudimentary spell checker.



A database can be thought of as a computerised card index. There are direct electronic equivalents for all the elements: the box of cards becomes a file, the cards themselves become the records, and the items of information on each card become the fields. In most databases, you can design the layout of each record, giving each field a name and making the ST do the hard work of sorting and searching through the records.

Any database should provide a range of basic facilities: you should be able to add and

delete records at any time, edit their contents, and rely on the program to maintain good indexes to make searches quicker. It should also enable you to design your own reports, so you can print out selected items from specified records, and to export the data into a word processor for further “massaging.”

Some ST databases can hold graphics in

their records as well as text and numbers. If you intend to use graphics in your records, though, remember they take up a lot of memory and disk space.

Recommended viewing: The leading lights in ST databases are *Superbase 2* and *Data Manager Professional* (£39.95, Electric Distribution ☎ 0954 80381), though there are others, including *K-Data* from Kuma (£49.95 ☎ 0734 844335) and *Prodata* from Arnor (£79.95 ☎ 0733 68909).

Superbase Personal 2 is an all-singing, all-dancing GEM-based program which can handle graphic, number and character fields and uses

an intuitive video recorder style control panel to enable you to flip through its records. What's more, if you need to upgrade your data handling at a later stage, you can upgrade to the fully compatible – and fully programmable – *Superbase Professional*.

PD choice: *DB Master* is a good, GEM-based database which consists of two programs: one to design the record layout and the other to handle records as you build up your files. You can include colour and font effects to brighten up your data, and search facilities are good. However, documentation is sketchy and there are no facilities for calculations.

SPREADSHEET SPREADSHEET SPREADSHEET SPREADSHEET

Not the most popular of ST applications, judging by their availability, spreadsheets are nonetheless essential for anyone forecasting finances. A spreadsheet is like a sheet of squared paper, where every square can take a number, a label or a formula. The nifty thing about the spreadsheet, though, is that a formula can tie together the numbers in different cells and produce a result in another cell automatically. Change any of the source numbers and the contents of the results cell changes, too. This is ideal for "what if" calculations, an essential part of good forecasting and something Michael Fish dreams of.

If you're looking for a spreadsheet, keep your eyes open for three things. First, the size of the sheet should be at least 256 by 256 cells. Although you won't be able to fill this many cells without running out of memory, a large matrix gives you plenty of room to lay your calculations out clearly.

Second, the pre-defined functions provided by the program govern what calculations you can do. Generally, the more functions the better, but if your work includes statistics, check the statistics functions. If your main interest is in finance, check the financial ones. Obvious, really: define your needs first.

■ **ST Sheet is well up to the standard of some commercial spreadsheets on the ST. It's a bargain at just £13**

Third, it's nice to be able to display your calculations graphically. Most spreadsheets offer bar graphs and pie charts, but compare what they can do and check for printer support.

Recommended viewing: Of the commercial spreadsheets, the *K-Spread* series from Kuma are good. *Logistix* (£114.94, Grafox ☎ 0494 728439) is another possibility, since it's been around in a variety of guises and is thoroughly tested.

K-Spread 4 is an thoroughly comprehensive

beast, though not desperately fast. It benefits from GEM compatibility, which makes it easy a little on the slow side but is easy to use.

PD choice: A couple of worthwhile programs: *Opus 200* is a neat package but needs GDOS and at least 1MByte to run.

ST Sheet is perhaps a better bet for the new user. It runs under GEM, provides an excellent set of functions and works quickly. It's shareware – which means that you're asked to send the American author \$25 for registration. (See box on page 34.)

WHAT IS THIS CURIOUS THING CALLED GEM?

If you're a newcomer to the wonderful world of the ST, you may be confused by all the references in this article and elsewhere to GEM. In fact the Graphic Environment Manager (GEM) is simply a grand name for the point-and-click system you see when you start up your ST. If you've ever glared at a window, clicked on a menu or even just moved your mouse, you've used GEM!


The problem is, it's a bit slow for some programs, and is therefore sometimes bypassed. This may enhance speed, but at the cost of reduced user-friendliness.

If you get stuck with other ST terms used here or elsewhere in this issue, then turn to page 65 for a special two-page newcomer's *Jargon-Buster* section.

One of the main interest areas for ST users who aren't absorbed by games is graphics. Drawing and painting programs provide outlets for all kinds of creative talent – witness *FORMAT's* *Kandy Koloured GALLERY* pages. If there's no graphics package bundled with your machine, there are plenty out there to please.

Range of colours is one aspect to bear in mind, and 256 colours is a basic minimum these days. To get this colour palette, you have to settle for low resolution, but the standard range of drawing tools is now often complemented by variable brush shapes, colour cycling, block movement and basic animations. Manipulations like rotate, flip, re-size, skew and shear are also common.

One important thing to check out with a graphics pack is the disk formats it supports. If you want to import pics from other sources or

save your artwork for others to view, you need to bear in mind the fact that the three main painting standards are GEM's IMG, *Neochrome's* NEO and *Degas's* PI1, PI2 and PI3 formats. Most packages can pick up on at least one of these formats.

Recommended viewing: *Degas Elite* (£24.95 Electronic Arts ☎ 0753 494442) is a fine drawing package with some useful functions, but *Deluxe Paint ST* wears the laurels – see review in *FORMAT* 15. This package really is feature-packed, and quick with it. Bezier curves, plenty of brush effects and basic animation are all included and the *DPaint ST* won the first ever *FORMAT* Gold for non-game software.

PD choice: There are two contenders for the PD graphics crown: *Neochrome* and *Ani-ST*. While the latter is a new addition to the Public

Domain, it has for a long while been a commercial painting and animation package, and *Neochrome* has been around even longer.

Neochrome was bundled with early STs but has been continuously developed and is still the first choice of many ST artists. It's easier to use than *Ani-ST*, while still having some innovative features like real-time zoom.



An application area which sprung up at almost the same time as the ST itself. If you want to take your word processed text and lay out the columns of a newsletter, adverts for your PD library or the pages of a fanzine, there's a good choice of DTP packages for your ST.

Decide what kind of document you're aiming your DTP at. If it's the novella for your latest megagame, you'd be best off with a program like *Timeworks DTP*, where you can set up style sheets and use them to establish a regular page layout. This helps in long documents where you don't want to waste hours laying out each page.

If you're more interested in meticulous page control, with text wrap around graphics, rotation of text and graphics or colour work, you'd be better off with a program like *PageStream* (£171.35, Silica Systems ☎ 081 309 1111), which embodies a far less structured approach.

Look also for good control of typography – fonts, sizes, letter and line spacings – and proper printer drivers for the printer you have (you do have a printer, don't you?).

Recommended viewing: *Timeworks* and *PageStream* are joined by *Fleet Street Publisher* (£199.95, Mirrorsoft ☎ 071 928 1454) and *Calamus* (£459.99, Signa ☎ 0252 341600) to complete a quartet of excellent DTP applications. All of these can handle basic page lay out. For the new user, though, *Timeworks DTP* has stood the test of time and is

inexpensive enough to make it ideal for anyone contemplating setting up a fanzine or newsletter.

PD choice: Choice is restricted in the Public Domain, possibly because of the complexity of DTP programs. *Eazy Text* is the only real contender, though it's not so much PD as a budget offering, at around £20. It can handle straightforward page layout, but don't expect anything too fancy.

This is not the most glamorous of application areas, but one which can smack your wrists when you shell out on another *FORMAT* Gold. What you want in the accounts field is a program which does the hard work for you and reminds you what's necessary. It should warn you if your cash is about to disappear down the pan, and show you why, preferably with graphics (not necessarily of the pan).

Recommended viewing: A major contender is *Personal Finance Manager Plus*, which provides multiple accounts, automatic handling of standing orders, plenty of graphs and all this from the GEM Desktop. Up to five windows can be opened on the same account and there's full on-line help for when you get lost. Why not try the demo version on last issue's *FORMAT* Cover Disk before you buy?

PD choice: Although fairly thin on the ground, accounts programs do exist in the Public Domain. For home accounts, you could look at the appropriately-named *Home Accounts*.

HOW TO GET PROFESSIONAL QUALITY PROGRAMS CHEAP

You don't have to spend a Publisher's ransom to obtain good "serious" software. The ST has attracted some excellent Public Domain and shareware programs, which cost little but supply plenty of punch. "Public Domain" refers to programs which for one reason or another have been released by their authors for use by anyone, free of charge. The only cost you pay is a very small copying fee to the PD library, usually about £3.

"Shareware" is a term used to describe

programs which have been released for assessment purposes via normal PD sources. Shareware authors want a return on their work, though, and you are morally bound to pay a registration fee for such software, if you use it regularly. The registration fee often covers extras like an updated version or a printed manual. Both PD and shareware programs are often well up to the standard of the "buy before you try" brigade.

The PD choice under each category in this

article is designed for the new user. There may be more effective or sophisticated options available, but we've gone here for a low intimidation factor. *stf*

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





There's an awful lot more to any decent ST game than meets the eye. Where do the ideas come from? Who does what? Do programmers earn millions? The answers to these questions and many more are revealed in this exclusive report on the making of the follow-up to the classic Resolution 101. Steve Carey asks the questions



■ Paul Carruthers: the man behind two **FORMAT** Golds



Paul Carruthers is a game programmer. So far his CV includes two *ST FORMAT* Gold-rated games – the excellent *Archipelagos* for Logotron and the thrilling *Resolution 101* for Logotron's new games arm Millennium. These two games have marked Paul out as a man to be watched, and with signs of a new game on the cards there is good reason to be excited. His latest project, due for release in April, is *Stormball*, a one or two-player sports game which is unusual in that it uses much of the code, the "graphics engine," that was first written to create the 3D graphics in *Resolution*, itself a development from *Archipelagos*.

Paul has been struggling with *Stormball* since *Resolution* was released last July. He is now approaching the crucial stage when a good idea must be converted into a good game. Over the next few months we shall be observing his progress in some detail. We'll also be talking to his

employers in an attempt to discover just what it's like bringing a game from the initial conception through a traumatic birth and beyond.

We shall of course chart the development of the game itself, as ideas arise and evolve or are rejected. But we shall equally be concerned to convey something of the experience of writing a game – the elation and the disappointment, the sheer effort and even the boredom.

We will be looking in detail at the marketing of a game – the packaging, the advertising, the sales story. And when it's all over, we shall be asking everyone concerned how it all went. Runaway success or unmitigated disaster?

This month we interview Paul about his game and go on a conducted tour of the program as it stands to date.

STF: Your latest project, Paul, *Stormball* – how did it come about?

It just sort of grew up over a long time while I was writing *Resolution 101*, and I suppose I wanted to do something in which the essence of the game was really simple, but which would be a nice game. Something that was easy to write and would not take too much time but which played well.


I was trying to get away from the idea of having to write a really big game which had everything in it; to concentrate on getting at the heart of the game, to build code around it. You see, when I was doing *Resolution* I wrote all the code and then tried to squeeze a game into it – which is the wrong way round, really.

Afterwards you have the opportunity to add on all the extras like the sound and the graphics

THE STORMBALL DIARY

WEEK 1: IN THE BEGINNING...




■ "This is the earliest screen I have, dating from about July. It's the 3D polygon on the floor taken out of *Resolution*, together with an old astronaut sprite I used in *Quadralien* acting as the player in the game. At this time I was really just trying out code,

finding out what sort of speed it would run at, with a floor like that and two sprites, one of which is compressed in real time.

"I'll explain that. You see, the only picture I have is of that full size sprite, the one in the foreground. The other sprite in the background is only half that height, but rather than having a sprite of half the size, or indeed of every size in between, I only need to use the one sprite. Whenever I want to draw that smaller one, I simply use a routine which compresses it. That's slow anyway because it has to be done pixel by pixel, but since it's happening in real time it has to be quick. So that again is a routine I wrote for *Resolution*. I've altered it slightly in this game, but it's basically that routine.

"So all that has happened here in this earliest incarnation of *Stormball* is that I have allied those two routines out of *Resolution* to find out what sort of speed this runs at, how it looks and so on. Now I've got the basic ideas running I can get on with the game"

WEEK 2: GETTING UP 'N' RUNNING



■ "This is unfortunately me in my pants. I'd had enough of that astronaut sprite, and I wanted to have a running sequence that I could try in the game. The only way I could do that – I can't draw awfully well – was to use my camera hooked up to digitise me. I had to do it in two halves, because this room is too small and I didn't have enough of an angle on the camera to get all of me in at once. So I did it in two halves and this is one of the halves. Hideous isn't it, just look at those horrible – yes, anyway..."

which make it a really good game, but you can only do that if the game is right.

STF: What games would you most wish to have written? What do you admire the most?

I wish you hadn't asked me this, because I'm not really into games at all! There's lots of games which are excellent – they play well or the code is amazing – but I haven't seen anything that really has any element of imagination, you know, any sort of genius. I can't think of anyone who has got a reputation for writing that kind of game.

STF: How do you feel about the project at the moment?

I like it. It's not what I want to do in my heart, but as a sports game, it plays really, really nicely.


STF: What do you mean it's not what you want to do in your heart? What is?

I just want to write something which is *me*, you know, in which I can put lots of little touches of imagination. I don't think *Stormball* is it but I shouldn't really say that, should I? Ian will kill me! It is genuinely a nice game. I wrote *Archipelagos* and I had the feeling about that that I have now – it is an easy game to write because it works right. All the elements fall into place and work. I had to really force it through with *Resolution*. This one is writing itself.

STF: Have there been moments when you wished that you hadn't started?

Not really, no. I could easily imagine it as a game a long time before I actually wrote it. I had the vision as well with this one and it's all a matter of moving yourself from having a vision to actually having all the code. So there aren't really any points where you suddenly stop and think, God, what shall I do now?

There have been times where I wasn't happy with it, where you start to think, "this isn't a game – there's no excitement." And then you stop for a

week or two and come back and find it was OK. Even though it looked bad, it was just that you had been looking at it for such a long time.

STF: How do you sort out a good from a really rotten idea for a game?

I honestly don't know. You just have to have it in your mind for a hell of a long time. A good idea sort of hangs round in your head and the bad ones just drop away. There isn't any reason, that's just what happens.

STF: And where do you get your ideas?

Out of a book that I'm not going to show you!

STF: No, I mean, you have them when you're in bed, or out walking, or in the bath – or worse?

Not worse, no! Usually when I'm actually writing something. I tend to think, oh this is a nice routine, wouldn't it be nice if I could use it in a game which did blah-de-blah – and you know, that usually

happens. That's what happened with *Resolution*.

STF: What about payment, advances and so on? How is that sorted out?

Well, in our case Astral [the three man team Paul is part of] have worked with one publisher for a long time and built up a lot of trust with them. They know that over a period of about a year we can write a good game.

At the start we go along and say, we have a couple of ideas for games on these lines and they'll say, "Well, we like this idea here but this other one we're not too happy about. Write this one and we'll offer you X amount as an advance on your royalties." We'll say, "Oh no, we'd like a bit more please." And then we probably end up in the middle somewhere, usually a lot closer to their original sum than ours!


That amount is paid to us over the time we write the game, and then after it comes out and is on the market it earns royalties. Once it's earned as much as the advances that we were originally paid, then we also get straight royalties after that. On the whole though, the advances just about

WEEK 5: THE FIRST BITS OF GAME!




■ "Now I have a pitch on the floor rather than just one huge area. And I'm using a sprite which is actually me running, so I have a series of about eight sprites of me running around which you use."

"At this point your man can actually move on the pitch, so I would be controlling him with a joystick to make him turn around and run forwards and backwards. 

➤ cover everything the game makes in its lifetime.

STF: Doesn't that make you a bit suspicious? Yes, it does.

STF: Either the publishers lose a small amount of money on a lot of games, or it goes the other way and they end up not paying a lot of royalties that they ought to?

Yeah. I think that may be so. We have done some really nice games, but we still haven't really hit the market right. If you do that, I think you can easily earn twice as much.

STF: So why didn't *Resolution 101* make you millionaires?

Because people didn't buy it.

STF: Why didn't people buy it?


I don't know. Without trying to lay blame, it came out at the start of a very hot period and at a very well known slack time of the year for the market. I believe that every game that came out at that time didn't do terribly well. Obviously I could blame the quality of the game – some people might say that it just wasn't good enough.

STF: It got very good reviews, though.

It got good reviews on the whole, but it did get criticism for some aspects.

STF: Like the music, for example. Did you agree with that criticism?

On the whole, yeah. The gameplay is actually quite interesting, but it takes a long time to get into it. I could play the game because I knew how it

operated, but I think those new to it wouldn't really have known what they had to do and just ended up flying round shooting things.

"Perhaps there's something wrong with game players when they spend a whole day mindlessly playing computer games"

STF: So *Stormball* is going to be something that people can pick up and play?

It's going to be totally different, yes, because it will be instantly obvious what's in the game. At the same time you can play it over

weeks and I've made sure that you'll find other bits that keep you occupied. You have to actually play the game to improve rather than just be lucky.

STF: I always think it must be very difficult to write a game for someone who has never seen an ST game before, someone who got their ST at Christmas, for example, and at the same time satisfy the

sort of hardened cynics who will be reviewing it and everyone in between with different areas of expertise.

Absolutely. And I think there are a lot of writers who carry on and ignore that aspect of game design. We always try to make it an easy start. It's not quite like that on *Resolution*, because it's hard anyway. You can't make a game like that easy.

STF: Do you use kids for playtesting your stuff, or do you just depend on Millennium to playtest for you?

Up to now, yeah, but I want to take charge of that. Those people who test or comment on it can play the game anyway, because I've been sending them copies of it every month for the last year. They've been following the game right from the start. A person who just comes along and starts it up won't know what the hell is happening.

