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# THE TAX HANDLER™

## I. Introduction

Welcome to the TAX HANDLER! With this software, your Atari 400/800 can now help you prepare your taxes. The Tax Handler facilitates tax preparation by doing the calculating for you. Using the graphic capabilities of the Atari, each screen is formatted exactly as the tax form. All you do is input data, the programs do the rest!

All programs are menu-driven and all data can be saved to cassette or disk.

### A. SPECIFIC FEATURES

- Form 1040 (Long Form): covers filing status, exemptions, income, income adjustments, computation of tax, tax credits, taxes (other), and payments or balance/refund due.
- Schedule A - Itemized Deductions: reviews medical and dental expenses, taxes, interest expense, contributions, casualty/theft losses, miscellaneous deductions; and presents a summary of itemized deductions.
- Schedule G - Income Averaging: reviews base period income and adjustments, computation of averageable income, and calculates computation of tax.

### B. REQUIRED EQUIPMENT

- Atari 400/800: 24K cassette, 32K diskette
- Basic cartridge
- Single disk drive (Atari 810, Percom)  
or
- Cassette recorder

## II. GETTING STARTED

### A. DISK USERS

#### 1. LOADING INSTRUCTIONS

The TAX HANDLER is completely menu-driven with an auto-boot system.

- turn on your disk-drive
- insert the TAX HANDLER disk
- turn on your Atari
- the auto-boot system will automatically load the first program of the package, the TAX HANDLER PROGRAM MENU

## 2. THE TAX HANDLER PROGRAM MENU

This program contains the menu which drives all of the other programs. After the TAX HANDLER PROGRAM MENU has loaded, press any key and the menu will automatically print to the screen.

The menu looks like this:

### THE TAX HANDLER PROGRAM MENU

- (1) Run Form 1040 - Part 1
- (2) Run Form 1040 - Part 2
- (3) Run Form 1040 - Part 3
- (4) Run Schedule A - Itemized Deductions
- (5) Run Schedule G - Income Averaging

What is your choice?

Enter the number associated with the program you would like to load.

Loading the programs without using the Program Menu:

Depending on the program you are loading, do the following:

- for Form 1040 - Part 1, type in RUN"D:F10401", then press (RETURN)

- for Form 1040 - Part 2, type in RUN"D:F10402", then press (RETURN)
- for Form 1040 - Part 3, type in RUN"D:F10403", then press (RETURN)
- for Schedule A, type in RUN"D:SCHEDULA", then press (RETURN)
- for Schedule G, type in RUN"D:SCHDULG", then press (RETURN)

It is recommended that all users use the Program Menu.

## B. CASSETTE USERS

### 1. LOADING INSTRUCTIONS

The cassette version of the TAX HANDLER is identical to the disk version in all respects except - it is not equipped with the TAX HANDLER PROGRAM MENU. Hence, you must advance your tape recorder to the appropriate line counter numbers and load the programs separately.

### 2. LOADING PROCEDURE

- for F1040 1, advance line counter to 10, type in CLOAD, then (RETURN)
- for F10402, advance line counter to 106, type in CLOAD, then (RETURN)
- for F10403, advance line counter to 163, type in CLOAD, then (RETURN)
- for SCHEDULA, advance line counter to 214, type in CLOAD, then (RETURN)
- for SCHDULG, advance line counter to 278, type in CLOAD, then (RETURN)

### III. THE PROGRAMS

#### A. FORM 1040 - PART 1

Both disk and cassette users should refer to the loading instructions detailed in the "Getting Started" portion of this documentation, to run this program.

The menu for Form 1040 - Part 1 appears as follows:

#### FORM 1040 MENU

- (1) Review Filing Section
- (2) Review Exemptions Section
- (3) Review Income Section
- (4) 1040 File Menu
- (5) Return to Main Program

What is your choice?

First, a few pointers:

- You should notice the blinking cursor. This is a machine language subroutine used to help you locate the cursor on the screen.
- Option 4 is to load or save the 1040 File. This file will contain information you have previously entered, and is the same file for all 3 of the 1040 Programs.
- Do not use decimals. Round figures to nearest dollar. (The IRS allows you to do this)

#### CASSETTE USERS

-- Form 1040 FILE MAINTENANCE

To generate your working tax file you must follow this procedure.

- (1) Load F1040 1, input data, save file
- (2) Load F1040 2, load file from F1040 1, input data, save file
- (3) Load F1040 3, load F1040 2 file, input data, save file

## DISK USERS

-- Should maintain their files on a separate preformatted diskette (see your Atari DOS manual for formatting instruction). All files will be automatically updated in a central file. Remember to always load in the central 1040 file before making any changes in any of the three programs, and then resave that file.

