

## NOTE WIZARD UPDATES Version 1.3

### *New Quicker Version*

- Drills can now be completely operated remotely from your MIDI keyboard, with the exception of stopping the Drill and going back to the menu.
- All dialogue boxes in the Drills, (After every problem, Pass Stage, and Too Slow) now display a small keyboard above the words "GO ON". Clicking on "GO ON" or pressing any note on your keyboard, will continue the Drills. MUCH FASTER! Use the computer mouse to exit the Drills.
- In the Drills, if you make several mistakes, pushing <SPACE> while the first note is being corrected will allow you to continue without having to wait for other corrections. If you start on the wrong note, you can start over right away after the first note is corrected by pressing <SPACE>.
- A new MIDI function works with all aftertouch keyboards.
- Enhanced screen graphics.
- All MIDI functions are now compatible with the Casio MT series.
- An MT-240 default file is included for those of you with MT-240 keyboards. Rename this to DEFAULT.NPA to have the program initialize with these patch settings when booting the program.
- The Grades Option is now mouse driven.
- The Edit MIDI option is now mouse driven. First click on the box of the patch you wish to change and the black box will move. Then further clicking will increase (left mouse) or decrease (right mouse) the number. Clicking on the four boxes at the bottom will play, load, save or return to menu. Upon clicking on PLAY, a message box reminds you that, as with all musical feedback, clicking RETURN will continue (stop the music).
- When the word "PLAY" is shown during Drills or Practice modes, you must click the mouse on the displayed keyboard (or use Pitchbend) to exit.
- The dialog box defaults in both the Drills and the Recorder have been changed so that a mouse click is required to exit and pushing RETURN will put you back where you were in the Drill or the Recorder.
- The Recorder now is mouse driven, and pitch bend can be recorded.
- Tutorials are now mouse driven. You have the choices of 'Continue', 'Menu', 'Practice', and 'Review' (at the end of tutorial).
- The MIDI Recorder now has a STOP button.
- Polyphonic Aftertouch is now supported.