But then, on the other hand, you get someone who writes into *ST FORMAT* saying, this game is too easy, I spent £25 and I solved it in a day – there must be something wrong in the game. Perhaps there's something wrong with themselves if they can spend a whole day just lounging and mindlessly playing computer games. God, what a terrible thing to say! **stf**

WEEK 21 - JUST TURNED 21 - AND STORMBALL IS ALREADY IN ACTION




■ "This is right up to date, and all the elements of the game are in. We've now got two halves in the game, with each player in his own half. There's a sort of audience in the background. That's not how it will be, it's just a strip of colour which I can replace when it's been drawn by a real artist. I have the ball and am about to hit it. The small bar at the bottom of the screen shows how much time I have to hit the ball, so any moment now I will hit it.

"The other bar is the time the ball is allowed in each half, so I have obviously got quite a lot of time there to hit it out of my half and into the other bloke's half.


"I'll have to explain what I intend to do here. I'm aiming the ball into the opposite

corner, because even though you can't see it terribly well, there are three high score squares and if I hit it over there there's a high possibility that I'll hit one of those three. The other bloke is actually on my right which means I can hit it and he won't have enough time to move in"



■ "Now I've hit the ball, which is why the bar at the bottom is gone. The other bar is still there and you can see that it's much larger because it's only this moment entered the other person's half.

"I've just moved slightly sideways and the ball, which has entered the other half, is illuminating some of the squares as it moves. Those are the white squares"



■ "Now I've moved up to the half-way line so I can see more clearly what's happening over in the other half of the field. I've hit one of those high score squares, because you can see that the hundred has actually risen out of it and is moving up the screen. You can't see it terribly well because I'm hiding it, but the other bloke has now moved to the ball and has caught it. He's actually stopped it.

"What I'm intending to do is to move that sprite in the foreground a little bit to one side, so he's not hiding anything that's in the middle. Eventually, in the final version he'll be holding some kind of hockey stick-type of implement" **stf**

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
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

Worried about viruses? No? Well, you should be! Unless you operate a perfect "clean environment" you are bound to be infected at some time. The trouble is, it can take weeks before you realise, and by then your entire disk collection could be damaged. To help out, here's a program which examines every disk you put in the drive and tells you if it thinks it's dodgy.

STARTING OUT

Copy the file *GUARDIAN.PRG* to a blank disk as follows. First, use the

"Create Folder" option in the Desktop's File menu to make a folder called *AUTO* on your blank disk. Now copy *GUARDIAN.PRG* into that folder and reset your ST.

If you use this disk to start your ST each time you switch off or reset, then *Guardian* automatically loads, runs and hides itself in your ST's memory. If you later insert an infected disk, the screen flashes and a bell sounds, warning you that the disk may contain a virus. If so, you have the option to destroy it, but be careful. Don't ever attempt to repair commercial, auto-booting disks (and this includes *all* games) in this way: they'll become unusable.

Whatever virus-killer program you use, read the instructions carefully before you begin - and if you're not quite sure what you're doing, make a point of asking a friend before you do anything. We can't accept any responsibility if you ruin your disk collection.



PROPORTIONAL MOUSE ACCELERATOR

This smart little accessory applies a multiplier to the mouse movement depending on the speed you set it to. A fast move of the mouse moves the pointer a long way across the screen, thus minimising the amount of work that your poor tired little hands have to do. *PMA* comes with 3 preset speeds and multipliers so you can configure it to suit your needs. Each multiplier is used when the speed is less than or equal to the speed next to it. The table at the right shows how the mouse moves.


After you've set up *PMA* to give you the best balance of speed and usability, you can save the settings to disk by choosing "Save." A file called *PMA.INF* is then stored on the root directory of your disk, and in future

loads this is automatically read into *PMA*, ready for use.

STARTING OUT

To use *PMA*, you must copy the files *PMA.ACC* and *PMA.RSC* to a blank disk. Make sure that the files are saved to the root directory - that is, not in any folders. To use *PMA*, simply reset your ST with the *PMA* disk in the drive. Because it's an accessory, you can't run *PMA* from the Desktop. Instead, you should select the *PMA* accessory from the Desk menu at the top of the Desktop screen. For further information, read the *PMA.DOC* file which is stored in the same folder on the Cover Disk.

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
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First, take this copy of *ST FORMAT* firmly in one hand and tear off the small plastic package that's taped to the front. (If there isn't one there, see your newsagent for a replacement immediately.) Turn off your ST at the power switch and while it's off, have a look around for a couple of blank or unused disks that can be used to store all the Cover Disk files. Leaving the ST off while you're doing this kills any viruses that may be lurking inside – you don't want to infect your new Cover Disk.

(THE SAFE WAY TO) WAKE UP YOUR ST

Right, so you have a couple or three blank disks, and the ST has been cooling off nicely. The first job that needs doing is the preparation of the blank disks. You need the ST for this, but you need to be sure it's still virus-free. The best way to do this is to use the Cover Disk as a boot disk. Check that the write-protect notch in the corner of the Cover Disk is open, so that you can see through it. This prevents anything being written to it until you close the notch. Pop the

Cover Disk into the ST's drive slot and turn on the power switch.

SINGLE? DOUBLE? WHOSE SIDES ARE YOU ON?

With all this talk of single and double-sided disk drives, you may be wondering which type your ST has. Most STs have double-sided drives. All STEs, 1040s and MEGA STs have double-sided drives. It's only the very earliest 520STs which had "singles" fitted. Almost all 520STs sold for the last two years are "doubles." If yours might be a side short of the full load and you haven't had it long enough to be sure, there's a dead easy way to find out. Just follow these simple steps:

1. Turn off the ST for 30 seconds.
2. Insert the Cover Disk.
3. Switch on, and wait for the Desktop to appear.
4. Double-click on the Disk A icon to see the folders


(RAJ, READER, ACCS and SIDE 2).

5. Double-click again, on the folder SIDE 2.


6. If another group of folders is displayed (BASICS, MOREACCS, INDEX and GUARDIAN) then breathe a sigh of relief. You have a double sided drive.

7. If instead you get the message "Data on drive A may be damaged," you aren't so lucky. You can only access the folders on the first side, because you have a single-sided drive. You are able to copy only RAJ, READER and ACCS to a single-sided blank disk. Don't fret, though, you can still get copies of the side 2 programs if you check out the offer on this page. For now, just click on CANCEL and continue with the files you have.




1. Make sure that all the blank disks you want to format are write-enabled (with the little tabs closed) or you won't get much data on them! Put one into the drive and move the mouse pointer over to the Floppy Disk A icon. Click once on the icon with the left mouse button and it turns black




2. Now, using the mouse to move the pointer on the screen, move the arrow up to the menu bar at the top of the Desktop, over the word "File." The drop-down menu drops down, and at the end of the list of options is the word "Format." Move the arrow over the word and it turns black too



3. Click the left mouse button and a dialogue box appears, warning you that all the data will be lost from the disk in the drive if you continue with the formatting operation. Don't worry, because that's exactly what you want to do. Move the pointer onto the OK box and click on it to continue



4. Another dialogue box appears. If you have a double-sided drive, click on "Double-sided" (see the box on this page if you're not sure what kind of drive you've got). If you have a single-sided drive, you don't need to change the setting. Now go up to the box which says "Format" and click on it.




5. When you do this, your ST's drive starts to whirr and the orange light nearest to the drive comes on. While the formatting operation is progressing, the pointer changes to a bee and the screen displays this message. When it's finished, the screen changes to show the "Format Complete" box




6. The "Format Complete" box tells you how much free space there is on your now-formatted blank disk. A double-sided disk has 726,016 bytes free, while a single-sided one has only 375,376 bytes available. Click on OK and repeat the formatting operation for each of your blank disks

HOW TO BACK UP YOUR *ST FORMAT* COVER DISK - IN THREE EASY STEPS




1 OPEN THE WINDOWS

Now you have some ready-prepared blank disks (see previous page), it's time to start copying your *ST FORMAT* Cover Disk files to their new home. Pop your Cover Disk into the ST's drive and press the reset button at the back of the machine. After a couple of seconds, the Desktop appears again. Move the pointer to the Floppy Disk A icon, as




before, but this time double-click on it. A window appears in the middle of the screen (Fig. 1), showing the folders on side 1 of the Cover Disk. There should be four: RAJ, READER, ACCS and SIDE_2.

The next thing to do is re-size the window and reposition it to make copying easier. Aim the pointer at the small box at the bottom right corner of the window and hold down the mouse button. A




dotted line appears, similar in size to the window. Move the pointer around and the line follows it. When you release the button the window re-draws itself to the shape of the line. Pull the window to a shape like the one in Fig 2 and release the button.

Then aim the mouse at the menu bar, where it says A:\ and hold down the button again. Now when you move the mouse, a dotted box moves around the



screen. Move it to the top of the screen as in Fig 3 and release the button. The window moves to where the ghost-image was. This window, we'll call window A.


Point the pointer at Floppy Disk B icon and double-click the left button. The ST asks you to insert disk B (see Fig 4), so eject the Cover Disk and replace it with a blank disk. Now click on OK. Another window appears below the first




one, but with nothing in it (see Fig 5). We'll call this window B. Now we have a place to put the Cover Disk Files.

2 SHIFT THOSE FILES

The next step is to select the files you need to copy over first. Aim the pointer at window A, anywhere, and click once.




This re-selects A as the active window again. Now point at the first folder (RAJ) and click on it. Then hold down the shift key, aim at the next folder (ACCS) and click on that too. Still holding the shift key down, point at the next folder (READER) and click once more. Now let go of the [Shift] key and check that you now have three black folders in window




A. Assuming you have, point at any of the three and hold down the left mouse button. A ghost-image of the three icons appears, and you can move it around with the mouse (see Fig 6). Move the pointer part of the image into window B and let go.


Your ST responds by asking you to put in Disk A (that's the Cover Disk), to



check the files you selected, so swap the disks over again (see Fig 7). Your ST reads it, and a new dialogue box appears (see Fig 8). Click on OK. The copying operation begins and your ST may start asking you to swap the disks over again. If so, just remember disk A is the Cover Disk and disk B is the blank disk (and remember to keep your blank




disk away from the other blank disks, until you mark it!). When the process is finished, your screen looks like Fig 9..



changes to show the contents of that folder. Here you see four more folders (BASICTUT.001, GUARDIAN, INDEX and MOREACCS).

Use the shift-and-click method described before to highlight all four folders. Then drag them over to window B (see Fig 11) and release the button.

During the copy process which fol-



lows, change disks, etc., when your ST asks you, as you did before. At some point your ST tells you that your disk is full (see Fig 12) and stops copying. Examine the contents of windows to see which files didn't make it across and make a note of which they are. It's likely to be the GUARDIAN folder, but check anyway.



Eject the blank disk and mark on it what it is. Insert another formatted blank disk and use the same methods to copy over the last remaining folders or files. When finished, mark that disk too. You now have safe, virus-free copies of your *ST FORMAT* Cover Disk files. Turn back to the Cover Disk Pages to find out what to do with all those goodies... **stf**

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
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


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

PUTTING THE BOOT IN

Why do you need a "Boot" or "Start-up" disk? Well, if you use your ST for playing games you don't – but when you run more serious applications such as word processors or databases, a "Boot disk" enables you to initialise or set up your ST in just the way you want it before you run the main program. For example, you can set the date and time so that any files you create are automatically date stamped, or load in utility programs to assist you in a particular way. This "flexible friend" approach means you can get exactly what you require out of your system every time you boot up. What's more, creating your own personal Boot disk is easy – just see the box on page 55.

CALLING IN THE DA


There are lots of utility programs called Desk Accessories (DAs). Put these on your Boot disk, switch on with this disk in the drive and your ST loads the DAs into memory. Here they sit waiting to be called up – hence they're said to be memory resident. Then even though you're in the middle of doing something in your main program, you can pause, select your DA and carry out something completely different, then quit the DA and return to where you were before in your main program – sounds like time travel! Up to six DAs can be in memory at once, and this is where the fun starts – finding the best ones for your particular use. Out of the hundreds available, a few are commercial programs, like *Harlekin* and *Universal Item Selector*, but most of them are Public Domain – available for next to nothing from your friendly neighbourhood PD library. Let's look at a few of the best.

■ **Virtually all of these programs should be stocked by any half-decent Public Domain library. See this month's regular roundup and directory of libraries beginning on page 125. And we've put five of the little darlings on this month's Cover Disk too: turn to the Cover Disk pages, starting on page 45, for more information and a detailed explanation of how to make best use of them.**


MORE THAN SIX OF THE BEST

There are so many good DAs around that you may want to use more than half a dozen, but the ST's operating system can handle only six resident at one time. Here are some ways around this little problem.


1. You could have more than one Boot disk, with different sets of DAs on each disk, but this is a bit messy.
2. Try using the DA *DC Stuffer*, which enables you to have up to 32 DAs in memory at once. This is available from all the PD services and it works, but only if you have enough memory – at least a Mega ST.
3. Use a DA loading program which enables you to select the ones you want at boot-up time. An excellent choice is *Selector*, yours free on last issue's Cover Disk. (Miss that? See page 148 for info on ordering back issues.) Just put all your favourite DAs on the one disk and the loading program enables you to pick the six you want to suit what you're doing. If you're using the art program *Degas*, for instance, you might not need the mouse accelerator DA but might like the DA which loads in images in Tiny format. And when you switch to word processing, the DAs for disk formatting and word counting are more useful. Unfortunately, some DAs clash with each other and are not compatible – for example, you can't use *Speedmouse* and *Rat-Trap* together – and some early DAs can't run on the latest versions of TOS.




■ **Butler James is from Luxembourg but looks very English. Basically this is a superior CONTROL.ACC replacement with a few added features thrown in, like a virus checker. Not a bad chap, and certainly preferable to the standard Atari Accessory. Check it out for yourself – it's yours on this issue's Cover Disk!**




■ **CAL_20A is a calendar utility which does more than simply give you an on-screen display of any month. Click on the current date and it tells you how many days of the year have gone by. You can also go back or forward to any year (within reason, of course) to see what day of the week important events occurred**




■ **DJ-DUMP, by Martyn Dryden of The South West Software Library, enables you to print out a Degas picture to a Hewlett Packard DeskJet printer, and produces excellent dumps in any of three sizes. You have to load Degas itself first to run the DA version, although it is also available as a stand-alone program. Both versions, however, work in monochrome only**




■ **Double Vision** enables you to format a disk so it can be read as a single-sided disk in a single-sided drive but a double-sided disk in a double-sided drive. Whatever you put in the SIDE2 folder created on the disk can be read only on a double-sided drive. This facility could be quite handy if you use two STs




■ **Expander** is from France and also available as a stand-alone program. It enables you to re-format a single-sided disk into a double-sided disk, without losing any data! If you upgrade from an old 520ST with a single-sided floppy drive to a 1MByte double-sided disk drive, you can make loads more space on your disks




■ **Melt** is another amusing little DA. Click on it and the Desktop slowly starts to melt! Fool your chums into thinking you have a nasty virus in your ST! In fact **Melt** is quite harmless: simply click again with either mouse button and the Desktop is completely restored. Not all DAs have to be serious, you know!




■ **Format 11** is very useful for formatting disks from within a program without having to quit to the Desktop. Using the MSDOS setting with nine sectors and 80 tracks gives you a disk that can be used in a PC-compatible as well as your ST, thus enabling you to transfer text files between them. Use the settings 11 sectors and 83 tracks and you can format a double-sided disk to an amazing capacity of 923,648 bytes! Beware, though: not all disk drives can handle this number of tracks



■ **Edhak 2.0** is an excellent text editing/word processing DA – probably even better than **Word Window** on page 56. This one's actually Shareware – the PD version is like a demo of the full program (though it's fully usable on its own), and if you like it you then send the author a few quid for the complete version




■ **Machine Gun** helps relieve the tension of slaving over your ST for too long. Click on this and the mouse pointer becomes a gunsight. You can blast away at the screen, fill it with lead and enjoy the sound effects. When sanity returns, you can simply press the right-hand mouse button to restore the screen




■ **FCopy 3** or **FastCopy** is one of the best DAs ever written. Use it to make a copy of a whole disk, much faster than copying it file by file and with the minimum of disk swapping. It reads the disk you want to duplicate in one go, as long as you have enough memory, and makes a track-for-track "clone" of it on your target disk. **FCopy 3** works with a one or two floppy disk system or a hard drive, makes multiple copies, can format the new disk as it copies, checks for viruses – in fact, it has so many useful features that you'll just have to try it for yourself

MAKING YOUR OWN BOOT DISK FOR YOUR DAs


1. First take a new blank disk, put it into your ST and format it. To do this you need to have the ST Desktop on-screen. Move the mouse pointer to "File" at the top of the screen and a menu drops down. Click on "Format" and away you go.
2. Next copy some Desk Accessory programs onto this new disk. You can recognise them easily because DAs always end with .ACC – like CONTROL.ACC which comes with your ST when you buy it.
3. Make sure you have no more than six Accessories on the disk. Then with this new disk in the drive, press the Reset button on the back of the ST. Your screen goes blank for a moment, and then the DAs are loaded into memory. The ST Desktop re-appears, and if you now touch the word "Desk" (in the top left-hand corner of the screen) with the mouse pointer, down drops a little Menu listing the DAs just installed.




■ **Speedmouse** is one of the first mouse accelerator DAs, and if you haven't used one you should – it really makes a big difference! You can adjust the speed of the mouse and the acceleration, and **Speedmouse** can be turned on or off to suit – but once you've tried it, working without it is like walking in lead boots




■ **MMCopy** is an awfully useful utility that enables you to copy files from place to place very easily. Just open the windows of the disks involved, select the files to be copied and press the correct button. Even if you've got a single floppy drive system, this has its uses: you can open one window to show the contents of a folder for copying. **MMCopy** probably does a lot more but nobody around here reads German – can anybody out there translate the README.DOC for us illiterate folk?