### 1. REVIEW FILING SECTION

After selecting Option 1, the following screen will appear:

Enter [1] to [5] or [N]ext or [RETURN]

Enter 1-5 to input your applicable situation. If you key 1-5, you can press any key but the (SPACEBAR), and that item will be 'X'ed and recorded. If you key (SPACEBAR), all applicable information for that item will be erased.

Under category 3, Married Filing Separately, use the following procedure to input information:

Press 3, then any key. A blinking cursor will prompt you to input name of spouse. Input name, then press return. Next input the name, then press return. Next input the social security number using digits only (the hyphens are provided automatically by the program)

**IMPORTANT:** To calculate the later computations, you must complete this section!

To return to the first menu, press (RETURN), or to go on to the next page (EXEMPTIONS), key in (N).

## 2. REVIEW EXEMPTIONS SECTION

After selecting Option 2 on the main menu, (or pressing [N]), the following screen will appear:

Enter (6A) - (6D) or (N)ext or (RETURN)

Enter 6A-6D as your situation applies.

**NOTE:** This is the only section in the package not equipped with a blinking cursor to guide you on each line. To input data on lines 6A and 6B, press 6, then a or b, then any key but spacebar to flag each category. For example, to declare only yourself as exempt, press 6 then a, then any key, an X will appear next to yourself. Next, press [spacebar] twice to ignore the other two categories.

To input dependent's names, press 6, then C. A cursor will appear prompting you to input first dependent's name. The return key is then used to skip to the next line. You have space to input up to five (5) dependents.

To return to the main menu, press (RETURN), or to go on to the next page (INCOME), key in (N).

## 3. REVIEW INCOME SECTION

After selecting Option 3 on the main menu (or pressing [N]), the following screen will appear:

Enter (07\*)-(21\*) or (RETURN)

The computer is expecting 3 keys. For example, to enter item 13, key in 130; for 20A, key in 20A, etc. After selecting the item, key in the amount, then press (RETURN). For negative amounts include the minus sign.

Items 09B, 09C, 20B, and 22 are calculated for you. Thus, you cannot access these items.

If you accidentally input a value in the wrong line, reopen the line and type in either 0 or the correct value, then press [RETURN]. Follow this procedure with the other programs as well.

When finished entering the data press (RETURN) to return to the menu.

4. 1040 FILE MENU: After you have entered all the necessary data, you are ready to save your tax files.

To load or save the 1040 File, select Option 4 on the main menu. The following menu will appear.

#### 1040 FILE LOAD

- (1) Cassette Load
- (2) Diskette Load
- (3) Cassette Save
- (4) Diskette Save
- (5) Return to Main Menu

What is your choice?

Choose the appropriate option to either load or save the tax data.

NOTE: When saving tax data, the program will prompt you to load 1040 file into storage device. Remember to insert a preformatted disk or cassette in your drive or tape recorder. Then press any key to save the tax file.

#### 5. RETURN TO MAIN PROGRAM

- Disk-users select this option to return to the TAX

- Cassette-users select this option to exit from the program.

**B. FORM 1040 - PART 2**

Both disk and cassette users should refer to the loading instructions detailed in "Getting Started" to run this program.

The menu for Form 1040 - Part 2 appears as follows:

Enter (23\*) - (39\*) or (RETURN)

Again, the computer is expecting 3 keys. For example, to enter item 23, key in 230. After selecting the item, key in the amount, then press (RETURN). For negative amounts include the minus sign.

Items 31, 32, 34B, 35, 36, 37, 38 and 40 are calculated for you. Hence, you cannot access these items.

When finished entering the data press (RETURN) to return to the menu.

### 2. 1040 FILE MENU

Select Option 2 to save/load this tax data.

This procedure is identical to that in section 1.

**DISK USERS** - Your TAX FILE will be automatically updated.

**CASSETTE USERS** - This file now becomes your working file i.e. you will load this file into part 3.

### C. FORM 1040 - PART 3

Both disk and cassette users should refer to the loading instructions detailed in "Getting Started" to run this program.

The menu for Form 1040 - Part 3 appears as follows:

**FORM 1040 MENU**

- (2) Review Payments or Balance/Refund Due
- (3) Form 1040 File Load
- (4) Return to Main Program

What is your choice?

Enter data in the same manner as before, except you only need to input 2 digits. When done, key (N) to go on to the next page, (Option 2) or (RETURN) for menu.

