For the past several months I have been using Windows 2000 Beta's on my home computer. As of a couple of weeks ago I have graduated to the final version and though it was time to report on my findings.

Needless to say I am very pleased with 2000 and will continue to use it. It offers a number of features that I find to my advantage. The first advantage is reliability; despite using mostly beta versions the program has held up surprisingly well. The next big advantage is speed, mostly speed using a cable modem. Overall I would guess 2000 to be 30 to 40% faster than Win 98.

All is not roses for everybody who has tried 2000. There are very definite hardware

requirements that must be observed in order for it to work properly. I would guess that a 350 MHz. CPU and a minimum of 128 megabytes of memory should be considered a realistic minimum to achieve a good level of operation.

All the hardware that you have must be on the approved list or there will be nothing but problems. The other big drawback to its use in the home environment will be because it does not play most games. It is primarily a business OS and it lets you know it very quickly when you try to load an unapproved program.