■ **Mouse Trix** is an amazing new DA from South London. The PD version is a demo of the commercial release, which costs only a fiver itself. **Mouse Trix** includes a mouse accelerator and screen saver, and it gives you control over GEM's drop-down menus in your programs. It has loads of other features too




■ **ProgCalc** is a programmer's calculator. You can use it as an ordinary calculator, and input values by either clicking on the appropriate buttons with the mouse pointer or by using the ST keypad. But its real use is to make calculations in those mysterious number systems used by programmers and other boffins, like Binary or Hexadecimal. Values can be converted between the various options, and the results are held in the calculator's display screen even when you exit from the program




■ **Private Eye** shows you your ST's inner secrets – like which version of GEM you're running and the amount of RAM (memory) available. Some of the details shown may be a bit of a mystery to the beginner, but as you get into it you'll soon understand things like Drive Seek Rate and Top of Memory – er, won't you?



■ **Snapshot** is a classic DA, widely used, which enables you to grab an image from any part of the screen. You use the mouse pointer to draw a rectangular box of any dimensions anywhere on-screen. You can define just a part of the screen or all of it, then save what's framed by the box to disk as either an IMG, DOODLE, DEGAS, or NEO file, whichever you choose, with any name you like. You can then load the file into your own art or graphics program. **Snapshot** is also yours free on the Cover Disk



■ **MS-DOS** is another disk formatting DA, which can format on either your internal 3.5 inch drive or an external 5.25 inch drive if you have one. It formats disks to MS-DOS standard so they can be used in either a PC-compatible or ST machine. (If you have TOS 1.4 or above, you have this MS-DOS feature built in)



■ **Word Window** is the latest version of the WP program Word-400 V3. It gives you all the facilities of a simple-to-use word processor and you can call it up anytime, enabling you to write text and save to disk whenever you want. You can also load in a text file, even one produced by a completely different WP program. On-screen HELP can be displayed, and it even prints out the document to a printer if you want. Some of the features in this DA are better than those in commercial WP programs! *stf*

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
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

getting started



with GFA Basic

Bored with the games on your ST? GFA Basic has the reputation for being one of the best programming languages, especially for beginners. James Beswick begins a new series helping you to program with ease

After you've finished playing the games bundled with your ST pack, you may want to start programming your own masterpieces. By far the best language to start with is GFA Basic. Admittedly, you're not going to write a four-way parallax scrolling, two-player shoot-'em-up overnight – that's not the idea. Just writing a small utility actually gives a great feeling of satisfaction – especially if it works!

To get started, load the GFABASIC.PRG from this issue's Cover Disk. GFA Basic is what is commonly called an "interpreter." This means that to program in this language, GFA Basic must translate or interpret the lines in your program into machine code – the only language the computer can understand. You write your BASIC program using GFA instructions, and when you decide to run it GFA examines each line in turn and translates it into machine code instructions.

When you load GFA the screen you are faced with is called the "editor" – this is where you design and edit your programs. A useful feature of GFA is that it checks the validity of the line when you press [Return]. If it is incorrect in any way, your ST bleeps at you and also displays the message, "Syntax Error." Another handy feature of GFA is the way it indents lines of code to make them easy to read.

The lines of your programs are "executed" in the order they appear on the screen. When you're in the editor window you can click on "Direct Mode," type a command and then press [Return] to execute it immediately. You can read the file GFABASIC.DOC for straightforward instructions on how to use the editor.

GRAPHICS COMMANDS

GFA Basic has an impressive range of graphics commands, and they all do what they say they

do! The commands PLOT, BOX, CIRCLE and TEXT are all fairly straightforward.

The screen resolution you are currently running affects the graphics quality and the number of colours you can use. For this tutorial, everything demonstrated is especially written for low resolution, although the commands all still work in medium or high res.

Pixels are the tiny dots that make up the screen image. In low resolution, you have 64,000 of these (320 multiplied by 200) – a television picture, by comparison, is made up of about a quarter of a million pixels. To demonstrate the size of a pixel, press [Shift] and [F9] simultaneously and this takes you to "Direct Mode" in GFA Basic. Now type in the line:

```
PLOT 159,99
```

Press [Enter] and you now see a tiny black dot in the middle of the screen. This is the purpose of the PLOT command. The first value, 159, is the number of pixels to the right of the screen the dot is to appear, and similarly, the second value, 99, is the number of pixels down the screen the dot is to appear. These are called X and Y values respectively. Whenever you see X and Y in a command, you should replace them with these horizontal and vertical values.

Luckily, we don't have to plot all the shapes like this. To draw a circle, for instance, we can use the CIRCLE command. CIRCLE X,Y,R is similar to the PLOT command, except it has an extra value, R. This is the size of the radius (the straight distance from the centre of the circle to its edge), measured in pixels. Try this:

```
CIRCLE 159,99,50
```

Press [Enter] and a circle with a radius of 50 pixels appears in the centre of the screen, as long as you're using low resolution

If we wanted a box the command we need is, amazingly, called BOX. This is slightly different, though, since BOX X,Y,X2,Y2 has two extra X and Y values.

The first set mark the position of the top-left corner of your box and the second set, this time called X2 and Y2, mark the bottom-right corner

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You don't have to spend a thing to get straight into this programming lark. Just use the terrific GFA Basic 2 included free on this issue's Cover Disk – and see our Cover Disk pages, beginning on page 45.

of the box. Type in the following command:

```
BOX 0,0,319,199
```

In low-resolution mode this draws a box that is the whole width and height of the screen. The various commands PLOT, CIRCLE and BOX are demonstrated in three files which you can easily find in the GFADEMOS folder. Press the [Escape] key to leave "Direct Mode," then press [F1] and use the file selector to load these files.

THE WRITING'S ON THE WALL

There are a number of ways to write text to the screen. One is to use the TEXT command. This enables you to create certain effects with the text, but for now, we won't use these. Go back to "Direct Mode," type CLS and press [Return] to clear the screen. Now type the following line:

```
TEXT 30,40,"Hello World!" [Enter]
```

"Hello World!" appears 30 pixels across and 40 pixels down on the screen. But notice the quotation marks you typed are not displayed. This is because the text you want displayed must be contained inside them. As you might guess, this causes some problems, one being the fact that if your text contains quotes, you get an error message, since you can't have quotes within quotes, at least not at this stage.

Besides using the TEXT command you can also use PRINT to display information. For example, on the Direct screen try typing the following:

```
PRINT "Hello World" [Enter]
```

The words Hello World magically appear on the screen. You can change the position at which these letters appear on the screen by adding the X and Y co-ordinates:

```
PRINT AT(5,5) "Hello World"
```

The X and Y co-ordinates are used differently in

the PRINT command. A low resolution screen can display 40 characters horizontally and 20 characters vertically, medium res. can display 80 characters by 20 and high res. screens can show 80 characters by 40. The PRINT AT command instructs your ST to position the text according to these conditions.

I WANT SOME COLOUR!

Colours are unfortunately slightly bewildering for the beginner. It's because of their red, green and blue (RGB) format. On the ST, you're allowed 16 colours on screen at any one time, mixed from a palette of 512 colours (unless you've got an STE, in which case you have 4,096 of them available to you). To complicate things even more, the way monitors and televisions produce their colours is by mixing together a controlled amount of the primary colours red, green, and blue. For instance, maximum red and maximum blue make the colour purple. To set the ST's colour palette, we use the command SETCOLOR

HOW TO MIX THOSE COLOURS

| COLOUR | R | G | B |
|--------|---|---|---|
| Red | 7 | 0 | 0 |
| Green | 0 | 7 | 0 |
| Blue | 0 | 0 | 7 |
| Yellow | 7 | 7 | 0 |
| Purple | 7 | 0 | 7 |
| Cyan | 0 | 7 | 7 |
| White | 7 | 7 | 7 |
| Black | 0 | 0 | 0 |

C, R, G, B (note the American spelling). C is the number of the colour you want to set and its range is from zero to 15. Zero is the background colour and 15 is the text colour. R, G and B are the values which determine what the colour is. This does need a bit of practice, though, since it's quite tricky. The maximum brightness you can have for a given colour is seven. Run the program called SETCOLOR.BAS and experiment with the values until you get the hang of it.

MAKING YOUR FIRST DEMO

Over the next few parts of this tutorial, we'll show you how to write your own demo. OK, it's not going to be the supreme demo, but it should demonstrate the commands pretty well. However, as with all programs, you've got to have a plan. This is because you can guarantee any program over four lines long won't work straight away! Luckily, I've already planned it out (and here's one I prepared earlier...). It's in two parts – the introduction and the demo. Let's concentrate on the introduction.

This is a "GFA DEMO" logo, with multi-coloured stars twinkling in the background, and a "pen" writing a short message on the screen. Sounds complex? All will be revealed! Go back to the editor and load the file DEMO.BAS from the Cover Disk. Don't run it yet, though! Let's take a quick look at the programming first.

You are going to find some commands you don't understand yet, ones that I've introduced

into this routine. "CLS" is the simplest command there is – it clears the screen. In the place of the logo which we'll design next month, I've placed a white, empty box in the middle of the screen, using the BOX command. I've also used variable techniques – these are similar to the algebraic techniques that you hated at school! More on those soon.

RANDOM is also new to you. The computer generates a random number between zero and the number within the parentheses (brackets to some). This number is subsequently stored. COLOR is a command that utilises SETCOLOR. Unfortunately, one problem with GEM (see *Jargon-busters*, starting on page 65), is that when you use a colour, you don't necessarily get the one you want! More on this later.

Other new commands include EDIT, which leaves the program and returns to the editor. With the REPEAT and UNTIL commands, you create a loop around a particular part of your program – it continues to execute that part until the particular condition you've specified is true.

Well, that just about does it for this month – be here next month when we look at loops, conditional statements, variables, and using commercial graphics packages to create graphics for your programs. We'll also be putting the finishing touches to the introductory screen in the GFA Demo, and then we can get on and write the main routine. **stf**

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
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
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
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
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
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FORMAT gold awards 1990



Drumroll. Fanfare. Spotlight picks out tiny figure on incredibly distant stage. Yes, it's the biggest and bravest awards ceremony to celebrate the events, achievements and cock-ups of 1990. Your host with the post, Steve Carey, presents the prizes for the best and worst of the past year

That was the year that was, folks. On the one hand, it was the year, regrettably, that the STE's incompatibilities, the TT's delays and the Stacy's lack of lasting power showed that Atari still have trouble walking and chewing gum at the same time. Yet on the other hand it was also the year that saw a bigger, bolder and downright better world of ST games and indeed serious/productivity software than we've ever had the pleasure of getting to know before.

1990 gave us such astonishing pieces of software as Neodesk 3, Lattice C5 and DeluxePaint ST, and truly breathtaking games such as

F-19 Stealth Fighter, Kick Off 2 and Sim City. It was a year in which some people continued to complain – and others rejoice – that the ST is a damn fine games machine.

The wisest simply acknowledged that the ST's core business in Britain has always been as a games machine anyway, and that if this gave it a "Trojan Horse" effect and opened up opportunities for serious and productivity software, that was no bad thing. ST owners are now spoilt for choice when it comes to the range of programs available for their machine. And it's not going to stop in 1991 either.

On the one hand, 1990 was the year that a

newcomer called ST FORMAT moved purposefully centre-stage, to become the bestselling magazine serving the ST owner in Britain. Readership shot up from 43,246 (July to December 1989) to 50,007 (January to June 1990) and way beyond, while the size and range of the magazine increased considerably.

However, it was also the year that one ST magazine went bust (*Stampede*); another went quarterly and ever closer to a much rumoured demise (*ST World*) and yet another dropped its independently audited status, went through three editors and crowned the year by putting a virus on its December Cover Disk (*ST User*).

READERS' AWARDS

Two issues ago we asked you to make your nominations. We were amazed by the quality as well as the quantity of the replies. Thanks for taking the time. Without more ado, these are the ST FORMAT Reader Awards 1990.



ST game of the year: **SIM CITY**

Heavily nominated: F19 Stealth Fighter; third placed Kick Off 2 and second placed MidWinter. The overall winner is the exceptionally well-thought out and intelligent "world simulator." Fans will be delighted to know that programmers Maxis are putting the finishing touches to the follow-up, *Sim Earth*, due from Ocean in a month or two. (*Sim City* £29.99 from Infogrames ☎ 071 738 8199. Reviewed in STF 12: 92%)



■ Infogrames' highly regarded "world simulator," *Sim City*, clearly won the approval of a great many game-players



"Serious" ST software program of the year: **DELUXEPAINT ST**

Heavily nominated: Lattice C5 and *That's Write*, third placed TCB Tracker and second placed Neodesk 3. But the winner, by a long, long way – influenced no doubt by the useable demo on STF 15 – goes to the best thing that's ever happened to the ST's graphics, *DeluxePaint ST*. (DPaint ST £59.99 from Electronic Arts ☎ 0753 49442; reviewed in STF 15: 96%)

ST company of the year: **EVESHAM MICROS**

Heavily nominated: third placed Silica/SDL and second placed Gasteiner. But the clear winner, by a two to one majority over second place, is

Evesham Micros, now the biggest seller and repairer of STs in Britain. (☎ 0386 765500)



ST software house of the year: **MICROPROSE**

Heavily nominated: HiSoft (the clear "serious" software winners), Ocean, Mirrorsoft (though a number of people thought the Bitmaps were publishers – which, as Renegade, they now are), third placed Electronic Arts and second placed Psygnosis (who may be somewhat surprised to see themselves proclaimed as heroes of the ST this year). The winners, by a narrow margin, picked up a surprising number of votes for *Rainbird* – one assumes attributable to *MidWinter*.



ST Public Domain library of the year: **GOODMAN PDL**

Heavily nominated: South West Software, MPH and Floppyshop; third placed Softville PD and second, ST Club. First, by the narrowest of margins, Mike Goodman's highly professional and comprehensive service. To make it clear how close it all was, any of the above mentioned could have won, with no-one in the ST FORMAT office crying "Foul."


It's good to see that the ST is so exceptionally well-served in this department, and this tight contest suggests strong loyalty to a wide range of libraries and excellent service from the top dozen. There were also many others up there, including PDom, LAPD, Riverdene and Page 6.

Printer manufacturer of the year: **STAR**

No other nominations. Star have driven the price of printing relent-


lessly down, with the LC-200 and LC24-200 at exceptional value. (Apologies once again for the incorrect pricing in our reviews: the true prices, considerably lower than those quoted in STF 17, are £297.85 and £366.85 respectively).



Music software of the year: **PD - ACCOMPANIST/ HENRY COSH SEQUENCER HOME - TCB TRACKER**

No longer do you need to be a tech-head to make music on your ST. The former (featured in a full, special edition on STF 16) is available from any PD Library worth its salt – see this issue's PD section, beginning page 124, for a directory. The amazing *TCB Tracker*, written by one of the best demo writers in the business (reviewed in STF 16: 93%), is just brilliant (£39.95 from MPH ☎ 0603 503382).

Incidentally, your professional musicians go for C-Lab's *Creator/Notator*. If it's good enough for Fleetwood Mac, Madonna, Betty Boo and Jazzy B, it's good enough for the rest of us too. Not only do you get cracking software, there's also excellent support (£299, £499; Sound Technology ☎ 0462 480000).


Educational program of the year: **FUN SCHOOL 3**

At last! Education software that does what it's supposed to do: make learning fun. There was really no competition when it came to deciding this one (£24.99, over 7s, 5-7, and under 5s: ☎ 051 357 2961).



Educational software house of the year: **DATABASE EDUCATIONAL SOFTWARE**

Fun School was the program that moved the goalposts as far as expectations of educational software sales are concerned, giving a major boost to the whole market. Edition 3 is a superb package, too. (☎ 051 357 2961)

Cock-up of the year: **THE STE**

Despite strong competition from the ST magazine that put a virus on its Cover Disk (ST User, December), Atari simply sailed away with the tragedy of the STE. Firstly, much of the software was incompatible, then a faulty chip made it hard drive-unfriendly. Both problems have subsided, but the nasty taste in the mouth remains. Signs are that Atari are on the way to recovery, but they cannot afford another such Golden Turkey.



Worst full-price commercial game: **WEB OF TERROR, IMPRESSIONS**

Hotly pursued by *Bubble Plus* (Info-frames, STF 12: 38%), *Web of Terror* set new standards (STF 16: 35%). Other nominations include another Impressions turkey, *Rorke's Drift* (STF 13: 46%) and the immensely disappointing *Chuck Yeager's AFT* (Electronic

Arts, STF 17: 34%). I'm afraid that this is just not good enough, chaps, not by a long chalk!