**\*NOTE:** Depending on the situation, line 68 will read either BALANCE DUE, or AMOUNT OVERPAID, depending on who owes who.

### 3. FORM 1040 FILE LOAD

When finished entering data, select Option 3 on the main menu to save/load the tax file. This is now your master tax file.

### D. SCHEDULE A - ITEMIZED DEDUCTIONS

SCHEDULE A can be used in conjunction with our other tax schedules to both ease your tax preparation and save you taxes.

The program is divided into sections in the same manner as the actual SCHEDULE A form. To determine what you can and cannot deduct, it is suggested that you refer to the instructions that you receive from the IRS; we also provide you with the actual Schedule A form. It can be found at the end of this section.

1. The first screen in the program is the main menu. You can review medical and dental expenses, review taxes and interest expense, review contributions and casualty/-theft losses, review miscellaneous deductions and summary, or save and/or load tax data.

The main menu appears as follows:

Enter (010-090) or (N)ext or (RETURN)

The computer is expecting 3 keys. For example, to input medicine and drug expenses, key in 020. A blinking cursor will appear at line 020 prompting you to enter the appropriate amount. After entering the amount, press (Return).

Follow the same procedure when entering all data. Keep in mind that line 030, 060, 070, 080, 090, 100 are calculated by the program, so you are unable to open these lines.

After inputting all necessary data press (RETURN) to return to the main menu, or (N) to go on the the next section - TAXES AND INTEREST EXPENSES.

## 6. FILE MAINTENANCE MENU

When finished entering data, select Option 5 on the SCHEDULE-A main menu. (File Maintenance) to save the tax information.

## E. SCHEDULE G - INCOME AVERAGING

Here's a program that everyone should have in their software library. Schedule G can be used in conjunction with our other tax schedules, or used by itself to help you save taxes.

If your income this year is much greater than the average of your income for the past 4 base period years (1978-1981), you may be able to pay less tax by income averaging. To see if you qualify, load the program and follow the instructions outlined below.

The first screen to appear is the main menu:

### SCHEDULE G

- (1) Review Base Period  
Income And Adjustments
- (2) Review Computation of Averageable Income
- (3) Review and Calculate Computation of Tax
- (4) File Maintenance Menu
- (5) Return to Main Program

What is your choice?

The first thing you will want to do is to review your base period income and adjustments. To do so, select option 1 on the main menu.

After selecting option 1, the following screen will appear:

Key [01 - 11] or [N]ext or [RETURN]

To input income information for the past four (4) base period years, press the appropriate keys. Remember, the computer is expecting two (2) digits. For example, to input 1978 taxable income of 10,000 first press 01. Then input the amount and press [RETURN] follow the same procedure for each line.

If you make a mistake, and are still on that line, you can use the Back Space (Back S) key to backtrack and correct the error. Otherwise, press the line number containing the error, and reinput the correct data.

If you accidentally select a line you do not wish to use, input 0, then press RETURN.

After entering the necessary amounts, press [N] to continue to the next page.

- (13) Amt. on line 12 + 30%

  - (15) Penalty for Excess. Dist'n
  - (16) Line 14 - Line 15

  - (20) Line 18 - Line 19
- (Averageable Income)

On this screen, you need enter only three amounts. The same rules apply for entering data as in the first screen.

If your averageable income is less than or equal to \$3000, you do not qualify for Income Averaging. If this is the case, you will be informed by a message on the screen, and will be returned to the main menu. If you do qualify, you will be asked if your filing status is:

1. Single taxpayer.
2. Unmarried head of household.
3. Married taxpayers filing jointly, or qualifying widows and widowers.
4. Married taxpayers filing a separate return.

After selecting the appropriate option, the screen will automatically print out your tax computing using the income averaging method.

Line 34 displays the tax you owe under this method. Beware, compare this amount with what you would normally have to pay because it is not always the best method, even if you do qualify.

## FILE MAINTENANCE MENU

To save the data you entered, and the results calculated by the program, pick Option 4 from the main menu. This menu will appear on the screen:

### 1040 FILE LOAD

- (1) Cassette Load
- (2) Diskette Load
- (3) Cassette Save
- (4) Diskette Save
- (5) Return to Main Menu

What is your choice?

The procedure is identical to that used with the other programs. Remember to insert your 1040 File in storage device (either disk drive or cassette recorder), then press any key to save the data.

The menu is self-explanatory . . . the whole program requires less than 20 entries to calculate your tax through Income Averaging, and will be accurate within 10\$ either way. We hope it saves you some money!
