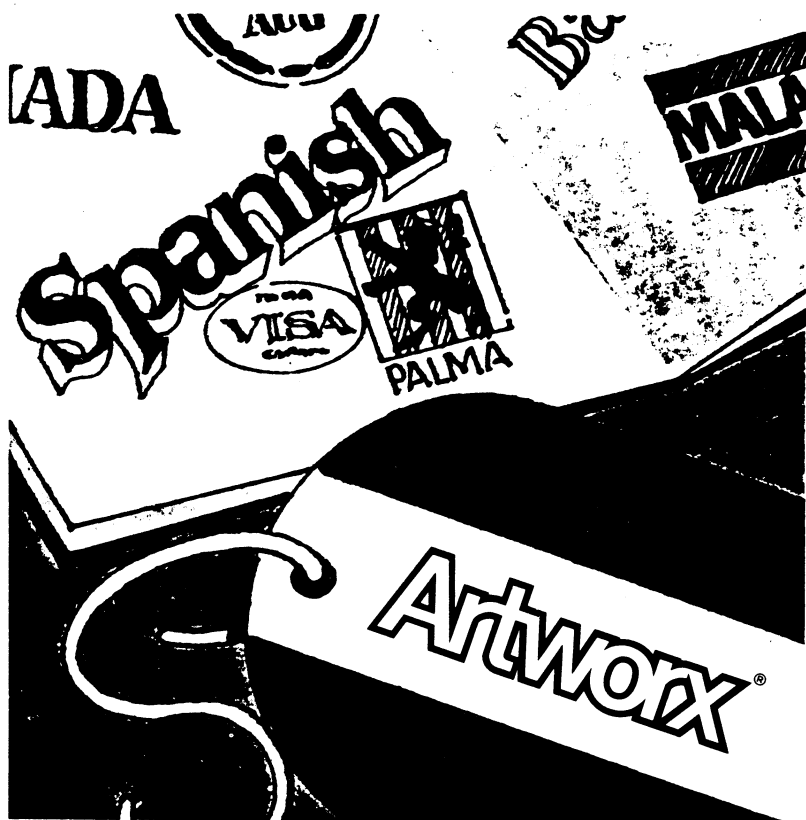

What is the Artworx Linkword Language System?

The Artworx Linkword Language System is a system for teaching foreign languages which is much faster, easier and more enjoyable than normal methods of language instruction. In ten hours, you will learn a vocabulary of about 400 words and a basic grammar. This will help you to understand and to be understood should you travel to a Spanish-speaking country or talk to a native Spanish speaker. Of course, there will be gaps in your vocabulary and your knowledge of grammar, but you will be surprised at how quickly and easily you learn the basics of Spanish. One of the ways in which the system works is to use visual images. An English word is linked, by means of a visual image, to another English word which sounds like the Spanish word. For Example:

The Spanish for **bread** is **pan**
Imagine a large **pan** full of **bread**

You imagine this picture in your mind's eye as vividly as you can. When you are given the word 'pan' you will immediately think of bread in a pan and will remember that Spanish for bread is 'pan.'

Who can use the Artworx Linkword Language System?

The short answer is **anyone** and **everyone!** You certainly don't need a gift for languages to learn Spanish. The courses have been designed for vacationers, for business executives who want to learn the basics of a language in a hurry, for children who find learning languages at school difficult or boring, or for anyone wanting to learn a language for pleasure. The courses often appeal to those who find learning a language by normal methods boring or difficult, but even people who are good at languages often find the Linkword courses much more interesting and enjoyable than normal methods of learning.

Loading instructions for Linkword SPANISH

Macintosh, Atari-ST and Amiga: Insert Linkword disk and select 'Linkword' icon.

Apple: Insert Linkword disk and turn on computer.

IBM: Boot system with your DOS disk. Insert Linkword disk in drive A and type: **SPANISH** <Enter/Return>

Commodore: Insert disk and type: **LOAD"BOOT",8,1** <Return>

Atari (8-bit machines): Remove BASIC cartridge if present. Insert Linkword disk, turn on computer (XL users should press **OPTION** key when turning on computer.)

Commodore- the accent and the letter are entered at the same time as follows:

For **ã** press **C-** and **n** simultaneously
For **é** press **C-** and **d** simultaneously
For **í** press **C-** and **w** simultaneously
For **ó** press **C-** and **h** simultaneously
For **ú** press **C-** and **r** simultaneously
For **ñ** press **C-** and **j** simultaneously
For **¿** press **C-** and **e** simultaneously

Atari- the accent and the letter are entered at the same time as follows:

For **ã** press **CONTROL** and **a** simultaneously
For **é** press **CONTROL** and **e** simultaneously
For **í** press **CONTROL** and **i** simultaneously
For **ó** press **CONTROL** and **o** simultaneously
For **ú** press **CONTROL** and **u** simultaneously
For **ñ** press **CONTROL** and **n** simultaneously

7. Sometimes the word in Spanish and in English is the same or very similar. For example, the Spanish for 'taxi' is 'taxi'. When this happens, you will be asked to associate the word in some way with a bullfighter:

Imagine a taxi full of bullfighters.

Whenever a bullfighter comes to mind therefore, you will know the word is the same or similar in both languages.

8. It is very important to realize that some groups of words are more difficult to learn than others. If this happens, do not worry. Just go on to the next set of words and forget you have had any difficulty. The important thing to appreciate is how much you **do** learn very quickly. Even if you feel you want to exit a section before completion, you are strongly advised to carry on to the end of that section before going back to look at what you have already accomplished.

9. The examples given in the course may well strike you as silly and bizarre. The fact is that they have deliberately been constructed to illustrate parts of grammar and to get away from the idea that you should remember useful phrases 'parrot fashion'.

10. The pronunciation given in the course is only approximate.

11. The Spanish in this course is 'Castillian' Spanish. It is very similar to any other Spanish. However, for South American Spanish there are some slight differences in pronunciation.

12. Note to parents and teachers:

If your child has difficulty in reading, you can still use the course to teach Spanish. You can use the text as a manual and read from the screen to your child. One way of holding a young child's interest is to get him or her to sketch the images you present.

13. Important note

You should not listen to the audio tape until instructed to do so by the computer. The audio tape gives the correct pronunciation of the words used.