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
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jargon-busters

Get to grips with the gobbledegook and beat those buzzwords with the ST FORMAT drivel-dictionary



Words like this are explained in their own entry

Alert messages: Your ST warns you that certain operations, like **formatting** a disk or erasing files, can be dangerous to data. A **dialogue box** pops up with an alert message which you must read before proceeding

Application: The ST's posh name for a program, so named because you apply your ST to the task in hand. Also what you do with Vicks Vapo-Rub

ASCII: Acronym for American Standard Code for Information Interchange, the standard method for sending data from computer to computer. Every character and punctuation mark has a unique code number

Auto-boot: See **Boot**

ASIC: Acronym for Beginners' All-Purpose Symbolic Instruction Code, which is the most popular programming language for newcomers to the ST

Baud Rate: Pronounced "board"; the speed in **bits** per second that your ST communicates with another computer. All transmissions over telephone lines conform to a standard baud rate of either 300, 1200, 2400 or 9600 baud. It is *not* the rate at which you get bored with playing *Rorke's Drift*

Bee Icon: The ST changes the mouse pointer to a bee when it's busy searching for data from a disk

Bit: The smallest unit of computer data. Eight bits make a **byte**, four bits make a **nibble** (See also **Kilobyte**, **Megabyte**)

Boot: You boot your ST by (a) turning on the power or (b) pressing the reset switch when you have a disk in the drive. The ST reads the first part of the disk (the bootsector) and then displays the **Desktop**. The bootsector can be set to auto-boot a specific program, which runs immediately upon booting with no input required from you. Also a shoe with tall sides

Byte: Computer **memory** is organised into groups of eight data **bits**, called bytes – short for "by eight" (see **Nibble**)

Cartridge: Cartridges plug into the port on the side of the ST and often contain a program on a chip, which loads instantly since it does not require the use of the disk drive

Click: You perform a click by positioning your mouse pointer on an **icon** on screen and quickly pressing and then releasing a mouse button once

Close box: The small box at the upper left-hand corner of a **window**, used to close an active window – that is, one you're working in

Colour Palette: The ST has the capability to dis-

play 512 different colours (STes can show 4096), 16 of which can be stored in a special area of **memory**, known as the colour palette. These 16 can all be on screen at once

Cursor: The square black marker that shows where the next typed character is to go. Also the editor when he sees how late we all are with our pages

Data file: Used by programs to store incidental information, or by programmers to store user instructions. The data file **icon** is like a sheet of paper with one corner folded over

Desk accessory: Accessories are programs with a filename ending in .ACC. Stored on the **root directory** of a disk, these are automatically loaded into the ST's memory on booting. They can then be run at will, by selecting the relevant name from the **GEM** Desk menu, at the top left of the **Desktop**

Desktop: See **GEM Desktop**

Dialogue box: Messages your ST displays, informing you of the effects of some operation or other. You cannot remove a dialogue box from the screen unless you acknowledge the message by **clicking** on one the buttons

DiskCopy: The ST's copy program. Move Floppy Disk Icon A on top of Floppy Disk Icon B and it attempts to make an exact copy of the source disk, but it's not infallible. For example, it can't copy non-standard disks (like the *FORMAT* Cover Disk)

Disk Drive: Your ST's main storage device. It uses this to read from the **floppy disk** and write data to it. The ST displays a Floppy Disk **Icon** on the **Desktop** for each disk drive you have connected

Double-click: Two quick **clicks** on the left mouse button. Double-clicking opens **files**, runs programs and enters **folders** and disks

Dragging: The method for moving **icons** around the **Desktop**. Point at the chosen object, press the left mouse button and hold it down. The object selected should turn into an outlined **ghost-image** which moves around the screen as you move the mouse. Let go of the mouse button to deposit the icon in its new position

DTP: Acronym for Desk Top Publishing, the high-tech method of creating newspapers, magazines and books using computers for typesetting and printing

File: A chunk of information stored on disk. Could be a program, a data block, a document or any other collection of storable information. Also a thing you use on your fingernails

File Copy: To copy individual files from a **window** to a disk or from a window to another window. You reposition a file **icon** in its new home by **dragging**

Floppy Disk: The actual storage medium where data is kept. Made of a similar material to audio tape, but it's flat, round and er, floppy. Kept safe inside a plastic sleeve, which you insert into a **disk drive**

Folder: The ST's name for a directory. You can store many **files** inside a folder and move them all around at once by moving just the folder **icon**. To access a file which is inside a folder, simply **double-click** on the folder icon

Format: You prepare a blank disk to take data by formatting it. The ST checks the disk and creates spaces which can be used to store files. Formatting erases all data which is on the disk in the first place, so use it with care

Full Box: The opposite of the **Close Box**. This opens the selected **window** up to full screen size to enable you to see many more files than you'd see with a small window

Function Keys: The topmost row of keys on the ST keyboard, marked F1 to F10. These can have a multitude of different functions (or none at all), depending on what the particular program you're running uses them for. Many serious programs use them to do repetitive tasks at the touch of one key

GEM: Acronym for Graphics Environment Manager. This program is the part of the ST's operating system which handles all the **windows**, **icons**, and graphics functions used on the **Desktop**

GEM Desktop: The main ST screen which includes (at least) two Floppy Disk **Icons**, the **Menu Bar** and the **Trash** Icon. You get this when the ST **boots** as normal, before running any programs. From here, you can select various functions and any **Desk Accessories** you have loaded

Ghost: An outline of an **icon**, **file** or **window** which shows the current position of that item as it is dragged around to a new location on the **Desktop**. Also a nasty ST **virus** which flips the up and down axis of your **mouse**, so it operates backwards

Hard Disk or Hard Drive: Another storage medium, this time with a non-removable magnetic surface. It's faster than a **floppy disk** and can hold a lot more data

High Resolution: One of three video display modes available on the ST. High Resolution consists of 640 dots horizontally by 400 dots vertically and is only black and white. You need a high resolution monochrome **monitor** to use this mode. Also the Resolution least likely to get broken after New Year

Icon: A small picture on the **Desktop**, representing an item such as a **disk**, **file** or **folder**. You select files and operate programs by **clicking** on the appropriate icon

Information Line: The line at the top of a **window** which shows how many **bytes** are used and how many items there are

Input/Output (I/O): The name for the communications process that occurs when your ST talks to its **disk drives**, printers, etc. Input is data that comes into the ST, from a floppy disk for example. Output is the reverse – for instance, data sent out to a printer

Interface: A hardware connection that enables your ST to communicate with a **peripheral** device. Could be a printer cable, or a **hard drive** connection, for example

Kilobyte (K): 1024 bytes (not a thousand bytes, because it's binary for 2 to the power 10). Also what you can get from an angry Rottweiler if you're not careful

Low Resolution: Another of the ST's video display modes. Low Resolution has a display size of 320 horizontal dots by 200 vertical dots and can display 16 colours on screen at once. If you have a **high resolution monitor**, you cannot access Low Resolution mode. Also the Resolution most likely to be broken after New Year (the one about drinking, prob'ly)

Loop: See **Loop**

Medium Resolution: The third of the ST's three video display modes. Medium Resolution has a display size of 640 horizontal dots and 200 vertical dots and can display four colours on screen at once. Medium resolution cannot be accessed on a **high resolution monitor**. Also the New Year's resolution which lasts about three months (the one about smoking, prob'ly)

Megabyte (M, MByte): A thousand kilobytes (see **Kilobytes, Bytes**).

Memory: The electronic circuits inside the ST which store data and programs. There are two types: RAM (Random Access Memory) which loses its data if the power goes off; and ROM (Read Only Memory), where the main operating system is kept, which retains its data without power, but cannot be written to. Memory is also, er, um, what is it now? Er. Never mind

Menu Bar: The bar at the top of the **GEM Desktop**. When you start up, it displays the Desk, File, View and Options menu titles. Other **applications** may have different headings

MIDI: Acronym for Musical Instrument Digital Interface. A built-in standard **interface** designed to connect your ST to a musical instrument such as a keyboard or a drum machine

Modem: Short for MODulator/DEModulator. A device which enables you to connect your ST to a telephone line and thereby communicate with other remote computers and bulletin boards

Monitor: A device like a TV set, but without the ability to tune into BBC1 or any other transmission. You plug it into the monitor socket on the ST which sends pure video signals straight to the screen, for a better, clearer picture. But no *Neighbours*

Mouse: The device which moves the pointer around on screen. You slide it around on a flat surface and

the small rubber ball inside picks up the movement and relays it back to your ST, which updates the pointer's position. A mouse also has two buttons on the top for selecting files and operating programs by **clicking**. Also a small furry rodent which gets Mum standing on a chair in the kitchen screaming

Move Bar: The bar at the top of a **window**, just above the **Information Line**. You click on this bar to drag the whole window around the **Desktop**. Also what you do when you're chucked out of the pub

Nibble: Four **bits**, or half a **byte**. Also something you hope to get when you're out – er, fishing

Parallel Interface: A standard **interface** for connecting your ST to a high-speed printer. It's the one marked "Printer" on the back of your ST

Partition: Hard disks are subdivided into smaller sections called partitions. To the ST, each partition looks like a separate **disk drive**, but they are actually part of the same block of storage. Also the thin plasterboard wall which allows you to hear next door when they're fighting or bonking

PCB: Acronym for printed circuit board, which all the chips and components of the ST are soldered onto. Also PolyChlorinated Biphenyl, a nasty gas pumped into the atmosphere when you burn toxic waste

Peripheral: Any device which can be connected to your ST, like a **monitor**, printer, **disk drive**, etc

Pixels: The tiny dots which make up the ST's video display. The name comes from "picture element"

Pointer: The arrow which you move around the **Desktop** to select files and operate programs. Also a dog which seems to have something against wounded pheasants and blows the whistle on them

Program File: A file which contains an **application**. Program file **icons** on the **Desktop** are boxes with a shaded top edge

RAMDisk: A program that creates a pseudo-disk drive, which functions as a **disk drive** but is actually just a spare part of **RAM**. Very helpful for single drive owners who get tired of disk swapping, since it enables you to perform copy operations in two quick moves

RAM, ROM: See **Memory**

Reset Button: The small, spring-loaded, grey button at the back of your ST. Press this and the system re-boots (see **Boot**) and forgets whatever it was previously doing. This doesn't kill any internal **viruses**, though: to do that, you need to switch off the main power for at least 30 seconds

Resolution: See **High, Low** and **Medium Resolution**

RGB: Acronym for Red, Green, Blue. These are the three primary colours which the ST uses to create its colour video display. An ST has eight levels of intensity for each colour, creating 512 different colours. An STE has 16 intensity levels, giving 4096 colours

Root Directory: Where a **file** is said to be when

it's written directly onto a disk and isn't in a **folder**. Also a very very small map which shows termites the way to the bottom bit of a tree

RS232: An industry-standard connection for **peripherals** which require serial information. Serial information is sent **byte** after byte down the **interface** cable. On the ST's casing the RS232 port is marked "**Modem**," although serial printers may also be connected here

Scroll: To move information up, down left or right, using the slider bars at the side of the **window**

Scroll Bar: One of two bars that border an active **window**. **Click** on the arrows at the ends of the bar and the information moves in that direction. The shaded portion represents information which is not currently visible on the screen. The white block shows the portion which can be seen and it can be moved with the arrows, by clicking on the shaded part or by **dragging** the block itself

Sector: A section of a **track** on a **floppy** or **hard disk**. On an ST disk, each is 512 **bytes** long

16-bit: A computer (like your ST) which can read in and write out 16 **bits** at a time. Consequently it runs a lot faster than 8-bit machines.

Size Box: The small box at the lower right-hand corner of a **window** which can be **dragged** to expand or shrink the window. Doing so is called "sizing"

Spacebar: The long horizontal key at the bottom of the keyboard which prints spaces when hit. Also a pub on the moon; the Ed's been there and he says it's got no atmosphere

TOS: Acronym for Tramiel Operating System, the main program stored on **ROM** inside the ST. It controls all the ST's functions and the operation of the **disk drives**, **mouse**, printer, video display and so on. In short, the brain of the ST

Track: A circular path on a **hard** or **floppy disk**, which contains several **sectors**. The data on the disk is arranged into tracks like those on a record, so they can be read or written quickly

Trash: The **GEM Desktop icon** which is used to delete **files** or **folders** from a disk. Once placed on the Trash icon, data is erased permanently

Virus: A nasty little program which is stored in the bootsector (see **Boot**) of a **disk** and does strange things to your ST (see **Ghost**, for instance). It's hidden, so you can't readily find it, and it runs when you boot from that disk. It lies in **memory** and can copy itself to other disks' bootsectors if not discovered and eradicated

Window: The work area that the ST uses to display **files** and **folders**. You may have up to four windows on the **Desktop** screen at once. Also the large glass object that stops your room being really dark all day

Write-Protect: To prevent a **disk** from being written to by the **disk drive**. Every floppy disk has a small tab in the corner: set it so that you can see through the hole in the disk. When it's in this position, no data (or **viruses**) can get onto the disk **stf**



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
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


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


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
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
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

God games like *Supremacy*, *Millennium 2.2*, *UMS 2*, *Populous* and *Sim City* are hypnotically compulsive. None of them, though, had as much to live up to as *Powermonger*. It's the latest game from the Bullfrogs, the programmers who created *Populous*, which was deservedly one of the biggest-selling ST games of all time. But although this is a God game played on an isometric 3D landscape, that's where any similarity to *Populous* reaches an abrupt end.

Your ambition in *Powermonger* is to conquer a staggering 195 territories – but you handle each of them individually, so in any single game the objective is to win just one territory. You can then save your position to disk with the save-game option, coming back later to tackle more.

An overview map in the top left of the screen shows the entire terri-


If you're the sort who longs for a starring role in the Gulf War, or have a ghoulish fascination with dead bodies, or you're just plain power hungry, then your needs are about to be satisfied, sicko. Forget all the rumours and play *Powermonger* for yourself – finally.

tory you're playing on, while a detailed close-up map reveals a small section of it in impressive 3D. You can use this to zoom in on individual characters, settlements and battles. By clicking on four icons at the top of the screen you can spotlight settlements, people, roads and contours on the overview map to

help plan where to direct your campaign.

To initiate a move you first select a Captain from your ranks and then send him off with his men to subjugate a village,



WAR: A GUIDE FOR THE UNINITIATED

That expanse of space in the centre of the screen is devoted to displaying a detail of the landscape, but all your decisions are made by clicking on the icons round the map. When you make a move where a location must be specified (as in the case of Attack, Trade and Invent), you choose your destination by clicking on the small overview map

POSTURE Click on one, two or three swords to determine your aggression level. The "Posture" setting affects all sorts of things in the game. On a high aggression level you find it very hard to strike an alliance with someone but you are able to kill many more villagers in an attack. You can set Captains up so they each have different posture settings

DISK OPTIONS Besides loading and saving the game, this icon also gives you the opportunity to switch to multi-play

SPY This enables you to send out a spy to infiltrate your enemies' village and bring back useful information







trade or form an alliance. At the start of a game you have only one Captain but you can accumulate more as you press forward.

In the first territory all you have to do to win is race round the island and attack every settlement you can lay your sword to before your obedient serfs starve to death. To attack, you select the Attack icon and then highlight the settlement you want to target. Your men race off to it and begin to attack. If it's equipped with superior weapons you're likely to fail – and in this case small angels rise from the battlefield as your men are sliced to death. If you succeed in defeating the village, your men gather in a circle around your Captain until you decide what audacious move to make next.

Usually you wouldn't charge short-sightedly into battle. Instead you first check how far the village tribe have advanced and how many people live in the village. You may

STRAIGHT FROM THE PROGRAMMER'S MOUTH

To get you off on the right track, *FORMAT* went to programming team Bullfrog's head honcho, Peter Molyneux, to get you his Top Ten Tips for advancing through the early stages of the game.

Take it away, Peter...

1 You don't have to conquer all 195 territories to win the game: you just have to go from the top left of the main map down to the bottom right. Picking a route going approximately diagonally down the big map is obviously the shortest way to go, but of course when we designed the worlds we realised this and put some real toughies in your way.

2 If you do happen to meet a particularly tough land, consider going around this territory to find an easier one.

3 If you start a territory with more than one computer opponent, watch what they do. If they start attacking each other they have been set up in a state of war. Pick your side carefully and make an alliance with the better side (by clicking on the Hands icon on the left side and then selecting one of his villages). This enables you to use all of his resources, such as food and equipment. Be careful if you break the alliance, though, since he'll then tend to pick your villages to attack. Also, he has the capacity to break the alliance as well, so don't trust him too much.

4 When you first start into a territory, check how many men are under your command. Click on some of these troops to see if they are using any weapons.

5 Beware whenever you attack towns which have been inventing weapons. The people from these towns try to pick up the weapons from their workshop before engaging you in battle.


6 If a town has weapons, try to ambush the people when they are far from the town. This stops them picking up the weapons.

7 Sometimes it is worth inventing rather than attacking. Bear in mind that a person equipped with a pike can kill as many as two people holding nothing, and someone equipped with a sword can kill up to three people holding nothing. A bow means the person holding it can kill from a distance, and cannons or catapults are deadly.

8 If you have invented bows, it's a good idea to have an army equipped half with bows and half with other weapons.

9 Bear in mind that a character's strength in hand to hand combat depends on his age and how much he likes you. This also applies to the power of bowmen.

10 It takes a very long time to produce a cannon or catapult – but if the town that's in the process of making it is defeated, the stage that the cannon was at is saved, so

the victor has less time to wait for the finished weapon.

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TWICE THE THRILL

The Bullfrogs have always been fascinated by the idea of multi-player games – and who can blame them? The idea of playing against a friend rather than a computer opponent is enough to make your hands sweat in anticipation. In *Powermonger* there are two forms of multi-player mode available, and both demand that each player competes on a separate ST. You can connect the two machines using either a data or modem link. To connect the machines using a datalink, you need to buy yourself an RS232 lead (just £10.95 from Lightwave, ☎ 051 639 5050). This method demands that both STs be in the same room. The alternative, a modem link, requires both players to own their own modems. This is more costly but the connection between the STs is then made across the telephone line, enabling you to play either against your mate next door or your Swedish pen-friend.

When in multi-player mode both players choose their side from any of four tribes. The view shown on your ST is identical to that in a single-player game, but when you raid a village it belongs to your friend and not an invisible opponent. For more of a challenge, you can opt to switch on up to two computer opponents who also play on the same map. You then need to defeat his villages as well as those belonging to your mate if you want to win *Powermonger*.

from the fight. You're then informed that you've won the island and you're returned to the main map where you can select the next adjacent territory to attack.

In the more advanced games you can have as many as four computer opponents all competing for prime spots on the territory. They often develop weapons judiciously and then attack with prime accuracy. You don't win the game by being nasty but by caring for your people's needs. You must keep them supplied with food and be sure to attempt alliances and trade, not just whip out your sword and go on a bloodthirsty search for flesh.

EFFECTS

This is no simple re-hash of *Populous*. Although the isometric 3D playing area looks similar, the landscape has so much extra detail that it's radically different. Villages comprise taverns, workshops and barns, with smoke effectively pouring out of the occasional chimney. Every character in the game is represented by a small graphic and even has its own name. Using a Query icon you can click on each character and display

his name and profession. There are even sheep roaming the fields and birds flying through the trees.

Complicating your viewpoint and affecting your villages' ability to produce food are regular falls of rain and snow. When the snow falls on the landscape, everywhere pales gradually into white.

Sound effects are equally comprehensive, and for once they aren't limited to a handful of spot indeterminate grunts. Instead, you're treated to the sampled sounds of sheep baaing, birds singing and men going to work in villages. This adds a whole dimension to the gameplay: if you merely overhear the men in enemy villages working you may want to go there and put a stop to their ambitious designs.

VERDICT

Each year there are a tiny handful of games which look like something really special – the ultimate game? Although *Powermonger* is a technically better game than *Populous*, however, it doesn't have the same immediate appeal, and this is going to prove off-putting – particularly to people who've just bought their ST and are new to strategy-war games.

Sadly, what lets *Powermonger* down most is its 44-page manual. It adequately explains how each icon can be used and how to utilise the different options to your own advantage, but unlike comparable manuals such as *Supremacy's* and *Imperium's*, it lacks a walk-through of the first few minutes of play. Instead, you're tossed into the action and left mercilessly to your own devices to work out by trial and error the best way to win a campaign. Thus, the first time you pick up *Powermonger* you're not sure whether you should concentrate on inventing new weapons or just stick to your sword and dart round the island using it on every poor little homestead you can reach.

Nevertheless, once you've finally worked out how to proceed this is one of the most absorbing games around, in the same league as *Supremacy* and *Millennium 2.2*. With astonishing attention to detail and an engrossing range of options at your fingertips, you just can't stop conquering villages.

There are hideous creatures with antennae and more than a natural number of legs needing to be dealt with. The invasion must be stopped, and there's only one person suitable for the dirty job. It's not the ordinary alien attack from Planet X that we're talking about here. It's insects – and they've taken over the whole house.

Your day's work starts in a quiet and secluded cul-de-sac. Seven houses are infested by larger-than-life insects, animated household garbage and worse. You are a spooky disembodied hand hovering around the screen and must stomp, squash and splatter the creatures as they come toward you.

The variety of pests is staggering – over-large flies, toy tanks and killer tomatoes, to name but a few. If

they fly you have to catch them in your hand to kill them. If they don't, you can kill them by swatting them with a quick downward swipe.

As your kill ratio goes up, the floor tile directly below you changes colour. Fill up an entire strip with your colour and you're onto the next screen. Each house also has a bonus level where you can gain extra points with no harm to yourself.

In the first couple of houses, you must shoot rats as they scurry around the shelves of the scullery. There are plenty of others too – wasps hover enticingly near with their stingers out and bombs threaten to blow your fingers off. You've got more than dishpan hands to worry about here: allow them to be hit too often and it's curtains.

EFFECTS


The interior design of the houses is well done, but they're just back-grounds – pretty pictures against which you engage the enemy. They don't actually affect the gameplay at all. Movement of the disembodied hand, your playing sprite, is fluid and lifelike – but the creatures are so cute it seems a shame to kill them. Their tiny forms fall lifeless to the floor and lie there, stuck to the carpet by their own oozing guts. (Sob!)

Plenty of squelchy and splatty sounds accompany your death-dealing blows. There's also an up-tempo tune which adds a sense of urgency to your thankless task.

VERDICT

Exterminator must be one of the most original arcade games! It's easy enough to get to grips with the controls straightaway, but the gameplay is challenging enough to keep you coming back for more. The two player mode – where two of you play left and right hands – adds another dimension. It has all the classic arcade elements which make a game stand out from the crowd. While you may not play it for hours on end, you'll feel the urge to come back often enough.




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

You've seen the film, bought the T-shirt, the video, the poster and the battery-operated rubber effigy, now it's time to play the game, again. Robocop is back, with a neat line in lethal response. His (your) mission is to penetrate a drugs network and arrest the laboratory technicians who've created the highly addictive drug, Nuke. You must ensure that Robo doesn't inadvertently pop these guys off in a battle-frenzy, since you need the arrest points for later. Everyone else is dead meat – apart from one leather-clad, laser-toting female who also needs the long, strong arm of the law to get her to see reason.

So off you trot, breaking boxes open, riding lifts

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and floating on hover-platforms in your search for Nuke, extra weaponry and the secret of eternal happiness. Clear out the drugs base and you move on to mental dexterity puzzles which could help you regain some of Robo's pre-cyborg humanity.

Then after a test on the firing range you get to meet Cain, the evil drug baron. He's holed up in his hide-away at the Tokogawa Brewery, where you must avoid the temptation to organise a proverbial and defeat him instead.

However, that's not the end for Cain. He returns as the drug-crazed OCP robot and he's not a happy man – er, cyborg. During a demonstration of his abilities at the Civic Centrum,

some unfortunate fool waves a canister of Nuke around and Cain starts going cold turkey. Robo emerges for the final showdown and it's all down to you from there.


EFFECTS

The first thing you notice on the graphical front is the smoothness of Robo's animation. He may not be the most controllable sprite in the world (he has a tendency to refuse to jump where you want him to), but he's certainly among the slickest. Other incidental animation is crisp and clear, well-defined against a detailed back-

drop which helps you to spot dangers early. No aciieed-house, eye-confusing colour schemes here – it's all first-rate arcade clarity.

The sound effects are a bit twee, though. They add nothing to the atmosphere and merely inform you that you've been hit or you've hit something else.

However, the music is (for a chip-tune) quite remarkable. It took an astonishing 24 hours of continuous play before I finally cracked and had to kill the sound. That's a sure sign of a (relatively)





pleasant intro tune. Ennio Morricone would be proud of it.

VERDICT

Robocop 2 is tough – tougher than is perhaps necessary, but not unbeatable. Too high a level of difficulty on the first stage makes it frustrating but not unattractive: the desire to continue and win through surpasses the desire to switch off and do something easier – and that's the mark of a good game. Buy it and you'll be swearing, throwing the joystick around, missing your tea and staying up into the night. But you'll love every minute of it. Your move, creep.

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Keen to acquire some ST owner's easily earned Crimble dosh, the software houses spent the latter half of last year whipping their programmers into a frenzy with Pro-Plus and incentive pay packets. Latest in the spate of arcade licences is this Domark conversion of the wickedly fast and frantic Tengen game.

STUN Runner is a futuristic racing game. You control a STUN ship (hence, no doubt the title) which you race down a series of twisting tunnels and race tracks. Other STUN runners are intent on stopping you from reaching your ultimate goal – the 24th level.



■ In the tunnels you've got to watch out for the other STUN runners. – That green blob ahead, by the way, is in fact the enemy, not a part of the wall

You control the ship entirely by using the joystick. Your speed varies according to the line you take on the wall of the tunnel, just like in a toboggan. Pressing Fire sends a laser beam down the tunnel and you can vary the height of the laser by pulling backwards or forwards on the joystick.

There are three skill levels to choose from.


■ If you beat the clock and your opponents, you see the end of the level where you can collect your bonus

A beginner's level eases you into the game gently. A mid-range starting point takes you to the sixth level, while the hardest start, "The Labyrinth," throws you in at level 11.

The objectives on levels vary.



■ Chase the stars to find the optimum route through the tunnels. Avoid the car ahead or you lose energy (and Lucozade ain't going to help you either, never mind what that nice Daley Thompson says)



■ At the start of each level you're briefed on what to expect: chase the stars, jump the ramps or zap the enemy

Some require you to collect a series of objects, others to kill as many opponents as possible. Similarly, the track varies from twisting tunnels to winding race tracks.


Stars appear down the track to indicate the optimum route for speed. Occasionally a turbo-boost pad appears. Running over this sends you to lightspeed: you go so fast that you can travel straight through solid objects.

Enemy STUN runners cruise the tunnels thick and fast, seeking to slow you down. The Train slowly trav-

els along the bottom of the tunnel, Mag Cycles brake suddenly in front of you and Armoured Drones get in the way since they're unaffected by your laser fire. Flyers drop bombs or missiles onto the track and destroying them gives you a hearty bonus.

EFFECTS

Initially STUN Runner looks excellent. A nice series of intro screens leads up to the start of the level. But the chronic animation hits you at once. The best aspect of the arcade game was its superb speed, completely lacking in the ST conversion. A series of dowdy frames limps past you with all the speed of a Ford worker between tea-breaks (not necessarily the views of the management – The Management). The laser looks incredibly crap: two small

green lines poke out of your ship and don't even wriggle about or anything. Sound is dire: blips worse than a Casio watch.

VERDICT

This could have been a wicked game. If the programmers had sacrificed the solid tunnels for a wire-frame format it would have been far better, although Tengen probably think otherwise. There's little to recommend this game, certainly not for £25. Nip down the arcade and play the original instead.

fires a weapon. The racecourse is in the form of a grid arranged in a series of a straights and shapes. Speed-ups and extra energy lie around the built-up areas of track.

If opponents get in your way you can hang a hard corner and hope to cut them off or you can lock weapons and then unleash a missile up – oh, say their sub-system cooling network. Some weapons, the Smart Gun for instance, lock on to targets automatically, while others require a bit of gun toting expertise to be effective.

Additional weaponry costs money and you've only got 1,000 credits initially. You earn money while on the Matrix itself – but since the

most expensive weapon costs 8,000 credits, you'd be wise not to expect too much on your first race.

There's no second place so if you lose a race you die. If you get so good that the computer holds no challenge for you any more, then simply plug in a null modem cable and attach it to another ST to play head to head with a friend.

EFFECTS

Marauders has the high quality of graphic presentation you'd expect from Psygnosis games. The ship ordnance and repair screens look futuristic and believable. There are innumerable clever touches like the lift sequence which places you on the matrix itself, though the graphics throughout the race are only ade-


quate. The other spacecraft are solid 3D and all move fluidly. Weapons look good as they're fired and scrolling is seamless. The sound however is a bit of disappointment: where are those chunky samples?

VERDICT


Matrix Marauders is a competent and interesting racing game with some clever twists, though unnecessarily "techie" – beginners should beware. Graphics are of a high quality and the animation is fast and smooth. The serial lead option enabling you to play a human opponent is a nice touch and the game probably plays a lot better this way. 



Sounds like the title of some tacky, gruesome drive-in movie, doesn't it? Possibly one too awful even for Vincent Price. But in fact *Horror Zombies* is an exploration game similar in style to UBI Soft's *Night Hunter*. You play the role of one Count Valdemar, who drops in on the country retreat of Gory Manor. You must explore an entire six levels to complete the game and return to normal life.

As you wander round the Manor you have to find your way past zombies, shrouded spectres and even the occasional vampire. You can shoot many of the ugly monsters in your path but some are invulnerable and you have to find other ways





past them. Fortunately, you can climb ladders in the background or leap onto the occasional platform. The Count can also interact with the backgrounds – moving trolleys around to climb platforms or shifting objects to fool the monsters.

Throughout the action there are heaps of bonus items to collect – like keys to unlock doors, boots to sneak past monsters or weaponry to fend off attack – and you must pick up all the skulls in a given level to advance onto the next.

EFFECTS

The six levels span 600 screens. The first is inside the Manor with its backdrops of patterned wallpaper

horror zombies from the crypt

and ostentatious furniture. Other levels take you into a nearby village, off to a hidden cave and into the crypt. The backdrops are hugely detailed and there are many platforms and ladders to leap onto or climb.

The playing sprites are clearly animated and effectively leap around the levels. You can even get your hero to tip-toe past some of the more ferocious enemies to escape attack. The graphics are generally excellent, although some routines – particularly climbing ladders and walking down stairs – look dubious.

The sound effects are brilliant. Sampled spot noises and a clear intro tune set the 1950's B-movie tone superbly.

VERDICT

The adventure and arcade mix in *Horror Zombies* is either its making or breaking point, depending on which side of the fence you sit: if you're a devout shoot-'em-up fan, then the adventure/exploration side of the game is going to put you off, and vice versa. However, if you like a good joystick blast before you go to work and then a strategy to relax with in the evening, you could easily find a spot for *Horror Zombies*.

The problems confronting you are enormously entertaining. It's occasionally tricky lining yourself up to make a precise jump across a platform or finding a way past some of the invincible aliens, but that's what gives the game its wonderful appeal. The game would have benefitted from having still more interaction with objects, but this is only a tiny complaint. A great idea, cleverly executed and with enough collectable bonuses to keep you playing for hours on end.



Listen up, chaps.

Johnny's declared war on us, so you know what that means. Yes, that's right, we get to muck about in some super whizzo blasting-mobiles and give the oiks a right royal bruising. Andy Hutchinson, you take the Mauler tank. The rest of us are right behind you... in the bunker



Nearly two years ago, *Carrier Command* burst onto the ST scene and received more accolades than Dolly Parton at a cleavage contest. Realtime Designs, the programming team responsible for that mega game, have been locked in an attic slaving away on the sequel. The result is now finally ready for public

The style of the missions varies to suit all players. If strategy is your idea of fun, you can spend two hours sat on a hill waiting for a convoy. If blasting the hell out of an entire tank division seems more like it, you can strap the old rising sun to your forehead, load up the cannon and motor out looking for trouble.

Once you decide on a suitable mission you can check the briefing and map screens.

These show you your objectives and where exactly you've got

viewing and the main surprise is, your aircraft carrier's been traded in for a more economical vehicle – a tank.

Battle Command is a shoot-'em-up cum strategy game. You are in command of a small and nippy Mauler tank and your job is to complete a total of 12 missions. To do this you have to learn all about the weapons systems of your tank. You also need to know how to outfox the enemy – when to stay and fight and when to run and hide.


The game world is represented in solid, full colour 3D. Initially you see the world from inside your tank, with all the instrumentation at hand, but you aren't restricted to sitting at the wheel: you can also view the tank from any angle outside it.

■ Study the map screen carefully, because once you're dropped into the war zone you're likely to have three or four Banshees up your bottom

to get to and from. It's a very good idea to read them carefully, since you're likely to be under fire from the moment you're dropped into the war zone.

There are four weapons pods on the Mauler and these can be filled




with either offensive or defensive weapons, in any combination according to your tastes. There are seven offensive weapons to choose from, varying from missiles to bombs. The defensive weapons come in four flavours, including the usual chaff and decoy flares.




EFFECTS

Solid 3-D graphics have rarely looked as good or moved as fast as in *Battle Command*. Attention to detail is spot on, with trees, hills and enemy vehicles all looking the part. Animation is smooth and rapid, and what's more there's no appreciable slowdown when a lot is happening on the screen. The static screens – the ones which enable you to choose weapons, for example, or look at the map – are all well drawn and functional.

Sound is fairly sparse – in fact, the only time you really hear anything is when you're under fire. You know when a missile hits you because of the sound, so in that sense it works fine.

VERDICT

Battle Command certainly comes up with the goods. It's very high quality, from the hi-tech weapons to the fast animation. The starter mission eases beginners in, but there's still enough depth in there to keep even the most ardent game-player happy for a while. Whereas previous games by this team had only one objective, *Battle Command* has 12 – and what's more, there's little probability of you successfully completing a mission the first time you try it. If you've got a bit of Christmas money left, buy this – you'll still be playing it next Christmas.





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teenage mutant hero turtles

There's no way you can have dodged the Turtles. As if all the hype weren't enough to make you chuck, here's the ST game – and it offers nothing new. You must race through six New York levels and rescue Channel 16's news reporter, April O'Neil, from the evil Shredder. The game is split into two sections – an overhead view of the city streets and a side-on view in the sewers.


In the street section you must dodge the odd purple blob (they're presumably Shredder's henchmen) and disappear into a building or down the occasional manhole. Once you're inside a building or the New York sewers, the action switches to a side-on scrolling platform level. Here your task is to dodge or fight Shredder's mutant men, reach the end of the sewer and then escape to safety on the streets.

One of Shredder's cronies guards April O'Neil, who is tied up at the end of one of the sewage systems. By the time you've smashed him to the ground, someone else has come along and snatched her off again. When you follow them through the end-of-level door you're given access to the next level.

EFFECTS

OK, so the game really isn't anything special, but what about the visuals? 'Fraid not, no. Shredder's henchmen

are almost totally shapeless splotches of colour, often lost against the usually highly patterned background.

They are terribly animated and look completely unbelievable.

You thought the Turtles were individuals? They're actually clones. The only thing to change between the four playing characters is the weapon. Each of the turtles can

walk, jump or roll into a ball but there are so few frames of animation involved that it all looks laughable.

And what about the scrolling? Erm, what scrolling? The display jerks left and right, making it very difficult to keep your eye on your active turtle. The sound effects have you reaching (or retching) for that volume control.

VERDICT

It's always an ominous sign when a software publisher refuses to send you a copy of a game for review, as Mirrorsoft originally did in this case. You don't usually expect classic

games to emerge from licence deals, but with a £25 price tag and a name as big as the Turtles you envisage something a bit special. Gremlins 2, for example, was just a simple scrolling shoot-'em-up but there were heaps of Gremlins leaping about on pogo sticks, hiding behind the furniture and doing zany things.

In Turtles you don't have any of this attention to detail, so you're left feeling cheated out of your cash. It may scale the software charts on the strength of Turtlemania, but you're going to need a frontal lobotomy if you want to play this for more than a couple of hours.

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This is just a straightforward blast-everything game. The original Sega arcade version of *Line of Fire* was eminently playable and had everyone hopelessly addicted, but the sprites were big and producing a successful conversion always looked tricky. Sadly, it hasn't gone at all well.

The game is split into levels with an end-of-level alien at the end of each – now that is a surprise! Throughout the levels you scroll forwards into the landscape, confronted by a stream of terrorists, missiles, helicopters and bombs. You move some red gunsights around the screen, point them at your target and fire. The mouse is the best way to control the sights but you can use the joystick at the same time if you wish. In this way, two players can play simultaneously.

When you run over any bombs or sustain a hit, a message appears on the screen informing you of damage. You can recover by picking up the occasional medical kit, but you must be careful – often you blast these kits by mistake.

EFFECTS

You only need to take a glance at the screenshots to appreciate that the visuals are very



striking. What you don't see, though, is the insanely slow speed at which they move. The attention to detail, especially in the parallax-scrolling backgrounds, is superb but there are very few frames of animation used in the movement of either the enemy sprites or the cen-

tral playing character. Combine this with the appalling speed of the game and you have something that is so unplayable it's a torture to try.

The final nail in the coffin is the way you lose sight of the cursor, with devastating results. The tiny red crosshairs get lost in all the blasts and before you can find them again you often find yourself dead instead. That's adding injury to insult, and then some.

Sound effects are the usual kind of spot explosions and ineffectual

noises which have you quickly reaching for the volume control. Believe us, you don't want to listen to these!

VERDICT

What is happening to US Gold? A software publisher that once used to produce some top games like *Operation Stealth*, *Strider* and *The Last Crusade* is turning out crap like *ESWAT* and *Line of Fire*. It's appalling enough that they should choose such games to release at the most competitive time of the year, but what's even worse is that they're charging almost £25 for them. What a rip-off!


Line of Fire is a horrendous game and nothing like its hugely absorbing arcade parent. The scrolling is ridiculously jerky and the animation is almost non-existent. As if that wasn't enough, it's a travesty that the action pauses while the bad guys are loaded from disk.

The game's biggest problem is speed: it's so appallingly slow that it just isn't playable. There's little here for anyone, even the most forgiving novice. If you lash out on this one you're going to seriously regret it.

play. It's the spells that lift *Mystical* above the ordinary shoot-'em-up, enabling you to pick just the right potion.

EFFECTS

The graphics are quite superb. All the characters are large and detailed, well animated and very funny. The graphics don't move particularly quickly, but the overall pace of the game is gentle, so it doesn't really matter.

Sound is great, with a terrific gothic-sounding title tune and some excellent sound effects – especially when you cast spells! "Very funny indeed. I chortled" – R. Lawton.

VERDICT

Mystical's gameplay isn't particularly deep. Although the ability to collect



and select spells adds to the depth, using the keyboard takes away the arcade immediacy and leaves you annoyingly vulnerable when you drink or read.





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
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How do you improve on Tetris, the Russian block-buster that had all us decadent Westerners marvelling at its compulsive simplicity? Well, Infoframes reckon they know how, and have come up with a new, improved version with four walls instead of one, loads more pieces and some extra rules to keep you on your toes.

The basic principle remains the same. As blocks drift down a wall you can rotate them and move them to fit into those already at the bottom. When you complete a whole line it disappears.

However, where Tetris had you forming lines on just one wall, Welltris has you doing it with four. You look down into a kind of well (hence,



the name) and must create lines on a "floor" at the bottom. The blocks slide down the walls and then across this floor, stopping at the first obstruction they encounter. The dimensions of the playing area mean you have less space to work in but can drop shapes from any of four directions – the walls even "wrap" around. Complicated stuff, eh?

What's more, if you leave any part of a shape overlapping onto a wall it becomes unusable until you land another three shapes. This means that the game ends when all four walls become blocked off, rather than when the pieces pile up to the roof.

There are three levels to choose from, each of them featuring steadily increasing speeds as you

progress. On the first level, the shapes are made of two, three or four blocks. On the second level it's four blocks and on the third level, between two and five blocks. Ouch!

Apart from this, the game is very similar to Tetris in appearance. For every demanding increase in speed on the left of the playing screen you get a brand new picture on the right. This depicts Russian scenes to prop up the inevitably rather plain graphics.

EFFECTS

The graphics are far, far better than those of Tetris on the ST. OK, so there's not much to them, but the shapes move rapidly in response to the controls, and are sufficiently clear and well-defined to allow the split-second timing necessary when the going gets tough.

The sound is minimal. There's a pseudo-Russian jingle every time the


game speeds up, but after that you're back to some rather basic block-bashing noises.

VERDICT


Tetris was brilliantly simple. Welltris has certainly added to the gameplay and depth of the original, but the result is a game that's no longer simple at all. The strategies are more complex and it requires greater lateral thinking – but it's not the same game any more. Welltris has more features, but in gaining these features it's lost the simplistic appeal of the original. And it's really not very easy to tell if you're doing well or not!

However, the responsiveness and playability of the game are much better. Welltris is definitely one for the eggheads, even those new to the ST – you'll take a long, long time to master its subtleties.

Space Ace had truly gob-smacking animation but left you wondering what went wrong with the gameplay. **Rick Dangerous** was a

frighteningly addictive puzzle game but the graphics were far from state-of-the-art. So where's the ultimate game with **Space Ace**-style visuals and **Rick Dick**-quality gameplay? Mark Higham puts on his pyjamas, climbs aboard a magic carpet and asks if this could be the one

Films like *Tron* and *The Last Starfighter* have proved just what computers can do when it comes to sophisticated animation and mimicking reality. Surprisingly, though, this animation has rarely found its way down onto the humble home micro. *Space Ace* came the closest, offering Disney-style animation on an ordinary ST, but it was more like watching a PD demo than participating in a game. *Prince of Persia* may not quite scale the same dizzy heights but the animation is absolutely incredible.

Don't expect a radically original plot, though. The adventuresque storyline goes something like this: the busty blonde little hostess with the mostest that you fancied has gone

and got herself imprisoned in a Persian castle. You must rescue her from her captors, produce a wedding ring out of thin air and marry her before she realises you're really a bit of a wimp.

Working out how to get through the castle is the hard part. Your task in each level is to discover the exit through to the next. Unfortunately, it's usually protected by malicious swordsmen and you don't stand a chance in hell of destroying them without locating the sword first. In

level one this means you have to work your way forward through the level until you get all the way to the end, pick up the sword, carry it back safely and then hack the head off of the bearded Arab. Once you've collected the sword it stays with you into the remainder of the levels.

What makes this objective even tougher is the heaps of puzzles you must solve to work your way through the castle. These are focused on trying tests of your joystick skill and simple switches. If you screw up and get killed you're returned to the beginning of the level to try again.

Through all this, the animation is wonderful. All the movement is so detailed that you can make your playing character run

over three tiles at a time, walk across single tiles or stop dead. To climb up ledges, you simply push the joystick up and your hero thrusts his arms into the air and pulls himself upwards. If you look like tumbling off a ledge, you can even thrust out your arms and grab onto the precipice – if you're quick. When it comes to jumping, you can either leap from a standing start or take a running jump over bigger gaps.

It's all beautifully realistic – but you do need to exercise all these



moves to work your way through the castle. In one of the screens on level one, for instance, you need to walk carefully over one switch to cause a portcullis to rise, then leap over the next two tiles – the first tile falls beneath you if you stand on it and the second causes the portcullis to drop before you can reach it.

If you fall down gaps in the tiles you can either lose energy or end up dead, depending on how far you fall. To refresh your energy you need to find a potion. These are often hidden in secret sections of a level which can only be discovered by jumping up and knocking out tiles above your head. All good fun, so long as you don't get killed in the process.


EFFECTS

Perfectly smooth animation is what makes *Persia* special. There are so many frames of animation used in walking, running, jumping and climbing that the movement looks brilliantly realistic. There's even several frames for such a simple activity as turning round. There's a tiny delay in the game's response to your movements and the animation tends to slow down slightly when there are other things happening on the screen – such as tiles falling around you – but this doesn't disturb the gameplay.

To move around the level you have to dash across rows of tiles. There is no scrolling, so as you move off of the end of one screen you're instantly transported to the start of the next. These screens are

all set against a boring black backdrop – but compensating for the lack of backgrounds are some kaleidoscopic intermediary screens between levels which are so colourful they make your eyes sting.

Sound effects are a long way off rivaling those used in *Space Ace*, where sampled music was played throughout. Simple sampled spot effects are used instead to indicate

when you're running, collecting items or activating switches, and a sound chip tune introduces each level. There is a nice gory "shh" effect when you fall on the knives, though...

VERDICT


Prince of Persia is an enormously entertaining game. Even when you tire of the puzzles, you can still enjoy the quality animation. Each of the

screens is equipped with many testing obstacles, and when you believe you know a level inside out it's still possible to accidentally discover a pathway to more potions and another swordsman.


One major point in *Persia's* favour is the way the traditional lives system has been abandoned. Instead, you get a 60 minute time limit to explore the castle. This means you can die over and over again, always returning to the beginning of the level. The only complaint comes when you're tackling a few annoying obstacles and you're constantly returned to the start of the level rather than being given the option to continue from where you last failed. It's even worse when you race all through a level, pick up a sword and then fall down a hole just seconds before you meet the swordsman guarding the level exit. This is a minor complaint, though, and one you quickly learn to tolerate.

Precise, detailed animation is married with entertaining puzzles to produce a thoroughly absorbing game. If you're looking for something you can impress your friends with and still be addicted to after a marathon 12-hour playing stint, this is it. Let's hope *Prince of Persia* is about to mark a change in animation techniques so that we can finally kiss goodbye to the laughable character movement in such games as *ESWAT*, *Ninja Remix* and *Rick Dangerous*. If only all games could be like this!




America is a strange and scary place. In US Gold's vision of the future you are a member of the CyberPolice and your aim is to make it to the elite corps of headbangers – the *Enhanced SWAT* team. *ESWATs* get to play with cybernetic exo-suits featuring duo laser-cannons. They also get the opportunity to say things like "Your move, creep" without looking totally out of character.

First you must prove to your superiors that you are of the right stuff by dealing with three gangland bosses. If you successfully make your way through the mean city streets, you get to meet these toughies in the flesh. Pop them off and your Chief rewards you with a promotional shoulder-stripe (but no pay-rise, of course!). Beat all three and you get to put on the cling-film suit and look cool.

In perhaps the worst example of a hackneyed game format, you get all kinds of nasty to deal with. The first is the poor animation: you are a kind of Pink Panther with a groin rash, unable to move your back leg past your front knee for fear of a devilsome chafe. Then you discover your next problem: your state-of-the-art, hi-tech weaponry is really a potato-popping spud-gun. Strictly

one bullet on screen per week, chaps. We don't want to overdo it!

As if that isn't enough, you can even fire backwards without turning round – a feat I thought only Clint Eastwood could carry off. A quick twist of the joystick fools the animation routine so it launches a bullet from the back of your neck, without printing your updated position.

EFFECTS

You must be joking! There is nothing new, exciting or even remotely out of the ordinary in *ESWAT's* graphics department. The sprites are poor and the animation is even worse.

Sound is such an irregular visitor to the game that it barely registers: it consists of only a click or duck-fart every ten seconds. The intro music resembles a badly played rendition of the *Inspector Gadget* theme tune, but it's possibly the most solid part of the whole game.


VERDICT

Leave it alone, unless you've never played a scrolly beat-'em-up before – in which case you'd never know the difference. This one is guaranteed to provide five minutes of entertainment before you fall asleep.

ESWAT is actually an anagram of "waste," which is a fitting coincidence. Is it your time or your money that's being wasted? Is it both? I think we should be told.




The game is essentially a shoot-'em-up. You control Dredd as he carries out various missions allocated to him by Justice Central. These take differing gameplay formats depending upon the location of the crime. There are six levels in all, with each level made up of two sections.

Level one is set in, er, the Dantanna block, where it seems the fatties are running amok, gorging themselves on food. You've got to wipe out all the food dispensers in order to calm the fatties down. Once you've destroyed a number of these overweight chaps in their white shirts, you find that they've taken over a food convoy.


There's a total of 12 missions to complete and these continue in much the same vein. A mad professor in a laboratory, a runaway sludge





important. Visually *Judge Dredd* fails because it doesn't make enough of the cartoon style. The character's animation is very average – he sometimes looks as if he's moonwalking – though the scrolling is smooth and seamless and the backdrops attractive and eye-catching. Sound is below average, a definite case for turning that volume right down.

VERDICT

Judge Dredd fails. A game based around this character should have been a rich and funny romp through Mega City One, but instead it's a poor and thoroughly comatose glance at the city and at Dredd. The game is simply a shoot/beat-'em-up, based on other platform games; walking around and shooting things is as far as it gets. There are some nice touches: you can play two sub-games, bomber and snakes, in the initial section of the game, for instance. However, these alone don't save *Judge Dredd* from joining the other mediocre licences in our circular filing cabinet.



Elite – £24.99

Jumping on the compilation bandwagon comes Elite with this offering. Compilations can either be good news because they mean cheap games, or very bad news because they mean crappy games repackaged. In this case

five varied games are included: *Paperboy*, *Overlander*, *Ghosts 'n' Goblins*, *Space Harrier* and *Frank Bruno's Boxing*.

Paperboy is a conversion of the original coin-op game from Tengen. You've got to deliver the papers while avoiding the traffic, the dogs, the kiddies and the kerbs.

Overlander is a car pursuit game where you're a mercenary

out to earn big money. *Ghosts 'n' Goblins* is a medieval fantasy beat-'em-up in which skeletons, dragons and fire-spitting plants want your skin. *Space Harrier* is a frantic shoot-'em-up and *Frank Bruno's Boxing* surely needs little explanation.

These are all reasonable games, but they're getting a bit long in the tooth. Some of them are well over two years old and aren't really worth investing in. Buy an ST FORMAT Gold game instead, preferably one from this decade.

NINJA REMIX

System 3 – £24.99

Two years ago *The Last Ninja* became a big hit for System 3. The martial arts fighting, combined with a great plot and tasty gameplay, proved to be a popular choice with the discerning beat-'em-up game player. However, the follow-up, *Last Ninja 2*, wasn't very good at all. It rehashed the elements of the original and

combined it with lousy control and overly intricate rock hopping. Now System 3 want to clear their name, and *Ninja Remix* is how they reckon *Last Ninja 2* should have turned out.

Most elements of the game have been tweaked, revamped or re-written. Joystick control of the Ninja is a lot easier, making fighting and jumping considerably less trouble. The tunes have been revamped, though they're still boring internally generated ditties.

Gameplay has been considerably improved, although it's still very awkward when you try to pick something up. *Ninja Remix* is a considerable improvement on *Last Ninja 2*, but is that enough to warrant a £25 price tag?





STUNT CAR RACER

Microprose

Paul Groom from Middlesbrough in Cleveland has got through several joysticks on the way to completing this nifty game. Take it away, Paul:

The Little Ramp: should be easy. All you have to do is take the ramp itself at no less than 130 mph. However, the hump shouldn't be taken at more than 200 mph – otherwise you lose a lot of time in the air.

The Hump Back: take the first hump at any speed up to around 130 mph. There are two options available when negotiating the bumpy straight that follows:

- 1 Take it at a sedate pace (under 150 mph);
- 2 Put your foot down and rocket through it at over 200 mph.

Keep your foot down for the next hump but slow down for the straight, since there is a sharp bend. Once past the final bend ignite the boosters and sprint to the line.

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➤ **The Stepping Stones:** the ramps on the first length of straight should be taken at either over 200 mph or under 150 mph. In order to attain a smooth landing after the next ramp, make sure you are travelling at about 150 mph. Meanwhile, take the stepping stones at between 140 mph and 175 mph. Finally, when you have cleared the last turn, race to the line.

The Big Ramp: race at top speed around the course – except, that is, for the two small ramps, which should be taken between 160 mph and 180 mph. The huge ramp should be taken at over 210 mph.

Division 2:

The High Jump: in order to clear this you must be racing at over 200 mph. Otherwise, the angled straight should be taken at about 170 mph and the rest of the track at full speed.

The Rollercoaster: the largest hill should be taken at a maximum speed of 160 mph. Stay at that speed until you are three quarters of the way down, then open the throttle for the rest of the track.

Division 1:

The Ski Jump: start the race and stay at about 30 mph until you reach the end of the third straight. Put the pedal to the metal and remember the ski jump must be taken at over 200 mph.

The Drawbridge: once again, this track is pretty easy to complete. Attempt the drawbridge at around 140 mph and pelt round the rest of the course at full speed.



Use unused passport on opening. Press red button, operate briefcase.

Go to passport control officer, use passport on passport controller. Go to welcome hostess, speak to welcome hostess, examine telegram. Move left, go to guard, use airline ticket on guard. Move to first baggage carousel, examine baggage which says Mr Martinez, take baggage, operate baggage.

Go to the bathroom, operate razor, use electric socket. Go to passport officer, use original passport on passport officer. Walk left, get in taxi. Examine American passport, take bench of notes, go to bank, use bench of notes on bank clerk. Use coins on florist, take red carnation, use red carnation on John. Go to park, sit on bench.

Move quickly to the right and go to the bank, use card and key on bank clerk, go downstairs and enter vault, use key on safe (bottom right). Operate ground, use ropes on ground. Operate ground, examine the part of the wall where the breeze is coming from. Operate pickaxe three times on the wall.

Now comes the difficult part: swim under and over the rocks, and watch the oxygen level at the top. When you have finished this you come out at the florist. Walk to the beach and talk to the man. Use coins on man. Go to the hotel, press button and go to level 2, and walk

to floor 3. Go to the last door and operate it. You meet Julia and Otto (your double agent).

They kidnap you and put you on a boat. The very first sentence, operate the bracelet. When they throw you off the boat and you reach the sea bed, operate the bracelet again. Swim over to Julia and operate her (oer). On the surface one of Julia's friends picks you up and takes you to their hideout.

Well, here's the boring bit, going through five levels of mazes. Not too hard, really – just a question of getting to the key and going back to the stairs. Operate the door and go into the office, go over to the statue and operate the statue's arm. A safe appears. Use the little box on the safe door: turn the box on. Operate the up and down arrow until the first light on the box comes on (if two lights come on, this means that there is a double figure combination), then press the lock combination button. This moves it on to the second figure. Repeat this for the rest of the three digits.

Press the lock combination button until the line under the digits goes off the screen, turn the box off, then remove the little box. Press the lock combination one more time and this reveals the secret envelope that you need so much to get in contact with your agent.

Run after the man in the white coat and follow him on a jet ski – all you have to do is avoid the sharks. The second bit is really hard because you have to avoid Otto's men.

Go to the seaweed screen and examine all seaweed until you find an elastic band. Go right till you reach the last screen and examine the palm tree. Operate it, operate button, then go to the entrance and operate the opening.

Andrew Treherne, alias **Raphael Darkangel**, from **Ackworth, West Yorks**, created this picture of Alice Cooper with the popular **Degas Elite** by drafting out the basic outline using K-Line and Freehand Draw and then working on the nose in magnify mode (pic 1). Close-up work continued on the eyes and mouth. The mouth is tough to position correctly, so Raphael worked on it as one chunk and then Cut and Pasted it to the final location (pic 2).

Text is next, when all the filling is done, using a standard font which is then stretched as a block, altered in magnify mode and then rotated to the desired angle (pic 3). Finally, Raphael tidied up the hair, spent 30 minutes getting the ear detail correct, prettied up the text and finally signed it. The whole picture took around five hours to do, with the hardest part being Alice Cooper's famous squint.





Tim Watten from **Droitwich** used the Public Domain version of **NeoChrome** for this picture of a SEPECAT Jaguar fighter plane. The four stages in its creation were:

- Sketch the basic outline (pic 1).
- Add simple colours to the shape to demarcate the coloured areas (pic 2).
- Add highlights to give the picture a three-dimensional feel (pic 3).
- And finally add the squadron decals, wing details and touch up any rough edges (pic 4).









Scott G Mackay from **Inverness** is another user of *Degas Elite*, the most popular art package for the ST. His first step in creating this picture of a Cheetah joystick (somehow "still life" doesn't seem the right term) was to choose a suitable palette. His first choice of white, grey and black didn't give the right effect, so he added one bit of blue to each colour: instead of black, which has an intensity level of 000, he used dark blue of value 001 and so on.

Using a mixture of K-Line (continuous line) and freehand draw, Scott sketched the basic shape of the joystick (pic 1). Next, using magnify, for close-up checking, and more K-line, to keep lines parallel, he tidied up the basic shape (pic 2). Then he added base colours (pic 3) and began shading, using a palette of seven blues, seven red-oranges and a dark grey to highlight and darken the joystick (pic 4). To get more subtle shades, colours were mixed, using a

pixel-chequerboard pattern, in magnify mode. When two similar colours are mixed in this way, the optical effect is that a third colour appears, with a tonal value halfway between the two original colours (pic 5).

Finally, Scott created a background on a separate screen, using the same colour palette and the same mixing techniques. The completed joystick was then cut and pasted on top, creating the finished picture (pic 6).



Julian Buswell from **Portsmouth** uses *OCF Art Studio* for his artwork: it has a zoom facility which can display the main features of the face all at once, and he reckons the drawing facilities are easier to use than other art packages'.

His first move is to draw the basic outline for the face and add minimal details (pic 1). The shape doesn't need to be perfect, since it can be re-shaped when the detail is added. It's important to note that a face contains a minimal amount of lines – it's constructed mainly by shadow. Julian fills in every alternate pixel with a colour in order to blend different shades.

The complete Joker's face has ears, neck and teeth added, and the face itself has been re-shaped several times (pic 2). After this the clothing, hair and hat are added and the background colour is changed to make sure all detail is visible on screen (pic 3).

The next stage is the creation of Jack Nicholson's face, which is constructed in the same way as the Joker's (pics 4 and 5). Finally, the two images are combined on one screen and a background is added (pic 6).

The most important thing to remember, Julian comments, is that the face won't always look like the real person until all the shading is

complete. A few pixel alterations can create different looks. This picture apparently looked like Bob Hoskins and Robert Wagner before it was finished! The Joker took eight hours to draw, while Nicholson took four, and the background another two. Time well spent! **stf**

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

the ST goes live

You know your ST is a great games machine, and you may even know that it makes a great word processing and graphics computer. But did you also know it's the professional musician's choice, too? Steve Cogan reports

Are you one of the many thousands who bought or were given an ST over Christmas? If so, you may not know about one of the ST's strongest points. Its built-in MIDI ports enable it to talk directly to synthesisers and the like, and this has led to the existence of some exceptionally good professional music software.

The result is that the ST is the preferred hardware for many of the world's best-known musicians, from Madonna, who used STs on last year's world tour, to Fleetwood Mac, Soul-II-Soul, Betty Boo and many, many more. In fact, most weeks on *Top of the Pops* you'd be hard pressed to find an act that *hadn't* used STs somewhere along the way.

One of the first to exploit the ST's potential – live and in the studio – were Tangerine Dream, who were for that very reason sponsored by Atari on a series of tours. They've also contributed to the development of many a piece of software – the latest being the acclaimed *Cubase* from Steinberg.

In their 23 years, Tangerine Dream have sold over seven million albums worldwide, with five gold records and three sell-out tours in the USA. The line-up has changed many times, and now only founder Edgar Froese remains of the original band.

Paul Haslinger, the other member of Tangerine Dream, is a classically-trained Austrian keyboard player, and *ST FORMAT* interviewed him prior to their first UK tour for over four years.

Why, we asked, do they use STs? "It's a long development from the first sequencers that could

just produce a single scale," he says, "up to the first MIDI sequencers like the Yamaha QX1, and then on to the more sophisticated computer software. But it's all giving us chances to compose and arrange in a certain set-up that we create ourselves – that's basically my perspective on it.

"The first programs I used had very bad timing and very few features. Now we actually work together with Steinberg, trying to give them input from the musicians' side and make the software into a better tool.

"I was never very fond of mathematically structured software: it looks like a calculation or something, and not like a music program at all. But I think in general it's a display problem. To have a big screen is a bigger point than what software you're using, because as soon as you can put it on a big screen you just have musically many more possibilities.

"100 years ago you bought the instrument and everything came with it. Today your instrument consists of maybe two or three computers, a couple of sound modules and the mixing and effects facilities – so you can reconstruct and re-edit your instrument all the time."

"Of course we have a lot of customised equipment, but we're also using the normal stuff that everyone uses, like Roland, Yamaha, Korg mod-

ules, and we try to give those companies input too. The Korg Waystation at the moment is a very interesting instrument and the [Akai] S1000-S1100 family is definitely a new sample standard.

"As far as ST software is concerned, we use both Steinberg and C-Lab, and both are really professional – possibly the best pieces of software that exist for musicians.

"For a lot of programmers the operating system is a big problem, and changes there would be my first request. Second, I think the Stacy laptop could be a wonderful machine for musicians – if they get rid of the little mistakes it has. They should do this quickly and not make a big deal out of it." (In fact, since this interview Atari have relaunched the Stacy, sorting out just the problems Paul refers to – see last month's News.)

"I think the music market is the big plus that this computer has. Atari shouldn't let the musicians go, because they are the main group of people they count on." This is possibly a little biased:

"The ST is the preferred hardware for the world's best-known musicians – like Madonna, Fleetwood Mac and Soul-II-Soul"

though the ST is the choice of many professional musicians, they're a tiny proportion of ST users, after the game-players (the vast majority) and others interested in serious/productivity uses such as desktop publishing and graphics.

What's it like depending on the ST – especially live? Do they ever get breakdowns? "Yeah, there was one major gig on the US/Canada '88 tour. We had a transformer for 110V-220V and all the instru-

ments were running on 220V. The STs were on 110V, and ten minutes before the end of the concert the transformer blew up! The result was all the instruments were off, but because they were on 110V the STs stayed on. The funny thing was that the whole of Atari's distribution personnel in Canada were in the concert so they were glad – everything blew up but the STs!"

One of the most exciting new developments in the ST music world is direct-disk sampling, enabling you to transfer master tapes to hard drive, then experiment, distort and edit endlessly, without losing any quality and without the restrictions that working with a physical medium

imposes. This has become possible on the ST in only the past year or so.

"We don't have a main direct-disk sampling system yet," Paul says, "though we have experience with *Soundtools* and the Steinberg system. I'm sure that in the next year we'll see digital multitrack solutions for a very affordable price that get rid of a lot of the problems we have with the analog machinery."

How do Tangerine Dream go about creating a track using the ST? "It's always different," Paul replies. "The normal way is that someone has an idea and puts it on a sequencer, shows it to the others and says 'What do you think?' That's how

we decide whether we work on it or not. But a lot of our songs have been really long in development. You start on a song, you work on it three months later and then another year later you finish it. Some songs simply need time to grow – and when we reach a certain point we say we have to put it out!" **stf**

Of course their three Mega STs played a big part in the show – though they use trackballs rather than ST mice, which tend to jump about somewhat in the general hubbub!

Prisma released *Prof Plays a New Game* last Spring (see STF 12) and are now releasing parts two and three. Part two, *Prof Looks at Words*, uses the same platform-game format employed in part one. You direct the Prof around using the arrow keys, searching for letters to complete words. There are five games here: finding beginning letters, ending letters, missing vowels, double letters and combinations of vowels. The

words used are those introduced in part one and in the five books in that package. Prisma suggest this package can be used on its own but this is not recommended.

"Finish a Sentence" and "Make a Sentence" make up part three, *Prof Makes Sentences*. The phases of the games correspond to the books in part one. You can play either "easy" or "hard" for each phase. Again you direct the Prof using the arrow keys to pick up answers but eventually you can enter answers using the keyboard.

In "Finish a Sentence," your ST begins by highlighting one word in a short sentence shown on the blackboard. You select that word from a group of three at the bottom of the screen. This is repeated for other sentences, each with different words highlighted. ➤

Scetlander's first ST title *Hooray for Henrietta* is a competent Maths package comprising a disk, a comprehensive 16-page manual, and a button badge. Henrietta is about to marry Hopeless Henry until a mischievous bird, John the Parrot, steals Henry and his clothing.

When you load the program, you select the level of difficulty from one to eight. Henrietta's attempts to rescue Henry and his

clothes occur over four screens. The first deals with addition, the problems appearing at the bottom of the screen. Henrietta climbs a house to reclaim her incompetent fiancé and for every correct answer she gets a step closer to him. When reunited, they jig around comically in a cross between break-dancing and the Highland fling!

The remaining three screens follow the same format. The second deals with subtraction (at a boat race), the third with multiplication (hurdles) and the fourth with division (at a building site). If successful, the couple are permanently united. A bowl of custard covers Henry if he fails.





In "Make a Sentence" the format is the same except that you make sentences by unjumbling sequences of words. There are animated scenes which reward players for completing certain problems. One of these, for example, shows whizzing cars.

Prof Looks at Words and Prof Makes Sentences have 17 and 20 levels of play respectively. Both of these long-awaited packages help children progress from the basic skills covered by Prof Plays a New Game. Prisma claim their Play and Read series will, eventually, form a "complete reading tutor" – and there's no reason to doubt their statement. This package is recommended. **stf**



This is a competent program but the sprites and graphics are small and this is a distraction. Kids are likely to tire of the four screens fairly quickly even though the program covers a wide age range. Finally, the documentation is misleading, implying that the National Curriculum attainment levels one to five are covered by the software when this is only partly the case.

Despite these grumbles, Hooray for Henrietta is recommended as a program which in a limited way helps to encourage basic numeracy and provides parents and teachers with a record of children's progress. **stf**

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
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

INNER BLITTER TROUBLE


Mick Smith from Worthing has noticed that the STE and Mega ST have a "blitter" chip whereas the old STFM had none. What's it for, he asks, and should I be impressed?

The simple answer is yes, you should be impressed, and here's why. The blitter (short for bit block transfer processor) operates automatically on certain operating system functions to increase the speed of these functions and reduce the amount of program code required to work them. Blitter-enhanced functions include: area fills, rotation and magnification, brush line drawing, text transformations and scrolling, window updating, pattern filling and memory to memory block copying.

GET YOUR ACCS TOGETHER

Accessories cause a lot of people a lot of hassle, and Nigel Trent from Humberside is bound to agree. He's tried double-clicking on .ACC files in a desperate bid to get them to load and for his trouble he's been presented with all kinds of gobbledegook. How do they work?

Accessories are special programs that you don't need to double-click on. When it boots up, the ST looks for .ACCs on the root directory of the disk in the drive (that is, .ACC files which are not in any folders) and then loads them into a private section of its memory. Once it's done this, the Desktop appears, looking as normal as ever, and you can carry on as usual, loading

and running the programs of your choice – with one difference, so long as they run with GEM.

If you move the mouse up to the "Desk" menu, you should see several additions. For every .ACC program on the disk (up to six are allowed) there's an entry in the menu. Select any of these by clicking on the name with the left mouse button and that accessory runs.


The advantage of accessories is that they can be run at any time, as long as the Desk menu is still on screen. So you could be running, say, *Degas Elite* and decide you need a calculator. If your disk holds a calculator accessory at boot-up, you can use it without even having to leave *Degas*.

THESE BOOTS ARE MADE FOR WORKING


Simon Walker from Reading is having difficulties with auto-booting programs. He wants to know how you make a program load and run automatically whenever you reset the ST, without you having to select and load it each time. This is something the ST's manual studiously ignores, presumably because there are two ways of going about it.

On older machines, the only way of auto-booting a program is to create a New Folder, using the File menu from the Desktop. When you are asked to enter a name for the folder you must enter AUTO. Then you copy the program you want to autoboot into this folder, deleting the original when you've copied it. If you then reset the ST (leaving the disk in the drive), it loads and runs the program without bothering to show you the Desktop.

On newer machines (TOS 1.4 and above), you can still use the auto folder method just described, but there is also another way. First highlight your chosen program by clicking on it once and then select "Install Application" from the Options menu. Click on the "Auto" box in the dialogue window that pops up and then select "Install" to save this change to disk. Now when you reset, your program loads and runs immediately.

■ Pre TOS 1.4 – Autobooting requires you to create a folder named AUTO and place your chosen programs inside. This method can also be used on new STs

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
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

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DRIVING A HARD BARGAIN

ST FORMAT recently reported that some STEs have a faulty DMA chip (the chip that controls "Direct Memory Access" between the STE and peripherals like printers and hard drives), which makes them incompatible with certain hard drives, with the result that data saved to the hard drive may become corrupted after just three or four hours' use. (See *News* pages in *STF* 16.) **Neville Simpson** from **London** has just bought an STE and wants to know Atari's policy on replacing the faulty DMA chips which were the cause of the problem. Do they intend to recall the faulty machines? Will they make me pay for replacement chips or are they covered by the guarantee?

Atari do not plan to recall the faulty machines, even though there are only 100 or so in the hands of users. **Peter Staddon**, Atari UK's Marketing Manager, outlined the situation to *DESKTOP*. If your STE suffers from the DMA problem with a bona-fide Atari-made hard drive, you can have the offending chips replaced by Atari, providing the STE itself is still within its 12-month guarantee period. There are now only three types of Atari hard drive, the Megaflo 30, 60 and 44 (priced at £499.99, £689.99 and £919.99 respectively).

If you have trouble using a drive made by any other manufacturer... er, it's tough luck. Atari guarantee compatibility only with their own drives. Third party drive owners have to pay a charge to have their DMA chips replaced. **Bob Gleadow**, Atari UK's Managing Director, comments: "Atari will be providing a test and certification procedure to any third party manufacturer who wishes to claim Atari Tested Compatibility." But that's likely to be some time in the future and it doesn't help owners of non-approved drives – and that's most of them!


It seems Atari are trying to turn a corporate balls-up into a marketing ploy, because it obviously makes sense for STE owners who are unsure about their machines to go out and buy an Atari hard drive, now, while the STE's guarantee is still current. If it doesn't work, then Atari pick up the tab. If it does, then... er, you got your hard drive a bit earlier than you might have done.

So, here's a few *DESKTOP* words of advice. Firstly, under the Sale of Goods Act, goods sold must be "as described." If they aren't, you have a direct

recourse to the supplier – the shop that sold them to you in the first place. This is often easier than battling it out with the producers of the goods themselves, but you have to prove to the shop that the goods are not as described, which can take some doing. If you're meeting resistance, it might help to send a few letters making casual mention of the Trading Standards. (Besides, it's always a good idea to put complaints in writing if you don't get satisfaction as soon as you point out a problem. And always keep a copy of any such letter you send, so you can refer to it later if need be.)

Secondly, Atari have been marking the cardboard boxes of all recent STEs with a red sticker-dot, denoting that they are not affected by the DMA problem. If you're thinking of buying one without a dot, get the shop to check it working with your preferred hard drive before you hand over the dosh. If they won't, then walk away – you need dealer support, not a box-shifter, if you're going to make the best of your computing.

Finally, don't panic! If you're not in the market for a hard drive anyway, the problem doesn't affect you. All the other functions of the STE work as they should, so you won't end up with a white elephant. You only need to find out if your machine is one of the ill-fated few if you're planning to stick a hard drive onto it. With this aim in mind, *DESKTOP* would love to hear from any reader who has first hand experience of the DMA problem. We need to know the numbers of the dodgy machines so we can, in turn, let everyone else know, so if your STE has recently been fixed, let us know the serial number printed on the bottom of the casing. getting it across

Transferring to your ST? Follow these guidelines by Simon Williams

Once the initial wonderfulness of your new ST or STE has sunk in, you may want to use the data on your old machine. There are two stages in transferring data from an "alien machine." The first is to move the files into the ST environment and the second is to persuade the ST to read and convert them for its own use.

In the first stage you either carry over a disk from one machine to another or link the two computers with a cable. Unfortunately, there are a mass of different sizes and formats of disk. The only ST compatible format is the PC, and then only if your PC has a 3.5 inch drive which can read and write 720K disks.

If you're transferring from an IBM-type PC, you should format the disk for the transfer on the PC. PCs can't read disks from early STs (pre-TOS 1.4), but all STs can happily read 720K disks formatted by a PC. Recent ST/STEs are fully compatible with the PC disk format. You may also transfer from the Archimedes via a copy of the Acorn PC emulator or MultiFS on the Archimedes, which directly reads, writes and formats ST disks.

Other disk to disk transfers require a second drive. With a 5.25 inch second drive on the ST, you can transfer from the BBC Micro or Commodore 64, and with a 3.5 inch drive attached to an Amstrad PCW you can even draw files from this source. ST utilities for reading the PCW's CP/M disks are available in the Public Domain. (See directory, page 130.)

If you haven't a second drive, you can still transfer data by disk, using a copying bureau.

One which can handle many formats is Grey Matter (☎ 0364 53499), based in south Devon. The company can shift data from Amstrad CPC and PCW, BBC Micro and most CP/M and MS-DOS formats. They charge £10 per disk.

You may find it easier to connect the alien machine directly to your ST, transferring your data down a suitable lead with appropriate file transfer software. The cheapest set-up is with a null modem cable. The cable fits the modem (Serial) port on the ST and the Serial port on the other machine. The sockets vary widely so quote the two machines by name when you seek advice.

It's best to get the same communications software running on both machines, and the

Public Domain *Kermit* program is widely available. Uniterm is one ST source of *Kermit*, available on disk COMS3, for £3.00 from Softville (☎ 0705 266509). *Printercept* is a useful file transfer utility (reviewed in *DESKTOP*, STF 17).

Once you've got the files across, you must convert them. If you're moving text files, save them in ASCII format on the alien machine, unless you are loading them into an ST version of the same program on the ST. The ST version of *Protext*, for instance, reads *Protext* files from other versions. Graphics files most probably need conversion. Sometimes you can save the alien program to an intermediate format which the ST program can then read from. **stf**

NOT FOR YOUR EYES ONLY

Pete Nichols from Chipping Sodbury wants help with reading documents from the Desktop. Why are there some files which just print up total gibberish?

The reason for this is that they are not meant to be read by humans at all. These files are usually required by other programs on the same disk in order for them to work properly. They are often called something like SOMETHING.RSC or ANOTHER.EXE. You can double-click on them, just like on any other non-program file. The document reading part of the ST does not differentiate between different kinds of non-program files and attempts to display them verbatim. So don't be alarmed – your disk isn't duff, you haven't got a broken program and you aren't expected to know Swahili to understand them. Most readable files are called something like README.NOW or something ending in either .TXT or .DOC.

THE NEED FOR LEADS

Darren Price from Ormskirk has a straightforward question (the kind *DESKTOP* loves!). What do you need to connect an STE up to a hi-fi? You need a twin phono plug to

phono plug lead, and one of these costs all of 98 pence from Maplin Electronic Supplies (Sales ☎ 0702 554155). Their part number for it is RW50E, but you should be able to get one at most hi-fi shops in your local High Street. Just connect the plugs on one end of the lead to the audio output sockets at the back of your STE and connect the other two to the AUX INPUT on your hi-fi.

BROWSING BY MOUSE

The other kind of letter that *DESKTOP* loves is the type with tips, like Martyn Armitage's from Sheffield. He's noticed an undocumented feature on the STE which he'd like to

We like *Protext 5* [See box at left], but yes, £150 does seem quite a lot to pay for a word processing program, even if it is the best. 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
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

share with us all. When you're reading a document from the Desktop and you've selected SHOW from the SHOW/READ/CANCEL dialogue box you have some degree of mouse control over the document on display. Pressing the left mouse button has the same effect as pressing the space bar – it scrolls the document on to the next page – and pressing the right mouse button aborts the reading session as does [ESC] or [Control]+C or Q.

DEPRESSION OVER COMPRESSION?

Brian Evans from Wallasey has spotted the fact that 1st Word Plus can load Degas pictures into documents. He has Degas Elite himself and he wants to have a go, but is having problems with filenames. 1st Word Plus can load only

Degas files with a .PI3, .PI2 or .PI1 ending and his pictures are all saved as .PC3. How can he get them in?

When Degas first loads, it sets itself up to compress every picture it saves to disk. The file-extensions are .PC1, .PC2 or .PC3 for low, medium or high resolution pictures respectively. This is known as the *Degas Elite* format. It's possible to turn this function off by selecting "Compression" from the File menu within *Degas Elite* and setting the dialogue box to "Normal." Pictures are then saved as .PI1, .PI2 or .PI3, in what's known as the standard *Degas* format. Now they can be loaded into 1st Word Plus without problems.

ELSIE 10, DEGAS 0?

Lots of readers have written to *DESKTOP* bemoaning the fact that *Degas Elite*, the art package, doesn't have a STAR LC-10 printer driver supplied with it. The popular LC-10, a very useful colour/black and white printer, is noticeably absent from the list of supported machines, but it can still be used. *Degas* supports the JX-80P printer, which uses the same picture format as the LC-10. Select the JX-80P printer driver from the "Set Printer" menu on *Degas*, then select "Print Pic" and you can get full-colour (or mono) printouts from your faithful Star. All you needed to do was ask us! **stf**

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
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


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

what is MIDI?

Vic Lennard introduces the built-in communication system that enables you and your ST to make beautiful music together



One day when you're feeling curious, have a look on the left hand side of your ST. See those two 5-pin sockets towards the back? They are one of those special features that make the ST the versatile machine it is. They're for MIDI, the Musical Instrument Digital Interface, and they make the ST the ideal choice for musicians.

Before MIDI, you could get a computer to talk to a synthesizer, or two synthesizers to talk to each other, but back in the mid-1970s these were very basic affairs. They were monophonic – they could handle only one note at a time – and the only way they could send out information about that note was by using a control voltage (CV). If the computer wanted a middle C, for instance, it might send out a CV of five volts, and vary that by one volt per octave change up or down. The length of time for which the note played was set by the gate time.

This meant that you needed two connecting cables to control the playing of just one note. The emergence of the Prophet 5 synthesizer in 1977 made the problem even worse: it had five note polyphony – that is, five notes could be played at once – which improved the sound and the musical possibilities, but it meant that you needed ten cables to play those five notes on another synth!

Ending up with a room that looked like a spaghetti factory after the Blitz wasn't the only problem with the CV and gate method: there was no standard for the CVs, no transference of how hard a key had been hit (the "velocity") and a definite problem keeping synths in tune with each other. In 1982/3, with polyphonic synths becoming the norm, the MIDI system was created to simplify and standardise the situation.

What exactly is MIDI? It's basically a way of transmitting information from a master device

to slaves. It's what is called a serial protocol: it can send only one byte at a time. Each byte consists of a start bit, eight bits for information and a stop bit – ten bits in all.

There are 16 MIDI channels on which information can be sent, and two different types of message: CHANNEL messages, which relate to all real-time aspects of MIDI – notes, pitchbend and so on – and SYSTEM messages, which are not channel specific and tend to deal with the timing and general control of MIDI – Clock, Stop, Start and the like.

MIDI is fast for a serial protocol, 31,250 bits per second – achieved by using a current loop in the MIDI circuitry – and this means that a byte takes 0.32 milliseconds to travel from the master device to the slave. The length of cabling between them has to be kept to less than 15 metres or else there is a risk of messages being corrupted as a result of the capacitance in the cable.

The master device sends MIDI info from the OUT socket, and it's received via the IN socket on the slave device, which can then pass it on to the IN of another synth by using the THRU socket. However, the MIDI message is decoded and then re-encoded before winding its merry way onwards and a chain of more than two or three devices can easily lead to delays (at best) or data corruption (at worst).

Messages usually consist of two sorts of byte. A status byte comes first, and of its eight bits, the most significant bit (MSB) is set to one, the next three are used for the message type, and the last four show the MIDI channel. The status byte is followed by one or two data bytes which have the MSB set to zero and so have seven bits for their data value. Hence, the data value is a number between zero and 127.

The most important message, of course, is notes. Every time a note is pressed, a NOTE ON

is sent. Every note has three properties: a MIDI channel between 1 and 16, a note number between 0 and 127 and a velocity between 1 and 127. The lowest note is usually written as C-2, followed by C#-2, D-2, D#-2 and so on, all the way round to B-2. Then the number increases by one, so it's followed by C-1, C#-1 all the way up to G8 – a range of over ten octaves.

For an example, let's take a note C2 on MIDI channel 5 with a velocity of 100. All numbers are in binary. The STATUS byte starts with "1," followed by "001" to show a NOTE ON. The MIDI channel is a little weird: MIDI counts from zero while we count from one so MIDI channel 5 is shown as 4 – "0100" in binary. Put together, this is "10010100," which is 148 in normal counting. To make every MIDI byte into two digits maximum, this is translated into base 16 (hexadecimal), which utilises the numbers 0123456789ABCDEF. So the STATUS byte becomes "94H" ("H" signifying hexadecimal). Generally this is shown as 9nH, where "n" signifies one less than the MIDI channel.

There are then two DATA bytes. The first shows the note number: for a C2, this is 48, which in hexadecimal is 30H. The second shows the velocity of 100, which is 64H. So, the complete message is: 94 30 64, in hex.

These three bytes take just under one millisecond to travel down the MIDI cable.


Stopping the note requires a NOTE OFF, which can occur in one of two ways: a NOTE ON with a velocity of zero or a STATUS byte of 8nH,

MAKING THE CONNECTION

To prevent earth loops and the resulting hum, MIDI OUT and THRU sockets have earth connections but MIDI IN doesn't. In fact, only three pins of the 5-pin socket are actually used. Looking at a MIDI plug, the pins are numbered 1, 4, 2, 5, 3 going anti-clockwise from left to right. Numbers 4 and 5 are used for MIDI data while 2 is the earth pin.

Atari have been a bit naughty in wiring up all five pins of their OUT socket with the other two echoing the input – effectively a MIDI THRU and OUT combined. This can cause problems when using cheap MIDI leads which solder across pins 1, 4 and 5, 3 for expedience. To prevent these, you should always snap off pins 1 and 3 from the lead used exclusively for the OUT of the Atari.

This lead can still be used for MIDI IN, which doesn't utilise pins 1, 2 and 3 at all, but you should have another lead handy for sending THRU your ST, when pin 1 becomes the "Transmit Data" pin and pin 3 the "Loop Return" (making pins 4 and 5 the problem!).

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THOSE MIDI BLUES

the special NOTE OFF message. To turn off the note just sent, 94 30 00 or 84 30 vv would do. The "v v" stands for the release velocity – how fast you let the key go – but not many keyboards can transmit this and even fewer synths can respond to it, so the first method is by far the more used of the two.

Finally, let's look at a MIDI CONTROLLER message. These are used for sending out information from all of the various switches, pedals and sliders on a MIDI keyboard. The most common of these is the Sustain pedal which is MIDI controller number 64 (40H). This has only two positions – on (127) and off (0). All MIDI controllers have a STATUS byte of BnH, "n" being the number one less than the MIDI channel, as before. So a MIDI message telling a device to hold whatever notes it is playing on, say, channel 7 would be: B6 40 7F A message with the "7F" replaced by "00" would then turn the Sustain off.

This is an example of a MIDI switch. The MIDI volume slider is a continuous controller,

number 7, and can send out any value between a minimum of 0 and a maximum of 127. Volume is not the same as velocity: many synths change the quality or the timbre of a note depending on the velocity with which the note is hit, while a change in volume doesn't affect these things. You could set a synth to maximum volume by sending it the message: Bn 07 7F.

As you can see from these two controller messages, the maximum possible value which can be sent in one Data byte is 127, which is insufficient for some MIDI controls. Pitchbend is one of these: you'd probably be able to hear the

steps if the pitch of a note were changed in 127 steps, so pitchbend takes two Data bytes and has a Status byte all to itself.

This system has not only succeeded in simplifying the enormous problems of the old CV and gate system; it's also made it possible to develop increasingly more sophisticated and subtle musical instruments – and it's made the ST the preferred machine for professional musicians the world over! **stf**

MIDI HELPFILE

■ Each month Vic Lennard answers your queries about MIDI on these pages. If you have problems with MIDI equipment, write to MIDI helpfile, ST FORMAT, 30 Monmouth Street, Bath BA1 2BW. Don't forget to include all the necessary information including serial numbers and a diagram of your system.

What's the difference between MIDI velocity and MIDI volume? Don't they mean the same thing?

When you press a key on a MIDI keyboard, you create a three byte message. The first byte gives the NOTE ON status and the MIDI channel, the second gives the note number, and the third gives a measure of how hard you have pressed the key. To be more precise, this is a measure of how fast your finger hit the note – and hence, it's termed "velocity." This takes a value between 1 and 127.

The receiving device may use this velocity value in a number of ways. It may simply vary the loudness of the voice, but more likely it may change the timbre

or tonal quality of the sound. Compare this to a real piano. A note struck with little force has a mellow, soft sound, while hammering down on a key creates a brighter, more cutting tone. This aural illusion can be put across through MIDI by controlling the tone filter according to the velocity value: the higher the velocity, the more the filter opens and the brighter the sound; the lower the velocity, the less the filter opens and the more mellow the sound. This example is slightly over-simplified, but it shows how velocity can be used to change the character of a sound.

MIDI Volume, on the other hand, simply acts something like turning down the volume control on your synth, although there is often some residual sound when MIDI volume reaches zero. It has no effect on the tonal quality of the sound.

So, if your receiving device is one of the sort that simply vary the loudness of a sound in direct proportion to the MIDI velocity without changing the sound character, then the effect achieved by reducing the velocity is practically the same as using MIDI volume without the extra MIDI commands. However, this situation rarely occurs. **stf**



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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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

GFA Draft Plus 3

MACHINE: ALL STs



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An increasing number of architects and draughtsmen use Computer Aided Design (CAD) to produce technical drawings and plans necessary for manufacturing. The advantages are many – speed, accuracy, and the convenient ability to alter complex drawings quickly. The design can even be saved onto disk and sent to the manufacturers of the finished item. Up until now, however, CAD has been prohibitively expensive, so news of GFA Draft Plus 3 – a CAD program for the ST that gives you change out of £150 – has got to be interesting.

It comes on two disks with an extensive manual, complete with index. The main program is only 250K in size and so runs on any ST including the STE. It drives a colour monitor in medium res, or a mono monitor in high res. You can install it onto a hard drive, or run it from a floppy disk system. On loading, a file




■ A German program, a German car. The X and Y coordinates in millimetres below the menu bar show the cursor position

DRAW, DON'T MAP

With an Art program like *Degas* or *Canvas* the image consists of pixels – it is "bit mapped." If you enlarge a section of it, all you get is a bigger view of the square blocks that make up the picture. With a Drawing or CAD program, the image is made with "vector graphics." The computer stores the picture as a collection of lines, each with a starting point (defined by an X and a Y coordinate), a length, and an angle. When you zoom in on a section of a drawing, you see these vectors displayed identically at each level of magnification. The vectors stored in memory are accurate to within a millimetre.

You can output the finished design to a printer or a plotter, or use pens of different thicknesses and colours to highlight details in the drawing. GFA Draft Plus 3 can output to a range of plotters as well as the normal Epson type dot matrix printers, inkjet printers and the Atari laser printer.


selector appears, enabling you to read in an existing drawing or create a new one.

The total work area is a window of up to 1365 mm square, and you can move about this in all directions using the normal GEM scroll bars. The drawing itself can be viewed in a number of user-variable magnifications. Two columns of icons displayed to the left of the screen control the most often used features of the program, so you can select or de-select that particular mode or tool by clicking with the mouse as well as from the usual pull-down menus along the top of the screen.

You draw lines or other geometric shapes such as circles, rectangles and polygons simply by clicking and dragging the mouse. All shapes are "rubber banded," as in all good graphics software, and text can be added in many different styles and sizes.

GFA Draft Plus 3 can't produce perspective drawings, only two-dimensional ones, but this is fine for most purposes. The 3D CAD software available elsewhere is much more expensive and complicated, although GFA are at this very moment working on such a 3D program which is to be compatible with GFA Draft Plus 3.

The program has a library of over 100 symbols and you can design and add custom symbols, assigning them to function keys for easy recall. Add to this the program's ability to read in and execute Hewlett Packard Graphic Language commands, plus those written in GFA Basic, and this completes a pretty full specification. The DXF data format supported

SOME OTHER CADS

Here is a round-up of some of the competition that faces GFA Draft Plus 3. There are plenty of commercial CAD packages for the ST, but hardly any Public Domain programs except demo versions of those mentioned below. Contact your usual PD library (directory, page 130) or the producers below for demos.

■ Waltec Computers have a CAD program called *ARKEY*. Originally developed in the Netherlands, this program must be the most expensive ST application ever, with a price tag of over two grand! It does however produce 2D or 3D images of the design you are working on. An immensely powerful piece of software for real upmarket professional use with a price to match. Requires 1MByte RAM.

■ Expressworks offer *DynaCADD*, another 2D and 3D architectural and technical drawing program. This runs on both the ST and the PC-compatible, with data exchangeable between the two. *DynaCADD* sells for £650 plus VAT, and offers an amazing range of features at a fraction of the price of similar PC software. Discounts are available for educational users. Requires 1MByte RAM and double sided drive.

■ *Campus Draft* is an entry-level CAD program available from Power Computing at only £70. This one is 2D only, and can produce drawings between A5 and A2 size. This is a really nice little program with some excellent features, and could be ideal for students or for the production of small engineering-type drawings. It can run on a 520 ST.

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
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
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LANGUAGE BARRIER
